NEW RELEASES ADDED INCLUDE HOT DOCS 2025 TITLES **APOCALYPSE IN THE TROPICS** AND TOP TEN AUDIENCE FAVOURITE **MR. NOBODY AGAINST PUTIN**, PLUS **IT'S NEVER OVER, JEFF BUCKLEY**, **NEIL YOUNG: COASTAL**, **E.1027: EILEEN GRAY: HOUSE BY THE SEA** AND TORONTO PREMIERE OF **TRUTH AND DARE** SERIES SELECTION **INVENTION**

Toronto, ON - Hot Docs Ted Rogers Cinema is excited to announce 2025 Festival films and new release docs that will join the growing lineup of exciting films coming to the cinema screen this summer. Hot Docs 2025 official selection *Apocalypse in the Tropics* (D: Petra Costa | Brazil, USA, Denmark | 110 minutes | 2025) offers an investigation into the increasingly powerful grip Christian evangelical leaders hold over politics in Brazil. Hot Docs 2025 official selection and top ten audience favourite *Mr. Nobody Against Putin* (D: David Borenstein | Denmark, Czech Republic | 90 minutes | 2025), in which Pasha becomes the world's friendliest whistleblower in response to the Russian government getting teachers to spread state propaganda.

Music, artistry and architecture permeate personal character-driven true stories in additional new release docs. *It's Never Over, Jeff Buckley* (D: Amy Berg | USA | 106 minutes | 2025) offers an intimate portrait of one of modern music's most influential and enigmatic figures from Oscar-nominated director Amy Berg (*Deliver Us from Evil*) and executive producer Brad Pitt. *Neil Young: Coastal* (D: Daryl Hannah | USA | 105 minutes | 2024) follows the maverick musician as he cruises the coast on his recent solo tour, and is directed by Young's wife, acclaimed film star and filmmaker Daryl Hannah. *E.1027: Eileen Gray and the House by the Sea* (D: Beatrice Minger | Switzerland | 89 minutes | 2024) is a docudrama that takes filmgoers to Côte d'Azur in 1929, telling the story of a brilliant designer, her masterpiece, the power of female expression—and men's desire to control it.

Joining these titles for its Toronto premiere is *Invention* (D: Courtney Stephens | USA| 72 minutes | 2024), a heady blend of mumblecore, sci-fi and archival documentary, in which a woman inherits the patent to her father's invention. The film will screen as part of the cinema's popular *Truth and Dare* series, highlighting cutting-edge documentaries that challenge the idea of what a doc needs to be. Acting as a spotlight for future cult classics, this series was started by a collective of cinema staff members in order to showcase and celebrate the most mind-expanding, form-pushing works emerging from the documentary world.

The films above join previously announced *Antidote, The Encampments*, and *The Hobby* as the current lineup of new release docs screening at the cinema in July and August.

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Owned and operated by Hot Docs, a not-for-profit organization dedicated to advancing and celebrating the art of documentary, Hot Docs Ted Rogers Cinema is the world's largest documentary cinema. A historic, century-old landmark located in Toronto's vibrant Annex neighbourhood, the Cinema is a year-round home for non-fiction film and storytelling, presenting first-run international and Canadian documentaries, curated film and speakers series, signature events including Hot Docs Canadian International Documentary Festival, Hot Docs Podcast Festival and Curious Minds Weekend, as well as hosting for some of the city's premier festivals and events. Since assuming management in 2012, Hot Docs has screened over 1,425 films to audiences of more than 1.3 million. In 2016, a generous \$5-million donation from Rogers Foundation enabled Hot Docs to purchase the venue.

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
