Freedom House

Comparing Facts

Using the CIA World Factbook, this assignment explores statistics-based comparisons.

This excerpt from a World Health Organization report investigates the connection between public health and social conditions.

Comparing Cultural Dimensions

This assignment uses Geert Hofstede's model of Cultural Dimensions to compare and contrast the cultures of China and India.

Comparing Maps

How are maps used to compare country data and trends?

The Communist Manifesto

In an excerpt from The Communist Manifesto, Marx and Engels explore the relationship between religion and policy.

Oligarchy: Mexico and Brazil

Using a selection from "Rural Incorporation and Regime Durability in Brazil" by Ana Cristina Araújo Alves, this assignment explores the differing fates of oligarchies in Mexico and Brazil.

Darfur

A video documentary produced by the Washington Post that tells the story of those ravaged by the violence in Darfur.

CHAPTER 2: BRITAIN

Conservatives in Britain

These short videos explore how British conservatives are cooperating with and learning from other European conservative parties.

A Shadow Minister's Thoughts

This assignment explores the British National Health System from the perspective of the British Conservative Party as well as the Labour Party.

Redefining Scotland

The Scottish National Party is seeking to redefine Scotland's relationship to England. What factors influence this movement towards independence?

Debate in Parliament

This glimpse inside the British Parliament gives a look at the Queen's Speech, in which the British government outlines its policies for the coming year.

London Mosque

Plans to build Europe's largest mosque in London stir controversy and racial tension.

CHAPTER 3: FRANCE

Occupied France

After the French defeat in 1940, Germany occupied much of France. But a new French government at Vichy had its own policy agenda.

Regime Seeks Leader

This online lecture looks at France's foreign policy during the transition from the Fourth to the Fifth Republic. A special emphasis is given to France's relationships with her colonies.

France's Fifth Republic

A journal article from 1960, two years after the founding of the French Fifth Republic, analyzes French politics from a socialist point of view.

Economic Development

A documentary exploring how French legislation meant to protect worker's benefits has affected a younger generation of job seekers.

Immigration

As Paris celebrates its history of immigration with a new museum, a strict immigration bill makes its way through parliament.

Protests in France

These clips identify two forms of French political protest and explore the differing levels of power between some citizens and 'elites'.

Banning the Hijab

A French law threatens to ban Muslim headscarves from schools. This assignment explores the tension between religious expression and secular authority.

Voicing their Dissent

Nazi Propaganda

A brief documentary explores Germany's post-war economic recovery.

Helmut Kohl

A short video story describes the German government's concerns about the Church of Scientology.

German Election

The complications of the 2005 election reveal the idiosyncrasies of German politics.

Dividing India

How have religious and ethnic divisions shaped India's history? Was Partition inevitable after the British granted India its independence?

India's Growing Pains

With an abundance of technology jobs available to India's college educated, what could be bad about modernization there? These stories reveal the shortcomings.

Religious Tensions

The Babri Masjid mosque in Ayodha, India, has been a source of conflict between Muslims and Hindus for over 150 years. This timeline tracks the development of tensions between these religious groups.

Habeas Corpus Suspended

For nearly 2 years during the 1970's, India was governed under a state of emergency. Civil liberties protections like habeas corpus were suspended. How did this affect the nation as a democracy?

Whistleblowing on You Tube

Lagos

A short documentary examines life in Lagos, Nigeria, the fastest growing megacity in the world.

The transition from military rule in Nigeria has involved shifts in elite politics. What role do political elites play in society, politics, and policy?

Nigeria's Oil

A documentary discusses Nigeria's abundant oil supplies, growing popular unrest in the face of widespread poverty and corruption, and the use of military force.

CHAPTER 9: BRAZIL

Land Occupation

A documentary on land reforms in Brazil examines the notion of property ownership in a nation known for its stark division between rich and poor.

Brazil's President

Brazil's president Lula da Silva has become very influential in Latin America and the developing world. In this interview he speaks of his role in Brazil's future.

Jewel of the Amazon

The Brazilian government's efforts to put a stop to a thriving black market in diamonds mined on a Cinta Larga Indian reservation is the focus of this assignment.

Socialization Factors in Brazil

Does an examination of family life in Brazil expand our understanding of socialization processes? What is the relationship between economic growth and family life?

Brazil's Indigenous Peoples

Although Brazilian law provides land rights for indigenous peoples, these rights are often nullified by administrative decisions. Is there an appropriate balance?

Mexico Candidacy Battle

After generations of political domination, PRI—Mexico's leading political party—embraces change.

NAFTA's Effect on Mexico

This essay explores how clientelism in Mexico City is affecting the legitimacy of the government.

Good Cop, Bad Cop in Mexico

Mexico's drug wars exacerbate rifts between local and federal law enforcement agencies. This news article demonstrates the challenges of working within multi-tiered political systems.

Maquiladoras

Along the north border of Mexico, electronics assembly plants provide jobs for some Mexicans. Workers tell their stories.

CHAPTER 11: RUSSIA

Economic Heresy in the USSR

A documentary chronicles economic reforms in the Soviet Union instituted by Mikhail Gorbachev.

The Collapse of the Soviet Union

This assignment traces the collapse of the Soviet Union and its transition to a new political and economic system.

Death by Privatization

Privatization has had a tremendous impact on the Russian people. How has Russia's government responded to this phenomenon?

Democracy in Russia

Though Russia has officially become a democracy, Vladimir Putin holds more power than his formal government duties would suggest is appropriate.

Putin on Term Limitations

Vladimir Putin's increasing power may be a sign of creeping authoritarianism. How much power should a president have in deciding term limits?

Khomeini Returns

Leadership in Iran

How does the Ayatollah's role in Iranian politics affect the legitimacy of the government? The following sources explore the relationship between charismatic leadership and institutional authority.

Ahmadinejad's Perspectives

Some revere President Ahmadinejad as a populist, while much of the world distrusts him. This assignment explores competing assessments of Iran's controversial president.

Oil for Iran

Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmedinejad attempts to use oil revenues for social purposes, but is constrained by both internal and external factors.

Iran's Nuclear Program

Amidst great controversy over Iran's nuclear capabilities, the country insists its nuclear centrifuges are necessary. Is it right for some countries to have nuclear weapons, but not Iran?

CHAPTER 13: CHINA

China's Wealth Gaps

A video exploration of the Chinese government's role in urban development, and how some Chinese citizens are affected by their government's policies.

Civil Rights and Liberties

As China seeks to become more globally integrated, its policies on civil liberties have come under scrutiny.

The Chinese Bureaucracy

This assignment discusses the Chinese bureaucracy, from both theoretical and functional perspectives.

China's Economic Growth

China's economic growth has led to a massive migration of workers from the countryside into cities, creating serious instability. This documentary looks at the effects.

China's Space Program

This assignment investigates the role propaganda plays in political agendas and in garnering public support for government projects.

This short film documents the ways that the Uyghur independence movement is complicating the position of other Chinese Muslims and how the Chinese government is responding.
