Surgery Admitting Form

Seven Oaks Pet Hospital Pre-Anesthetic Testing

Your pet is with us today for a procedure that will require anesthesia. We will perform a physical examination on your pet before administering the anesthesia. We require pre-anesthetic blood testing to check your pet's organ function and blood count. These tests will be performed in order to insure that your pet is in a low risk category during anesthesia by ruling out pre-existing internal problems that may not be evident upon physical examination, but could possibly lead to complications.

Intravenous Fluids and Catheter Placement

In order to minimize complications/risks while under anesthesia, your pet will have an IV Catheter placed so that he/she can receive venous fluids. These fluids allow the liver and kidney to flush out any remaining anesthesia that is in the blood, maintain blood pressure at a safe level, and gives the doctor venous access to administer emergency drugs or blood if needed..

Radiowave Surgery

We offer radiowave technology in our surgical suite. This gives us the ability to offer your pet shorter anesthesia and post-surgical healing times. How does radiowave surgery work? A micro fiber tip becomes energized by the radiowaves but does not become hot. The ultra high frequency radiowaves provide specific and delicate tissue interaction. This results in a focused cutting and coagulating effect, which disintegrates and volatilizes single cells minimizing the amount of tissue destruction. Healing is rapid and painless. Radiowave surgery does not burn the tissue, unlike laser or high-temperature electrosurgery.

Laparoscopic Surgery (Minimal Invasive)

Your pet's surgical procedure can be performed with traditional invasive method or minimally invasive. The benefits of using the minimally invasive method for your pet are: less pain, less bleeding, and a quicker recovery. We will proceed unless you request us not to. In the event the doctor feels that it is medically necessary to create larger incision (more invasive) they will proceed at their discretion.

Post Operative Pain Management

After any surgical procedure, pets do experience some pain and discomfort for the first 48-72 hours. Pain medication will be given and dispensed to reduce pain and discomfort as well as inflammation after a surgical procedure has been performed.

Elizabethan Collar

About 50% of pets will lick, scratch, or even destroy the surgical incision area. This is one of the most common complications after surgery.
