How is The Gospel Project for Students different?

The Gospel Project for Students stands out in three ways.

1. It is Christ-centered. Every session is studied in light of what it tells us about who Christ is and His plan of redemption.
2. It is missional. The Gospel Project calls us to action, to live out the implications of the gospel.
3. It partners with adult classes. For churches that use The Gospel Project with both students and adults, they have the opportunity to be moving in the same direction. Families can work to be missional families.

Does The Gospel Project require my students to prepare before coming to class?

Preparation is not required for students to participate, but those who do so will greatly benefit. The *Personal Study Guide* provides three daily devotionals that will get students thinking in anticipation of the group study. In addition to the pages that will be referenced during the class, the *Personal Study Guide* also provides some additional, deeper reading for students as a follow-up.
