Scheduling Appointments: Our goal is to provide exceptional pet care and customer service. Patients are seen by appointment. We do our best to stay on schedule and ask that to help facilitate our efforts, you give our receptionist detailed information about your pet's needs when making your pet's appointment. This will allow our staff to allot the proper amount of time for your pet's appointment.

After-Hours Emergency: In the event that your pet has a medical emergency or illness after hours, call our regular number (603)755-9004. This is an answering service. Please give the receptionist a brief description

of your pet's medical condition. The on-call veterinarian will call you back immediately. If you do not receive a call back within 5-10 minutes please call the emergency service again, until your call is returned by a veterinarian.

Day-Time Emergency/ Urgent Needs: For urgent needs, serious illness or injury we encourage you to call and let our staff know you are coming so that we may prepare for your pet's arrival. Life-threatening illnesses or injuries take precedence over routine or non-life threatening cases. If it is determined that your pet's condition is urgent but not life-threatening, you may be asked to wait. You may also be given the option to drop your pet off at the clinic; this enables us to devote the time needed for the diagnosis and treatment of your pet.

Payment: We require payment at the time of service. Payment can be made by cash, personal check, or credit card (Visa, Mastercard, and Discover and American Express). If paying by check, a valid credit card must be on file. We also accept CareCredit. If you would like information about obtaining a CareCredit account please see our receptionist.

Why shouldn't I purchase medications and vaccines from the internet?

The FDA cautions owners about the dangers of purchasing drugs through the internet and from catalog companies. Many drugs can be dangerous if not properly prescribed and monitored by your veterinarian. Internet "pharmacies" advertise low prices and convenience but the industry is poorly regulated and products purchased through the internet are not guaranteed by the pharmacy or manufacturer. Internet customers have reported receiving expired medications and foreign pharmaceuticals not approved for use in the United States. Many pharmaceutical companies only guarantee their product if they are purchased through a licensed veterinarian. Most online medications are within 3% - 5% of the cost charged by most veterinary hospitals.

Ultimately, the small savings is not worth risking the health of your pet.

A pharmaceutical purchase from your veterinarian is an investment in a business that will provide long-term health care for your pet. No internet pharmacy cares for your pet like our veterinarians do.
