## SENATE RESOLUTION ON ADVERSE EDUCATIONAL IMPACTS OF INCREASED COURSE ENROLLMENT LIMITS

Whereas the primary goal of SCSU is academic excellence;

And whereas the current dire budget situation has caused SCSU to increase the enrollment caps in a number of courses, including LEP, W and online courses in order to generate more tuition payments;

And whereas such increases necessitate significantly increased faculty workload for faculty teaching courses with increased enrollment caps;

And whereas existing faculty workload leaves no room for faculty to meet the added workload;

And whereas the available pedagogical efficiencies that might otherwise be exploited to meet the additional workload have already been exhausted;

Therefore, be it resolved that:

The faculty and administration of SCSU recognize that increased class sizes degrades educational quality in the courses whose limits have been raised;

And that the administration of SCSU commits to reducing enrollment caps to their 2010-2011 levels as soon as possible, and no later than the 2012-2013 academic year.
