Our clinic's Lyme/Anaplasmosis/Erlichiosis (tick borne diseases) and Heartworm (mosquito transmitted) positive test count increased from 2010. We are seeing more & more dogs each year that test positive and require treatment. This is why it is important you take the time to bring your dog in for a quick blood test. Lyme disease, Anaplasmosis and Erlichiosis (which are diseases transmitted by ticks) are on the rise in Manitoba both in the city and in cottage country. All can be easily identified and treated if caught before your pet becomes ill. At Anderson Animal Hospital and Wellness Center we recommend annual testing (usually done in May) for these diseases. If the test is negative, we can then suggest specific preventative measures based on your dog's lifestyle so your dog stays safe and healthy!
