Railroad bridge repair on 212 begins Sept. 12

Anyone who lives anywhere near the Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company bridge outside Bolivar can attest to the number of trucks that have become stuck under it through the years. There have been at least 20 over the past 17 years, according to WL&E.

All that is about to change. The railroad announced work will get underway Sept. 12 and last through Sept. 28. The plan is to change the elevation from underneath the bridge, with the hope of putting an end to the problems.

This means state Route 212 will be closed in both directions during that same

time period. Lauren Borell, public information officer for the Ohio Department of Transportation District 11, shared detour information.

“Our official detour from the north is to take I-77 South to U.S. Route 250, exiting at Strasburg, then pick up 250 West and continue on to state Route 21 North and back to state Route 212,” Borell said.

If traveling from the south, the route would simply be reversed: state Route 212 West, to state Route 21 South, to I-77 North and back to 212.

Borell said it’s a long detour, but ODOT can only route people on state routes. “Locals can, of course, find

many other ways to get around it,” she said.

Those with GPS can probably find shorter or easier alternative routes. Another resource offered by Borell is www.ohgo.com for the latest on current and upcoming road work.

Dr. Derek Varansky, superintendent of the Tusky Valley school district, said only a few families will be affected by detoured bus routes. They will be contacted individually by Scott Pennell, transportation, buildings and grounds supervisor for the school district.

Work on the track will not affect the use of the Towpath Trail or the bridge crossing the river under the tracks, according to the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition and Nick Strub, the project manager for the railroad.

The problem

Built in 1936, the bridge has a posted clearance of 12 feet, 6 inches. Nevertheless, trash trucks and semis have become stuck under it, leaving residents to shake their heads at the truck drivers.

However, according to Strub, the posted elevation is actually a bit misleading, and the road itself is part of the problem.

“It’s downhill to get

under the bridge and then kind of uphill coming out,” Strub said. “That’s why semis have such a hard time because they get halfway under and then the roadway comes back up.”

The solution

The answer, while quite simple, took a little time to develop, and funding needed to be secured. The railroad will add \$240,000 to the \$250,000 in grant money from ODOT.

Strub explained the job. “When the bridge was built, it used two 84-inch-tall girders underneath,” he said. “We’ll replace those girders with four shorter ones measuring 60 inches each so we gain 18 inches of clearance on the bridge. We’re actually raising the underside of the bridge by 2 feet, but the track itself is not changing in elevation. The girders are just getting

shallower.”

Strub said the track itself will only need to be closed for about 10 hours on Sept. 20. “We’re going to cut the rails, remove all the ties and the rail from the top,” he said. “Then we’ll replace the girders and tie the track back together.”

Future work on state Route 212

Borell said work is scheduled to begin soon on the bridge over the Tuscarawas River just west of the railroad bridge. “A lot of people have complained about the roughness of the approaches, so we do have work that is supposed to take place there this fall,” she said.

During that time, one lane of traffic will be maintained.

When it’s all said and done, truck drivers and others using the route will be able to breathe a sigh of relief.

BECOMING A MENTOR

Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio gives kids a positive role model, valuable guidance and a dependable friend. Here's how you can become one.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio has been a part of President and CEO Beverly Pearch's life since she graduated from Kent State University 13 years ago and started her first job with the agency.

"Married now, with children of my own, I understand the importance of positive role models for children," she said. "We often say, 'Your kids have a role model. Do you know who it is?' As a parent or guardian, you want that person to be giving the child the advice you want them to hear. Our mentors fill that crucial role for children every day."

Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio began serving children in 1973 throughout Tuscarawas and Carroll counties. In 2021, 338 "littles" were mentored by their "bigs" through the community-based and school-based core programs. And the agency is looking for additional volunteers because right now 36 children are waiting for mentors.

Community-based program

"Our community-based program matches an age 18 or older 'big' with their 'little' and requires a minimum of four hours per month be spent with the child," Pearch said. "Each 'big' and 'little' can schedule that time however they would like, according to their schedules."

Pearch said "bigs" often include their "little" in everyday activities like running errands and spending time with family.

"We want these interactions to be normal and comfortable," Pearch said. "It's good for 'littles' to experience positive relationships with friends and families and see their 'big' as someone they can trust and want to emulate."

School-based program

The school-based program takes place at the school the "little" attends and runs from the start of the school year through the month of May. Matches meet at the school once a week, and visits follow a curriculum based on social and emotional learning competency and growth for that child.

"For the school-based program, 'bigs' can be high school students or adults," Pearch said. "It's a great way to earn volunteer hours and to be involved in the community in a structured setting."

Volunteering as a "big" in the school-based program begins with a meeting with a mentoring specialist where the goals for the child are established. Mentoring specialists

check in regularly on the child's progress with the "big," and goals are updated every year.

"'Bigs' in the school program work on academics, behavior issues if that's relevant and other pertinent areas," Pearch said. "A 'big' is never left on their own and has contact with our agency for support at all times. Once the match is made, the 'big' and their 'little' meet at the school, work together on established goals and then share a snack."

Referrals for children involved in either program come from parents, guardians, school personnel or someone involved who sees a need for a positive role model, valuable guidance and a dependable friend.

"We try to match our 'bigs' and 'littles' based on similar interests," Pearch said.

"We want both to be comfortable working together and spending time together in more casual settings."

Other benefits

Pearch said the agency provides free activities that matches can attend, and the time goes toward that four-hour minimum. And every "little," once matched, receives a free membership to the YMCA, and their "big" can go along for activities offered there.

"Our goal is to meet each child where they are in their development and help them reach their full potential," Pearch said. "Together, matches work on academics, self-esteem, wherever the 'little' is struggling. Our 'bigs' say they are learning just as much, if not more, than their 'little.'"

Once a "little" ages out of the program at 18, Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio offers Big Futures for 18- to 24-year-olds in need of support.

"We stick with them until they are enlisted, enrolled or employed," Pearch said. "We help with things like job training, college loan applications, military enrollment and more. The goal is to see our 'littles' headed toward their own successful future."

“Project Hope” Marks Overdose Awareness Day and the Start of National Recovery Month

On International Overdose Awareness Day (August 31), a press conference was held to kick off Project Hope with the goal of raising awareness of the toll that drug overdose is taking here in Tuscarawas County. During National Recovery Month in September, residents will be able to spot wooden silhouettes throughout Tuscarawas County. The silhouettes aim to shine a light on the issues of addiction and overdoses and also serve as a memorial in remembrance of those lost to addiction. The silhouettes display statistics on the amount of reported overdoses and known overdose deaths in our towns. There are also signs included with the silhouettes advertising the Tuscarawas Substance Use Hope Line phone number (330-663-6812), emphasizing that help is available and recovery is possible.

Leaders of Project Hope want to lessen the stigma surrounding substance use disorders and spread the word that there is hope, and there is help. To empower Tuscarawas County with information about local resources, the Tuscarawas County Addiction Task Force and Empower Tusc (formerly Anti-Drug Coalition) are promoting this Project Hope community awareness.

The Project Hope press conference featured two important proclamations from our County Commissioners: one proclamation declaring August 31 as International Overdose Awareness Day, and the other declaring September as National Recovery Month. These proclamations highlight the significance of ensuring that county residents who struggle with addiction and their loved ones have access to recovery resources and support. Congressman Bill Johnson, Senator Jay Hottinger, and Representative Brett Hillyer also provided their perspectives as our State and Federal political leaders.

The press conference also included the viewpoints of two persons in recovery, Nick Javas and Kathy Bazaar, and one mother, Marlee Beatty, who lost a child to substance use. Publicizing the perspectives of those actually affected by addiction helps our community better understand the everyday battles that people touched by addiction are facing. Whether it is someone still fighting addiction, an impacted loved one, or a person in recovery, allowing a voice in a public forum is essential to help citizens better understand addiction and what the community can do to help.

The unfortunate truth is that addiction does not discriminate. Sadly, all walks of life face this problem of substance use disorder. Despite this knowledge, it is still common that persons struggling with addiction feel alone, ashamed, and isolated. These feelings too often prevent people from reaching out for help, whether it be the individual in addiction or the loved ones dealing with the effects.

Prevention efforts, stigma reduction campaigning, and making local treatment options known must be continuously prioritized to encourage individuals to seek help and support. There is always hope. Empower Tusc, the Tuscarawas County Addiction Task Force, and our local ADAMHS Board are dedicated to raising awareness and are passionate about offering treatment services.

The Substance Use Hope Line (330-663-6812) is a great option for those who don't know where to start receiving treatment and support. The following websites are also excellent resources to learn about prevention and treatment services and how to get a free Naloxone kit: The ADAMHS Board (www.adamhtc.org) and Empower Tusc (www.empowertusc.com).

Together Tuscarawas County can make it known: There is always help. There is always hope.

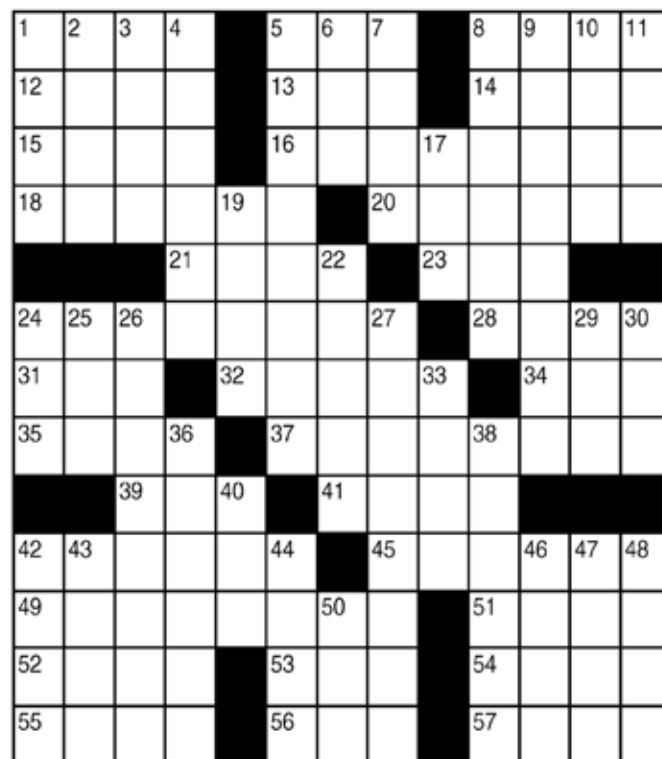

Quaker Cinema to host film festival

Quaker Cinema in downtown New Philadelphia is a place managed by and for film lovers, with a variety of movies and special events through the year.

The annual Tuscarawas Valley Film Festival this year promises to be better than ever, with seven films shown over four nights beginning Sept. 22 and running every Thursday through Oct. 13. Food for the evening events will be provided by Park Street Pizza and beer by Hoodletown Brewing Company. Wine from area wineries also will be available.

Film festival board members Ty and Jennifer Simmelink, Stephanie Price, Laura Bowe and

Jim Boose met recently at event sponsor Hoodletown Brewery to finalize plans for the upcoming festival.

“We scout the Cleveland Film Festival for ideas for films we can include,” Ty Simmelink said. “We take a look at what got an audience award or a lot of buzz. Then we also look at streaming services that are producing films that don’t get full releases, like those from major studios. Ultimately, (Quaker Cinema owner) Mike Ernest kind of weighs in on selections and has some good ideas to add to the mix. We all love movies, but Mike is the real movie guy.”

The film festival proceeds will benefit Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio.

Films showing Sept. 22 and 29 and Oct. 3 will feature a Q-and-A session with a person associated with the production. “Either a writer, producer or director, someone close to the movie, will be there,” Simmelink said.

Tickets for the film festival are available via eventbrite.com and are \$10 per night or \$30 for a VIP film festival pass, which buys admission to all four nights and a wrap party after the final film is shown Oct. 13. Food and beverages are available each night beginning at 5:30 p.m., with the movie slate beginning at 6:30 p.m.

The first film, offered Sept. 22, is “Bat Boy: Tragedy and Triumph,” the story of an inner-city kid who finds himself with a great mentor.

“We actually moved the film festival back a week this year,” Boose said, “so that we could accommodate the speaker for this movie. That’s the one I’m most looking forward to seeing.”

Movies this year include “Bat Boy” and “The Integrity of Joseph Chambers” on Sept. 22, “Open Hearts” and “A Love Song” on Sept. 29, “A Cleveland Story” and “Jethica” on Oct. 6, and “The Aqua Blue Night of Horror” on Oct. 13. The final evening will feature classic horror films. The Eventbrite page for the festival offers information about each film.

“Every year we raise money for a local charitable organization,” Jennifer Simmelink said. “We have been able to give more and more to those organizations every year. The first year it was a couple hundred dollars, but last year we were able to raise more than a thousand dollars.”

“The festival has grown every year, and every year over the last six, we’ve been able to give a little bit more,” Ty Simmelink said.

“One that will really touch people’s hearts is ‘Open Hearts’ on Sept. 29,” Ty Simmelink said. “It’s the story of doctors from Cleveland Clinic who traveled to Haiti, where they performed 12 surgeries over a four-day period for kids who had heart defects. ‘A Cleveland Story,’ showing Oct. 6, is by local native and current Cleveland resident Eric Swinderman. So we have a couple of movies with some kind of local connection.”

“The film festival is always a lot of fun,” Price said. “Anyone who loves movies should plan to be there.”

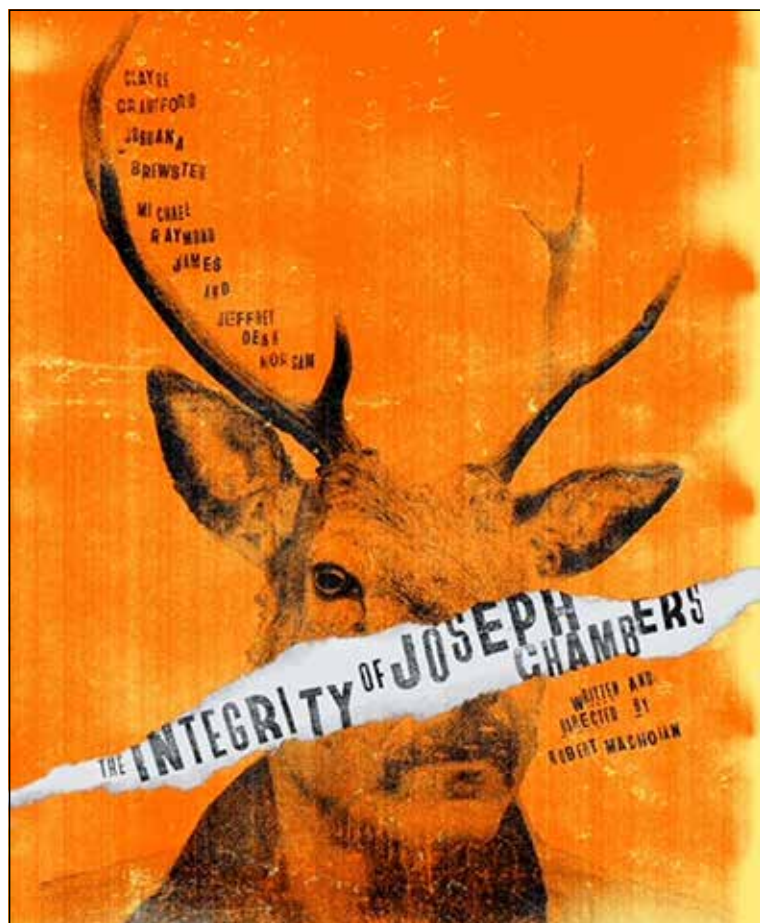

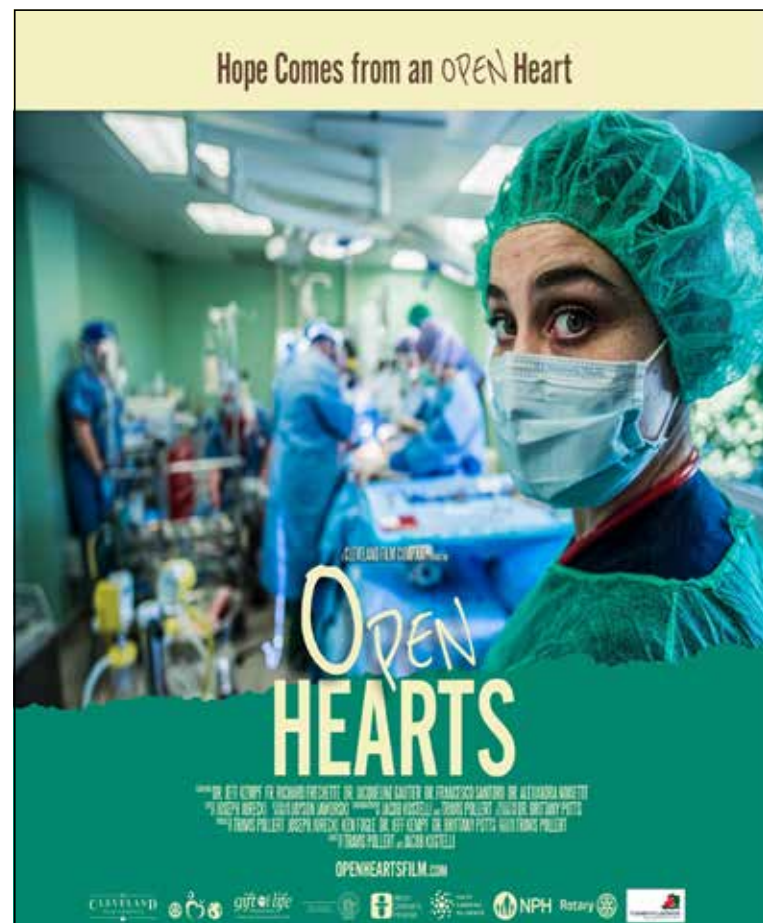

13th Towpath Century Ride is seeking volunteers

The Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition is seeking volunteers to help with its annual Huntington Towpath Century Ride. The event, which will take place Sept. 17 and 18, will finish in New Philadelphia at the Holiday Inn Express Suites at 145 Bluebell Drive SW.

“This is the 13th year for the event, which starts at Canal Basin Park in Cleveland and goes the entire 101 miles of the Towpath Trail,” said Amber Genet Barkoukis, vice president and COO for the O&EC.

The two-day ride required cyclists to raise at least \$1,000 to go toward completing the last few connector trails in Tuscarawas County.

“We don’t have novice bike riders,” Barkoukis said. “These are people who train very hard all year long to make sure they can complete this event, so it’s also a very enthusiastic group, and then it is our biggest fundraising event

of the year.”

Barkoukis said the only sections remaining to be completed are those past Route 800 and ending at Waterworks Park in New Philadelphia.

The O&EC is looking for people who can help with tasks at the finish line such as checking in riders as they finish, helping with bicycle parking, and helping at the post-event celebration by welcoming riders, guiding them toward showers and other amenities, and perhaps replenishing food during the celebration.

Volunteers are being asked to work three-hour shifts, either from 3-6 p.m. or 5-8 p.m.

Volunteers also are needed to greet and check in riders in Massillon during lunches on Saturday and Sunday at the Blue Heron Deli.

Volunteers will be given a volunteer shirt to wear during the event and the opportunity to cheer

on cyclists as they complete the ride.

A little history

Barkoukis said the Century Ride began in 2010 with just 17 bicyclists, but it has grown quickly every year. In 2021 more than 80 bicyclists raised more than \$130,000. This year 93 riders are registered with a goal of raising

\$170,000.

In Tuscarawas County there are three riders who have participated for years. Named Team ZTAP, they include Patti Himmel, Ken Johns and Joe Krockner.

The most recently completed section of the trail was made possible in part by the efforts of riders in both the Towpath 100 and the

shorter Towpath 50.

“The McDonald trailhead is a quarter-mile section, and completing it was a really big deal,” Barkoukis said. “It takes quite a bit of effort and resource to open up even a few 100 feet of the Towpath Trail.”

Completion of the remaining quarter-mile connected 90 miles of the trail and linked it with four counties. The trail now includes a bridge over the river, under the railroad and an elevated boardwalk.

“The Towpath Trail is a real quality-of-life amenity for residents and visitors because it serves a wide variety of purposes,” said Dan Rice, president and CEO of the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition. “People are out there exercising, riding bikes, relieving stress from the workday, or maybe stress at home or school.”

According to an economic impact report from 2015, 2.5 million people use the Towpath Trail each year.

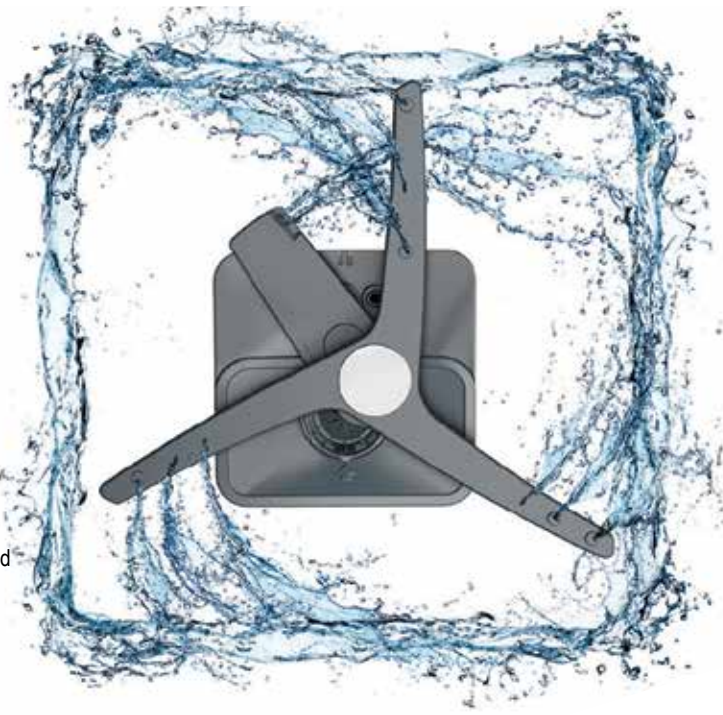

Bulk of Zoar Levee work wraps up

Repair work on the Zoar Levee, which began in earnest in July 2020 with planning dating back several years, is now nearing completion. While there is still some earth-moving equipment in place near the levee at Second Street, the removal of cement silos and other equipment from near First Street in Zoar is a welcome sight to village residents.

Nathan White from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers reviewed a schedule of the remaining work needed and took questions from stakeholders during an online meeting on Sept. 1.

According to White, the drilling of the internal erosion interceptor trench and building of a seepage berm to prevent seepage under the levee has been completed, but additional work remains.

What's to come

Once the IEIT receives final approval and is doing its job correctly, the contractor will place fill material in and perform site restoration.

White said the fill material, which is basically sand, still needs to be trucked in, put in place and then topsoil

placed over it.

Todd Newman, a representative of the construction side of the Army Corps, said they will bring that material Sept. 12-29, but that is subject to change if the IEIT does not receive final approval, which no one really foresees.

Newman also said final repaving will take place soon on Fifth and First streets. "Our contractor has asphalt removal taking place from the 19th to the 21st of October, and then from the 24th through the 27th, we'll be putting the asphalt down," he said. "On Oct. 20 they will do the pavement markings, which is also subject to change."

White said the corps will do work after the contract for the IEIT wraps up. That work includes installing 17 new piezometers and automating 23 existing ones for more and faster readings.

According to Seth Lyle with the Army Corps, additional piezometers, which will be used to continually monitor water pressure, will be installed around the end of October or early November.

The installation phase will not last nearly as long as the previous work has, nor will it be as intrusive because the operation involves only hand digging. Once installed, corps personnel at the Dover Dam will download data from the

piezometers quarterly.

White also said federal funding has come through for three more relief wells to be installed in spring 2023. Again, White said fewer disruptions would take place with installing the wells.

"It will be a far smaller scale operation than the IEIT," White said. "You'll see some drill rigs, but there won't be as much traffic. They're not going to be moving in fill or hauling out dump trucks full of sand and gravel."

A brief history

Water first began seeping under the Zoar Levee in 2005 during heavy flooding. It happened again in

2007. In 2013 residents did not know if the levee would be repaired, if the village would be allowed to flood after being purchased by the government or if the whole town would be moved to higher ground.

After examining all the options, to the relief of many, the Army Corps chose to repair the levee, which protects a National

Historic Landmark.

Work began in July 2020 with the creation of a ponding area near the pump station and relief wells to pump excess water to the pond, along with a filter along the base of the station.

The Army Corps and the Zoar Community Association plan to have a celebratory dedication when work wraps up.

Developer says he will solve problems at Olde Hilltop

Mike Durbin, the developer of the Olde Hilltop subdivision in Wilshire Hills, has been criticized by some of the homeowners in the new development, most recently for problems with a water retention basin that is not draining. Two homeowners attended the Aug. 25 meeting of the Lawrence Township Board of Trustees to go on record as being unsatisfied with the way the matter was being handled.

In a Sept. 2 interview, Durbin set out to explain what happened and how he plans to remedy the situation.

"I want to do what's right," Durbin said at the site just prior to meeting with the affected homeowners.

In fact, Durbin said he has always wanted to do what's right, but there have been a number of complicating factors from the beginning of the development.

"When I bought the land, the township trustees said they were happy to

support the development if I could keep all the water from running off the hill," he said, "not just my water, but all of it."

Durbin asked a respected engineer for help, who designed the pond and dam, which was then approved by four bodies: the township trustees, the regional planning commission, the Ohio EPA and Joe Bachman, the county engineer. Bachman had one suggestion, though, which was to add a keyway to prevent the pond from leaking under the dam.

"In addition to that, there are four sump wells measuring 6 feet deep and filled with stone. If the water gets high enough to go over the dam, it goes into these dry wells with the idea that it would dissipate into the ground," Durbin said.

The first problem

Durbin said the first problem he encountered was the soil composition.

"As we were building it, the excavator said, 'This isn't going to drain very fast because there's clay down here.' This whole hillside is mostly clay, so the water doesn't dissipate."

Durbin said he considered punching small holes in the dam to allow the water to trickle through. However, he said if the water were

to divert to neighboring properties, he could find himself in legal trouble, so that option is out.

"So here's the dilemma: We've got a pond that won't drain. I'm not allowed to dump it onto the neighbor's, but I have to get rid of it," Durbin said.

Durbin said someone mentioned the lack of silt

fences at the township meeting, which he said is the responsibility of the homeowners, one of whom has recently installed a fence. "Having said that, as a developer I should have told them they had to do this, but it didn't get done."

The result in the spring, before grass grew in the lawns, was a muddy mess.

In addition, Durbin said construction debris blew into the pond and was never cleaned up. "So if any of those rock sump wells were going to work, they have no chance of working now because it's all covered with mud, silt and clay."

On the bright side, now that the lawns are coming in, there should be no more mud issues. In addition, one of the residents has seeded the ditch in front of his property, which Durbin said will help. Durbin owns the end lot, which has yet to be seeded.

Durbin said he has a silt fence on the land he owns that he intends to reinforce. "Then I think we need to pump out the water and clean out the mud that's on the bottom. What I don't know is what to do next. If we clean it out and restone on the four dry wells, it's just a matter of time before it silts over again because

it's still built on top of clay."

Durbin said he will consult with engineers to try to solve the problem. "There's always going to be water, even though some of it will dissipate if we can get a system that will allow it to do that. I'm sure there's an engineering feat of some sort that maybe can take care of it, but I don't know what that is yet."

As for cleaning out the

pond, Durbin said he was told by the excavator it would be best to wait until the ground freezes a bit. "He said, 'If I do it in this mud, it will just be a muddy mess, but if I do it after it's frozen, the mud comes up in chunks like rock, and it's easy for me to clean up.' So I'm not delaying it intentionally — there's a rationale behind it."

In the end Durbin said he is limited in what he can do. "I can only do what the regulations will allow."

“There are two- and four-year programs represented, vocational training, military options, and businesses presenting what they have to offer. Everyone, it seems, is in need of good employees right now, and companies benefit from being able to talk to potential workers. The day is a win for students and for colleges and businesses.”

College and Career Day is set up similarly to a tailgate party, Tidrick said, and is held in the parking lot outside the university.

“Everyone who participates gets a space and a table,” she said. “Students can get a lot of good information from a large number of sources all in one place. They wouldn’t likely be able to talk to so many people otherwise.”

She said feedback from attendees on both sides of the table was excellent in 2021.

“We know that the key to success in any job is to find what you really love to do and stick with it,” Tidrick said. “The saying is to do what you love and you’ll never work a day in your life, and that’s so. The Career Day allows kids to look for the thing they might like to make a career of. If you’re doing some-

thing that is important to you and that you care about, success and money fall into place much more easily. We’re pleased to provide a venue for kids to see some of the many possibilities open to them.”

A few of the schools and businesses scheduled to attend the College and Career Day are Ashland University, Aultman College of Nursing and Health, Eleet Cryogenics, Heidelberg University, Muskingum University, Ohio University, United States Army Academy at West Point, ProVia, and Plumbers and Pipefitters Local Union 495. The list is sure to surpass last year, Tidrick said.

We are fortunate to have a balance of lush, green



pasture land; fertile, tillable fields; and a large amount of productive woodlands along with creeks, streams, ponds and lakes.

Particularly in the fall, we get to witness the beauty of the leaves changing colors along with the crops in the field getting prepared for harvest. None of this happens by accident.

The producers in our area work very hard and have done a magnificent job of adopting procedures and practices to protect the natural resources we

are blessed with. There is always room for improvement and new practices. However, with the adoption of practices such as pasture management, rotational grazing, fencing out riparian areas, broad use of no till in crop production, cover crops and woodland management, we have made great strides to protect the natural resources that make our area so unique.

The producers in this area have taken many of the necessary steps to protect our soil and water so future generations also can benefit from these natural resources. This responsibility falls on all of us, not just the agricultural producers.

Just a couple examples of what a homeowner could do to assist in protecting our soil and water would be to not over fertilize a lawn or responsible use of chemicals when treating unwanted vegetation.

Many of these practices

have been implemented with the assistance of your local county soil and water conservation districts. Funded by the county commissioners along with the state, county soil and water conservation districts consist of a board of supervisors along with dedicated employees who are passionate about the conservation of our natural resources.

These employees are tasked with assisting producers, property owners and more with the availability and implementation of these practices, which not only protect, but also often improve our natural resources.

No, you do not necessarily need to be a farmer to benefit from the assistance of your local soil and water. It could be an issue with a recreational pond, potential home site or drainage in your backyard, along with myriad other issues or questions

you might have.

It truly does not matter whether you are running 500 mama cows, row cropping 1,000 acres, milking 500 cows, have a half-acre backyard or just simply want to learn more about the protection and improvement of our natural resources. Your local county soil and water conservation district has something for everyone.

This fall I encourage everyone, whether you are driving down a country road, sitting in a combine, on a utility vehicle checking cows or sitting on a front porch enjoying the color of the leaves, to take just a minute to appreciate the abundance of natural beauty and resources our corner of Ohio has to offer. Hoping everyone has a safe and bountiful fall season.
