

The Law of Multiplication



The Blessing is on the Believer

- Gen 1:28

- 28 And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over...
- To bless in the OT means "to endue with power for success, prosperity, fecundity (the capacity to multiply), longevity, etc."
- To endue means to invest or endow with a capacity, a gift, a quality
- To invest means to put on
- God expects a return on His investment

The Blessing of Abraham is on the Believer

- Gen 12:2-3

- 2 And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:
- 3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

- Gen 22: 17

- ... in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply....

The Blessing of Abraham is on the Believer

• Gal 3:6-9

- 6 Even as Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness.
- 7 Know ye therefore that they which are of faith, the same are the children of Abraham.
- 8 And the scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the heathen through faith, preached before the gospel unto Abraham, saying, In thee shall all nations be blessed.
- 9 So then they which be of faith are blessed with faithful Abraham.

The Power of the Blessing is released by faith

- Biblical Faith is defined as persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself.
- Biblical faith is personal. You must personally rely upon, trust in and wholly lean upon The Invisible Living God of the Bible. Mk 11: 22
- Biblical faith is powerful. It is the victory that overcomes the world! 1 Jn 5: 4
- Biblical faith is procedural. ...steps of that faith.... Romans 4: 12

How faith works

- Biblical faith rests upon and springs from the promises of God. The promises of God are given to mankind purely out of the grace of God toward mankind. Romans 4: 16; Eph 2: 8, 9
- What you believe about God greatly impacts how you will respond to His promises. Hebrews 11: 6; 1 Peter 2: 3; 3: 20; 2 Peter 3: 9, 15; Romans 4: 21
- Those in the Hall of Faith in Hebrews 11 did 4 things according to verse 13; they saw the promises, they were fully persuaded of them, they embraced them and they confessed them.

How faith works

- They saw the promises. One can not see promises with the natural eyes. How tall are promises? What color are they? No, they saw the promises with spiritual eyes; they visualized what a fulfilled promise would be like in the natural.
- They were persuaded of the promises that He Who had promised was also able to perform
- They embraced the promises of God. The word embrace means to enfold in the arms, to welcome. Have you hugged the promises of God? Have you welcomed the promises of God?
- They confessed the promises of God. Say what God says.

The Law of Multiplication

- Several covenants emphasize the concept of multiplication.
- Multiply in Hebrew is 'rabah'. It means to increase, to bring in abundantly, be in authority, bring up, enlarge, excel, grow up, heap!
- A prominent feature of your life as a covenant believer is multiplication.
- We should live with the expectation of multiplying whatever we set our hands to do.
- Our mindset should be to facilitate multiplication in every endeavor we engage in.
