Bronze "half liang" (these are 2.3 grams) cast by emperor Wen of the Western Han Dynasty in China 179-157 BC Obv: "pan liang" Rev: blank VF nearly as cast light encrustation \$27.

101 BC ? brass of Mithradates VI of Pontus, city of Amisus. Obv: very nice head of Mercury (showing features of Mithradates' son, Ariarathes IX. Ariarathes IX was a general for his father and installed as king of Cappadocia, until deposed by the Romans in 89 BC. He died fighting the Romans in Macedonia in 87 BC.) Rev: cornucopias between caps of the Dioscuri NGC CH VF \$477.

100 BC silver denarius of the Roman Republic Obv: helmeted Minerva Rev: Victory in chariot, moneys: MF Rullus NGC ch VF PQ old collection toning \$277.

78-77 BC silver tetradrachm of Ptolemy XII of Egypt, Alexandria mint. Obv: diademed head of Ptolemy I Rev: eagle. Recovered from the "Ashkelon, Phoenecian" shipwreck of about 76 BC. Nice EF, slty off center \$297.

57-38 BC silver drachm of the Parthian king and general Orodes II, who inflicted the worst defeat ever on a Roman army led by Crassus, of the First Triumvirate. Obv: Orodes II Rev: Parthian archer NGC AU \$377. Raw EF \$197.

49-48 BC silver denarius of Julius Caesar Elephant/implements NGC Abt Unc (off center) \$477. Raw VF better centered \$775.

48-47 BC silver denarius of Julius Caesar Obv: diademed head of Venus Rev: scarecrow like trophy of Gaulish arms and armour. ICG AU 50 old collection iridescent toning \$1977.

44 BC winter silver denarius of Julius Caesar Obv: his laureate bust, comet behind Rev: Venus holding long scepter and victory ICG VF 35 \$4700.

38-2 BC silver drachm of Phraates IV, who delivered the Romans under Marc Anthony, their 2<sup>nd</sup> most humiliating defeat, with the loss of 35,000 Roman troops. Obv: his robed and diademed bust being crowned by flying Nike Rev: enthroned archer Arsaces I NGC AU \$477.

2BC-14 AD silver denarius of Augustus Obv: his laureate bust Rev: grandsons and heirs Gaius and Lucius with arms and armour. NGC XF \$1277.

2BC-14 AD gold aureus of Augustus (Octavian) Obv: his laureate bust Rev: grandsons and heirs, Gaius and Lucius with arms and armour ANACS VF 25 \$5700.

10-38 AD silver drachm of Artabanus III, Parthian king between the Romans and China Obv: his dramatic bust Rev: Arsaces I holding bow NGC MS \$977.

C20 AD bronze as Obv: commem head of Augustus Rev: thunderbolt VF, brown, oxidized surfaces \$127.

Augustus brass sestertius restitution by Nerva in 96-98 AD Obv: laureate bust of Augustus Rev: large SC. Any lifetime sestertius portrait of Augustus is excessively rare, and this makes a comfortable addition to one's 12 Caesar set. NGC Ch VF (EF features in fine style, black, slightly rough patina) \$1477.

Bronze huo chuan (9-22 AD) cast also by the usurper Wang Mang in China. Obv: two word symbols, rev: blank. VF Superb originality with patina and light encrustation \$27.

Bronze 25 huo bu (14-20AD) cast by the usurper and tyrant Wang Mang 9-22 AD in China. Sometimes nicknamed "pants" money EF Superb patina with light dirt \$127.

15-26 AD bronze prutah of Valerius Gratus, as procurator of Judaea, appointed by Tiberius Caesar of Rome. Obv: barley stalk Rev: Tib case monogram in wreath. NGC fine, sand patina \$57.

14-37 AD silver denarius of the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 12. Obv: laureate bust of Tiberius Rev: his mother Livia enthroned. Also famous as the "Tribute Penny" of the Bible. NGC Ch VF pq \$977. NGC VF \$700. Raw VF, slight defects \$497.

14-37 AD gold aureus of Tiberius, the so called "**Tribute penny in gold**" featuring the exact designs of the silver coin most commonly described as a "Tribute penny". He is also the Third of the Twelve Caesars ch Abt Unc, some tiny nicks and scrs \$4977.

27 BC silver half shekel of Tyre, the exact amount due the temple in Jerusalem as annual payment from every male Jew. One of the reasons there were money changers in the temple. Raw EF oxidation spots \$477. Raw 76-75 BC superb Abt Unc \$1977.

19-20 AD silver shekel of Tyre, or "thirty pieces of silver" type paid to Judas for the Betrayal. Lifetime of Christ issue. NGC ch VF toned \$677. Another, c 90 BC big flan Tyre mint raw VF \$877.

(14-37 AD) type sestertius of Tiberius Obv: his bare head Rev: altar at Lugundum This is an aftercast of a Renaissance Cavino. EF \$377.

(37-41 AD) type sestertius of the insane and debauched Caligula This is a Renaissance cast copy. Obv: his laureate bust Rev: his 3 sisters as the Three Graces EF \$377.

(41-54 AD) type sestertius of Claudius with his triumphal arch. This is a Renaissance cast copy. VF, pleasing \$277.

54-68 AD silver tetradrachm from Antioch, in the Roman East Obv: laureate bust of the infamous Nero Rev: eagle on thunderbolt raw VF+ \$297.

68 AD silver denarius of Galba Obv: his bare head Rev: accolades in wreath ANACS VF 30 old toning \$1775.

81-96 AD silver denarius of Domitian, as Caesar Obv: his laureate bust Rev: flaming altar with garland NGC AU \$477.

97 AD brass sestertius of Nerva, 96-98 AD, first of the Adoptive emperors. Obv: his laureate bust in fine style Rev: Libertas standing. NGC CH VF, wonderful smooth **jade green patina**, which is a lot rarer than many Roman collectors realize, due to the huge number of tooled and repatinated with epoxy sesterces coming from Bulgaria. \$3277.

96-98 AD silver cistophorus (3 denarii) of Nerva, Ephesus mint in Asia Minor Obv: his laureate bust Rev: Nerva in temple being crowned by goddess NGC Ch VF \$1977

98-117 AD gold aureus of Trajan, 2<sup>nd</sup> of the Adoptive Emperors. Rome mint, 107 AD Obv: his laureate and draped bust Rev: Ceres standing, holding grain ears and long torch. ANACS EF 45 \$7750.
