Before placing your pet under anesthesia, a doctor will perform a complete physical exam to identify any existing medical conditions that could complicate the procedure and compromise the health of your pet. Some conditions, however, may not appear evident by physical exam alone, especially conditions of your pet's liver and kidneys. These organs remove the anesthesia from your pet's blody. Abnormalities of the liver and kidney greatly increase anesthetic risk. It is also important that your pet have normal blood cell counts to promote proper tissue healing. Pets with pre-existing medical conditions and / or are 5 years and older (senior pets) are considered higher risk for anesthesia. These pets are required to have the pre-anesthetic testing prior to undergoing anesthesia.
