






Only Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA) reflects research findings that reading comprehension requires not just formal decoding skills, but also wide-ranging background knowledge.







Unique structure


CKLA integrates developmentally appropriate activities in PreK, offers two distinct strands for K-3 and merges them into one comprehensive offering for grades 4-5.

K-3 Listening & Learning strand




CKLA blends a sequence of increasingly complex literary and informational teacher read-alouds, text-based class discussions and application across content-based domains to develop content knowledge and vocabulary.

K-3 Skills strand



CKLA teaches the foundational skills in a sequence that includes decoding and encoding, blending, segmenting, spelling, tricky words, alternative spellings and morphology. Lessons also cover writing, grammar and vocabulary.

PreK, 4, 5 Integrated instruction



CKLA provides instruction and activities that begin building knowledge and foundational skills in PreK. In grades 4-5 a sequence of content-based units integrate close reading and writing, speaking and listening, vocabulary and grammar lessons.

The power of content-rich curriculum


Increasingly complex texts bring content to life and inspire discussion, with a focus on building background knowledge and vocabulary across domains.

- Read-Alouds provide students with above-grade-level content and vocabulary that they will recognize and understand when decoding complex texts
- A mix of informational and literary read-alouds are organized with supporting images and question prompts to support all learners
- Whole-class, small-group, and partner discussion provide repeated exposure to vocabulary and allow students to practice and apply what they learn








The power of systematic skills development

Sequenced skills development brings students from explicit instruction to independent practice to develop strong readers and writers.


- Explicit and systematic phonics instruction helps students quickly launch into reading

Explicit and systematic phonics instruction




Teaching the most frequent sounds and sound-spellings first helps students master the basic mechanics of reading and quickly advance to engaging decodable readers.




Sequence of decodable readers




Interactive Quests fuel the imagination.

Exclusive adventure-based units bring students together for immersive team experiences that provide every opportunity to practice close reading and writing skills.





Digital support





Kit components

Each classroom kit accommodates reading and writing instruction for 25 students with a range of print materials that support instruction.

Grades K-3

- **Teacher anthologies** include carefully sequenced read-alouds with rich content and support for robust, text-based discussion
