Non-Import | Saskatchewan | 6-2 | 240 lbs | Born October 20, 1987 in Regina, SK

Acquired: Claimed off of Montreal's practice roster on June 29, 2011

2010: Played in one game with the Alouettes after re-signing on October 25...made two defensive tackles and one tackle for a loss...was released by the Alouettes on July 4 after beginning the season on the practice roster.

2009: Spent most of the season on the Montreal Alouettes practice roster after they selected him in the fourth round (31st overall) of the CFL Canadian Draft.

College: Played at Saskatchewan...made 36 tackles and seven quarterback sacks in 2008.

JERRY BROWN | DL

Acquired: Signed as a free agent on September 27, 2011

2011: Signed with the Arena Football League's Jacksonville Sharks on March 3...made 15 tackles, one forced fumble and three fumble recoveries...helped the Sharks capture ArenaBowl XXIV.

College: Played four seasons (2006-09) at Illinois...sued up in 24 games.

Personal: Son of Dujaun and Stacey Jackson...played football and ran track at Vashon High School.

Non-Import | Maryland | 5-10 | 175 lbs | Born April 28, 1986 in Windsor, ON

Acquired: Signed as a free agent on June 27, 2011

2011: Selected in the third round (19th overall) by the B.C. Lions in the CFL Canadian Draft...attended training camp and was released by the Lions on June 25.

College: Played three seasons (2008-10) at Maryland...sued up with Erie Community College in 2006...was named a first-team all-conference selection after recording 35 tackles and four interceptions

Personal: Cousin of St. Louis Rams safety O.J. Atogwe...majored in African Studies at Maryland.

MILT COLLINS | DB

Import | Mississippi | 6-1 | 180 lbs | Born March 9, 1985 in New Orleans, LA

Acquired: Traded from the Calgary Stampeders on September 26, 2011 along with a fifth-round pick in the 2013 CFL Draft in exchange for the rights to Jadon Wagner and a 2013 fourth-round pick.

2011: Played in two games with the Stampeders prior to being traded to the Tiger-Cats on September 26...made one defensive tackle and one pass knockdown...spent four weeks on the injured list and was inactive for six games.

2010: Played in 17 games during his third season in Calgary...recorded 36 defensive tackles, three forced fumbles and three interceptions...returned an interception 55 yards for a touchdown against Saskatchewan on September 17.

2009: Played in all 18 games in his second season with the Stampeders...made 38 defensive tackles, five special teams tackles and intercepted two passes...scored a touchdown on a 39-yard fumble recovery in Hamilton on September 18.

2008: Played in 10 games with the Calgary Stampeders...made 11 defensive tackles, one quarterback sack and three interceptions...named CFL Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in week 16...played in two playoff games, including Calgary's Grey Cup final victory against Montreal.

College: Played at Ole Miss in 2005 after spending two years (2003-04) at Jones County Junior College...played as a receiver in college...earned first-team all-state junior college honours at Jones County.

Acquired: Signed as a free agent on June 27, 2011

2010: Attended training camp with the Toronto Argonauts and was released on June 20...joined the Argonauts practice roster on August 9 and was released on August 31.

2009: Played in eight games with the Toronto Argonauts after signing as a free agent on July 13...made eight special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

College: Played four seasons at Bishops...started 32 games at linebacker...made 42.5 tackles, 5.5 quarterback sacks, three interceptions and three forced fumbles in 2008...participated in the 2008 East West Bowl...served as a team captain in 2008.

Non-Import | Bishop's | 6-1 | 207 lbs | Born December 13, 1987 in Lachine, QC

Acquired: Signed as a free agent on July 25, 2011

2011: Attended training camp with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers after they selected him in the sixth round (41st overall) of the CFL Canadian Draft...was released by Winnipeg on June 7.

College: Played four seasons (2007-10) at Concordia...began his CIS career as a quarterback before converting to receiver in 2009...caught 94 passes for 1,208 yards and 10 touchdowns in two seasons as a slotback...won the Peter Gorman Trophy as the outstanding rookie in CIS football in 2007.

RAY MARIUZ | LB

Non-Import | McMaster | 6-3 | 228 lbs | Born December 25, 1980 in Mississauga, ON

Acquired: Originally signed as a free agent on February 16, 2006...re-joined the Ticats on September 27, 2011 after retiring in the off-season.

2010: Played in all 18 games during his fifth season as a Tiger-Cat...finished second on the team with 21 special teams tackles while adding six defensive tackles, one quarterback sack and one forced fumble.

2009: Played in all 18 games during his fourth season as a Tiger-Cat...made 19 special teams tackles, one defensive tackle, one pass knockdown and forced one fumble...made three special teams tackles in the Ticats Eastern Semi-Final loss to B.C.

2008: Started all 18 games at outside linebacker in his third season in Hamilton...finished fourth on the Ticats with 65 defensive tackles and led the team with 15 special teams tackles...also recorded two quarterback sacks, four tackles for a loss, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one pass knockdown...earned the Ticats nomination for the Most Outstanding Canadian Player Award.

2007: Played in all 18 games, starting two, in his second season with the Ticats...recorded a team-leading 17 special teams tackles, 28 defensive tackles and two tackles for losses.

2006: Played in all 18 games, starting 16, during the regular season after signing with the Ticats as a free agent on February 16...finished second on the Tiger-Cats with 20 special teams tackles and four tackles for a loss...also made 28 defensive tackles...Made his Ticats debut on June 17 in Toronto, recording two defensive tackles and one special teams tackle.

2005: Played in 17 games with four starts at linebacker during the regular season... led the Argonauts and finished tied for third in the CFL with 22 special teams tackles...made 22 defensive tackles and the first three quarterback sacks of his CFL career...recorded his first career quarterback sack in Toronto's June 25 home loss to B.C...made his first career start on July 15 in B.C...was a runner-up for the CFL Special Teams Player of the Week award after he made a team high three special teams tackles and one defensive tackle in Toronto's 22-18 victory at Edmonton on August 20.

2004: Played in all 18 games as a backup linebacker and on special teams...was named the special teams captain by coaching staff...finished the season as the league-leader in special teams tackles with 28...made five defensive tackles including one for a three yard in loss...played in the Argonauts 27-19 Grey Cup victory over the B.C. Lions.

2003: Played in 15 games with the Toronto Argonauts after the Argos selected him in the fourth round of the 2003 CFL Canadian Draft...spent three weeks on Toronto's practice roster (weeks 2, 3 and 5)...recorded two defensive tackles, 15 special teams tackles...made his CFL debut and recorded two special teams tackles on June 19 when the Argos hosted the Saskatchewan Roughriders.
