THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

IN RE: A Request from the Burundi and East Africa Annual Conferences for a Declaratory Decision Regarding the Decision and Action of the General Council on Finance and Administration in Reducing the Bishop's Salary and Episcopal Allowances in Light of ¶2609.5, ¶2610.2 of the Book of Discipline 2012 (BoD)

The President of the Judicial Council,

Members of the Judicial Council.

I am Bishop Daniel Wandabula, the Resident Bishop of the East Africa and Burundi Annual Conferences of the United Methodist Church which covers the countries of Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, South Sudan, Ethiopia, and Burundi.

Over the period of seven (7) years, East Africa Episcopal Area has made some significant achievements in all the six countries.

- Prior to 2006 East Africa Episcopal Area was not being represented at the Council
 of Bishops meetings since Bishop Ndoricimpa could not be granted United States
 entry Visas.
- Since 2006 membership has increased from 172,725 60 to 400,865 in the two Annual Conferences.
- We have always held peaceful and successful annual conferences on a rotation basis in Uganda, Kenya and Rwanda from 2006 todate.
- We have encouraged the training of both pastors and laity.
- Ordination of those who have fulfilled their ordination process and been approved by the Board of Ordained Ministry.
- We have strengthened and united the church by fostering reconciliation and growing vital congregations in all the six countries under my ministry. Congregations especially in Gulu, Sudan, and Burundi bear witness that the reconciliation with God that Holy Communion offers demands reconciliation with one's neighbor/brother/sister as a prior condition (Matthew 5:23). Consequently, the church is not only growing in numbers but people are growing in theological understandings, reason and lived experience.
- Since my election to office in 2006 and re-election in 2012 the local churches have grown in numbers from 306 to 505 while the membership has grown from 172,725 to 400,865.
- We have secured scholarships for some of our pastors for further training at both Africa University and universities within the United States.
- We have built new schools in Uganda, Kenya, Burundi and South Sudan.
- We started the orphan and vulnerable children ministry.
- We have established a number of children, youth and women empowerment programs among others.

- A number of opportunities especially regarding partnerships with conferences/churches were lost. Since 2006, a number of achievements have been realized. New partnerships have been established with a number of conferences, local churches and nonprofit organizations to support work in the East Africa Episcopal Area. These include among others partnerships with:
 North and South Georgia, Holston Conference, Kentucky Conference, Winter United Methodist Church in Florida Annual Conference and many other individuals.
- We have supported the drilling of 50 boreholes in the 6 countries to provide safe, clean water.
- At least 300 pastors have benefited from short term training programs.
- We have established a United Methodist Bible School at the Humble United Methodist School and have enrolled 60 pastors in an in service training program for a two year diploma.
- We have also organized training workshops for teacher, health workers and lay leaders.
- Schools, hospitals and health centers have been built to provide education and health services.
- We have provided scholarships for the orphans and needy children. Currently we have over 230 children at the Humble United Methodist School receiving quality education.
- What we have managed to do is just a drop in the ocean. There are so many other things that we can do as a church to help the people in all these 6 countries which form the East Africa Episcopal Area. (See Power Point Presentation of the East Africa Episcopal Area of the United Methodist Church to the Spring Judicial Council and a Achievements of the East Africa Annual Conference and Burundi Annual Conference Attachment 1).

The request from the Burundi and East Africa Annual Conferences for a Declaratory Decision Regarding the Decision and Action of the General Council on Finance and Administration in Reducing the Bishop's Salary and Episcopal Allowances to the Judicial Council is not tenable for an effective Bishop. Is there any other Bishop's salary under United Methodist Church that has been reduced to 0% on the ground of audit faults. Would I be wrong to conclude that this is discriminatory with intent to stifle my operations and oust me from office for selfish motives!!

GCFA's decision was pre-mature and unreasonable in as far as the Africa Central Conference has not heard and concluded the complaint before it. Funding an effective Bishop office by payment of his salary does not in any way create a waste of the church fund. Considering the established and ongoing projects under my annual conference, the action instead impacts on the projects since most of them may phase out for lack of monitoring; for the Bishop cannot monitor the projects without support.

I thus associate myself with the humble position and steps taken by the Burundi and East Africa Episcopal Committee to petition the United Methodist Church, Judicial Council on my Episcopal support, because the members falling under the said two annual

conferences feel the effect of having a none – functional office of the Resident Bishop due to lack of funding.

The East Africa Episcopal Area office is located in rented premises in Naguru, Kampala city, Uganda. It is supported by the Episcopal fund. My Episcopal office provides support, administrative and executive staff that ensures continuity and growth in the work of the Church and continuity of the Church in the episcopacy. The decision by GCFA to stop giving me Episcopal funding has immediate implications on the work of my staff i.e. Conference Treasurer, Bishop's assistant, Administrative Assistant, Coordinator of Connection Ministry, Director Communications and those tasked to oversee the planning and execution of the annual conference sessions, the nomination of the Board of Ordained Ministry members and the nomination of Conference Committee Chairpersons including the daily connectional ministries.

As a result of the action by the General Council of Finance and Administration to stop funding my Episcopal Office. Our office operations have been stifled:

- -My office space has not been paid for 2 months now
- My office staff have not been paid for 2 months now and office utilities like water and Electricity are all in arrears. We are being threatened by the land lord to take us to court for delayed payments. This has made my office operations very difficult. GCFA actions does not only punish me but also the Christians out there who need my services.

My office staff has always worked diligently and we have been sending our Audit reports to the General Council of Finance and Administration every year since I came in Office in 2006 and GCFA has never had any problems with our Audit reports. (Attached please find Audit reports for the years 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2013).

GMGM Audits

We received auditors in 2008 when the funds were released and the audit report was good and not bad as GBGM is trying to portray.

We received 2 audits in 2011, namely in April and September 2011. We responded to them as required. However, there have been inconsistencies in the GBGM audit reporting.

A case in point, the funds released to Humble United Methodist School for the period of 2009 to 2011, was reported to be \$ 942,000 in the April 2011 audit report. The number was later altered to \$ 842,000 in September 2011 GBGM audit report.

We later received a team of 3 auditors from GBGM in June 2012 and produced the June 30,2012 Audit report which bears many controversies. In the report, funds released to Humble United Methodist School for the period of 2009 to 2011 was later changed from \$842,000 to \$699,409.

We refer to it as a disputed audit report because of the many issues which are out right allegations. A case in point- in the said audit report, it is mentioned on page 9 under Land

Documentation, that the land titles presented to the auditors for the land purchased at Humble United Methodist School were non existent or not genuine. This is not true. The land title are genuine- please see attached search copies from the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban development. Land Titles and Proof of properties by Registrar.

The June 30,2012 audit report was released on the 7th August 2012. The June 30, 2012 audit report was surprisingly circulated to the delegates emails some 2 days before the elections of the Bishops. This was before the administration had made a response to the audit. Responses to the audits are usually made within 90 days. The delegates ignored the audit document and made their decision.

The Head of the GBGM Audit Department later requested that some documents be provided to the lead auditor, Mr David Guinkpa who is based in Nairobi -Kenya. My Conference Treasurer took those documents to Nairobi and met David. Most of the issues raised in the June 30, 2012 audit report were addressed.

GBGM however decided to withhold the report arising out of the Nairobi meeting between the Conference Treasurer and the lead auditor.

In March 1, 2013, GCFA and GBGM filed a complaint to the Africa Central Conference and to our surprise; they used the June 30, 2012 audit report as the support document to their allegations to Africa Central Conference . Remember that in a meeting between the treasurer and the auditor which was in Nairobi, most issues in the June 30, 2012 audit report had already been addressed .

On 30th April ,2013 at the Bishops meeting held at San Diego USA the supervisory response to find a lasting resolution was started. At the meeting, the June 30, 2012 audit report was still used by GBGM and GCFA as evidence for their complaints filed with Africa Central Conference. It was after I asked as to why no report had been released out of the meeting between the Conference Treasurer and the auditor in Nairobi, that Rev Thomas Kemper pulled out the February 9, 2013 Financial Review Report.

When we questioned why GCFA and GBGM are insisting on using the June 30, 2012 GBGM audit report and not the improved Financial Review report which reveals the current status of the audit issues that the June 19, 2013 Financial Review report was released.

In the 29-30 October 2014 Oklahoma meeting, a lasting resolution was still not achieved and so the matter was forwarded to Africa Central Conference Investigation Committee.

We were surprised by the GCFA's action to stop the Administration funds and Bishops salary. The Episcopal Office has met all the audit requirements since I came to office in 2006. All the funds directly under my control have been properly managed and accounted for. See attached scanned Episcopal audit copies spanning from 2006 to 2013.

The United Methodist Church in Kampala had to go through a rigorous legal exercise in order to get clearance for the travel of Hope for Africa Children's choir to USA. The expenses involved paying for Petition oath for each person on the choir team plus legal expenses for process. We have a table which shows how the expenditure of Petition is arrived at.

We don't know the source of the document which is attached as Exhibit F in the Financial Review report nor is it part of our documents.

The choir was housed in the premises from 1st September 2007 to February 2011. The market rate for the leased property with such spacious compound in the same geographical area goes for shs 500,000 per month.

Stanbic Bank- Humble School Capital - A/C no 01400239695/01:

Stanbic Bank, (Humble School Capital Account)

This is another example of auditor's mis-statement. This is an ongoing difference between GBGM & EAAC. Two GBGM wires totaling to \$51,292.92 (minus bank fees) were received by EAAC. That is 3,987,900shs (1,899USD), \$23,333USD for Humble School Capital) account. 44,368,380shs (21,434 USD).

The rest of the money was for other projects / programs e.t.c \$55,322 was not wired to/for (Humble School Capital) as stated in June 30,2012 audit report. Paragraph B banking page 7.

It is therefore not true that a total of \$55,322 were wired to the capital account as mentioned in the June 30, 2012 audit report. Also find attached the bank statement for the period under review and the remittance documents provided by the Area Financial Executive, Mr. David Guinkpa when he effected the 2 wire transfers of the funds to Humble School Capital Account.

30 families benefited from this program, some families got cows, others piglets and goats.15 families got cows in different parts of Uganda. Kopanga UMC in Kenya got 12 goats. A group in Sudan has got 2 goats.24 families got piglets scattered in different parts of Uganda. All the information related to this program is on the expenditure fire.

The property on Plot 495/496 Block 169 that is claimed to have been bought and sold by my wife, Betty Wandabula was property bought on funds extended to the ministry of Hope 4 Africa Children Ministries by Pilgrim Baptist Church and two other friends in the United States and England. There is no evidence whatsoever, that this money was church fund paid by GBGM / GCFA to purchase the same. Whereas this property forms part of United Methodist Church properties, United Methodist Church funding had no hand in obtaining the same and so, no requirement to account to an entity that was merely a beneficially but not the purchaser. See brochure for Children Choir.

On how the said property was purchased should be questioned by the respective funder and so far, there is no query on the mode of purchase by the said funder but instead the fund applauded us on the achievement and is satisfied with the mode of purchase and accountability to that effect.

Analysis

The complaint before the Africa Central Conference College of Bishops is as a result of what GCFA considers to be audit faults by the East Africa Annual Conference. The GCFA regards me being the Bishop of the conference, GBGM that I failed to provide adequate response to the GBGM audit faults.

The Judicial Council ought to take strong note that GCFA is diversive. The petition by the Burundi and East Africa Committee on Episcopacy to the Judicial Council concerns the reduction of the administrative funds and my salary to 0% All letters by GCFA to that effect are annexed on my brief above.

The question should be how the GCFA and GBGM expect me as the East Africa Annual Conference Bishop to monitor the already stifled projects (because funds for said projects have been suspended) when my office is not facilitated. Funds for travel costs are distinct from office funding. I have staff to pay salaries, office utility bills and office space. The issue for which they are illegally faulting me are still before the Africa Central conference investigation Committee. We have strictly follow the laid down procedures in the Book of Discipline inorder to get a just resolution.

BACKGROUND

Amorales.

The United Methodist Church (UMC), East Africa Episcopal Area

The East Africa Episcopal Area has until recently been comprised of East Africa Annual Conference, covering Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, South Sudan and Uganda.

The 2012 General Conference which sat in Tampa, Florida approved the division of the area in two annual conferences i.e. East Africa Annual Conference (comprising Kenya, Rwanda, South Sudan and Uganda) and Burundi Annual Conference (comprising Burundi). The Africa Central Conference will set the boundaries of these two annual conferences. It is our hope that the new development will bring about further growth and development of the United Methodist Church in East Africa. We are grateful to you all for your continuing prayers and support.

The widespread poverty, coupled with diseases, and the numerous civil wars have resulted in a large number of dependants, widows and orphans in our region. The Church in East Africa has become a sanctuary for the disadvantaged members of the community. With support from partners and agencies, we are proactively attending to some of the needs of the communities we serve.

In general, the Church enjoys a good working relationship with the respective governments in all five countries. This conducive environment enables us to implement regional, planned activities.

Building on the work of the late Bishop Alfred Ndoricimpa, the Conference has registered several accomplishments over recent years.

How I Come In

It is six years since I was elected and consecrated Bishop of the East Africa Episcopal Area in May 2006 at a Special Session of the Africa Central Conference held at the Africa University Campas in Mutale Zimbabwe. This was after the untimely death of Bishop Alfred Ndoricimpa in 2005. The period immediately following his death was characterized by uneasiness and confusion in our church.

I remain grateful to all the delegates that entrusted me with leadership of the Church in East Africa. I am equally grateful to all individuals and organizations that have provided support and guidance to me over the years. Your unreserved support has enabled me contribute to the church's growth and development in the region.

My passion and calling lies in helping the disadvantaged members of the community to access a better quality of life.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

 To develop Christian leaders, I have lobbied for scholarships and training opportunities for the women, youths, and leaders interested in further education.



- Through my leadership and guidance an increasing number of clergy and lay leaders have expanded their skills and knowledge at: Uganda Christian University, Africa University, Zimbabwe and universities in the United States. Over the past six-year, at least thirteen (13) pastors and lay leaders have been supported to attend training at Africa University Mutare, Zimbabwe. An additional six (6) church leaders, have been trained at universities in the United States of America.
- Many of these Church leaders are beneficiaries of scholarships and grants from our church friends/partners.
- The establishment of the United Methodist Bible College in 2011 has enabled 27 serving leaders to enroll for a two-year Diploma in Theology.



1st intake of the United Methodist Bible College

- More than 200 pastors and lay leaders have been trained through short term programs. Skills gained include evangelism and church leadership.
- Over 150 women have been trained in: project planning/management, financial management, and household hygiene/nutrition.
- 274 youths have been trained in the areas of poultry, agricultural production and life skills.



- The St. James UMC, Atlanta, is working closely with us to develop scouting among the youths in the church in East Africa.
- I am actively advocating and implementing the identification and

deployment of individuals for short and long-term missionaries from partners. Currently, we have the following long-term missionaries: Ms. Jennifer Hansen and Rev. Masuka Maleke (both from GBGM), Mr. Steve Hodges, Diantha Hodges, Rev. Fred Dearing and Libby Dearing (all from Holston), Lyn Fogleman and Sharon Fogleman (from Mission Society). Ms. Traci MuCstion (from Central UMC Fayetteville) has completed a six-month mission to East Africa.



CHALLENGES

Socio-political problems continue to adversely impacted the work of God in the Conference. However, my key challenge regarding leadership of East Africa Area has been conflict within the Church. In particular, the conflict in Burundi since 2005, to which we are yet to find a lasting solution, has negatively impacted the growth of the church and the Conference. In spite of many challenges, the Conference has made significant progress in its work which extends beyond geographical, cultural and theological boundaries.
