Requirements:

Application: Students must complete and turn in the attached application with a copy of their personal testimony. **Application must be turned in with deposit to register.**

Participation:

- **75% Sunday School Attendance**
- **D-Now (March 8th-10th)**
- **2 Pre-trip Meetings**

Reading and Writing: Students must read the book *“Do Hard Things: A Teenage Rebellion Against Low Expectations”*, by Alex and Brett Harris. After reading *“Do Hard Things”*, students will be required to write a paper on the book. **A physical copy of the paper will be due no later than Sunday March 24th.**

The paper should be formatted as follows:

- Cover Page containing your name, book title, author, and date of submission
- 12 point, Times New Roman font
- 1 Inch margins
- Double spaced

The paper should be outlined as follows (not including the cover page):

1. Pages 1-2: Summarize “Do Hard Things.”
 - a. What is the book about?
 - b. How does it relate to teen culture today?
2. Page 3: Write a reflection of how “Do Hard Things” challenged you.
 - a. Evaluate yourself. (The following questions are just to get you thinking.)
 - i. Are you doing hard things?
 - ii. Are you leading?
 - iii. Are you following?
 - iv. Are you following the status quo?
 - v. What needs to change in your life?
3. Pages 4-5: Write a response to the book.
 - a. Identify one hard thing that you are going to do as a result of reading this book.
 - b. Which of the “five kinds of hard” does this fit into? Why does it fit into that category?
 - c. Provide details of what this hard thing will look like when you execute it. (The following questions are just to get you thinking.)
 - i. How are you going to do it?
 - ii. Does it involve a team?
 - iii. What resources will you need?
 - iv. How does Jesus factor into this hard thing?
 - v. Who can you seek wisdom from?
 - d. What are some obstacles that you will face? How might you overcome them?
 - e. Conclude by writing a paragraph about why this “hard thing” is worth doing.

Scholarship Requirements:

- Meet all participation requirements
- Complete and submit the reading and writing assignment on time

Students who meet all of these requirements on time will receive a \$100-120 scholarship from FBC Newnan.
