Colorado Cannabis Survey

The following questions are from a survey of 600 Colorado registered voters. The interviews were conducted via land lines and cell phones on 28-31 July, 2015. The sampling error for this sample size is +/- 4.0%.

2012 Ballot

In 2012 Colorado voters approved the ballot measure legalizing marijuana for recreational use.

I'm going to ask you how you voted back in 2012 and how you would vote today if the exact same measure were on the ballot for the first time.

Back in 2012 some people held strong opinions on the issue; others leaned one way or the other and voted that way.

1st 2012 Ballot: Were you a strong vote for legalization, leaned toward legalization, leaned toward opposition, or strongly opposed legalization? If you didn't vote on the issue in 2012 just say so.
