DUST COMMANDER, prepping for the Kentucky Derby, galloped out an additional furlong to get the 1 1-4 miles in 2:03 $\frac{1}{4}$. CORN OFF THE COB, had speed to be taken in hand after a quarter mile, continued slightly wide while prompting the issue, moved to the fore when ready on the final turn to draw clear in the upper stretch and gave way grudgingly in a stiff drive. NASKRA, unhurried for a half mile, rallied along the outside on the stretch turn to loom boldly a furlong away but could not sustain his rally. NASKRA, prepping for the Kentucky Derby, galloped out an additional furlong to get the 1 1-4 miles in 2:06 $\frac{1}{4}$. PROTANTO came wide in his late bid to close a big gap. HARD WORK stopped badly after showing the way to the final turn. DR. BEHRMAN was without speed. **Scratched—Aggressively.**

PRINCE DAVELLE lacked a rally after racing forwardly to the top of the stretch. SALTVILLE weakened badly in the late stages.
