Travel quizzes are in vogue, thanks to the buzzed-about international competition that's sprung up around the one for members of the Facebook website.

A new travel site, Indagare, has a quiz that's a killer. At least I think so. I fancy myself something of a travel expert, but got just 25 of 50 questions correct. Ouch! (At least I scored 80% on the green/eco ones, so I'm not a total airhead.) Top scorers in each category (such as spa, style, learning) receive special gifts and invitations.

Questions include:

- *At which golf course is one of the holes in another country? (Bandon Dunes Golf Resort in Oregon; Playa Grande in the Dominican Republic; Ambush at Lajitas, the Ultimate Hideout, in Texas; Sofitel Royal Angkor Golf & Spa resort in Cambodia)
- *Which hotel chain offers free parking for hybrid cars at some of its hotels? (Hilton, Sofitel, Mandarin Oriental, Fairmont)

Try the quiz yourselves, but be forewarned that the questions tend to be esoteric. Please let me know if you did well. Winners get prizes, including stays at top hotels and a week in the Maldives, so it can be worth your while to play.

Indagare, by the way, is from well-respected former *Town & Country Travel* editor Melissa Biggs Bradley and it means "to discover or explore" in Latin, she tells me.
