Strasburg Village Council

Street extension still has no completion date

Strasburg Village Council passed an ordinance, as an emergency, at the Aug. 1 meeting to hire Donna Reiger and Michelle Dickerhoof as crossing guards for the 2023-24 school year, effective immediately, with the start date and work hours determined by Police Chief Dave Warrick. The first day of school is Aug.

A lengthy discussion was held concerning extension of Seventh Street Northwest, located between Williams Village and Dale Avenue. Louie Dreher, a resident, asked when the street will be completed. He said when he served on council 10 years ago, the competition of the street was discussed. Councilwoman Liz Dreher, chairman of the street and alley committee, was asked to set up a meeting with Mark/ Brad Malcuit, developers, about the street.

Council did the follow-

-Heard councilwoman Kathy Burrier has submitted applications for grants for tornado sirens to Reeves and Rosenberry foundations, prior to the deadline.

-Passed an ordinance regulating a sidewalk replacement and repair program. Nothing in section 55.01-55.015 shall be construed or require a property owner to reconstruct an existing sidewalk that is in good and safe condition, as determined by the village administrator. Property owners can qualify for assistance if proper information is filed with the vil-

-Heard from Fire Chief Steve Laskey that the squad responded on July 30 to three calls in 90 minutes. If help is needed, a text goes

to contact mutual aid.

—Learned the fire department has been awarded a FEMA grant for an apparatus bay exhaust system to allow for the exhaust fumes to be removed from the bays

-Heard since September 2022 the fire department has been requested more often by neighboring departments. Previously to March 2022, only 1-2% of fire responses were to Dover. Now it is 8.1%, and New Philadelphia Fire has requested mutual aid. Since the plans have been implemented in the fire department, it has proven successful.

-Received a quote of \$4,785 to place seven Norway spruce trees and eight arborvitaes on Haswell Circle. Mayor Steve Smith will visit all the residents on Haswell Circle to get their opinion.

-Heard from Louie Dreher that council has done exactly as promised using the 1/2 percent village income tax income funds to repair streets. Over \$400,000 is collected annually for street repair.

Passed an ordinance, by 4-2, to lower the speed limit from Second Street to Ninth Street on Wooster Avenue to 25 mph. Marty Zehnder and Dustin Briggs voted no.

-Adopted an ordinance rezoning Village Hall from B-3 (business) to S-1 (special).

Strasburg Back to School Bash set

The annual Strasburg Back to School Bash will kick off Aug. 21 at 4 p.m. with a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new multipurpose facility located off Tiger Drive.

Superintendent Vince Lindsey said the new facility is a celebration of the work that has been done for the past year in the district. Inside the facility are basketball and volleyball courts, softball and baseball nets, a walking track, and weight room. The floor will allow softballs and baseballs to hit the floor without damaging it.

"This will allow student-athletes to hold practices and be home at a reasonable time," Lindsey said.

There also are restrooms, storage and a mechanical room. Double doors will lock so the public using the facility are not able to enter the school without permission. Designated times will be made available for the community to use the facility.

The \$3 million facility was paid by COVID funds, donations from the Tiger Foundation, the district and other donations.

Beaver Construction was the construction manager at risk. Lesko Associates was hired as the design

Bolivar man has sold roadside corn for 3 decades

ne could be forgiven for thinking the nickname "Corny" was given to a man because he sold roadside corn for 32 years. However, the moniker was bestowed upon Gary Cornell by one of his junior high coaches at Tusky Valley in the 1970s.

For more than three decades. Cornell's corn, tomatoes and other crops have drawn families to his stand in Wilkshire Hills. The last day for sales this year was July 30.

'Our motto is if people don't

like what they got here, all they have to do is come back. We'll replace it or give them their money back," Cornell said.

Sowing the seeds

"How it all started was we had built our house, and then I had to have open heart surgery," Cornell said. "I was working at Nickles Bakery, and I was running out of breath. I could hardly work.

The late Dr. Dan McDonnell of Bolivar pinpointed the cause: a birth defect that left Cornell with a half-developed aortic valve.



Valve-replacement surgery was performed, and soon, Cornell was back in business.

There was just one little problem. "My insurance didn't pay all the medical bills," Cornell said. "So my uncle said, 'Well, come down here and do what your dad and granddad did -raise produce and sell it alongside the road.' So that's what we did.'

Initially, Cornell would finish his shift at the bakery, come home and eat dinner, then hit the highway, traveling to Meigs County in Southern Ohio, where his family's fields were.

"I would be gone by 7:30 in the evening, drive all the way down there after being up all day, load up and get out of there, hopefully by six in the morning, to get back up here and start selling. Over time it just got bigger and bigger as more people came to buy corn," Cornell said.

Adventures along the way

Cornell has plenty of stories to tell of his 32 years on the road. One story involves being pulled over by an Ohio State Highway Patrol officer when returning to Bolivar, towing his harvest in a trailer.

"I was tired, and I thought he was going to get me for weaving because I was falling asleep, Cornell said.

It turned out the officer just wanted to alert Cornell to the fact his taillights were out on the

After fixing the lights, the officer asked what Cornell had in the trailer. "I showed it to him, and he said, 'Where are you located?' I told him, and this guy was out of the Cambridge post, but he said, 'I'll be up tomorrow to buy some corn,' and by God he came up," Cornell said.

Further road warrior tales include selling corn to people at gas stations and on exit ramps along the way.

Back when the truck drivers and other people used CB radios, the truckers would ask, 'What do you got on there?' I'd tell them, and they'd say 'pull over at the next exit. I want some.' I didn't even have bags to put it in, so they'd carry it off in their arms and put it down on the front floorboards. I don't know how many times that happened," Cornell said.

All in the family

Taking a lesson from his father and grandfather, Cornell has made his produce stand a family business. His wife Janet has been

there from the beginning, and his down inside the kids are proud. brother Don helps out now.

"I owe a lot to Jan because there aren't too many women that would work the way she does with me because it's hard work with a lot of lifting," Cornell said. "And our anniversary is July 14, and what do we do on July 14? Sell corn."

Cornell's children, Kevin and Rachel, were raised selling corn. "My kids learned a work ethic,

they learned how to count money and make change, and they'd count it back to the customers, which is unheard of these days, he said.

After paying off those surgery bills, Cornell's produce sales paid for both children to go to college and for family vacations, home improvements and other projects.

'I couldn't have done this without them." Cornell said. "I'm proud of them, and I think deep

They saw that we were doing this for them."

Recently, the Cornell's stand had to change locations after the new baseball field complex opened on Arrowhead Road, not because the owners asked him to move, but out of concern all the traffic, combined with the cars lining both sides of the road, may cause an accident.

After a few days selling at the site of a burned-down car wash on Edgebrook Road, Terri Davis, owner of Ohio Billing, invited the Cornells to set up in her parking

"Terri buys a lot every year," Cornell said. "When she saw where we were set up, she moved us over there and even put my name up on her sign. We owe her a lot.'

Although retired from the bakery, Cornell now drives a bus for Tusky Valley, has served as a statistician for several school sports and volunteers time for many school events. It's a practice that has earned him yet another nickname: Mr. Tusky Valley.

"Volunteering for the school is just like selling corn," Cornell said. "It's in my blood."

When asked about future plans for the produce stand. Cornell said, "My health the last couple of years has not been good, and one of these years, I'm going to have to stop doing it. I've had some close calls, and I've had some times I probably shouldn't have been out there. But Lord willing. I'll be there next year."

Fairless Local Schools cuts ribbon on new school

Fairless Local Schools held a ribbon cutting and dedication of the 130,000-square-foot new high school building on Aug. 4.

The new high school for ninth grade through 12th grade is located at 800 Seventh St. SE in Brewster. Demolition has begun on the 1967 high school located at 11885 Navarre Road. The area will be filled in, seeded, graded and turned into a green space.

A large crowd attended the event held in front of the new high school. A memorial and flag pole were relocated from the former high school to the front of the new school. The Brewster American Legion Post #160 raised the flag.

Fairless Superintendent Michael Hearn said there is a great sense of pride in the new school. He said the community can smile about this new school and commended retired Superintendent Broc Bidlack for the hours spent at the site while the school was being constructed.

"Today is about the future and all the excitement that comes with the opportunity before us, which will impact generations of Fairless

families. Soon, we will open the doors of this new building to the community. I have walked these halls many times the past year, and each time I cannot help but feel an immense sense of pride and awe that this is ours. Take the 21st century tools and resources and do great things with them. Keep Soaring to Excellence," Hearn said.

Hearn and band members chanted, "We are Fairless, couldn't be prouder. If you can't hear us, we will yell a little louder."

Hearn introduced the board of education: Dr. Jody Seward, president; Hope Hill, vice president; Ken Killian; Charles Snyder; and Jason Kirby, whose vision, leadership and service made the project possible, along with treasurer Mark Phillips, who had a vision to take advantage of the revenue generated by Rover Natural Gas Pipeline. Administrators, teachers and other dignitaries were in attendance.

Bidlack said in October 2014, Phillips and he attended a community meeting held in East Sparta to hear about a proposed Rover Pipeline project. He said this initiated a dream of building a new high school.

"We have gathered here tonight because of the realization of that dream to dedicate this new high school to the students of this great Fairless community so they can begin to dream and prepare for their future," Bidlack said. "I am pleased and excited for all of you to see this brand-new, state-of-the-art high school that will serve generations of Fairless students.

"We never halted planning during the pandemic in 2020, which allowed us to lock in the construction of this building before major inflation hit the construction industry. I want to recognize the Construction Academy, which consisted of about 18 Fairless High students who participated in the construction."

The total cost of the new construction was \$34 million with \$13 million provided through the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission. The remaining \$21 million was tax revenue from the Rover Natural Gas Pipeline. The district completely funded the project without asking voters for a bond issue.

Lesko and Associates of Westlake, Ohio was the architect on the project, and Regency Construction Services of Lakewood was hired as the construction management risk team. Others participating in the dedication were Seward; Brandon Simmons, Rivertree-Fairless church; Robb Blatchford, Lesko Architects; Tari Rivera, Regency Construction Services; and the Fairless High School band. Visitors were able to tour the new high school after the dedication.

An open house will be held for kindergarten through 12th grade on Aug. 18 from 4-6:30 p.m. The first day of school for first through sixth grade and ninth grade is Aug. 22, and the first day for seventh, eighth and 10th through 12th grade is Aug. 23. Kindergarten students have a staggered start.



Recent studies help improve recycling knowledge

In 2019 the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Recycling District conducted a study that evaluated the rate of contamination in publicly used recycling bins. Contamination basically means items that are not recyclable are being placed in the bins or items are being placed in the wrong bin.

Based on the results, the recycling district then bumped up efforts to educate the public about what is recyclable and what isn't. Along with advertising and increased public awareness efforts through social media and the STWRD newsletter, new labels including pictures were placed on bins to better identify which items were acceptable and which were not.

According to Steve Tharp, Jr., program manager for STWRD, those efforts resulted in a 65% reduction in contamination. "That's a significant reduction,"

Tharp said.

Fast forward to 2023. The district recently wrapped up a study measuring the public's recycling awareness, knowledge and practices in the Wooster area. According to Tharp, the six-week presort study, funded by the Ohio EPA, began in late April and

wrapped up in early June.

GT Environmental of Columbus was selected to consult on the study, organizing and designing the campaign and then implementing it. The first phase involved dumping out bins to observe the items people were tossing in.

"In doing so, we were

able to isolate the problem child," Tharp said, which was occurring in the bin designated for plastic bottles and jugs only.

Tharp said not only were people placing items in the bin that were neither plastic bottles nor jugs, but they also were tossing in all sorts of items, from food containers and flower pots to dish drainers, garden hoses and plastic bags.

After isolating the problem, STWRD staff, master recyclers and drivers gathered at the Wooster Buehler's recycling site for six weeks to try to change those habits. Tharp said the Wooster Buehler's was selected as the study's launch site based on the higher contamination levels

What they found

"We wanted to see what people are putting in the bins," Tharp said. "So we had them fill out a survey and then helped them

unload their cars so we could identify items that were not recyclable or that they were placing in the wrong bins.

Among the most common contaminants were plastic clamshell food containers. Besides being placed in the wrong bin, those clamshells are not recyclable, according to Tharp. In fact, not all plastic bottles and jugs are recyclable.

"Those types of materials are labeled," Tharp said. "They also may have what people perceive as the recycle logo and a number on them. That logo is actually a resin code which identifies the type of plastic it is, but it doesn't indicate whether or not the material is recyclable. It's a common misperception."

The other complication is even if an item is recyclable, it may not be recyclable at the moment because there may be no market for it.

So how do we know what to do?

'Read the labels on the bins," Tharp said. "We tell you exactly what can be accepted and show pictures. We even provide little hints about things like flattening the cardboard."


Tharp said plastic bags are never acceptable in the bins because they cause a tangling hazard when the materials go through recycling machinery.

Over the six weeks, Tharp said people did react and respond positively. While the change in behavior was not as significant as the district would like to see, Tharp said a measurable decrease in contamination was observed.

"We felt that if we had the resources to be there more often, we would have experienced a more significant downturn," Tharp said.

Tharp said the information gathered in the study will serve as the baseline for a broader district-wide education program. "We have a number of collection sites in Tuscarawas County, but we plan to look at the Dover and New Philadelphia Buehler's first."

The nomination for Tree Farm of the Year came from Ohio Department of Natural Resources forester Luke Walters, who recognized the management of the farm during a visit in 2022 and

family.

"They opened their farm for some workshops we wanted to do to educate people about forestry management," Walters said, "and the number of people who came out for it was around 50. It was an easy and obvious thing to nominate their farm. They're active in the community. They do a lot of outreach and education here. They took some ground which they could have easily left go, but they've done everything you could possibly do to make it better.

The beneficiaries of the Schmukis' work are numerous as the land supports a diverse variety of Ohio wildlife.

'Just about anything you would expect to see in a forest in Ohio is here," Walters said, "from woodcock to deer. There's just really excellent cover and brambles which the family has preserved, and it supports the kind of low cover which birds depend on. If we had more grouse around here, this is where they would want to be.

Such a large collection of carefully maintained trees also produces fresh oxygen for the atmosphere each day, helping to com-

now works closely with the bat the effects of climate change. "The answer is to plant more trees," Mike Schmuki said.

> The tree farm tour will feature workshops and speakers who will help visitors understand how tree farms are managed for the greatest benefit to evervone.

> "We have been mowing and getting trails ready, Mike Schmuki said. "We will have a lot of foresters here acting as guides so you can get the most out of the visit.

"When you see logging trucks on the road," Patsy Schmuki said, "you rarely see them marked that way. So those trees have been cut without the assistance of a forester."

Mike Schmuki stood near red oak trees that were planted in 2018 and are now

about 8 feet tall. "We wrap the tree trunks with material that allows light and water in but keeps animals out. Deer like to eat those early shoots when they appear, so this helps to give them a better start," he said.

The farm is typically planted with 25% pine or soft woods, which are a sacrificial species.

"The deer eat those and rub their antlers on them and leave the hardwood trees alone," Mike Schmuki

Hardwood trees include red and white oak and even a few elm and ash trees, which are unusual to see. The farm also plants uncommon persimmon trees, which provide food for forestdwelling wildlife.

Walters pointed to young trees from the same planting year that are barely knee high and were not wrapped.

few seasons establishing a solid root system before they begin growing for height," he said. "That's when the deer keep eating them, and it keeps them shorter like this. But they'll recover."

The Schmukis allow hunting on their forested land as part of its management.

Wild osprey rescued from fishing line near Delroy

Thanks to community cooperation and concern for wildlife, an osprey was rescued after becoming entangled in fishing line up in a tree. The rescue mission led by Atwood Park staff, MWCD rangers, Dellroy Fire Department and DH Land Clearing took place over the weekend near Dellroy.

A nearby resident noticed the osprey strug-

gling in the tree and alerted local authorities. The osprey had been ensnared in discarded fishing line, leaving it unable to free itself.

"We have an awesome, supportive community and were able to quickly assemble a team to attempt a successful recovery," said John Lewis, Atwood Lake Park manager. "This rescue serves as a reminder of the importance of respon-

sible fishing practices and the impact on our wildlife. We cannot stress enough how important it is to discard used fishing lines or other materials properly. We are grateful for the swift response of the community and the dedication of our team in ensuring the safety of this animal."

Rescuers managed to safely reach the distressed osprey and remove the fishing line. Following the rescue, the osprey was transported to Stark Park's Wildlife Conservation Center, where it is being cared for to ensure its health and wellbeing.

"The osprey is doing fairly well," said Stephon Echague, animal care supervisor at Stark County Park District's Conservation Center. "He has a swollen leg where the fishing line was wrapped, but he can put weight on it, so that is a good sign. He will see the vet this week and is currently receiving fluids and being well-fed. If all goes well and he continues to show positive improvements, we will look forward to releasing him back into the wild soon."

Fishing line disposal bins are located at the public launch ramps and various locations at each of the MWCD lakes. Additionally, residents are encouraged to report any wildlife in distress to local authorities.

The Dover-Phila Federal Credit Union is celebrating 70 years of serving the community with 70 acts of kindness in the community. The Kindness Campaign began Aug. 1 and will continue through the end of the year. It includes a variety of projects designed to give back to the community.

The Dover-Phila Credit Union was originally established Aug. 5, 1953, when its charter was issued. Originally, it was for the employees of Warner & Swasey and was known as the Warner & Swasey Credit Union. Later when Warner and Swasey became Gradall, the name changed to the Gradall Employees Credit Union.

Gradall Industries went through some ownership changes in the 1980s. The credit union wanted to diversify a little bit and open up their membership. We got approval from NCUA to open it up to everybody in the county. So if you live, work, worship or attend school in Tuscarawas County, you're eligible for membership," said Jason Garner, CEO of the Dover-Phila Credit Union.

Garner was a Gradall employee for 15 years before he began employment at the credit union.

The credit union still has many Gradall employees among its membership of around 35,000. If a customer moves from Tuscarawas County, their membership is not revoked, and there are now members from all over the United States. These out-of-town members can access services through other credit unions that are in the same network as the DPFCU.

The DPFCU has five full-service locations to serve its customers. The main location is in Dover on Fillmore Avenue since 1986. A north Dover office and a New Philadelphia office was opened in 1997. The following decade the Newcomerstown office istrative building.

opened in 2003, and in 2005 the Uhrichsville office opened.

The Dover-Phila Credit Union has only had three leaders in its history. Dave Andreatta started the credit union and retired in March 2014. Then Jack Dooling took the helm for a few years, retiring in April 2019, and Garner accepted the position and still serves as CEO

Funds deposited in the credit union are protected by NCUA at the same level as banks have through the

The DPFCU gives back to its members first, then to the community.

"The biggest difference between a credit union and a bank is credit unions are nonprofit. Our mission is to provide as good of rates as we can for people on their savings and as low of rates as we can for loans," Garner said. "Our leadership is made up of about nine board members that are all voluntary. They're not compensated, and they're all members. So the members actually own the credit union, and the members participate in the management of the credit union through the board of directors. The nice thing is we're able to make decisions on a daily basis that we put our members first in and profit

More recently, with space at a premium, the credit union built an admin-

"We were running out of room for our back-office folks at the main office, Garner said. "There are about 250 credit unions in the state of Ohio, and we are the 13th largest credit union in the state. The community has been very supportive of us over the years, and that's why Kelsey (McConaha) has been heading up this campaign to try to give back to the community for the 70th anniversary."

The credit union's employees and board members will participate, and they suggested some of the kindness activities.

"We have a lot of stuff scheduled with local organizations, and then there's some that we're just going to be randomly doing on a nice day when we have the time available," McConaha

Some things planned for the Kindness Campaign are a school supply drive, sponsored date night through WJER, food trucks at credit union locations, helping with United Way's Rock-N-Run, planned activities at local nursing homes and senior centers, story and craft time at local libraries, helping at the food pantry, handing out passes for the Tuscarawas County Fair, gift card giveaways to support small businesses, working at concession stands at sporting events that support a cause, a turkey giveaway around Thanksgiving, a cookie giveaway around Christmas, gas card giveaways, a canned food

community - its local organizations, libraries, schools. We provide free financial literacy to middle schools. high schools in Tuscarawas County," McConaha said. "And then we also have an online wellness center for our members and for the community to look at called Banzai.' They also provide low-

cost financial literacy to local libraries and partner with Buckeye Career Center to provide a wellness program in the evening for students in the adult ed pro-

"We have a partnership with the sheriff's department for financial re-entry programs with their incarcerated inmates that we do," McConaha said.

The DPFCU is running a special loan promotion for the 70th anniversary.

"The rest of it is for the loans," McConaha said. "Those that switch their auto loan to the DPFCU can receive up to \$700 cash back."

> Terms, conditions and restrictions do apply, and the offer runs until the end of September.

> To help small businesses, each DPFCU location also will host a local food truck one day through August and the first part of September.

> As for the next 70 years, the DPFCU plans to grow along with its members.

"I would say the biggest challenge today, I think, for the credit union is staying relevant with the younger generation," Garner said. There's so many options out there for financing. We're constantly looking at ways to improve our digital footprint to be able to offer the services that the younger members are looking for.'


