Fairless Alumni Association to honor Belloni

Chris Belloni, a Fairless High School student alumni, was well known and loved in the community before his untimely passing in May of this year just before his 41st birthday. In his honor the Fairless Alumni Association is planning a Wall of Excellence, which will bear his name.

Belloni had been secretary of the alumni association and was active with the group. The Wall of Excellence will feature a kiosk and enclosure measuring 9 by 6 feet.

"Chris was the absolute epitome of a kind soul," said Elizabeth Musacchia, alumni association treasurer. "I knew Chris from the time he was a child. He had this deep empathy and compassion for others. He was highly

intelligent but at ease with everyone. It didn't matter who he was talking to or what they were talking about — he could make anyone feel comfortable. He had a quite dry sense of humor and laughed a lot. He liked to cook and grill outdoors.

"Chris' family meant everything to him. He loved to go to Disney World with family and recently went with just his daughter, the two of them. That's the kind of loving dad he was."

Belloni was quite close with his father, and the two operated Belloni Foods, a Brewster grocery store, which has been in the family for four generations. Belloni's mother and brother passed away when he was young of the same illness that took his life this year.

Belloni handled computer systems and IT for the store. "He was really good at that," Musacchia said. "At Christmastime he set up the lights and decorations outside at his house so they were synced up with music. I don't know how he did it, but it was amazing."

Jacqueline Musacchia, vice president for the Fairless Alumni Association, said it was Belloni's love and passion for technology that led the group to the idea

of the memorial kiosk.

"It just made sense to do something like this. He loved technology, and we felt this was the most appropriate and best way to memorialize him. It brings together so many of the things he loved. Chris was all about serving others in the community, and the kiosk is a good way

to honor him," Jacqueline Musacchia said.

When the idea for a memorial to Belloni came about, the alumni association knew it wanted to do something special.

"We have a Hall of Honor for former students who have made great accomplishments in their

lives," Elizabeth Musacchia said. "We wanted to create a forum to share all that information. The Chris Belloni Wall of Excellence is not just for athletes, but for anyone with any kind of accomplishment."

The goal is to have the wall ready when the new Fairless High School building is ready in spring 2023. The organization has raised \$8,000 of the estimated \$20,000 needed to bring the memorial to fruition.

The kiosk will be placed near the main entrance of the new school building and will unite many of Belloni's passions: service to others, history, technology and devotion to community. It will be an interactive experience, sharing history, photos and stories about Hall of Honor members. The kiosk will be fully searchable and connected to the internet so the information it contains will be available globally.

Township keeping eye on work

American Electric Power is removing trees along Eberhard Road in Lawrence Township in preparation for running new power lines to Speedie Auto Salvage for its new car crusher.

Township road supervisor Chuck McNutt said while most of the work is being done on private property, he is keeping an eye on the work to make sure no issues arise with storm water runoff and that no damage is done to the recently paved road.

"We look at the beginning of the day and at the end of the day," McNutt said to the township board of trustees during its Oct. 27 meeting. "I had to stop twice today to make them get the brush out of the ditches before it rains. That hill is delicate, and it does have a big dip. We have to watch how the water ends up coming off the hill so we don't lose our road."

McNutt also said a driveway is being installed at a residence on Welton Road without a driveway permit. Zoning inspector Ron Weekley will look into the matter.

In a related matter, chairman Matt Ritterbeck reported receiving an email from a resident of Old Drum Road asking the township to install an apron on her driveway. McNutt said confusion may have resulted from the wording of the road levy on the Nov. 3 ballot.

The township does not install driveway aprons but has occasionally repaired or connected some while paving. Ritterbeck asked trustees to develop a written policy regarding aprons, which provide a transition between concrete driveways and roads. The apron in question is gravel.

Resident thanks trustees for help

Ryan Sluss thanked Weekley and the board for helping resolve a three-year-old issue with an individual running a landscaping business out of his father's home on Laurens Drive.

Lawrence Township officials are keeping tabs on work being performed along Eberhard Road to make sure the road is not damaged by storm runoff from tree removal.

The business owner allegedly was parking trucks and other vehicles on the road, using parking space needed by the residents. Sluss also had complained about trucks using his driveway and additional trespassing issues.

Weekley said he also received a call from the school because the buses were having difficulty turning around in the cul-de-sac due to the parked vehicles. Weekley spoke with the business owner and believes the matter may be resolved, but he pledged to keep an eye on it.

In other matters

McNutt reported on crack and seal work, saying he and Ritterbeck had recently driven township roads to identify the spots needing the most work.

A public hearing for a zoning variance for a property on Fort Laurens Road will be held Nov. 3 at 7 p.m. at the township hall.

Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, trustees agreed to move the Nov. 24 meeting to Tuesday, Nov. 22 at 7 p.m.

The board passed a resolution approving the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Recycling District's revised five-year plan.

Always ready to do what was necessary,
Tusky Valley's Willard Himes receives award

Those who know him well have called Willard Himes a wealth of knowledge and a tremendous worker who could give the Energizer Bunny a run for his money. For these reasons and more, Himes was recently recognized by the Ohio School Boards Association Northeast Region as the 2022 Classified Employee of the Year. Himes received the award in October at the association's fall conference at the Galaxy Restaurant in Wadsworth.

Himes sat down for an interview on his 82nd birthday at his Sandy Township home. It's a home he helped his father build in 1958, and it's where he eventually took over the family's dairy farming business.

It was the unexpected demise of that business that led Himes to seek a position with Tusky Valley Local Schools.

"In '81 I lost a bunch of cattle through nitrate poisoning," he said. "We were milking 100 head

of cows at that time, and I had just invested \$175,000 in equipment. So there I was, a set of twins, 40 years old and broke. But you can't give up."

Himes pulled himself up by the boot straps and began driving bus as a substitute that year, becoming a full-time driver in 1987. During that time he would clean the high school in the summer, working his way into a custodian's position in 1988.

Himes retired — the first time — in 2008, but when bus drivers were in short supply, he returned as a substitute in 2008 and retired the second time, then came back full-time when drivers again became scarce during the pandemic.

Not your typical employee

Those who nominated Himes for the award did so because he has always worked above and beyond his job description. He was instrumental in building the high school soccer and softball fields, often using his own farm

equipment and putting in \$4,000 of his own money to build the dugouts.

Steve Franks, Tusky Valley's athletic director, said in his support of nomination letter that Himes single-handedly created the crown on the football field for water drainage.

"Willard has always been a tremendous worker, but when you add in his love and pride for Tusky Valley High School, you get someone very special and impossible to replace," Franks said.

Among his many contributions, Himes also ran water lines to the athletic fields for irrigation, helped build the football ticket booth and put in electricity for lighting the soccer and softball fields.

"Call Willard"

Himes has done so much work and knows so much about the building and grounds that whenever tough questions arise, the familiar refrain of "Call Willard" can still be heard up and down the school halls.

"At one point we had a question about where the breaker was for an outlet in the gymnasium and could not find the electrical plans," said Jason Phillips, the high school principal. "So we called Willard."

Himes confirmed having received many calls over the years. "Even now when they're building the new school, the construction company has called me a few times asking where things are," he said.

Himes said he enjoyed his

school bus routes, but he especially loved driving the athletic teams to their events. "The kids all liked me," he said. "I think it's because I understand them being kids. I mean there's always a regulation you're supposed to go by, but I bent that pretty good."

When the high school softball team won the district title last year, they made sure to recognize Himes as well. "They gave me a medallion like theirs and a big hug," he said.

Finally retired?

Himes officially retired for the third time on Aug. 31 of this year. He said he and his wife Jane have no particular plans yet. Himes is still a working trustee for Sandy Township. "If the economy keeps

going the way it is, I might have to find something else, too, to get a little spending money," he said.

Perhaps he will use that money to add to the Farmall tractor collection, which currently stands at 30 and a Farmall M his father bought in 1948.

Mark Murphy, former superintendent for TVLS, recently said of Himes, "At 82 years old, he still works circles around most of us. He runs on all cylinders to get things done. He has a heart of gold and will do anything he can to serve those around him."

Perhaps Murphy summed it up best when he said, "His service and devotion is unwavering. He is a man who has helped show how anyone can make an impactful difference in students' lives."

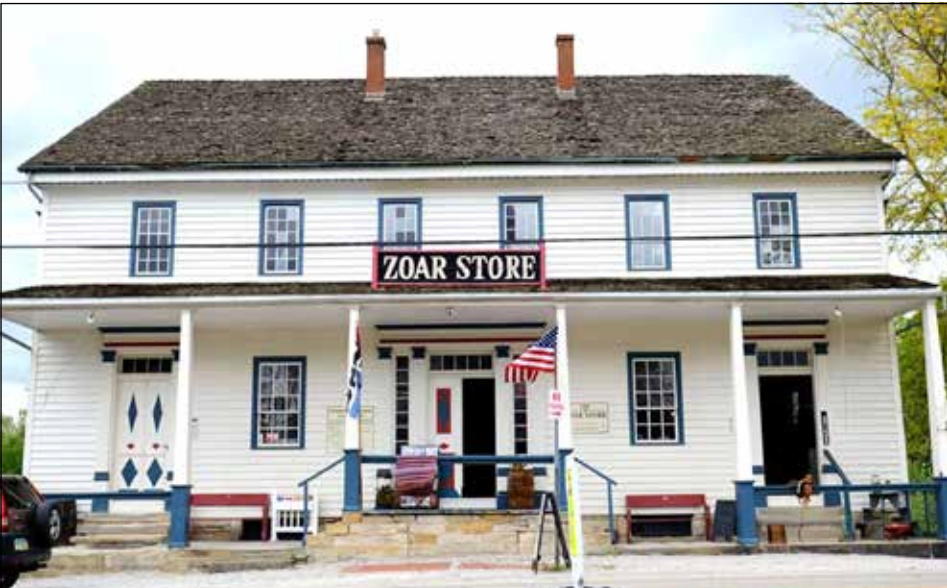

Admission to Historic Zoar Village is free for veterans on Friday, Nov. 11 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Veterans can stop by the counter in the Zoar Store and Visitors Center at 198 Main St. to gain free access to the village's museum tour and buildings. A form of veteran identification is required.

Admission free for veterans at area attractions Nov. 11

National Historic Landmark Historic Zoar Village and Fort Laurens, Ohio's only Revolutionary War-era fort, will both be open Friday, Nov. 11 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission for all veterans is free in recognition of Veterans Day.

"We want to thank veterans for their service and their role in preserving our nation's past, present and future," said

Tammi Shrum, historic sites director. "These sites are only 3 miles from each other but show America's great diversity. Zoar was a 19th century communal settlement while Fort Laurens was used as a base on the western front of the American Revolution."

Despite the pacifist philosophies of the German Separatists who founded Zoar in 1817, several men from

the village joined the Union Army during the Civil War. Of the 14 who enlisted, 13 survived and returned home following the war.

At Fort Laurens, more than 20 American soldiers died during a British siege in 1779. Today, an unidentified soldier in the conflict is interred at Fort Laurens' Tomb of the Unknown Patriot. The tomb memorializes all unknown casualties of the American Revolution.

While veterans' admission is free at both sites on Nov. 11, visitors accompanying them may purchase a combo ticket for both Zoar and Fort Laurens. Admission to both sites is \$12 for adults and \$6 for age 5-17. Admission for children age 4 and under is free.

TuscBDD proposes 1.7 mill renewal operating levy

The Tuscarawas County commissioners approved the Tuscarawas County Board of Developmental Disabilities' request to put a 1.7 mill renewal operating levy on the Nov. 8 ballot. This levy was first passed in 1993, and since that time much has changed.

The levy will not increase taxes; however, it will continue the existing levy in order to provide the funds to support over 600 children and adults with developmental disabilities in Tuscarawas County. There are no new taxes with the renewal levy, and it will cost the owner of a \$100,000 house \$26.76 annually.

Over the last several years, the need for youth-specific options has increased, especially for youth with intensive behavioral needs. The number of children being served by TuscBDD has been on the rise, and the team has spent a lot of time and funding on

creating local solutions for families.

"We created innovative services for youth and adults over these past several years, and to keep operating at this capacity, we will need to renew this funding," TuscBDD Superintendent Nate Kamban said. "Our priority is to keep families together and to help them to learn how to support each other. Because these types of very specific, specialized services were scarce, we made the decision to build local capacity for children with intensive needs. The services and supports that TuscBDD provides to children and their families in our community are free and primarily funded through local levy dollars. This is one of the many reasons that the passage of this levy is critical for people with disabilities in our community."

TuscBDD provides a variety of services to people with developmental dis-

abilities from birth through the end of life.

"We realize that we have a lifelong commitment to each person we serve. We have been serving Tuscarawas County for over 60 years, and many things changed during that time.

However, we have always promoted safety, wellness and success for those being served by TuscBDD. We will always work to establish a culture of inclusion, diversity and innovation for all," Kamban said. "The Tuscarawas County community has always strongly supported people with disabilities, and we are so thankful for their continuous support. We are counting on the community to continue this by supporting the levy in November."

TuscBDD uses its operating levy dollars to provide services, supports and funding to over 600 individuals with developmental disabilities in Tuscarawas County. Some of those services include the following:

- Service and support administration.
- Early intervention for children from birth to age 3 including speech, occupational and physical therapy.
- Starlight Preschool and school-age classrooms.

- Starlight School Specialized Services Program for public school districts.

- Youth in Crisis Stabilization Homes.

- In-home behavioral support programs.

- Family support services.

- Funding for adult day services.

- Provider support programs.

- Residential services.

- Respite services for

youth and adults.

- Self-advocacy.

- Assistance with obtaining community employment.

- Transition youth services.

- Summer programs at the Starlight School.

- Family mentorship.

- Special Olympics.

- FANS Network, which provides opportunities for individuals with and without disabilities to connect.

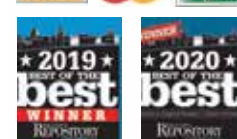

How do I know if I have TMJ Disorder?

When someone has jaw pain, pain in or around the ear, and/or popping or clicking in front of the ear, they're likely to ask their dentist if they have "TMJ."

The term "TMJ" is an abbreviation that refers to the jaw joint, known as the temporomandibular joint.

Everyone has these joints, and they allow us to chew, swallow, speak and keep our airways open.

When someone asks if they have "TMJ," it is more likely that they have a temporomandibular joint disorder, or TMD.

Resident is no longer supporting levies in Bolivar

Letter to the Editor,

It's fascinating the Village of Bolivar is seeking to double their police levy from 2 to 4 mills, yet council just approved historic raises in the face of epic inflation and imminent recession. Where are the tax payers' raises to afford this frivolous spending?

I was quickly chastised by the mayor at the last council meeting on Oct. 3 when I questioned why the village wasn't disclosing to the public of the \$41,000 in new levy monies. It will only translate to a net gain of \$20,820.

I stated approximately 49% of the proposed levy would be used on police raises alone, all while cutting out the patrol hours by approximately 24-32 hours per week.

The mayor angrily responded, "The levy doesn't have anything to do with the raises, which are not tied into the levy passing, so for you to say that is not truthful."

He became further disparaging and combative by



saying I was purposely being deceptive. "You're trying to confuse the public because you don't think they understand. I'm hoping they are smarter than you give them credit for."

I could have sugar coated it by saying the village will spend the equivalent of 49% of the proposed new 4 mill levy on police raises alone.

Brewster store will be missed

I was so saddened to hear of the closing of a wonderful local business, Belloni's in Brewster. Serving the community for 114 years is an amazing accomplishment. The store will be dearly missed, and I hope a local buyer can be found

No matter how you cut it, the rogue raises will affect the overall budget. Whether using new levies, old levies or the general fund, substantial monies are being paid out of the aggregate village funds to pay for these raises.

The village claims they aren't spending any new money on the police; they are basically reinvesting into raises the money saved from no longer having the third FT officer. Yet the village is seeking to increase the police levy by 2 mills to help reduce the "deficit" in the General Fund (stated in

the newsletter).

The mayor also stated in the paper, "It will free up money to support the street department or pursue capital improvement projects."

This makes me question the real reason for the levy. Is it for the police, capital projects and/or the street department?

The village alleges a concern about a deficit in the General Fund, yet they recently reduced the income tax revenue in that fund by 9%, increasing the Street Fund by 9%. If alleviating the deficit was such a prior-

ity, then why not give modest raises, map out resources for departmental needs, plan future cruiser replacements and set aside money? Have a plan for training, equipping the officers and increasing coverage.

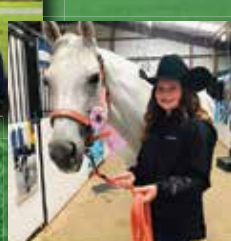

The Indian Valley cross country team is growing overall, according to coach Bill Palma.

"The current senior class has 11 runners in it, which is a huge class to graduate. It will be hard to replace their leadership," Palma said. "But we will have seven eighth-graders joining the high school program next year. We also had about 35 kids from grades k-6 complete the season with our Biddy program."

The team starts practicing the end of June each year with open runs.

"We ran Monday through Thursday together and then asked the kids to run one day independently over the week-end. Once official practices start on Aug. 1, we practice five days a week and then have meets on Saturdays," Palma said.

Palma said Indian Valley has the largest cross country program in Tuscarawas County.

"We have 15 high school boys, 13 high school girls, eight middle school boys and seven middle school girls," Palma said.

Palma is happy with his team on and off the course.

"My proudest moment this season actually came

from off the course. At our district championship meet, the Minerva boys team lost one of their runners in a tragic accident. Running is like a family, and our kids have responded so well to this," Palma said. "Throughout the following week, our team collected donations for the Grubb family and raised \$700 from just cash donations that we presented to their team the following

week at regionals. Our runners are great athletes, but they are even better young men and women."

Indian Valley earned their way to the regional championship meet, where the varsity boys finished 12th. Xander Heil, a senior, quali-

fied for the state championship by finishing 13th overall with a time of 16:23. Other scorers for the Braves were Joe Carlisle in 29th place at 17:01, Max Kinsey in 59th at 17:41, Seth Krockner in 106th at 18:28 and Delaney Phillips in 119th at 18:47.

The varsity girls finished 15th overall. Rylee Raymond, a senior, qualified for the state championship by placing 20th with a time of

20:03. Also scoring for the Lady Braves were Brooklyn Myers in 95th at 22:15, Ali-sha Shaw in 111th at 22:50, Loretta Johnson in 124th at 23:19 and Gia Miller in 137th at 23:58.

The state cross country championship runs will be held Nov. 5. In the meantime, mark your calendars to support these athletes and complete some early holiday shopping.

Medicare premium costs to be reduced 3% in 2023

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've read retirees will get a nice cost-of-living increase in our Social Security benefits next year, but what about Medicare? What will our Medicare Part B monthly premiums and other Medicare costs be in 2023?

Planning Ahead

Dear Planning,

From an entitlement program standpoint, 2023 is going to be a very good year for retirees. Not only will you receive a nice 8.7% cost-of-living increase in your Social Security retirement benefits — the largest since 1981 — but also the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services recently announced your Medicare Part B standard monthly premium will be lowered 3% or \$5.20 from the current rate of \$170.10 per month to \$164.90 per month in 2023.

The reason for the reduction is a correction to last year's hefty Part B premium increase, which was larger than it needed to be. The 2022 premium hike of about 14.5% was announced amid uncertainty about the potential impact of a new Alzheimer's drug called Aduhelm, which threatened to explode Medicare costs. That didn't happen. The cost of the drug was cut roughly in half from an original \$56,000 a year, and Medicare sharply limited coverage. This created

a large financial reserve for Part B, allowing the program to reduce next year's premium.

You'll also be happy to know that in addition to the premium reduction, the annual deductible for Medicare Part B also will be lowered \$7 from \$233 in 2022 to \$226 in 2023. And if you have a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan, the average premium in 2023 will be about \$31.50, which is a 1.8% decrease from \$32.08 in 2022.

But the news isn't all rosy. The deductible for Medicare Part A — hospital coverage — per benefit period, which generally starts when you are admitted to the hospital, will be \$1,600 in 2023, up \$44 from this year's \$1,556. That applies to the first 60 days of inpatient care. For days 61-90, the coinsurance will be \$400 per day, up from \$389 this year. And for days 91-150, the charge will be \$800 per day, up from \$778 in 2022. And the skilled nursing facility coinsurance for days 21-100 also will increase to \$200 per day, up from \$194.50 in 2022.

Wealthy beneficiary breaks

High-earning Medicare beneficiaries, which make up about 7% of all Medicare recipients, also will receive a break in 2023. Medicare surcharges for high earners are based on adjusted gross income from two years earlier, which means 2023 Part B premiums are determined by 2021 annual income.

So if your 2021 income was above \$97,000 up to \$123,000 and \$194,000 up to \$246,000 for married couples filing jointly, your 2023 Part B monthly premium will be \$230.80, down from \$238.10 in 2022.

Monthly premiums for singles with an income between \$123,000 and \$153,000 or \$246,000 and \$306,000 for joint filers will decrease from \$340.20 to \$329.70 in 2023.

Individuals earning above \$153,000 up to \$183,000 or \$306,000-\$366,000 for joint filers will see their monthly premium decrease from \$442.30 to \$428.60 in 2023.

Those with incomes above \$183,000 up to \$500,000 or \$366,000-\$750,000 for joint filers, your 2023 Part B premium will be \$527.50, down from \$544.30 in 2022.

And single filers with income of \$500,000 or more or \$750,000 or more for joint filers will pay \$560.50 per month next year, versus this year's premium of \$578.30.

High-income beneficiaries with a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan also will pay a little less next year. If your income was over \$97,000 or \$194,000 for joint filers, you'll pay a \$12.20-\$76.40 monthly surcharge on top of your regular Part D premiums based on your income level.
