Love to Read?



Panhellenic

Charlotte Panhellenic has had another active year! Thanks to our AutoBell gift card fundraiser and our 50/50 raffle, won by our own Sarah Swanson, we supported a Panhellenic Day and multiple scholarships for undergraduate women. Our Panhellenic Day was held at UNC-Charlotte on January 25th and was attended by Panhellenic delegates and chapter officers from Lenoir-Rhyne University, Queens University, and UNC-Charlotte to assist in successful Panhellenic cooperation and promotion of Greek Life. We also awarded two \$1,000 scholarships to Panhellenic undergraduates at UNC-Charlotte from our established endowment. This year we also rolled out an undergraduate Panhellenic scholarship for women who live in the Charlotte Metro area, no matter what school they attend. We had 31 applicants from Clemson, South Carolina, Queens, Wingate, Central Florida, Appalachian State, and Florida State. The winners of the two Charlotte Metro \$1,000 scholarships were Brooke Lampe, Kappa Delta, Appalachian State University and Maura O'Toole, Phi Mu, Queens University.
