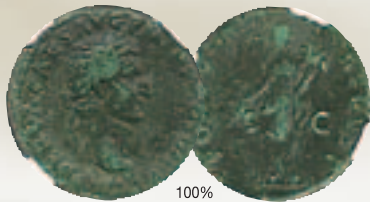

307-337 AD bronze nummus of **Constantine I the Great**, the Roman emperor who made Christianity the state religion. He apparently did not accept Christianity himself until his deathbed. Obv: laureate and armoured bust of Constantine I Rev: nude Sol, the sun god, wearing radiate crown and cloak, holding globe. All NGC: Ch AU \$87. AU \$67, Ch EF \$57.

235-238 AD silver denarius of Maximinus I, the Thracian giant who moved up the Roman military to become emperor Obv: his laureate and draped bust Rev: Max with legionary standards and scepter NGC Ch AU * \$577.

240-270 AD silver drachm of the **Persian Sasanid king Shapur I** who delivered Rome one of its worst humiliations. Shapur betrayed protocol and captured the Roman emperor Valerian I at a peace conference. Shapur then used the Roman ruler as a footstool at his court. After Valerian died in captivity he was preserved (stuffed) and his remains put on display in a Persian temple. EF drachm of Shapur, 24 kt modern custom bezel ready to wear. \$977. 780-800 AD silver half drachm from Tabaristan, south of the Caspian Sea, on the main trunk of the Great Silk Road. Caravans along this route moved luxury goods like silk and spices, furs, and gold from Constantinople to China. The fire worshippers held out in Tabaristan against the Muslim invaders until 761 AD. The Muslims continued the Sassanian-Ispahbad style good silver, but would frequently leave off the Caliph's name, and one rare type has the infidel face blanked out by a geometric diamond shape, so as to follow the Koran. These flat, thin, and good silver coins were very popular, probably because they were difficult to counterfeit. Anonymous early Caliph invaders Ch Abt Unc \$177. EF \$97.

Brass 10 cash, (45mm) or 1 candreen cast by Prince Gui, 1642-1662 AD, of the **southern Ming rebels**. After Peking fell to the invading Manchu, or Qing in 1644, the Ming royalty fled south to Canton and Yunnan. A haven in Burma was denied, and the Burmese turned Gui over to be executed by the Qing troops. EF, sometimes light earthen deposits \$97.
