500-600 AD gold, (electrum) thin bracteate dinar of southern Kosala, India. Prasannamatra of the Sarabhapuriya Dynasty. Obv: mythical Garuda bird with outstretched wings. Rev: incuse mirror image. Maybe the only gold bracteates coinage ever struck. Abt Unc \$477.

602-610 AD gold 1/3 solidus of Phocas, Constantinople mint. He was strangely popular in Rome, where a column still stands in his honor. Probably because he was never near Rome. NGC Mint State \$497. NGC AU \$407.

578-1078 AD mixed lot of Byzantine gold, unattributed, net Fine or better 10 coins for only \$3970.

612-621 AD gold tremissis of Sisebut, Visigothic king in Spain. Seville mint Typical Dark Ages engraving. Abt Unc, slight planchet distractions. \$777.

550-675 AD Merovingian gold tremissis, probably from the Le Mans region Obv: ruler's head Rev: cross 1.33 grams good gold VF or better \$1770.

613-641 AD gold solidus of Heraclius Constantine, Constantinople mint. He recaptured the True Cross from the Persians and restored it to Jerusalem. NGC Abt Unc \$597.

685-695 AD gold solidus of Justinian II at Constantinople, his first reign, when the first portrait of Christ on a coin appears Obv: long haired and bearded European bust of Christ Rev: Justinian standing, holding long cross NGC CH AU \$11700.

Gold 1/3 solidus of same designs ANACS VF 30 \$1977.

737-758 AD silver sceat of king Eadberht of Northumbria, pre Viking conquest of York. Obv: Archbishop Ecgberht standing, holding long cross Rev: Eadberht's name around cross. NGC MS 64 amazing condition, possibly finest known. \$3977.

803-811 AD gold solidus of Nicephorus I with son and co-ruler Stauracius, Constantinople mint. They both died from wounds after being ambushed by the Bulgarians. NGC Ch Abt Unc, \$2700.

c 900 AD Middle Age bronze cross from the Balkans, decorated with the **Slavic Christ Crucified**. With loop ready for wearing. \$247.

1000-1010 AD silver penny of Sihtric Silkbeard, Viking king in Dublin, Ireland. Obv: his bust in style of Aethelred II of England, his name around Rev: Long cross rev, Dublin mint name PCGS MS 62 \$6700. Rare, attractive, popular and important in both Viking and Irish history.

1016-1035 AD silver penny of Cnut, the Danish warlord who became king of England Obv: his draped and helmeted bust, scepter before, Lincoln mint PCGS MS 65 \$1477.

1042-1055 AD gold nomisma of Constantine 9th Obv: large nimbate bust of Christ Rev: crowned and robed bust of emperor ANACS AU 55 rich gold color, cup shaped coin \$977.

1279-1307 silver penny of Edward I of England, scarce York mint Obv: his facing bust Rev: long cross VF \$277.

1478-1485 silver half lira, or Marcello from Venice, Italy Obv: Christ enthroned Rev: doge Giovanni Mocenigo kneeling before St. Mark VF, slight irregular \$377.

1553M silver teston of Henry II of France Obv: his bust Rev: coat of arms NGC VF 20 even orig tone \$775.

Brass 10 cash, (45mm) or 1 candareen cast by Prince Gui, 1642-1662 AD, of the **southern Ming rebels**. After Peking fell to the invading Manchus, or Qing in 1644, the Ming royalty fled south to Canton and Yunnan. A haven in Burma was denied, and the Burmese turned Gui over to be executed by the Qing troops. EF, sometimes light earthen deposits \$97.

1645 silver 2 mark from Denmark King Christian IV. Obv: his crowned monogram Rev: tetragrammaton, Justus Judex VF, neat hole for suspension \$477.

Brass **10 cash**, Hsing Chao, c. 1645 of the Southern Ming rebels EF \$97.

Brass **5 cash** (36mm) of Prince Gui EF, as cast by mint, superb originality \$97.

1672 silver **50 stuiver klippe** struck during the siege of Groningen, which resulted in the defeat of the Bishop of Munster. Obv: coat of arms Rev: blank. NGC AU 58 PQ \$1977.

1673 Silver 6 kreuzer of Leopold the Hogmouth, Holy Roman Emperor, city of Breslau NGC MS 63 \$277. Struck from roller dies.

1700 gold ducat (in monogram) gold ducat of Nurnberg Obv: lamb of God on earth Rev: city coat of arms NGC AU 58 \$1977.

1716 tin medal, with copper plug, struck by Muller and son, to commemorate the successful defense of Corfu by Matt Johann, count of Schulenburg, against the Ottoman Turks. Obv: really big hair Rev: neat aerial view of Corfu harbor and fortress VF \$277.

1718 copper emergency 1 daler from Sweden Obv: sun god Phoebus standing in radiating oval Rev: nominal value ANACS EF 45 \$177.

1757 brass medal of Fridreich the Great of Prussia, celebrating his victory at Rosbach Obv: On horseback directing battle Rev: Battle scene with enemy fleeing EF \$277.

1760 gold ducat Frederich V of Denmark NGC MS 61 \$1377.

1782-1799 AD tiny gold fanam of Tipu Sultan, "the lion of Mysore" in northwest India and Pakistan. This Muslim ruler committed many atrocities against Christians during 4 wars which gave the British problems. Aided by French engineers, Tipu was an early user of solid fuel rockets in battle. Abt Unc or better \$47.

1600-1750 silver 4 real cob, 1/2 dollar weight, nicely mounted in 14kt bezel with bale ready to wear \$377. Another, unmounted fine, crude, corrosion \$87.

1641 shipwreck of the Concepcion off Hispaniola, in which the Spaniards lost over 100 tons of silver and gold. Silver cob 8 reales, usual crude Mexico c 1640 Fine \$97. VG \$77. Silver 4 reales, c 1640 Fine \$137. Good \$87. Silver 2 reales c 1640 VG \$177.

1645-46 silver crown of Charles I of England, Obv: Charles on horseback Rev: coat of arms PCGS XF 40 very pleasing even surfaces and toning, Far superior eye appeal than most. \$5700.

1694/1692 silver half ecu of Louis 14th the Sun King VF++ \$247.

1722-X silver ecu of the young Louis 15th. Incredibly hard strike with only the most important part of the undertype showing, choice even old orig toning, way PQ NGC MS 62 \$4775.

1722/1 H copper sou or 9 deniers of the **French Colonies** VF, moderate corrosion \$227.

1748 brass weight for a Portuguese moidore or 4000 reis gold coin of the 1720-30s. The moidore traded for about \$6. US in the 1790s. Name in wreath, cross of Jerusalem. EF+, Itly clnd \$137.

1769 gold ducat of Holland, nicely mounted in unmarked gold bezel, ready to wear. Obv: knight with sword and arrows Rev: plaque \$537.

1770 silver **Pillar dollar** of the Spanish Empire; from the rare Guatemala mint NGC VF 35 \$1177. Another raw EF slight oxidation issues \$677.

1781 North American Token net Fine \$137.

1787 New Jersey copper 43Y brown net Fine \$177.

1792-K bronze 12 deniers 29mm of Louis 16th of France, who lost his head very nice Fine + \$77.

1793 silver 2 bits NG mint NGC VG 8 \$67.

1795 Washington head Grade Halfpenny, lg buttons, Reeded Edge PCGS Abt Unc 50 \$477.

1795c copper farthing Condor token by Spence, Middlesex Obv: Adam and Eve Rev: Boar on sword, crown and mitre NGC MS 63 BN \$477.

C1807 bronze George Washington medal by **Sansom**, one of the prettiest medals of this era NGC MS 62 BN \$1477.
