



Bike Friday Fold Up Bike - 'New World Tourist' 24-speed touring model – with extra wide gear range and an extra low gear for riding up over those steep hills and passes. Original owner is ready to pass it on to a new generation of adventurers. \$690 OBO, includes the folding rear and front racks, and a zipper bag to carry or stow away your bike. New from the Bike Friday website

these items would cost at least \$250. This same 24-speed New World Tourist with the ChrisKing Grip Nut Silver headset upgrade that is on the bike would cost you \$1,400 new, not including pedals and a seat.

The bike folds to fit into a space 32" x 24" x 12" and will disassemble to fit into a Samsonite F"lite 30 suitcase. The case dimensions are 29.5" x 20" x 12" which meets most airline, Greyhound, and Amtrak requirements for checked baggage, and then it easily converts into a trailer that can be pulled by your New World Tourist once you reach your destination. Also Bike Friday sells zippered bags for the bike, one of which also meets checked bag requirements. The weight of the bike is 27 pounds. It is built to carry up to 220-lbs including gear, or the same. The bike is easily loaded with panniers, bags, or the mentioned suitcase turned trailer hitched behind it. It works fine as an about town bike also, but you won't be using many of the gears.

This is an American designed and built bike; the factory is in Eugene, Oregon. See www.bikefriday.com for general information about fold up bikes of this type and other information about this specific model bike. Bike Friday has a lot of YouTube videos on how to pack the bike and an extensive bike store of accessories and parts for this bike.

This bike is in good condition and has been well maintained. The moving components are all standard Shimano/Sram brand that would be available from bike shops along the way of your journey, and all the hardware is standard sized that you would find at hardware stores. I can send a PDF with the complete specs of every component currently on the bike upon request.

Bike Friday semi-custom builds their bikes for the owner. The frame is standard for this model, but they customize the bike with different components, like length of the handlebar stem from the bars, and height of the handlebars above the frame. I'm 5'11" height with close to average leg to torso ratio and arm length. If you are reasonably average for these ratios and between 5' 8" and 6'1" this bike will probably adjust for you as is.
