3 crystals – SS7 Amethyst Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1163)
1 crystal – SS7 Citrine Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestone (FT1171)
4 crystals – SS7 Indian Pink Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1192)
3 crystals – SS7 Olivine Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1211)
1 crystal – SS7 Sun Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestone (FT1223)
22 crystals – SS9 Amethyst Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1100)
18 crystals – SS9 Blue Zircon Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1103)
21 crystals – SS9 Citrine Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1108)
22 crystals – SS9 Olivine Swarovski Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1143)

Instructions to complete "Rainbow Brite" ring:

Tip

Gem-Tac permanent adhesive is thick and messy. An easy way to use it is to squeeze a small amount onto a piece of scrap paper, and use the head of a head pin or other small, flat object as an applicator. This method will help control the amount of glue applied to the surface. The pattern on the face of this ring is made by first gluing one SS9 rhinestone at one edge of the ring's face, then gluing arcs of rhinestones on the side of the first one. Most of the arcs of rhinestones are made up of the larger (SS9) rhinestones, and the ends of the arcs are completed with the smaller (SS7) rhinestones.

Step 1

Dot a small amount of Gem-Tac permanent adhesive onto the face of one black wooden ring. Using a Jewel Setter or tweezers, gently place one SS9 Indian Pink crystal rhinestone onto the glue. Allow the glue to dry (see Gluing Flat Back Rhinestones Technique and Tip.)

Step 2

In the same fashion, continue gluing curved lines of indicated rhinestones around this first Indian Pink in the sequence listed below:

4 – SS9 Blue Zircon rhinestones

6 – SS9 Sun rhinestones

8 – SS9 Citrine rhinestones

11 – SS9 Amethyst rhinestones and one SS7 Amethyst rhinestone

12 – SS9 Olivine rhinestones and one SS7 Olivine rhinestone

13 – SS9 Indian Pink rhinestones

14 – SS9 Blue Zircon rhinestones

14 – SS9 Sun rhinestones and one SS7 Sun rhinestone

13 – SS9 Citrine rhinestones and one SS7 Citrine rhinestone

1 – SS7 Amethyst rhinestone, two SS9 Amethyst rhinestones, one SS7 Amethyst rhinestone, nine SS9 Amethyst rhinestones, and one SS7 Amethyst rhinestone

1 – SS7 Olivine rhinestone, 10 SS9 Olivine rhinestones, and one SS7 Olivine rhinestone

2 – SS7 Indian Pink rhinestones, two SS9 Indian Pink rhinestones, one SS12 Indian Pink rhinestone, two SS9 Indian Pink rhinestones, and two SS7 Indian Pink Rhinestones

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
