 - C. Character cannot be purchased it must be planted Psalm 1
 - 1. Planted by streams of living water Holy Spirit
 - 2. Rooted in good. Fertile soil open heart
 - 3. Exposed to the light Word of God

 - a. Agape unconditional love; divine affection

 - 2. God is all wise omniscience His wisdom is like a mystery to humanity I Cor 2:7-8
 - B. Impartation
 - 1. By an angel sharing a word of wisdom from the Lord Gideon
 - 2. In a vision receiving a vision or dream that imparts a message of wisdom Daniel
 - 3. By an audible voice hearing the voice of God directly Moses
 - 4. In a thought or impression perceiving a message form the holy Spirit in your spirit or mind *Agabus*
 - C. Application
 - 1. Remember God's gifts are to promote God's redemption, righteousness and justice
 - 2. Messages from God may be spoken, acted out, painted, sculpted, woven, molded, carved, sung or played on an instrument
 - 3. Words of Wisdom help us:
 - a. To transform talents God's purpose
 - b. To develop skills God's way
 - c. To apply grace to each area of our lives God's will

 - 2. *baptizo* (GK verb) to dip or to dye (like a garment from one color to another); drawing out water from one vessel to another; washing
 - B. Baptism in the Spirit definite experience, subsequent to salvation, whereby the Third Person of the Godhead comes upon the believer to anoint and energize for special service; also called "falling upon"; "coming upon"; "poured out" and "being filled."

 - 3. Every gift is important I Corinthians 12:15-16
 - 4. Gifts are sovereignly bestowed by God I Corinthians 12:11
 - 5. Every gift is given by God's grace Romans 12:6
 - 6. All gifts must be developed and exercised II Timothy 1:6
 - 7. Gifts reflect the nature and character of God John 15:5
 - 8. Love is the key to all spiritual gifts I Corinthians 13
 - B. Spiritual Gifts Romans 12:1-8
 - 1. Prophesying the ability to speak God's will and God's way into life present and future **Righteousness**
 - 2. Serving the ability to aid or assist others in need Just Do It
 - 3. Teaching the ability to discern, analyze and deliver biblical and other spiritual truths **Just Do It**
 - 4. Encouraging the ability to counsel, inspire, motivate, encourage and strengthen others in and through their efforts to live out God's will and calling as Christians in pain or pleasure, want or plenty **Just Do It**
 - 5. Giving the ability to contribute income, time, energy and skills beyond the reasonable standard **Generously**
 - 6. Leadership extraordinary ability to envision God's will and purpose and persuade others to pursue and act upon it **Diligently**

position or recognition - with the strength of God

 - 1. Apostles the ability to adhere to the personality of Jesus Christ and His tradition of missional itinerary so that one so that one may wield effective spiritual oversight of new places for the purpose of extending Christian ministries for spiritual, just and righteous living

- 2. Prophets the ability to link biblical truths and God's will for today's living and to be an instrument for revealing or interpreting historic or current messages from God for righteous and just living in today's world
- 3. Teachers the ability to discern, analyze and deliver biblical and other spiritual truths to help others to comprehend and accept the clear calling of God to live justly and righteously
- 4. Workers of Miracles the ability to do powerful works that transcend our perception of natural laws and means to free the church or individuals from conditions that restrict needed ministries
- 5. Healers the ability to cure or to be cured of ill conditions that hinder effective ministries for Christ, the church or individuals
- 6. Helpers the ability and eagerness to aid or assist others in need to such an extent that the helper receives as much as the person helped
- 7. Administrators the ability to sort out resources and persons for effective church ministries and to organize and implement them into ministry projects until completion with eventful results
- 8. Speakers of Tongues the ability to pray to or praise God with beneficial wordless phrases or utterances not familiar as a known language, and with such a joy-filled intimacy with Christ that faith is strengthened and ministries become effective

 - 2. Suffering is often used to make us aware of God's power to sustain us Psalm 68:19

The Spirit in Church History

- I. François de Salignac de la Mothe Fenelon (1651-1715 AD)
 - A. Biography
 - 1. Born to a noble family in France; educated in Paris
 - 2. Ordained a Catholic priest; missionary to Canada
 - 3. Served as pastor, teacher, and archbishop in France
 - 4. Filled with the Holy Spirit after an eight day prayer vigil by Madame Guyon in November, 1688
 - B. Crucifixion of the Life of Self Fenelon
 - 1. Present your soul to God by faith submit
 - 2. Die to the inner pleasures and happiness of this life lose your life
 - 3. Die to the virtues and habits of this life lose your pride
 - 4. Die to the resentment of God's way in this life lose your feelings
 - 5. Receive the life of love from Christ Himself gain the resurrection
 - 6. Conform to the image of God in disposition and action gain new life
- II. Christmas Evans (1766-1838 AD)
 - A. Biography
 - 1. Born to a poor family on Christmas 1766; difficult teenage years no education
 - 2. Lost an eye during a fight at age 17
 - 3. Decided for Christ after a revival meeting in Wales
 - 4. Ordained by the Baptist Church
 - 5. Received the Holy Spirit after 9 years of struggling in the ministry
 - B. A Solemn Covenant with God Christmas Evans
 - 1. I give body and soul to Jesus Christ
 - 2. I call upon all nature to witness to the Redeemer of Sinners
 - 3. I take the work of God for my own my labor, His glory
 - 4. I entreat an interest in the blood of Jesus which cleanses me
 - 5. I consecrate my interest in the church building it for His glory
 - 6. I desire that every activity would be useful in the kingdom of God
 - 7. I desire that every word would be useful in the kingdom of God
 - 8. I desire that the Word of God be in me first; in my preaching second
 - 9. Wash me in your redeeming blood
 - 10. Give me power to trust in you
 - 11. Prepare me for my death let everything be in order
 - 12. Take away all sin and all merit
 - 13. Hear my prayers, oh Redeemer of Sinners
- III. Charles G. Finney (1792-1875 AD)
 - A. Biography
 - 1. Born in Connecticut to a Puritan family
 - 2. Studied law in New York; interested in the Bible
 - 3. Converted in the woods outside his office after a deep conviction from the Lord
 - B. Why Many Do Not Have the Spirit? Charles G. Finney
 - 1. Many live a hypocritical life insincere and without any heart
 - 2. Many live a frivolous life no interest for he things of God
 - 3. Many live a proud life fond of fashion, high life, and entertainment

A. Definition - the ability to link biblical truths and God's will for today's living and to be an instrument for revealing or interpreting historic or current messages from God for

righteous and just living in today's world

- 1. propheteia GK revealing, manifesting, announcing
- 2. Prophecy is for believers for strengthening, encouragement and comfort-I Cor 14:3
- 3. Prophecy is to be judged I Corinthians 14:29
 - a. By the Word of God II Peter 1:19
 - b. By the character of the speaker II Peter 1:19
- 4. Prophecy is partial and not complete I Corinthians 13:9
- 5. Prophecy is exercised in proportion to our faith Romans 12:6
- 6. The spirit of prophecy is the testimony of Jesus Revelation 19:10

B. Impartation

- 1. Word by word message
- 2. Picture and/or inner impression
- 3. Dreams or visions
- 4. Application of a particular scripture

II. Different Kinds of tongues - I Corinthians 12:10

A. Definition - the ability to pray or praise God with beneficial wordless phrases or utterances not familiar as a known language, and with such a joy-filled intimacy with Jesus that faith is strengthened and ministries become effective

- 1. glossalalia GK to speak in tongues
 - a. glossais tongues; physical organ in the mouth
 - b. *ialein* to speak
- 2. New Testament References
 - a. Mark a sign that the person is a believer
 - b. Acts one of several signs that a person has been filled with the Holy Spirit
 - c. *I Corinthians* a gift described as a form of private prayer or personal edification unless accompanied by the gift of interpretation for public edification
