

The latter, kept wide when improving his position, strongly engaged the winner through the stretch. SCOTLAND, far back early, made a good gain when on the outside through the stretch. QUANTRELL was never a serious threat. SPUTNIK, forced to be steadied when lacking racing room after a quarter, was never dangerous. BERNMATTAR was wide throughout and outrun. BENBECULA broke in the air slightly, rushed up to gain command before a quarter but tired badly through the stretch.

TOBY B., well placed from the start, took command from MARK'S RICKEY after leaving the backstretch, settled for the drive with a good lead, but was hard ridden to withstand CAREER BOY and won with little left. The latter saved ground while being outrun to the upper turn, moved up fast on the inside approaching the stretch, finished willingly under urging, but could not overtake TOBY B., although much the best of the others. REAPING RIGHT, forwardly placed from the outset, made a good bid when sent up on the outside in the early stretch, then faltered during the last sixteenth of a mile. COUNTERMAND, in hand to the last three-eighths mile, was unable to better his position when set down in the drive. MARK'S RICKEY raced prominently for five furlongs, then gave way. MR BOB W. began poorly and lost all chance. NASOMIE had early speed, but failed to stay and was not persevered with after being hopelessly beaten.

JEAN'S JOE dropped back after the break, saved ground while outrun to the last three-eighths mile, responded readily when set down through the stretch but could not overtake RACING FOOL, although giving a splendid effort. MUNCHAUSEN raced with SPEED ROUSER to the stretch, reached the lead at the final turn but faltered during the drive. MAKE READY, in hand until settled in the backstretch, bumped with NABESNA leaving the upper turn, then finished strongly when clear. NABESNA, outrun early, bumped with MAKE READY after five-eighths of a mile, made up ground when clear but was unable to seriously threaten the leaders. HUTCHESON had early foot but failed to stay. SPEED ROUSER raced with MUNCHAUSEN until inside the stretch and was tiring when crowded near the three-sixteenths mile pole. SHANNON COMET could not keep up. ALIBILT showed nothing and was not persevered with after hopelessly beaten.


