I've been asked by the Board to update everyone on Think Pink.



However after the storm, it was decided that a fundraiser at this tough time for Houston might not be the right thing to do and because of the very difficult situation (many of our members were flooded and many of our vendors were no longer able to participate), it was decided to cancel the event.

The Board then began to discuss Think Pink for 2018. For some time, there has been an ongoing difference of opinion within the group related to wanting to continue the support of Think Pink as a luncheon and this subject came up again. We have many members who want to continue having the current Think Pink luncheon in its current format and just as many members who think it is time to move to a new fund raiser. This has become a subject that we are spending an enormous amount of time in ongoing discussion. So the Board spent significant time to discuss this situation and came to the conclusion that we needed to take some time to really decide on what we want to support going forward.
