Zoning, police salaries top Bolivar Council agenda

At its June 6 meeting, Bolivar Council heard the first reading of an ordinance that would change current zoning regarding recreational vehicles, boats and utility trailers parked on private property. Planning commission chair Will Bellinger said an old ordinance is in place stating residents may not park or store such vehicles in driveways, on lawns or anywhere else on their property.

Proposed legislation would allow residents to park two RVs, utility trailers or boats on their property with certain restrictions including no parking in front yards or side yards with the exception of side driveways or for loading or unloading within 48 hours. A schedule of potential fines was outlined for council, along with the potential for legal action for not cooperating.

According to Bellinger, the commission's intention is to do away with the old ordinance, which was not being enforced, and to draft more reasonable legislation with a method of enforcing it. Residents also will be allowed to apply for variances if needed.

Police salaries addressed

Council approved plac-

ing a police levy on the ballot this fall. The replacement levy would increase from 2 mils to 4 mils and generate approximately \$72,000.

At issue is the police salaries currently are being paid out of the general fund, which, according to Mayor Tim Lang and finance committee chair Will Bellinger, is a two-fold problem. Using money from the general fund takes away from other village projects, and village police salaries are too low, which is causing too much turnover in the department.

Council discussed potential solutions such as allocating the salary formerly paid to a part-time officer who resigned to the two officers remaining. Bellinger also presented a solution that would reduce the number of days police are on duty in the village.

Resident Michela Huth voiced concern about paying a part-time summer worker \$12 when police are only getting paid approximately \$16 an hour and that Kyle Porter makes more money than the police as street superintendent and zoning inspector. Porter's pay was raised in February to \$20.38 per hour.

Bellinger said he agreed low police salaries are a

problem. He asked council to consider solutions and to finalize an approach in July.

Mayor's report

Lang had several resignations to report. Council voted to accept the resignations of fiscal officer Krystal Christensen, who has accepted a position as human resources director for the National Guard; assistant fiscal officer Patty Smith; and Police Sgt. Jeff Stearns, who has accepted a position with the Sugarcreek Police Department.

Lang then temporarily appointed and council approved Matt Judy, village administrator, as interim

fiscal officer, extending his hours to 30 per week until another can be hired. Council also approved advertising expenditures of up to \$1,000 to seek a new fiscal officer. Resumes will be accepted until the end of June and can be emailed to mayor@villageofbolivar.com or dropped off at the village offices at 109 N. Canal St.

Council also approved Lang's recommendation to hire Wyatt Jones as a parttime summer worker at \$12 per hour for 24 hours per

Public comments

Mark Goudy, representing St. John's United

Church of Christ on Park Avenue, asked if the two water lines there could be combined so the church would receive just one water bill.

Porter said he will look into combining the lines. Lang said council is holding a work session to try to iron out problems such as this on June 20 at 6:30 p.m.

Resident Ann Strauss said a noise study is now being conducted to determine whether ODOT will agree to erect a noise barrier along I-77.

Resident Chris Berens said the committee established to participate in the Love Tusc Sculpture Tour headed by the Tuscarawas Arts Partnership is in need of funds. The funds would be used to build a small park across from town hall that will be the setting for a village statue. Berens said she has applied for grants but asked for council's help financially, should no funds be granted.

In other business

Council approved the following expenditures as requested by Bellinger:

-Up to \$1,000 to cover repairs and purchase tires for the police department's



—\$750 to rent a lift to remove the light pole in the Cherry Street parking lot, if needed.

—Contract with Stacey Spillman or visiting clerk at \$30 for assistance with fiscal officer duties for six weeks.

—\$599 for a power washer.

—\$2,800 for gravel for the Canal Street rear parking lot.

Council also voted to accept a \$1,000 donation toward the cost from Rich Dotts, co-owner of the Towpath Tavern.

Council also approved issuing permits allowing advertising signs to be placed at the intersection of Park Avenue and state Route 212 to Bolivar, Main Street Association for the Strawberry Festival and the car show, and Ragon House for its current sale and upcoming fall sale.

Ordinances approved

—Lawrence Township/ Bolivar/Zoar contract with the Bolivar Volunteer Fire Department for fire and EMS service for 2022. Council had approved a draft version in April, but since then, some language was changed. —Designating parking on Tuscarawas Street as handicapped parking during the Strawberry Festival only.

—Changing police officer Eric Minor's position from part-time to full-time at a rate of \$16.50 per hour (Bellinger abstaining).

—Contracting with Barbicas Construction of Akron for \$65,300 for paving to include portions of Strawberry, Eberly, Pleasant and Lovers alleys and Walnut Street from Canal Street to Poplar Street.

Finding Your Flock

First Fiber Arts Festival a success

ith the success of the first Fiber Arts Festival in downtown Uhrichsville on June 5, a second festival is already being planned.

"I think things are going great. It went pretty smooth, and I'm really happy to see everybody out here," said Jessika Zontini, the owner of Pindrop Shop in Uhrichsville, who planned the event, along with the Fiber Arts Guild of Tuscarawas County.

Zontini already had some ideas for next year.

'There seems to be a lot of interest, and we hope to do it again next year and have it grow. There are several vendors I'd like to reach out to — more food and just a couple other little tweaks we'd like to make to make it run more smoothly," Zontini said.

Zontini heard from people who attended the festival who were interested in fiber arts and wanted to learn more about them.

"It's amazing. That's what we were hoping for, just to increase awareness of our fiber arts community," Zontini said.

Laura Gray is the president of the Fiber Arts Guild of Tuscarawas County. The Fiber Arts Guild of Tuscarawas County is a group of spinners, weavers, sewers, knitters, crocheters, felters, embroiderers, cross stitchers and other fiber artists who are interested in sharing their passion, learning new techniques and promoting fiber arts in the county.

There was a steady crowd throughout the day.

'We've had a better turnout than we ever imagined. I've been thrilled with the nonstop traffic," Gray said, adding the animals, three sheep and two alpacas were a draw for the children attending the festival.

As for adults, knitting is currently the most popular overall of the fiber arts.

Gray and Zontini thanked the First Federal Community Bank for funding the festival.

"We hope we can make it an annual thing. And we appreciate any constructive feedback on what you want to see, what you loved or what you didn't love, or what you want to see added," Gray said.

Food at the event included East of Chicago Pizza Shop of Uhrichsville doing business under their pizza tent, as well as Ott's Coffee and Le Macaron food trucks.

"I've had a steady stream of customers, a lot of interesting people, and I've made some sales," said Bonnie Daugherty of the Salt of the Earth shop, which carries a variety of eclectic decorative

Also open during the festival was the Good Buys Variety Shop and Lovely.

Fiber artist Ashley Casteel of New Philadelphia, who sells her products under the name, The Cultured Sheep, attracted a lot of attention at her booth, where she demonstrated how to dve wool with Kool-Aid packets. No sugar is needed, but Casteel did add vinegar to help set the color along with the citric acid that is in the Kool-Aid. Although the dve is colorfast, Kool-Aid dyed products can't be left for weeks in the sun without fading.

Casteel even mixed different flavors of Kool-Aid packets to make a variety of colors. She is a member of the Fiber Arts Guild of Tuscarawas County.

"I had been crocheting for three months before I joined the fiber arts guild. I got sucked into spinning, and it just kind of snowballed, so this is my thing now," Casteel said.

Exhibitor Maria Hall of the Hall Family Farm said "waste not, want not" became their motto when she and her husband, John, got two alpacas for their farm. Hall demonstrated needle felting and has used the alpaca fleece to felt onto silk scarves, making them warm but still lightweight. She's even felted soap, which

allows users to ditch their washcloths in the bath. When the soap is gone, the fibers can be reused or composted in the garden.

The alpacas are easy to transport and climb right into the Halls' minivan.

Another exhibitor, Cheryl Gordon of Kingsfold Jacobs of Shreve, displayed the raw fleece from a recently shorn sheep. She explained the process of skirting the wool, where you take out the parts of the wool you don't want processed. Dirt is acceptable hay, short pieces of fleece and matted fleece are not.

Debbie and Roger Thornton of Dennison were two of the many people who enjoyed the new fes-

"I like to knit and crochet, although I usually start a project see how yarn is made," Debbie Gray said.

Each part of the yarn-making process was demonstrated by at least one participant at the festival. Others participating in the festival included Perennial Blessings demonstrating rug hooking and wool applique techniques, B4 Farm demonstrating yarn spinning, Gwen Erin Natural Fiber, Hiddenview Farm showing an angora bunny, Ten Cat Farm showing sheep for display, and the Scarf Project, which started in 2016 in New Philadelphia to give because it can be washed out, but away scarves, gloves and hats to anyone in need.







Ohio EPA Grant allows mosquito population control

With the recent receipt of a \$24,900 mosquito-control grant from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, officials in the Bureau of Environmental Health at the Tuscarawas County Health Department have been at work to control the county's mosquito population and help prevent disease.

TCHD staff members are planning to collect mosquito specimens from traps that will be placed at locations across the county. They also will conduct larviciding — killing mosquito larvae and pupae at breeding sites — and spraying in many areas. These mosquito population-control measures will be ongoing throughout the summer.

Due to the West Nile virus outbreak in the U.S. in 1999, TCHD increased its focus on surveillance to detect mosquitoes carrying disease. Surveillance consists of setting strategically located mosquito traps in Tuscarawas County. The mosquitoes are sent to the Ohio Department of Health for testing for West Nile virus. Test results supply TCHD with information on locations of any infected mosquitoes within the county and where to best focus mosquito-reduction efforts.

In recent years TCHD has transitioned away from using organophosphate-based pesticides to more environmentally friendly and less toxic products. Currently, TCHD is using bacteria-based products to help control larval mosquito populations and a less toxic adulticide spray. These products are effective at controlling mosquito populations while having a very limited impact on nontarget species.

TCHD also provides education to the public on mosquito-breeding sites around the home, mosquito testing for encephalitis, treating areas of standing water for mosquito larva and evening spraying in areas where mosquitoes are a cause for concern.

Program goals

The goals of the TCHD Mosquito Control Program are as follows:

—Reduce the number of disease-carrying mosquitoes in a cost-effective and environmentally responsible manner.

—Educate the public on methods of cultural practices that will reduce the number of mosquitobreeding sites and methods to reduce the feeding activities of

mosquitoes.

—Have the ability to monitor mosquito populations in Tuscarawas County for mosquito-borne diseases.

The TCHD Mosquito Control Program components are as follows:

Public education and personal responsibility

Tuscarawas County Public Health provides information to the public on matters such as actions that can be taken to reduce mosquito-breeding grounds around the home and to avoid mosquito bites, mosquito ecology, vector-borne disease information, proper cultural practices for mosquito larva reduction, and mosquito-control methods used by the Mosquito Control Program. To obtain this information, call Tuscarawas County Mosquito Control at 330-343-5550 Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Mosquito surveillance and monitoring

Surveillance identifies locations where mosquito populations are building so targeted control measures can be implemented before a problem exists. The object of this program is to collect mosquito specimens for shipment to the Ohio Department of Health for mosquitorelated encephalitis testing. Thousands of Culex specimens per year are submitted by TCHD and are tested for West Nile virus. These mosquitoes are collected using gravid traps. TCHD has increased mosquito surveillance over the past five years to include setting traps in all communities participating in the program.

Source reduction and chemical control

Larviciding is the addition of chemical or other products to a water source to kill mosquito larvae and pupae. The purpose of the program is to reduce the number of mosquito larvae by treating breeding sites from May through September. Currently, TCHD utilizes naturally occurring bacteria to have a minimal impact on the environment, including nontarget species. To report areas of standing water, mosquito-breeding sites, call 330-343-5550.

The goal of adulticiding is to reduce the number of adult diseasecarrying and pest mosquitoes by evening spraying of residential areas with ultra low-volume mist spray equipment. Adulticiding is the last line of defense in the control of mosquitoes. Other methods of mosquito control such as source reduction and aggressive larviciding should be considered first. Using the system of integrated pest management, the decision of when and where to spray is based on the mosquito-surveillance program. TCHD sets out traps each night in Tuscarawas County to determine the location of areas of disease and mosquito activity.

Adaptive clothing takes stress out of dressing

Dear Savvy Senior,

What kinds of clothing options are available to mobility-challenged seniors who have a difficult time dressing?

Looking for Mom Dear Looking,

The chore of dressing and undressing in traditional clothing can be difficult, time-consuming and even painful for millions of people with certain health and mobility problems. Fortunately, there's a wide variety of special clothing, known as adaptive clothing, that can help with most dressing challenges. Here's what you should know.

What is adaptive clothing?

Adaptive clothing is specially designed garments for people with mobility issues, disabilities and cognitive challenges who have a difficult time getting dressed. This type of clothing incorporates discreet design features to make dressing and undressing easier while still having the outward appearance of typical clothing.

Depending on your mom's needs, here are some of the many different types of adaptive clothing options that could help.

For self-dressing seniors who suffer from Parkinson's or other disabilities that affect dexterity, there are pants, shirts, dresses and outerwear made with Velcro or magnetic closures instead of buttons and zippers, which are much easier to fasten and unfasten. But be aware magnetic closures are not suitable for those who have pacemakers.

For those who are disabled or who have limited range of motion and need assistance dressing, there are adaptive pants with zippers or snaps on both sides of the pants that are easier to pull on, as well as a wide range of rear-closure shirts, tops and dresses with Velcro or snap fasteners in the back for those who can't raise their arms over their head.

For wheelchair users there are higher back and



elastic waistband pants that don't slip down, as well as pants with fabric overlaps at the seat to allow for easier toileting access.

For people with tactile sensitivity, there are garments you can purchase that have soft and stretchy fabrics without tags and are sewn with flat seams to help prevent chafing.

And for seniors with Alzheimer's disease, there are one-piece jumpsuits that have a back-zipper access to prevent the wearer from disrobing inappropriately.

Where to shop?

Because each person's dressing needs and style is so specific, finding appropriate adaptive clothing can be difficult.

Recently, mainstream clothing stores like JCPenney (www.jcpenney.com), Target (www.target.com) and Tommy Hilfiger (usa. tommy.com) have started offering a line of adaptive clothing for adults that combines fashion and functionality, but their in-store options are limited. To get a bigger selection, visit the stores' websites and type in 'adaptive clothing" in their search engine.

You also can find a large selection at online stores

that specialize in adaptive clothing, like Buck & Buck (www.buckandbuck.com) and Silverts (www.silverts. com). Both of these companies have been selling adaptive clothing for decades and offer a wide variety of garments to accommodate almost any need, condition or style, for independent self-dressers and for those who need help.

Some other adaptive clothing sites you should visit include Joe & Bella (www.joeandbella.com), Ovidis (www.ovidis.com) and IZ Adaptive (www.izadaptive.com), which sells clothing primarily designed for wheelchair users.

And if your mom is in need of adaptive footwear, Velcro fastening shoes instead of shoelaces have long been a popular option and can be found in most local shoe stores.

Some other new lines of adaptive shoes that may interest her include Kiziks (www.kizik.com) and Zeba (www.zebashoes. com), which make fashionable sneakers and comfortable walking shoes that just slip on, hands-free, along with Billy Footwear (www.billyfootwear.com) and Friendly Shoes (www. friendlyshoes.com), which makes uniquely designed zip-on shoes.




