NN3-ADBC-08-001 (NWME)

Records of the American Defenders of Bataan and Corregidor (ADBC)
(Donated Materials Group ADBC)

Data File and Format: NARA received the donation of the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese, 2007 Update, on October 17, 2007. The donors submitted the file in a tab-delimited format. NARA staff preserved the records as a tab-delimited, variable-length ASCII file. The first record in the file contains the column heading, or layout, for that file.

Verification: The World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File was processed using the Archival Electronic Records Inspection and Control (AERIC) utility. The AERIC reports revealed some minor discrepancies between the data and the documentation provided by the donors.

On the AERIC reports, some of the abbreviations (codes) for some of the fields are listed twice with one entry having a carriage return, and in some of the records, the "Parent Unit" and "Assigned Unit" fields contain only a carriage return, not a null value or data. Staff viewed the data file in VEDIT and determined these carriage returns listed on the AERIC reports are instances where the records do not contain data or null values in all eleven fields according to the layout and instead have a carriage return in the last field with data in the record. In other words, these records are variable-length with tab-delimited fields and a carriage return and line feed at the end of each record.

Many of the records have one or more blank fields:

- 11 records have no data in the "Rank" field
- 58 records have no data in the "Service Number" field
- 279 records have no data in the "Arm" field
- 8103 records have no data in the "Source 1" field*
- 26209 records have no data in the "Source 2" field*
- 29725 records have no data in the "Source 3" field*
- 13820 records have no data in the "Subordinate Unit" field
- 8149 records have no data in the "Assigned Unit" field
- 15501 records have no data in the "Parent Unit" field
- 24710 records have no data in the "POW Camp Notes" field

*Although the documentation from the first donation (NN3-ADBC-06-001) indicates that all the records in the file show the source of the data, nothing in the documentation explains what a blank in the "Source" field may mean.

AERIC detected two exact duplicate records and four other instances where the name and serial number are the same, although the data in the other fields differed.

There are a few discrepancies in the "Assigned Unit" field in some of the records:

- There is one record with the value "Inshore patrol," however the value on the code list (and in 12 records) is "Inshore Patrol" with a capital P.
- There is one record with the value "V Inctp Cmd," however the value on the code lists (and in 187 records) is "V Intcp Cmd."
- There is one record with the value "USS Finch" and trailing spaces.
- Some of the records contain the values "See Notes," "Unknown," or "unknown," which are not listed on the code lists provided by the donors but are self-explanatory.

Documentation:

Since this file is an update of the 2006 donated World War II Prisoners of the Japanese Data File (NN3-ADBC-06-001), users may wish to refer to the documentation for the 2006 donation for information on the compilation of the records. In particular, the documentation for the 2006 donation mentions that much of the data in the "Name," "Rank," "Service Number," and "Arm" fields was obtained from the NARA series Records of World War II Prisoners of War so users may also wish to refer to the documentation for the Records of World War II Prisoners of War for additional information.

Narrative to accompany the revised ADBC Database of World War II POWs of the Japanese:

This revision to the ADBC Database of World War II Prisoners of War is being submitted to provide information gained from rosters of the 803rd Engineer Battalion (Aviation) and numerous individual records that became available to us after the April 4, 2006 submission of the original database. A few individual records have been added to the database when the information became available and that information was verified by the American Battle Monuments Commission database. In most cases, those individuals died soon after becoming POWs and the information did not get into the War Department files maintained on IBM punched cards.

During the preparation of this revision, it became apparent that displaying the Source Codes would be simplified by dividing the Source Field into three fields. In the revised database, whenever more than one source of information was used for a record, up to three source codes are provided. The sources are displayed alphabetically with the first code in the Source1 field, the next code in the Source2 field and (if there is a third code) the next code in the Source3 field.

The original database submission contained some instances of more than one code in the Arm and Rank fields that had the same meaning. These duplications have been resolved and the database can now be more effectively used to search for all POWs with the same entries in a field or combination of fields. There were also some typographical errors in various fields. We have worked diligently to eliminate such errors.

Since entries in the Code Lists must be brief and most punctuation characters are not permitted, references to publications are not complete. The following additional information on publications cited in the Sources Code List is offered to persons that desire a more complete description of the source.

Supplemental User Note 3: “Source” Field Clarifications

World War II Prisoners of the Japanese Data File

When processing the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese Data File so it could be made available online via the Access to Archival Databases (AAD) resource, staff noted a couple of issues with regards to the “Source” field and contacted John B. Lewis and Jim Erickson, two of the donors, for clarification.

In particular, staff noted that the code “3BN” appears in the “Source” field for about a dozen of the records, however a meaning for that code is not included in the donor-prepared Source of Information code list. Mr. Lewis replied that the code “3BN” refers to the source “Diary of 3rd Bn, 45th Inf Regt (PS) provided by Bill Cahill.” He further explained:

Right at the end of the project, I received a diary of the 3rd Battalion, 45th Infantry Regiment (Philippine Scouts). That document gave duty positions for many officers of the 3rd Bn, 45th Inf. Regt (PS) just before the surrender on Bataan [*sic*] on April 9, 1942. We already had information that those people were assigned to the 45th Inf. Regt. (PS); however, this document gave additional information concerning their assignment within the 45th. So I added the additional information and the new source code for that information . . .

Similarly, staff noted that the code “RM6” appears in the “Source” field for two records, but a meaning for that code was not provided. Mr. Erickson explained that “RM6” was a temporary code that was later removed from the database. Evidently, the two records in the donated database with “RM6” were mistakenly overlooked when the donors expunged the code from the other records. Therefore, for the records for George H. Erickson, service number 19010562, and Adolph Schuster, service number 2279109, the only valid code in the “Source” field is “BL” for the “Bilibid Liberation roster – National Archives,” since the code “RM6” is an invalid temporary code and should be ignored.

Also, staff had previously noted that 8,240 records (about 25%) have no data in the “Source” field, although the donor-prepared documentation indicates that all the records in the file show the source of the data. When asked about this discrepancy, Mr. Lewis explained:

We started with the NARA database of World War II POWs and first extracted all POWs of the Japanese. Next we deleted Civilians and Merchant Marine, since they were not members of the armed forces and had no military units. During the course of our research, we discovered a number of duplicate entries in the NARA database, so we eliminated those. Also, we inserted the following two names of well-known

POWs that changed their name after World War II and gave cross-references to their original names.

Alexander, Joe ---- see ----- Trejo, Joe L.

Tenny, Lester I ---- see ----- Tenenberg, Lester I.

That left us with a database containing 29,831 persons that seem to have been Military POWs of the Japanese. For identification of individuals, we retained NARA information as contained in the first four columns of our ADBC Database (Name, Rank, Service Number and Arm). We made minor corrections of names when we had valid information from family or other reliable source. To that we added five columns for additional data about the individual's military unit (Source, Subordinate Unit, Assigned Unit, Patent Unit, and POW Camps/Notes). Initially we were going to show only information about a person's military unit; however, we later decided to add available information about POW Camps and explanatory notes when we thought the data would be useful to descendants and others searching for information about a POW. When we decided to use information from other reliable sources in addition to the ADBC Registration Cards, we inserted the "Source" column to show where we obtained the information. We have made a strong effort to include only reliable source information.

Our work resulted in finding some information on 21,587 persons (72.36% of the 29,831 persons on the database). Of course, the remaining 8,244 persons have no entries for military units; hence, no source code has [*sic*] entered for those persons. This is why you found "about 25%" of the records have no source code.

Staff have subsequently located meanings for some of the previously undefined abbreviations (codes) used in the “Grade, Alpha” and “Arm and Service” fields. These meanings were found in the *Glossary of U.S. Naval Abbreviations*, prepared by the Office of Naval History, March 1947, or derived the meanings from the code lists from the NARA series Records of World War II Prisoners of War and the NARA series Records of Duty Locations for Naval Intelligence Personnel. Tables with the previously undefined abbreviations, the meanings, and the citation for the meanings follows.

Data File and Format: NARA received the donation of the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese Data File on April 4, 2006. The donors created the file in Microsoft Excel format, but donated the file to NARA in a CSV (comma separated values) format. NARA staff preserved the records as a comma-delimited, variable length ASCII file. The first record in the file contains the column heading, or layout, for that file.

The following description of the CSV format is from the Microsoft homepage section for Excel:

CSV (Comma delimited) format

The CSV (Comma delimited) file format saves only the text and values as they are displayed in cells of the active worksheet. All rows and all characters in each cell are saved. Columns of data are separated by commas, and each row of data ends in a carriage return. If a cell contains a comma, the cell contents are enclosed in double quotation marks. If cells display formulas instead of formula values, the formulas are converted as text. All formatting, graphics, objects, and other worksheet contents are lost.

Note: If your workbook contains special font characters such as a copyright symbol (©), and you will be using the converted text file on a computer with a different operating system, save the workbook in the text file format appropriate for that system. For example, if you are using Windows and want to use the text file on a Macintosh computer, save the file in the CSV (Macintosh) format. If you are using a Macintosh computer and want to use the text file on a system running Windows or Windows NT, save the file in the CSV (Windows) format.

Verification: The World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File was processed using the Archival Electronic Records Inspection and Control (AERIC) utility. The AERIC reports revealed some discrepancies between the data and the documentation provided by the donors.

As outlined in the documentation, the donors obtained data from the NARA provided "World War II Prisoners of War database" (also known as Records of World War II Prisoners of War, Record Group 389) and in some cases expanded upon this data. Therefore, NARA staff also used documentation from the Records of World War II Prisoners of War to verify the data in the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File. While most of the abbreviations (codes) in the "Rank" and "Arm" fields in the file were taken from the Records of World War II Prisoners of War "Grade, Alpha" and "Arm or Service" fields respectively, some of the codes do not appear in the Records of World War II Prisoners of War. In addition, the NARA compiled code lists for the Records of World

War II Prisoners of War do not include codes with a meaning of “undefined code” so some codes in the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File may not appear in the Records of World War II Prisoners of War code lists and thus may have a meaning of “undefined code.” As the case with some of the codes in the Records of World War II Prisoners of War, some of the codes in the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File may contain obvious typographical errors, e.g. AMMIC should be AMMIC, and others codes may consist of miscellaneous characters, e.g. &R-. Please note that since the donors sometimes expanded upon the information obtained from the Records of World War II Prisoners of War, the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File may have data for an individual that differs from that found in the Records of World War II Prisoners of War.

In some of the records, the “Rank,” “Arm,” and “Source” fields have trailing spaces after the abbreviations (codes). While most of the codes are in all capitals, some of the codes may contain lower case letter(s). The “Source” field may contain two or more abbreviations (codes), separated by a semicolon.

Many of the records have one or more blank fields:

- 6 records have no data in the “Rank” field
- 52 records have no data in the “Service Number” field
- 235 records have no data in the “Arm” field
- 8240 records have no data in the “Source” field (Although the documentation indicates that all the records in the file show the source of the data, nothing in the documentation explains what a blank in the “Source” field may mean.)
- 14628 records have no data in the “Subordinate Unit” field
- 8250 records have no data in the “Assigned Unit” field
- 15416 records have no data in the “Parent Unit” field
- 24670 records have no data in the “POW Camp Notes” field

AERIC detected one exact duplicate record and eight other instances where the name and serial number are the same, although the data in the other fields differed.

Documentation: Since much of the data in the “Name,” “Rank,” “Service Number,” and “Arm” fields was obtained from the NARA series Records of World War II Prisoners of War, users may wish to refer to the documentation for the Records of World War II Prisoners of War for additional information. In this regard, the code lists for the “Alpha, Grade” and “Arm or Service” fields for the Records of World War II Prisoners of War have been included with the NARA prepared documentation for the World War II Prisoners of the Japanese File as code lists for the “Rank” and “Arm” fields, respectively.

Mr. Gladwin;

The files on this CD are presented to NARA with the hope that this will result in a new database being added to the Access to the Archival Database (AAD) web site. The intent of this database is to supplement the data that is now available on the "World War II Prisoners of War Data File, 12/7/1941 – 11/19/1946" by making available information to show the POW's military organization prior to the time that person was captured. Please note that this is for POWs of the Japanese only.

This project began with the recording of information contained on ADBC registration cards. During that initial phase of the project, we decided to expand the project to include information from unit rosters and other sources we consider as reliable. The database we have created provides military unit and other information for over 21,500 (over 72%) of the U.S. POWs of the Japanese during World War II.

Each record in Master.csv contains nine fields. The first four fields are used to identify the individual and are taken from the World War II Prisoners of War database that was provided by NARA. Those fields are Name, Rank, Service Number and Arm. With minor exceptions the data in these fields are exactly as we obtained it from NARA. We did expand some names to include the middle name, when it was known, and when it served to differentiate two or more persons with the same name otherwise. Next, we inserted a "Source" field to indicate the source of our information about the individual. Entries in the Source column are explained in the file, "Sources.csv". Military Unit information is provided in three fields: "Subordinate Unit", "Assigned Unit and "Parent Unit". As an example of how these three columns are used, a person that was in D Company, 45th Infantry Regiment (Philippine Scouts), Philippine Division would have "D Co" in the Subordinate Unit column, "45th Inf Regt (PS)" in the Assigned Unit column and "Phil Div" in the Parent Unit column. All abbreviations used are explained in the "Abbreviations.csv" file. The last field of each record is "POW Camps/Notes". This column provides information from ADBC registration cards and other sources that we feel will be valuable to descendants and others researching information about a POW of the Japanese. For example, we have included notes concerning all POWs that were involved in the Palawan Massacre and about all those that were liberated at Cabanatuan during the "Great Raid".

Note that several former POWs changed their names after World War II. In each case that has come to our attention, we have inserted a record for the new name that will direct a researcher to the record as listed by the War Department.

Please give credit to the 20 volunteers that posted data from the ADBC registration cards. Also, please give credit to Roger Mansell who has allowed us to use data from his extensive web site, "Center for Research, Allied POWs under the Japanese". Credit should be given to Jim Erickson and John B. Lewis who worked many hours over the past six months locating and posting data from the all of the sources other than the ADBC registration cards. Jim Erickson is

ADBC Cards Project
Background Information
Submitted by: John B. Lewis

This project was conceived during the April 2005 ADBC (American Defenders of Bataan and Corregidor) National Convention in Cincinnati. ADBC member Joe Vater told me (POW descendant John B. Lewis) that he thought it was time to destroy the ADBC registration cards that had accumulated over the years and were then in his care. Since I knew that many NARA AAD records on World War II POWs of the Japanese are missing military unit information, I asked Joe if those cards contained such information. Joe said that many cards did have such data. Then I asked him to please hold the cards until I could check with NARA to find out if NARA might want the data from the cards to supplement the information contained in their World War II POWs database that is posted on the AAD web site.

I sent a message to NARA Archivist Lee Gladwin on April 12, 2005 and he responded saying, in effect, that NARA would like to have the data if I would do the work of recording the data. The Descendants Group of the ADBC assembled a team of 20 POW descendants that volunteered to do the work, Joe Vater sent the ADBC registration cards to me, and then the project began.

Our screening of the ADBC cards provided military unit information for almost 5,000 POWs. During our work of recording data from the ADBC registration cards, Jim Erickson and I made a decision to expand the project to include data from sources we consider to be reliable such as unit rosters. Jim Erickson and I added the remaining data from the other sources. All records in the resulting database are marked to show the sources of the data.

The Master.csv file we are providing has 29,830 records. Seventeen of those are for people that the NARA World War II POWs file shows as POWs; however, we have learned that they never were POWs. We left those names in the file and provided explanations in the POW Camps/Notes column as an assist to researchers. Some of the seventeen were killed in combat, some evaded capture and remained in hiding in China, and others were guerrillas in the Philippines that were never captured (such as the well-known Col. Wendell Fertig on Mindanao). That leaves a total of 29,813 POWs in the file. We have excluded most civilians since the intent of this project was to identify the military unit for POWs prior to the surrender. However, we left a few civilians due to their special relationship to the military such as Aaron Kliatchko who served as Jewish Chaplain in Cabanatuan. Master.csv contains military unit information for 21,589 POWs which is more than 72.4% of the POWs in the file.

Also, I specified the abbreviations that would be used as we recorded data. We had to have this information at the beginning of the project so that we would have a standard way of recording military units. During the expansion of the project when Jim Erickson and I were the only persons working, I recorded information from many unit rosters and internet sites.
