400-300 BC silver drachm from the northern Greek city of **Larissa** Obv: facing head of the nymph Larissa Rev: grazing horse, XF nice style.. \$677.

387-304 BC silver drachm of Rhodes, Greek city on island of same name Obv: facing head of Helios, the sun god. It was his huge statue, one of the **Seven Wonders**, which straddled the entrance to this port. Rev: rose in bloom. Bold net VF..... \$587.

297-281 BC silver tetradrachm of Lysimachus, treasurer and successor of Alexander the Great in Thrace and neighboring regions. Obv: actual portrait of **Alexander**, wearing horn of Ammon Rev: Athena enthroned, holding Nike net VF+ Fine style..... \$1477.

125-121 BC silver tetradrachm of mother and son drinking team of **Cleopatra Thea** and her son Antiochus 8th. Cleopatra decided her son was getting on her nerves, so she prepared a poison wine goblet for him at the royal banquet. The astute Antiochus graciously declined her offering, with "no thanks Mom, I'm not thirsty. You drink it". He managed to rule by himself for another 25 years. Obv: their diademed jugate busts Rev: Zeus enthroned, holding Nike Antioch mint EF. \$1877.

46 BC silver denarius of the Roman Republic, by the moneyer T. Carisus Obv: The **Sibyl** Herophile, her hair in a Greek style sling Rev: **Sphinx** crouching. EF, slight surface oxidation One of the most beautiful and interesting coins of the Republic..... \$1775.

19-18 BC silver 3 denarii, or cistophorus, of the Roman emperor Augustus, from the mint of Pergamum in Asia Minor Obv: his bare head Rev: **triumphal arch** surmounted with statue of Augustus in chariot, to commemorate the recovery of the lost legion standards from the Parthians. Choice smooth Fine++..... \$977.

43-44 AD billon (low grade silver) tetrachm of Claudius, the Roman emperor for his personal lands of Egypt, Alexandria mint Obv: laureate bust of Claudius Rev: his empress **Messalina**, holding two small children in her hand, presumably the heir Britannicus and his sister Octavia. Net bold VF..... \$477.

54-68 AD billon tetrachm of Nero, Alexandria mint, Obv: his radiate bust Rev: bust of Africa wearing elephant's skin headdress VF, dark toning..... \$177.

98-117 AD silver denarius of Trajan Obv: his bust Rev: his **column** celebrating his Dacian war victories, which still stands in the forum today in Rome Fine+..... \$277.

100 AD bronze as of Trajan Obv: his laureate bust Rev: Victory alighting, holding inscribed shield Fine ++..... \$77.

164-166 AD brass dupondius of **Lucilla**, wife of Lucius Verus and brother of the insane Commodus Obv: her draped bust Rev: Pietas sacrificing at altar net low VF, choice smooth green patina..... \$147.

367-383 AD silver siliqua of the Roman emperor **Gratian** Obv: his diademed and robed bust Rev: Roma enthroned, holding Victory and scepter Trier mint EF..... \$377.

810-841 AD billon (low grade silver) sceat of Eanred of **Northumbria**, the north of England, just as Viking raids were beginning to terrorize the coast. Moneyer: Wulfheard, S-860 NGC XF 45 dark gray toning..... \$477.

1059-1067 AD gold cup shaped nomisma of Constantine X of **Constantinople** decent VF \$397. Another EF+..... \$697.

1149-1163 AD billon denier of Bohemund III, princely heir to the Crusader throne of **Antioch**, during his minority and the regency of Constance and Renaud de Chatillon. Obv: bare head Rev: cross Fine+ very crude..... \$117.

1163-1201 AD billon denier of Bohemund III, **Crusader** prince of Antioch Obv: helmeted, armoured bust of Bohemund Rev: cross EF, slight rev oxidation \$287. Another similar type VF, dark toning..... \$187.

1251-1275 AD good silver gros of Tripoli by Bohemund VI, Crusader prince of Antioch, and **Count of Tripoli** (Trablos, Lebanon now) Obv: cross Rev: Star Abt Unc..... \$775.

1570-1577 gold ducat from Venice, of the doge Alvise Mocenigo I Obv: the doge kneeling before St Mark Rev: Christ in the Heavens. The **War of Cyprus** was fought 1570-1573, resulting in the loss of Cyprus to the Ottoman Turks, a serious blow to Christendom NGC AU 50..... \$775.

1689 July "gun alloy" sixpence of James II, fleeing king of England, fighting in Ireland, where his Catholic supporters held out. Nicknamed "**Gun Money**" since the silver was gone, and this issue was struck from melted down cannon (probably damaged ones). Usually these are wretched condition due to alloy and preservation problems. This is a spectacular NGC MS 62..... \$1977.

1696 Silver medal of Amsterdam (rebellion quelled?) by Jan Boskam. Obv: nude crowned **Neptune** with trident driving his two horse chariot across the stormy waves Rev: bird's nest floating on peaceful sea at sunset EF, Italy clnd..... \$387.

1769 gold ducat of Dutch province of **Holland** Obv: armored knight holding sword and arrows Rev: Latin inscribed tablet VF loop soldered on rim, ready to wear..... \$437.

1787 **Vermont** copper, Britannia reverse (always very, very weak) Ryder13, raw EF choice brown surfaces..... \$1277.

1812-P USA \$5 gold, Liberty Cap Bust NGC AU, damaged (minor)..... \$5700.

1865-P USA \$3 gold, EF, repaired, whizzed, rare..... \$877.

1916-J German military coinage for occupied Russian lands Iron **3 kopeks** NGC unc (oxidation spots)..... \$197.

1923 Wesphalia Germany **hyperinflation** 10000 marks aluminum bronze Obv: bare headed Stein Rev: prancing horse ch au58 \$177. Same designs, but about 24 mm aluminum: 1921 50 pfennig net VF \$37. 1921 mark net EF \$47. 1923 2million mark net EF..... \$47.

1939-1945 **World War II** medals on bar for Canadian volunteer for armed forces of the British Empire. Nice condition..... \$377.
