# awrence Township to replace aging sign

The Lawrence Township Board of Trustees voted at the June 30 meeting to hire The Country Sign Company of Bolivar to design a new sign to be placed in front of the Sleep Inn. The hotel recently renovated its exterior, and the manager asked for the old sign to be replaced. The new sign will say, "Welcome to Lawrence Township," instead of Wilkshire Hills.

Board chairman Matt Ritterbeck said Country Sign's bid was the lowest at \$8,460. Trustees also received bids from Synergy Signs and Graphics in Strasburg and Heritage Signs in Millersburg, both of which were nearly double the Country

In other business trustees voted to do the following:

-Spend up to \$900 to outfit a mower with flex forks and a Owikchute

-Place a 2-mill, fiveyear road replacement levy on the fall ballot.

-Move \$6,000 out of the road and bridge fund to cover increased costs for natural gas estimated through the end of the year. Ann Ackerman, fiscal officer, said the road fund currently has a small surplus, partly due to a reimbursement coming for some asphalt work.

-Renew a certificate with the public utilities commission allowing township aggre-

gates for gas and electric.

# **New Ohio fireworks law**

In light of new state legislation allowing residents to discharge consumer-grade fireworks on certain holidays, trustee Don Ackerman asked residents to use caution when doing so. "It has been dry and hot, and people need to use them in a safe area where it won't start a fire," he said. "We also don't need extra ambulance runs or fires to put out."

Consumer-grade fireworks include firecrackers, bottle rockets, sparklers, ground spinners and other novelty items, according to U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. Consumers are still not permitted to buy or discharge displaygrade fireworks.

Fire Chief Shawn Lynch outlined the new regulations. Fireworks may be set off July 3-5 and Labor Day and Memorial Day weekend. Fireworks also are permitted the weekends immediately preceding and following those holidays. Fireworks are allowed on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day with specific hours, as well as Cinco de Mayo and three other holidays.

Some local communities are opting out of the new

law, and there are additional restrictions for areas that allow fireworks use. Hours on some holidays are limited. Fireworks may not be discharged within 50 feet of spectators, and persons under the age of 18 are not permitted to handle or discharge fireworks.

### Tree planting policy at park

Trustees discussed the need for clarity about the tree planting program at the Lawrence Township River Community Park. Individuals may contact a nursery to plant trees in memory of loved ones at the park. However, the township does not have the resources or equipment to water the trees, so family members are responsible for watering. McNutt said if workers are in the vicinity, they may water them, but the township is not responsible for the life of the tree.

Ritterbeck said he will look into the possibility of using grant funds to invest in watering equipment down the road. In the meantime he also suggested planting trees either in the spring or late fall rather than in the heat of summer

# Road superintendent report

McNutt said the chip and seal contractor hopes to begin work by mid-July. He also reported graffiti on a sign near Hunter's Green; the theft of several road signs, all of which were immediately replaced: and the removal of 27 downed trees following recent storms.

### In other matters

Trustees heard from Lynch regarding the township's new fire truck, which it will share with the villages of Bolivar and Zoar. It should be in operation within four to six weeks.

Martina Mann, administrative assistant, is working with the county health department to try to secure more free insect repellent for township residents as the 50 bottles she had received went quickly.

A township resident said tar is bubbling up on several township roads and damaging vehicles. Sparks of Giving celebration to benefit local charities

You never know what is going to spark the next great idea. The concept for the Sparks of Giving celebration on July 16 grew out of a party and fireworks show held last year at the home of Kyle and Samantha Quillen, who had recently purchased Wilkshire Golf Course.

The fireworks show is being sponsored by Zoar View Investments, one of several companies owned by Kyle Quillen.

"We decided to do it again this year but with the goal of involving the entire community," he said. "We thought maybe this year we could have a larger impact on the community as a whole and do something good, so we decided to make it a charity-driven event, and it just kind of took off from there."

Zoar View Investments, which is owned by Quillen, will host the event on Saturday, July 16. The Quillens have involved community leaders at a number of local businesses and organizations in planning

the celebration. Among those who joined the project were Steve Franks, athletic director for Tusky Valley Schools; Jon Elsasser, owner of the Canal Tavern of Zoar and president of the Zoar Community Association; and Andrew and Lauren Marburger, owners of Lockport Brewery.

Participating partners along the state Route 212 corridor from Bolivar to Zoarville will donate a portion of their proceeds from that day to a local charity of their choosing. Zoar View Investments has donated fireworks for what is promised to be a display rivalling the largest in the area at sunset.

"The same company that does the fireworks at Tuscora Park will be doing ours, setting them off from our property," Quillen said.

"We had a test run with the fireworks about a month ago and had spotters in various locations to determine the prime viewing locations," Samantha Quillen said.

Those locations were identified as the Zoar Volunteer Fire Department, Tusky Valley High School, The Church of the Holy Trinity in Zoar and the Zoar Village Golf Course.

"We hope the fireworks attract people from neighboring communities and surrounding counties like Stark, Wayne and Carroll, not just from Tuscarawas County," Kyle Quillen said.

"Hopefully, they'll come and spend some money in the Bolivar area, and that money will go towards a good cause," Samantha Quillen said.

# What you'll find at participating locations

Some residents of Wilkshire Hills and other areas may be able to see the fireworks from their homes. "We want to encourage them to get out before the fireworks, enjoy what our partners are offering and help them support their charities before heading home if that's where they choose to watch," Kyle Quillen said.

Here's a sampling of what you can enjoy by location:

# The Church of the Holy Trinity

Concessions and live music will start at 7:45 p.m. by local band, Slick31, who has donated its time and talent. "We're charging \$5 a carload to view the fireworks from our parking lot and lawn," Deacon Lyn Houze said. "We've got plenty of room up here where people can watch from their cars or bring chairs or blankets for outdoor viewing."

The church has chosen to donate proceeds to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

# **Tusky Valley High School**

In addition to prime viewing from the stadium and parking lots, the school will have a concession stand benefiting the band, shaved

ice treats and music over the stadium's sound system. Athletes will accept donations for the new school's stadium project.

"We need new lights, our bleachers are due for an upgrade and ultimately we'd love to get field turf on the football field," Franks said.

Franks was quick to add funds raised will benefit the community as well. "Everybody's kids in our community are going to be using the stadium at some point, either for graduation, sports or other events."

Franks said people can bring chairs to set up on the football field if they want. The festivities will begin at 7:30 p.m. "That will give people enough time to get parked, come over and get your seats, go to the concession stand, and hear some great music before the fireworks," he said.

### **Zoar Golf Course**

There will be grilled burgers and dogs outdoors accompanied by prerecorded music from Big Fat Dog Blues Band. Manager Brad Haynes said the Coshocton-based group is one of Ohio's premier blues bands.

"We will be open for golfing too," he said.

The cost to park and have a great view of fireworks is \$5 per carload. "If people want adult beverages, they can purchase them here," said Haynes, who said it is against state law to bring your own.

All proceeds will benefit the humane societies in Coshocton and Tuscarawas counties.

### **Lockport Brewery**

Owners Andrew and Lauren Marburger hold a Christmas in July event every year.

"We'll have our popular Christmas ale, Cheer Beer, available in our beer garden during the event," Andrew Marburger said. "We'll also have the Macho Nacho food truck there from 5-8 p.m. and live music I think that's king about this year." For more inties at particip and follow the Facebook page.

from Urban Honey from 7-9 p.m."

While it may not be a prime viewing area for the fireworks, Lauren Marburger said everyone is welcome to stick around for the show.

"Or they can hit us early and maybe hit a couple of other venues as well if they plan to watch the fireworks from somewhere else," she said. "We're just really excited to be working with the Quillens on their vision to pull everybody together to benefit the community and bring people who aren't from the area here to see what we have to offer, all while benefiting some local charities. It seems like a winwin for everybody."

The brewery is donating 15% of their proceeds to Tusky Valley's Affordable Christmas Program.

# Additional participants and viewing areas

Other participating partners donating to charities include the Canal Street Diner, Sublime Smoke and the Bolivar Main Street Association. Viewing also is available from Wilkshire Golf Course, Vaughn's Pub, the Massarelli Baseball Fields and the Giant Eagle parking lot.

Elsasser also invited people to come to Fort Laurens, which will hold its annual Revolutionary War Re-enactment the same day from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Visitors are welcome to stay and watch the fireworks display from the fort.

### Kindling a new annual tradition?

"This is the first year that we're really doing this, with the intention of making it an annual event," Kyle Quillen said. "What we don't know is if we're going to get 10 people or 10,000 people or 50,000. And I think that's kind of the cool part about this year."

# Program helps residents stay cool in summertime

The Ohio Department of Development and HARCA-TUS Tri-County Community Action Organization Inc. will help income-eligible Ohioans stay cool during the hot summer months.

The Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program provides eligible Ohioans assistance paying an electric bill or assistance paying for central air-conditioning repairs. The program runs from July 1 until Sept. 30.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment with HARCATUS. Appointments can be scheduled by calling 855-806-9650.

Clients need to bring copies of the following documents to their appointment:

—Copies of their most recent energy bills.

—A list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30 days or 12 months for each member.

—Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.

—Proof of disability if applicable.

—Physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health if there isn't a household member over the age of 60.

Last year HARCATUS

assisted more than 390 families in Harrison, Carroll and Tuscarawas counties through the Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program.

"The intent of this program is to keep living spaces cool in the hot Ohio summer months. The Summer Crisis Program is geared to seniors age 60 and older but is also available to all lowincome households who qualify. With temperatures already rising this year, we anticipate a high demand for this program. I encourage residents to call early before funds are gone," said JoEllen Sanders, community services program director at HARCATUS.



Last year HARCATUS assisted more than 390 families in Harrison, Carroll and Tuscarawas counties through the Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program.

The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households with an older household member that can provide physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health, have a disconnect notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish new service on their electric bill

or require air-conditioning. Conditions can include such things as lung disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease or asthma.

Eligible households can receive up to \$500 if they are a customer of a regulated utility or \$800 if they are a customer of unregulated utilities such as electric cooperatives and municipal utilities.

The assistance is applied to their utility bill or to purchase an air-conditioning unit or fan or pay for central air-conditioning repairs. Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines to qualify for assistance. For a family of four, the annual income must be at or below \$48,562.50.

Also, Ohioans enrolled in the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus Program who meet the above criteria may be eligible for assistance toward their default PIPP payment, first PIPP payment, central air-conditioning repairs or may receive an air-conditioning unit and/or fan.

# **Funding available for remediation**

The Ohio Department of Development announced communities can apply for funds to assess and clean up hazardous substances on properties throughout Ohio.

The third application period opened for the Brownfield Remediation Program. The program will provide nearly \$350 million in grants to clean up industrial, commercial and institutional brownfield sites that are abandoned, idled or underutilized due to a known or potential release of hazardous substances or petroleum.

"Through our previous rounds of applications and awards, we've seen the need for this program clearly demonstrated," Gov.





# Fundraiser benefits research for childhood diseases

The Research Institute for Children's Health is a facility that digs into the genetics behind children's diseases to help develop new treatments. Based at Case Western Reserve University, the institute has held fundraising events in Sonoma, California and at First Energy Stadium in Cleveland since its founding in 2015 by New Philadelphia native Mitch Drumm, PhD.

On Aug. 27 at 6 p.m., a large fundraiser is planned at Columbia Woodlands in Dover. Giving Kids Hope will honor local natives and feature entertainment, auctions, a raffle, live music and food.

"Since we started in 2015," Drumm said, "we have gradually been increasing our outreach in making people aware of what we do and in our fundraising. The last two years have been remote, virtual things. This year, since we can do this in person, I really wanted to pull in people from Tuscarawas County and honor those who have made such a difference. There are just so many great people from that area.

The idea to host such a big fundraiser, likely to draw people from around the country, in Dover came about when Drumm, his wife, and friends including Dover native and Cleveland media personality Kim Scott Sowinski spent a weekend at the luxury resort.

"They came back and were just raving about how great it was and that we needed to do something there. We went and had a look, and it is indeed just perfect for us. We're very happy about the location," Drumm said.

Attendance for the event can be either in person or virtual, but those who attend the fundraiser will find themselves getting a culinary experience. The evening will be hosted by emcee David McCreary, who hosts "Cash Explosion.



Drumm was actively seeking cystic fibrosis treatments through genetic research in the early 1990s, treatments he has seen come to successful fruition in recent years.

# Electric trikes provide riders fun, fitness and safety

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about electric trikes for semi-seniors? I used to cycle a lot in my younger years but have some balance problems and don't trust myself on a twowheeler anymore. I've read that electric-powered trikes are a good option for older riders but could use some help choosing one.

Unsteady Eddie Dear Eddie,

Electric-powered adult tricycles — also known as e-trikes — are a great cycling option for older adults with balance or stamina issues because they're safe, super fun to ride and easy on an aging body. Here's what you should know, along with some tips





to help you shop for one.

### Safer cycling

If you're interested in cycling but worry about falling or injuring yourself, e-trikes are a great choice because of the three-wheeled stability they provide. With a trike you can ride as slow as you want without ever losing your balance, which is very reassuring for most older

E-trikes also come with a small electric-powered motor to enhance the riding experience, so when you saddle up and apply the throttle, the motor will give you a boost when pedaling or it will do all the work for you. This makes it much easier to whiz up hills and ride into headwinds without gassing yourself or taxing your knee joints.

In addition, most adult e-trikes also are made with a low "step through" design, making mounting and dismounting easier. They typically come with big tires that ensure a smooth ride, have ergonomic handlebars that are easy to reach and grip, and offer oversize seats — some even have backrests — for comfort and support.

When shopping for an e-trike, pay special attention to the motor, which determines how fast it will go, and the battery, which determines how far it will go between charges.

Most e-trikes can reach speeds of anywhere between 15 and 28 mph and typically go somewhere between 20 and 55 miles on a single tric Fat Trike and M-360

you, ask yourself how and where you plan to ride it. If you're primarily interested in a leisurely ride around the neighborhood for pleasure, fitness or running errands, an upright cruiser e-trike that has a rear cargo basket would be a nice choice.

Some popular options in this category include Addmotor's M-340 Elecers.com; and Buzz Cerana T, \$1,700 at www.buzzbicycles.com.

Or if you're looking to take longer road rides, a recumbent e-trike may be a better option. These are aerodynamic, low to the ground, have a stretchedout frame and allow you to recline with your legs positioned in front of you. Catrike at www.catrike.com and TerraTrikes at www. terratrike.com are two of the biggest U.S. companies that make recumbent tadpolestyle trikes. The two wheels are in front, and they both offer electric assist options at prices ranging from \$5,000-\$7,000.

There also are folding e-trikes, which are practical if you have limited home storage space or would like to take your trike with you when traveling. Some good options here include the Liberty Trike, \$1,600 at www. libertytrike.com, and Eunorau New-Trike, \$2,500 at www.eunorau-ebike.com.

# **Talent abounds at First Town Days Talent Show**

Posey will enter the sixth grade this fall, where she has already signed up for percussion.

"I really want to play in a band," Posey said.

Her other interests include doing hip hop and jazz dancing. Posey studies dance at Moxie Dance Academy.

Taking second place in the age 0-13 group was Lydia Gustkey, 10, who sang "The Star-Spangled Banner" a cappella. She impressed the judges and Marc Davis, the host of the talent show.

"She did it a cappella, with no background music. That is super challenging and hard," Davis said.

Taking third place was the sister duo of Cheyenne and Betty Millard. Cheyenne sang "How Far I'll Go" from "Moana" while Betty performed a dance at the same time.

Belle Fockler, 17, of Dover took first place in the 14 and up group with her vocal performance of "Don't Rain on My Parade."

Fockler has been an area talent show favorite for years and has won many competitions. She recently returned from at week-long theater camp at Baldwin Wallace University, and she hopes to study at the school once she graduates from high school.

"My top choice is Baldwin Wallace. It's like the number-one school in America for theater. It's right by Playhouse Square, so their students do a lot of stuff at Playhouse Square," Fockler said. "They have a showcase in New York City every year, and their students have 100% acceptance. Their seniors all get agents at the showcase in New York."

Chloe Martin of Tuscarawas took second place with her vocal performance of "Somewhere Over the Rainbow." Martin is a student at West Virginia University, where she is studying music producing.

"I've always loved the behind-the-scenes details. And I always thought it would be cool to run my own producing studio, maybe produce my own music and just become like an indie artist," Martin said, adding she also would like to produce music for other people too.

Winning third place was Sami Krocker of Goshen for her vocal performance of "In My Own Little Corner" from "Cinderella." The song has been one of her favorites since an aunt encouraged her to watch the "Cinderella" musicals when she was younger.

Krocker is a senior at Malone University, where she studies integrated social studies.

"I will be licensed to teach grades 7-12 social studies but mainly history," Krocker said.

She has already started a collection of books on history and will do her student teaching at Newcomerstown in the fall.

Judges for the competition included Cheryl Graham, who Davis called "the music queen of New Philadelphia." She has taught music for 52 years — 47 of them for New Philadelphia. Graham also is a member of the First Town Days committee for scholarships and an Ohio Music

Another judge, Lacey Herbert-Stephon, the owner of Lacey Performing Arts Center in New Philadelphia, also is CEO of Lacey PAC Adaptive Movement Center, a nonprofit extracurricular facility for adults and children with disabilities.

Davis was appreciative to Jaime Cole-Mansfield, who agreed to step in as a judge just hours before the event started when one judge was forced to cancel.

"She has been a big part of music. She took it to the professional level and has toured many years as a front vocalist for lounge bands, dance bands and show bands. She's even sang backup for country western superstar Ronnie McDowell," Davis said in his introduction of Cole-Mansfield, who recently moved back to the area. "She's also written recorded contemporary Christian original songs, as well as provided studio work for other professionals."

The participants were judged on attire, audience appeal, attitude and talent.

The competition in both age groups at the talent show was strong. Davis apologized to the judges for giving them the hardest job in the park.



Davis encouraged all participants to continue performing, whether they won an award at the show or not. He said he had won the First Town Days talent show in 2012 but that the second- and third-place winners went on to do greater things musically.

"Trophies are great, but they are not going to last forever, and this moment in time is not going to last forever. Win, lose or draw, you guys are all awesome. I want you to know that the most winning thing you can do is to keep persevering. Keep doing what you're doing. Keep enjoying what you're doing," Davis said. "I know that all of you who came didn't just decide last night to jump in. You have all been performing, working hard for many months, many hours, and I think you all deserve that recognition."
