Other items to consider for Visitation and Funeral/Memorial Service

Burial or Cremation

Pallbearers - Having 6 is traditional, we will work with however many you want to use

Flowers (2 options-family can work directly with florist or funeral home can place order with florist for the family)

Clergy (If the family doesn't have a clergy, the funeral home can help arrange one)

Veteran benefits (funeral home will help arrange veteran benefits.....must be honorably discharged)

- American Flag - Folded or Draped Who should it be presented to?
- Military Honors for Veteran: Y/N (honors can be held at the cemetery, funeral home or church)
- VA Marker or Medallion (funeral home will help in applying for marker or medallion)
- Other veteran benefits may be available. This will vary with each veteran.

Luncheon: (how many people, location & menu)

Obituary: (funeral home will help you with the format and which papers obituary should be in)

Balloon release (balloons can be released from funeral home, church or cemetery)

Dove release (funeral home will help arrange this option, weather permitting, there may be a cost involved)

Information that may be needed in obituary

Full name (nickname), age, residence of what city & state, date & place of birth, parents names, organizations, hobbies etc...only put in what information you feel is necessary), names of survivors (spouse, children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, parents, sisters, brothers, other relatives) names of those who have preceded in death, funeral, visitation and burial info., information on a memorial if one is going to be established.

Reminders:

Most papers charge by the length of obituary

Include a photo in paper?
