- The major theme of this letter is that the Church (ekklesia) is the body of Christ.
- The Church includes the Saints at Ephesus and the faithful in Christ – that's all of us
- The Church was chosen before God created the world vs.4
- He got pleasure when he predestined us vs.5



- All three <u>Persons in the Godhead</u> are involved in our salvation.
- As far as **God the Father** is concerned, you were saved when He chose you in Christ in eternity past.
- As far as **God the Son** is concerned, you were saved when He died for you on the cross.



- As far as **God the Spirit** is concerned, you were saved when you yielded to His conviction and received Christ as your Savior.
- What began in eternity past was fulfilled in time present, and will continue for all eternity!

- First comes regeneration –then



- Adoption He gives us the status of sons so that can part take of our riches in Christ.
- This continues into eternity when we receive our new bodies and the fullness of His glory.
- Because of His grace in Christ we have been accepted. We can't make ourselves accepted and no can make us unaccepted vs.6



- Vs. 7 –He redeemed us to purchase and set free by paying a price. Free from law/Torah, free from Satan; free from the nature of sin and free from eternal death.
- VS. 8-10 In the completion of time God gather all under the heading of Christ. (Gal 4:4)



- Vs. 11-12 In whom (In Christ) we have an inheritance – something assigned
- His will was that we would be to the praise of His glory.
- ♦ Vs. 13-14 The process of salvation:
- Hear the word; believe the word; sealed by the Holy Spirit
- The earnest of our inheritance –The Holy Spirit - Engagement ring



Why has God the Father chosen us, adopted us, and accepted us? 'To the praise of the glory of His grace" (Eph 1:6).



Why has the Son redeemed us, forgiven us, revealed God's will to us, and made us part of God's inheritance? "That we should be to the praise of His glory" (Eph 1:12).



Why has God the Spirit sealed us and become the guarantee of our future blessing? "Unto the praise of His glory" (Eph 1:14).



- * We have been redeemed through faith in Jesus Christ (Eph 1:7).
- * We are being redeemed as the Spirit works in our lives to make us more like Christ (Rom 8:14).
- * We shall be redeemed when Christ returns and we become like Him.



- vs.15 –Faith Toward God
- Love for the Saints
- vs. 16 -He does not ask God to give them what they do not have, but rather prays that God will reveal to them what they already have.
- With his natural mind, man cannot understand the things of God. He needs the Spirit to enlighten him (1 Cor 2:9-16)

- Vs. 17 Enlightenment comes from the Holy Spirit. He is the "Spirit of wisdom and revelation" (Isa 11:2)
- Enlightenment comes to the heart of the believer (Eph 1:18)



 This is what Jesus meant when He said of the people: "They seeing see not, and hearing they hear **not"** (Matt 13:13). The inability to see and understand spiritual things is not the fault of the intelligence but of the heart. They eyes of the heart must be opened by the Spirit of God.

Letter to the Ephesians

vs. 18 the hope of our calling

ø

*ekklesia a calling out, KJV - assembly, church.

Hope – anticipate with pleasure; "assurance for the future."



Vs. 18b- His inheritance in us. This is an amazing truth - that God should look on us as a part of His great wealth!



♦ Vs. 19-23 So tremendous is this truth that Paul enlisted many different words from the Greek vocabulary to get his point across: dunamis - "power" as in dynamo and dynamite; energeia - "working" as in energy, kratos - "mighty"; ischus - "power."



*"What is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the operation of the might of His strength."



We measure God's power by the miracle of Christ's resurrection. Much more was involved than merely raising Him from the dead, for Christ also ascended to heaven and sat down in the place of authority at the right hand of God. He is not only Savior; He is also Sovereign (Acts 2:25-36).



No authority or power, human or in the spirit world, is greater than that of Jesus Christ, the exalted Son of God. He is "far above all," and no future enemy can overcome Him, because He has been exalted "far above all" powers.



- ◆ Eph. 2:1
- This supreme one made you alive
- Dead a corpse cut off from God
- Trespasses- (paraptoma) unintentional error or wilful transgression



- ◆ Eph. 2-3
- The course of this world
- The Prince of the power of the air
- Worketh energeo to be active, efficient; in the children of disobedience
- Our conversation life styles in the lust of the flesh



- ◆ Eph. 2:1-3
- **♦ We Were DEAD**
- ◆ 1. Living according to the course of this world. – course (aion) age
- ◆ 2. According to the prince of the power of the air
- ◆ 3. He is the spirit operating in the children of disobedience



- ◆ Eph. 2:3
- We had our conversation (to busy oneself)
- 1. Lusts of our flesh
- 2. Fulfilling the desires of the flesh and mind (imagination)
- 3. By our nature children of wrath (John 8:44) (1John 3:10)



- Eph 2:4
- But God so rich is He in His mercy!
 Because of and in order to satisfy the great and wonderful and intense love with which He loved us,

- Eph 2:5
- Even when we were dead (slain) by [our own] shortcomings and trespasses, He made us alive together in fellowship and in union with Christ...(Rom. 8:11)



- Eph 2:6
- And He raised us up together with Him and made us sit down together [giving us joint seating with Him] in the heavenly sphere [by virtue of our being] in Christ Jesus (the Messiah, the Anointed One).



WHY DID HE DO IT?

- Eph 2:7
- He did this that He might Clearly demonstrate through the ages to come the immeasurable (limitless, surpassing) riches of His free grace (His unmerited favor) in [His] kindness and goodness of heart toward us in Christ Jesus.



- ◆ Eph 2:8-9
- ◆ 8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:
- 9 Not of works, lest any man should boast.
- God's grace gets to us by faith
- * KJV



Grace (charis) graciousness (as gratifying), of manner or act spiritual; especially the divine influence upon the heart, and its reflection in the life;

Eph 2:10

For we are God's [own] handiwork (His workmanship), (Masterpiece) recreated in Christ Jesus, [born anew] that we may do those good works which God predestined (planned beforehand) for us [taking paths which He prepared ahead of time], that we should walk in them.



- ◆ Eph. 2:10
- "For we are His workmanship created in Christ Jesus." The Greek word translated "workmanship" is poiema, from which we derive our English word "poem." It means, "that which is made, a manufactured product." In other words, our conversion is not the end; it is the beginning.



- ◆ Eph. 2:11
- Past Gentiles in the flesh a pagan race, without God
- Having teaching or instruction
- Uncircumcision- without covenant



- ◆ Eph. 2:12
- Without Christ
- Aliens from the commonwealth of Israel
- Strangers from the covenants of promise
- Having no Hope
- Without God in the world



- ◆ Eph 2:12
- * [Remember] that you were at that time separated (living apart) from Christ [excluded from all part in Him], utterly estranged and outlawed from the rights of Israel as a nation,



- ◆ Eph 2:12
- and strangers with no share in the sacred compacts of the [Messianic] promise [with no knowledge of or right in God's agreements, His covenants]. And you had no hope (no promise); you were in the world without God.



Eph 2:13

But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ.



- ◆ Eph. 2:14-18
- Jesus is our peace
- He has made Jew and Gentile believers one
- Broke down the wall of separation
- Abolished in His flesh the hostility (hatred)



- He did away with the old system of commandments in ordinances
- He made in Himself the two to be
 One New Man –The Church
- Gentile believers back into complete favor with God by dying on the cross



In the church, Gentiles do not become Jews, nor do Jews become Gentiles. Instead believing Jews and Gentiles become Christians, a whole new single entity. Jewish believers and Gentile believers



- Preaching Peace
- ◆ Peace with God and access to God by the Holy Spirit who lives within us
- Jew and Gentile believers have peace with one another because we are one in Christ.



- ◆ Eph. 2:19
- No more strangers
- No more Foreigners
- Fellow citizens with the saints
- Of the Household of God



- Eph 2:19
- Therefore you are no longer outsiders (exiles, migrants, and aliens, excluded from the rights of citizens), but you now share citizenship with the saints (God's own people, consecrated and set apart for Himself); and you belong to God's [own] household.



 Paul specifically stated that Gentiles are incorporated "with God's people" and are in "God's household" Paul explained that this new relationship is "built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets with Christ Jesus Himself as the chief Cornerstone" (v. 20). This began on the day of Pentecost, not in the Old Testament.



- ◆ Eph 2:21-22
- ◆ 21 In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord:
- * 22 In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit.

- ◆ Eph. 3:1-6
- ◆ God's Plan –The Mystery of Christ
- Paul is a in prison due to bringing this message to the Gentiles
- The mystery was made know to Paul by revelation
- The Mystery was hidden for ages
- It was revealed to the Apostles and Prophets by the Holy Spirit



- What Was the Mystery?
- ◆ Eph 3:6
- That the Gentiles should be fellowheirs, and of the same body, and partakers of his promise in Christ by the gospel:

KJV

- Eph 3:7
- Whereof I was made a minister, according to the gift of the grace of God given unto me by the effectual working of his power.

- ♦ Vs. 7
- I was made a minister-Diakonoswaiter-servant, teacher
- The gift (dorea) of the grace (charis) (the divine influence upon the heart and it's reflection in the life) of God

 the effectual (energeia)working of his power (dunamis).

- Eph 3:8
- Unto me, who am less than the least of all saints, is this grace given, that I should preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ;

- ◆ Eph 3:9
- And to make all men see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ:
- Fellowship koinonia -partnership

- Eph 3:10
- The purpose is that through the church the complicated, many-sided wisdom of God in all its infinite variety and innumerable aspects might now be made known to the angelic rulers and authorities (principalities and powers) in the heavenly sphere.

- ◆ Eph 3:11
- According to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord:
- Eph 3:12
- In whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of him.

- Eph 3:13
- So I ask you not to lose heart [not to faint or become despondent through fear] at what I am suffering in your behalf. [Rather glory in it] for it is an honor to you.

- Eph 3:14-16
- For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- 15 Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named,
- * 16 That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;

- Eph 3:17-19
- ◆ 17 That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love,
- * 18 May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height;

* 19 And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God.

- ◆ Eph 3:20-21
- 20 Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us,
- 21 Unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.

- Chapter 4
- Paul proceeds in light of our heavenly calling to challenge us on every level of our relationships; both domestic and public; neighbors, husbands, wives, parents, children, employers and employees.

- ◆ Eph 4:1
- * I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called,

The word "worthy" (axios) means "equal weight"; one's calling and conduct should be in balance. "The calling" refers not only to believers' salvation but also to their union in one body. Therefore a Christian's conduct concerns both his personal life and his responsibility to other believers in the church.

- ◆ Eph 4:1
- Lord, appeal to and beg you to walk (lead a life) worthy of the [divine] calling to which you have been called [with behavior that is a credit to the summons to God's service,

AMP

- Eph 4:2
- Living as becomes you] with complete lowliness of mind (humility) and meekness (unselfishness, gentleness, mildness), with patience, bearing with one another and making allowances because you love one another.

- The Three Virtues/Attitudes
- Humility Realizing who I am in God's Program; putting others before self.
- Gentle/Meekness This is the opposite of self-assertion, rudeness, and harshness. It suggests having one's emotions under control. But it does not suggest weakness.

- The Three Virtues/Attitudes
- Patience Patience is the spirit which never gives up for it endures to the end even in times of adversity It is the self-restraint which does not hastily retaliate a wrong.
- Attitudes of humility, gentleness, and patience foster unity among Christians.

Paul then stated the manner in which they are to be carried out in one's conduct: bearing with one another in love and making every effort, "making every diligent effort") to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

Christians are not to make unity but to keep or guard what God made in creating the "one new man" (Eph 2:15-16). They are to keep this unity "through the bond" which consists of "peace." Concern for peace will mean that Christians will lovingly tolerate each other, even when they have differences.

- * 3 Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

Gifts Given to Believers

- Eph 4:7
- But unto every one of us is given grace (charis)(enablement) according to the measure of the gift of Christ.
- ***Each believer is to function in Christ's body by God's enablement, proportionate to the gift (spiritual ability) bestowed on him, no more and no less.*** (cf. Rom.
 - 12: 4-6
- ◆ 1Cor. 12:4-6)

Gifted Believers Given to the Church

- Eph 4:11
- * 11 And he gave some, <u>apostles</u>; and some, <u>prophets</u>; and some, <u>evangelists</u>; and some, <u>pastors</u> and <u>teachers</u>;

- → Vs. 12
- *Equipping the Saints
- *For the Work of the Ministry
- For the building up of the body of Christ (Church)

- Eph 4:13
- *Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect (mature) man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:

♦ KJV

- Eph 4:13
- [That it might develop] until we all attain oneness in the faith and in the comprehension of the [full and accurate] knowledge of the Son of God, that [we might arrive] at really mature manhood (the completeness of personality which is nothing less than the standard height of Christ's own perfection), the measure of the stature of the fullness of the Christ and the completeness found in Him.

- ◆ Eph 4:14
- That we henceforth be no more children, (a simple minded person) tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;

- Eph 4:15
- But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ...

But Rather, let our lives lovingly express truth [in all things, speaking truly, dealing truly, living truly]...

- ◆ Eph 4:16
- He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love.
