SUBJECT: Revised Estimated Federal Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 State Allocations under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins IV) and Request for Submission of Revisions to Budget and State Plan (OMB Approval Number 1830-0029)

I am providing you with *revised* estimated State allocations for FY 2012 under Title I (Career and Technical Education Assistance to the States) of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins IV or the Act). See attached table (Table 1). We regret any inconvenience these revisions may cause. These revisions correct errors in the estimated State allocations provided on April 9, 2012.¹ If your State's estimated allocation changed, your eligible agency must revise its budget for Perkins IV for program year six (July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2013) to reflect its *revised* estimated Perkins IV, Title I allocation in the attached table, and submit the revised budget to this office as discussed below.²

Revised Budget and State Plan Submission Requirements

If your State's FY 2012 estimated allocation changed, your eligible agency **must** revise its budget for Perkins IV to reflect the revised estimated allocation in Table I for program year six, beginning on July 1, 2012. These eligible agencies must submit:

- A revised budget for program year six; and
- A cover letter that transmits the revised budget that is signed by someone who is authorized to act on behalf of the eligible agency.

Your State also must ensure that it meets the within-State allocation requirements in section 112 of Perkins IV if your State must revise its budget to reflect a change in its estimated allocation. Section 112(a)(1) requires an eligible agency to make available “not less than 85 percent” of its allocation under section 111 of Perkins IV (Title I) for distribution to eligible recipients under sections 131 and 132 of Perkins IV. Section 112(a)(2) of Perkins IV authorizes the eligible agency to make available for State leadership activities “not more than 10 percent” of the State’s allocation. Section 112(a)(3) of Perkins IV authorizes an eligible agency to make available for the administration of the State plan “an amount equal to not more than five percent, or \$250,000, whichever is greater” of the State’s allocation.

Submission Deadline, Signature, and Address

If your State’s estimated allocation changed, as reflected in Table 1, your eligible agency must submit its revised budget and a cover letter to this office as soon as possible but no later than close of business on Monday, June 4, 2012. Since all States submitted their 2012 State plans to the Perkins State Plan Web Site, States should submit their revisions through this site at: <http://www.perkinsinfo.com/stateplans2012>.

Your State must send a hard copy of the signed cover letter. Please note you are responsible for sending a hard copy with an original signature within five working days of the State’s submission. Please send the information in hard copy to:
