



- Gal 6:1
- Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.
- Paul picks up from chapter 5 referring to the list of sins in Gal. 5:19-21. One who is overtaken is under the power of/addicted and cannot free themselves. Those who are under the control of the Spirit must free and restore them with meekness, or without a superior attitude.



- Gal 6:2
- Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.
- The context here has to do with a continuous action. The believer who is caught in this sin is overpowered and needs someone to walk with them. The law of Christ is the law of love.



- Gal 6:3
- 3. For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself.
- 4. But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another.
- Vs.3 If someone thinks they are superior to the one who has sinned, they are self deceived.
- Vs.4- We should rejoice in God's grace alone and not in anything that uplifts self, which is pride.



- Gal 6:5
- 5 For every man shall bear his own burden.
- There is no contradiction here with vs.2. Burdens or loads in this verse has to do life's routine obligations, and each believers ministry calling responsibilities. (1Cor.3:12-15)(2Cor.5:10)

- Gal 6:6
- 6 Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things.
- Gal 6:7
- 7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man <u>soweth</u>, that shall he also <u>reap.</u>
- Gen 8:22-9:1
- 22 While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease.

 God uses a consistent method throughout scripture of explaining spiritual laws, by using the natural world, or natural laws. This method is being used in verses 7 and 8. The natural world operates likes the spiritual world; because the natural worlds comes from the spiritual world.

- Gal 6:8
- 8 For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.
- Gal 6:8
- 8 For he who sows to his own flesh (lower nature, sensuality) will from the flesh reap decay and ruin and destruction, but he who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.

- Gal 6:9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.
- Gal. 6:9 And let us not lose heart and grow weary and faint in acting nobly and doing right, for in due time and at the appointed season we shall reap, if we do not loosen and relax our courage and faint.

- Gal 6:10
- 10 As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.



The Just shall live by Faith

- Hab 2:4
- 4 Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith.
- Rom 1:17
- 17 For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, <u>The just shall live by faith.</u>

- Gal 3:11
- 11 But that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, it is evident: for, <u>The</u> <u>just shall live by faith.</u>
- Heb 10:38
- 38 Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him.
