



Mutual Aid for Dues Hardship - Seeking Your Support

Thank you so much for all the generous donations! Through your support we have been able to help assist two members of our sisterhood for whom membership would not have been possible. At this point, the fund is almost completely utilized. As we continue to grow and welcome more members, we are seeking additional support to ensure we can extend the opportunities to other women.

Eta Zeta is committed to welcoming women from all backgrounds and identities who are committed to friendship and doing good. This includes prioritizing a chapter membership that is diverse, inclusive, and accessible on all fronts. Inspired by the Zeta Theta chapter at Columbia, we are launching a formal fund via GoFundMe that allows assistance to go directly to members in need who are facing the possibility of terminating their membership in Delta Gamma. Delta Gamma Foundation initiatives like Sisters Helping Sisters (need-based scholarships) are vital and important, but they cannot be used towards chapters dues. Honor Board and the chapter's finance team can take steps to temporarily reduce dues hardship, but there is currently no way to provide mutual aid to those who need funds immediately. We would like to be that mutual aid.
