



### Tom Proctor

- Stable won 68 races in 2012 and earned \$3,531,595; highlights included wins in the Rodeo Drive (G1) with Marketing Mix, the La Jolla Handicap (G2) with Old Time Hockey, the Dance Smartly (G2-Can) and Nassau (G2-Can), both with Marketing Mix, the Suwannee River (G3) and Edward P. Evans All Along (G3), both with Snow Top Mountain, the Arlington-Washington Futurity (G3) with Pataky Kid and the Senator Ken Maddy (G3) with Broken Dreams.
- **Breeders Cup Win:** 1994 Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) with longshot One Dreamer.
- Stable won 63 races and earned \$3,454,149 in 2011 to rank 29th; highlights included wins in the American Turf (G2) and Del Mar Derby (G2) with Banned, and Mrs. Revere (G2) with Marketing Mix.
- Finished in a tie for second in the Kentucky Downs standings in 2008 and posted Top 10 finishes at Arlington Park and the Keeneland fall meet. In 2009, he finished in the Top 10 at Arlington and Keeneland (fall), and in 2010 in the Top 10 at Keeneland's spring and fall meets. In 2012, he finished seventh at Hollywood Park's fall meet.
- Won 2007 Shadwell Turf Mile (G1) with Purim.
- His father, Willard Proctor, won four stakes at Keeneland in the mid-1960s.
- Other graded stakes winners include Split Run, Concept Win, Openstock, Bonus Pack, Indy Groove, Rich in Spirit, Cryptoquip, Closeout, No Inflation, Keertana, Broken Dreams and Dilemma.

#### Background:

In 1964, Tom's father, veteran trainer Willard L. Proctor, won Keeneland's Fayette Handicap with Swoonen. The following year he returned to saddle Bright Bauble to victory in a division of the Ashland and Gallant Romeo to victories in the Ben Ali and Phoenix handicaps. Among the other top horses he trained during his highly successful career are Convenience, Summer Time Guy, The Carpenter, Lovelier Linda, Table Hands, Top Rung, Header Card and Major Impact. He died in October of 1998, while feeding his horses at his barn at Santa Anita.

Tom followed in his father's footsteps and began training in 1978. Although there are a few other fathers and sons who have both saddled stakes winners at Keeneland, it's far from commonplace.

His family's connection to Leonard Lavin's Glen Hill Farm began with his father and two of his brothers also have worked for the Florida farm.
