Help needed to bring broadband to residents

The Tuscarawas Economic Development Corporation and its partner organizations are asking all county residents to complete a five-minute survey that will help identify areas still in need of access to broadband internet service.

The ConnectTusc campaign is a fast-track program to develop a plan for expanding broadband internet access throughout the county. Marla Akridge, the executive director of TEDC, said previous studies have shown there are still unserved and underserved areas of the county.

"Every child needs the internet now for school work," Akridge said. "And

so much business is conducted over the internet including telemedicine and paying your bills. It is all dependent upon reliable, high-speed internet access."

Data from the survey will be used to secure grant funding for internet expansion as part of a 16-week pilot program run by the State of Ohio called the BroadbandOhio Community Accelerator program.

'We want to develop a strategic plan for expanding broadband across the county, particularly into the rural regions where a lot of people just don't have any access to broadband or they have poor access to broadband that is unreliable

and slow," John Kelly of the TEDC said.

Widespread access to broadband internet service is not the only goal of the program. The initiative also has a goal of making internet service fast and affordable.

"The survey is going to help us hopefully make some really good, informed decisions," Akridge said.
"The state is looking at different speeds important for businesses right now, and we anticipate that the funding is going to be regulated around that."

According to Kelly, receiving completed surveys quickly is crucial. "We had hoped to have at least 1,000 surveys returned by Sept. 1," he said. "We currently have received around

Kelly said while Sept. 1 is not a hard deadline, data from surveys completed by that date will be used in the presentation TEDC must give to funding organizations

"The goal is to have the data ready to present as soon as money becomes available," he said. "We're trying to develop a map that shows which providers are offering service and any infrastructure they may be working on. Once we do start getting funding, we'll be ready to tell companies

where they need to focus their efforts first."


Farmers an important survey group



n 1999, recently retired John Gregory moved to Millersburg from Connecticut and started a sawmill as a hobby, recalled Leroy Yoder, who now owns Gregory Log & Lumber, a producer of white pine lumber products. Twenty-three years later, the growing company has built an expanded warehouse, office and retail showroom.

Kent Tusc nursing offers twice-a-year admissions

Changes are coming to the Kent State University at Tuscarawas nursing program this spring. Starting in January 2023, the associate degree in nursing program will begin offering admissions to the program two times a year, for both the fall and spring semesters.

This transition will benefit those students who might have previously had to delay starting in the fall. Previously, students applying to the program in the summer needed to wait a year to enter the program. Now students will be able to start nursing classes in January. Offering all nursing courses each semester will provide students with more flexibility in their schedules.

"The nursing faculty and I are really excited about this change for many reasons," said Dr. Mariann Harding, interim director of the ADN program. "Over the next year, we will be able to start offering all our core nursing classes every semester. We are really excited about the flexibility that this will allow our students. Many of our students have life obligations. Some are working. Some have family obligations. These obligations do not go away when the student starts school. For some, the only way they can afford to go back to school is to keep working.'

Harding said by offering all courses each semes-

ter, students can more easily transition to a part-time schedule or take a semester off if needed without having to wait a year to return to school because a needed course is not being offered.

The twice-a-year admissions change also will help alleviate the nursing shortages that continue in area communities and across the country since the beginning of the pandemic.

"This shortage has impacted our area with unfilled nursing positions in most of our local facilities," Harding said. "We think that moving to twiceyearly admissions will help to ensure a steady supply of new nurses. This should benefit our community and help us to assist with meeting our local healthcare needs."

The board members of the Tuscarawas County Agricultural Society make it look easy, but there is an extraordinary amount of effort that goes into planning the fair each year.

"We're getting completely out of the entertainment business. We're trying to do our best at providing a good entertainment value. We're excited about bringing back the stunt show this year. It's been several years since we've had that. The whole group looked very hard to find that stunt show."

"We actually sold livestock in other states," Billman said. "(Former area residents) bought a hog, and they live in Florida. They just donated it to the food bank up here, but they were able to support a kid."

Businesses that support the livestock auctions like the online option because they don't have to leave work to make a purchase. The online option makes it possible to prebid on an animal shown by a 4-H member they would like to support. Bids can be placed up to the amount you select. Prebids must be set up in the system ahead of time.

Though the fair has recently seen record sales each year, the money goes to the 4-H members who raise the animal or are involved in dairy production, and a small portion of each sale goes to the committees. None of the money earned goes to the fair board. The committees — market livestock, small animal and dairy use the money for education like field trips or purchasing needed items like pens or bleachers.

All sales are held in the main show arena. The swine livestock sale will begin at noon on Thursday, fol-

4-H participation enriches members' lives

Fair King Cameron Brandt, Queen Riley Randolph and two 4-H members — sisters Allie and Addy Kendle - spoke about their success through 4-H and the Tuscarawas County Fair.

For Addy Kendle, raising sheep is her favorite project. She began showing at the county level, moved up to the state level and now is showing sheep on the national level in Louisville, Kentucky.

It's just cool because I have friends from all over the state," Addy Kendle said.

Randolph hopes to visit more county fairs prior to the start of the 2022 Tuscarawas County Fair, and she's looking to the future.

"I'm really excited to see who becomes the next fair queen and takes my place," she said.

In addition, the foundation supports youth activities that offer local children and young adults a place to express themselves and be supported including YoungLife of Tuscarawas County, Big Brothers Big Sisters, YMCA Strong Kids Campaign and Dover High School's Youth to Youth Program.

The foundation also is the keystone organization that administers five scholarships each year for students who are expanding their education in a field that is related to addiction, ranging from counseling to nursing and community corrections.

"It is important to me to offer hope, and helping others further their education so that they can help change the future is one way to do just that," Davis said. "Changing the life path of just one person is paramount."

Zachary's drawings were showcased at last year's event. He attended the Art Institute of Pittsburgh. "He did a lot of modern style art," Davis said.

This year a host of artisans will showcase and sell their creations to support the foundation.

Dogs were at work at new Hoofs and Hounds event

Spectators were treated to a demonstration of area K-9s in action at the first Hoofs and Hounds event on Aug. 20 at Camp Tuscazoar.

Providing the demonstration was patrolman Jordan Doughty of the Dover Police Department and his K-9, Red, and patrolman Brad Geist of the New Philadelphia Police Department and his K-9, Cooper. Assisting as the "bad guy" was Chris Heslop, president of the Police K-9 Association. Heslop also is a member of the Canton Police Department.

The training the \vec{K} -9s receive depends on the dog, but in general each dog receives 12 weeks of training before it joins the police depart-

"They also train two times per month after that," Geist said. "There is a training facility in Canton. They will go to empty buildings and do searches for narcotics just to keep them fresh."

The K-9s can smell things humans

"A dog's sense of smell is around 100 times better than a human," Geist

The use of K-9s can vary. Sometimes they are called out multiple

times in one day, and other days they are not needed at all.

"Cooper got his first call within three days," Geist said.

Both Red and Cooper are Belgian Malinois. K-9s live with the patrolmen they work with during their service and stay with the patrolmen after the K-9 retires.

"Depending on the dog, they usually serve seven to nine years," Geist said.

The speed and the agility of the dogs were on display during the demonstration. They grab a suspect by the arm, and they do not loosen their hold until their handler instructs them to let go.

The Police K-9 Association also sold shirts to raise funds to benefit about 60 active and retired K-9s through its organization. The organization provides education and training, veterinary and dental care, endof-life valor, and lifesaving equipment like ballistic vests, which cost between \$2,600-\$2,800 for one vest.

With law-enforcement budgets unable to cover some of these expensive costs, the PK9A steps in to help when they can.

The PK9A, a nonprofit organization, has an annual 5k fundraiser scheduled for this year on Saturday, Oct. 8 in downtown Canton. For more information or to purchase PK9A merchandise, visit www. policek9association.com or find them on Facebook or Instagram.

Plan underway to renovate Tuscora Park baseball field

A fundraising initiative to renovate the Tuscora Park baseball field into a baseball complex is underway. Organizers Kelly Ricklic and Tom Farbizo, along with other members of the community committee, For the Love of the Game, have titled the project, Turf Tuscora Diamond.

Phase one of the project includes renovation of the existing baseball infield by adding turf, building new dugouts, installing a new backstop, phase one of new lighting and a scoreboard installation. The second phase includes adding a seating area for viewing, restrooms, a press box that includes a sound system and a concession stand. Phase three includes installing turf to the outfield, replacing the outfield fence, constructing a maintenance/community center and finishing the lighting upgrade.

'The goal of this project is to create a desirable baseball complex for local athletes to use while also designing a space that can be enjoyed by community members of all ages, with low-key maintenance in mind," Ricklic said.

'We feel that a more flexible complex would maxi-

mize the use of the baseball field at Tuscora Park while also helping to showcase area youth and athletes in our community," Farbizo said.

Plans for the renovation have been in the works since 2015.

Fundraising is underway to meet a \$500,000 goal to complete phase one of the project. Organizers hope to reach that goal through various fundraisers, grants, partnerships, private donations and by hosting tournaments. Sponsorship opportunities also are available for seating, the press box, dugouts, bleacher corners, the scoreboard, community building, fence, backstop and bullpens.

In addition to Ricklic and Farbizo, other committee members include Ed Marsh. Ed Breehl, Chase Hostetler, Mitch Pace and Sharon Ricklic. Chris Bower and Brian Stull from Diversified Engineering are the engineering consultants, and Shyanne Carroll is handling public relations for the project. Partners in the project include the City of New Philadelphia, the New Philadelphia City School District, Tuscarawas County Pony League, New Philadelphia youth baseball and the Tuscora Park Foundation, serving as the 501(c) (3) nonprofit.

Help is available to stay cool in the summer heat

Development and HARCA-TUS Tri-County Community Action Organization Inc. will help income-eligible Ohioans stay cool during the hot summer months.

The Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program provides eligible Ohioans assistance paying an electric bill or assistance paying for central air-conditioning repairs. The program runs until Sept. 30.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment with HARCATUS. Appointments can be scheduled by calling 855-806-9650.

Clients need to bring copies of the following documents to their appointment: copies of their most recent energy bills, a list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30 days or 12 months for each member, proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members, proof of disabil-

The Ohio Department of ity if applicable, and physician documentation cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health if there isn't a household member over the age of 60.

> Last year HARCATUS assisted more than 390 families in Harrison, Carroll and Tuscarawas counties through the Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program.

"The intent of this program is to keep living spaces cool in the hot Ohio summer months. The Summer Crisis Program is geared to seniors age 60 and older but is also available to all low-income households who qualify. With temperatures already rising this year, we anticipate a high demand for this program. I encourage residents to call early before funds are gone," said JoEllen Sanders, community services program director at HARCATUS.

The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households with an older

older, those who can provide physician documentation cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health, and those who have a disconnect notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish new service on their electric bill or require

household member age 60 or air-conditioning. Conditions can include such things as lung disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease or asthma.

Eligible households can receive up to \$500 if they are a customer of a regulated utility or \$800 if they are a customer of unregulated utilities such as electric cooperatives and municipal utilities. The assistance is applied to their utility bill, to purchase an air-conditioning unit or fan, or to pay for central air-conditioning repairs. Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175% of the federal poverty guide-

lines to qualify for assistance. For a family of four, the annual income must be at or below \$48,562.50.

Also, Ohioans enrolled in the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus Program who meet the above criteria may be eligible for assistance toward their default PIPP payment, first PIPP payment, central air-conditioning repairs, or may receive an air-conditioning unit and/or fan.

How the scam works

You are looking to buy tickets to an upcoming concert or need to transfer tickets for a show that was postponed due to COVID-19. You do an internet search for your question, which brings up results for Ticketmaster. You click through to the website, and everything looks normal.

The website prompts you to enter your personal information and a credit card number. However, as soon as you complete a transaction, you notice some suspicious activity.

Concerts are back. Bands You might receive tickets with someone else's name on them, or you may never receive your tickets at all. In other cases you get the tickets, but the site charges you a much higher rate than advertised.

> Upon closer inspection, you realize you were not on the Ticketmaster site at all. It was a lookalike site with a similar name such as TicketSmarter or TicketFaster. When you call the customer-service number, they are either unreachable, unhelpful or downright aggressive.

One ticket buyer reported this experience: "They sent me two tickets with someone else's name on them, and they also charged me three times the amount (of) the ticket price. I have no way to get a refund and no customer service to contact (except by email) because they do not answer their phone.'

How to avoid ticket scams

Purchase from the venue. The safest way to purchase event tickets is to go directly through the venue, either in person or through their official website. The venue's website may point you to Ticketmaster or another provider to complete your purchase, but media and more.

you can be sure of having the correct website URL.

Check out the seller. If you purchase from a thirdparty company, make sure they are a reputable ticket vendor or reseller (https:// bit.ly/ticketreseller), not a ticket scalper. Check reviews on www.BBB.org.

Watch out for fake websites (www.BBB.org/all/ spot-a-scam/how-to-identify-a-fake-website). Take a close look at the website's URL to ensure there are no slight misspellings. Impostors like to make lookalike websites with domain names that are similar to well-known business names. This makes them hard to spot.



What is an annual notice of change from Medicare?

Dear Savvy Senior,

Last year I received a notice-of-change letter from my Medicare provider. Should I expect another one this year, and what should I do with it?

Medicare Rookie Dear Rookie,

The letter you're asking about is actually referred to as the annual notice of change or ANOC, which is a letter you receive from your Medicare Advantage or Medicare Part D prescription drug plan in late September. People with only a Medigap plan don't receive these because Medigap plans do not have benefit changes from year to year. So yes, you should expect to receive another letter next month.

The ANOC gives a summary of any changes in your plan's costs and coverage that will take effect Jan. 1 of the next year. The ANOC is typically mailed with the plan's evidence of coverage, which is a more comprehensive list of the plan's costs and benefits for the upcoming year.

You should review these notices to see if your plan will continue to meet your healthcare needs in 2023. If you are dissatisfied with any upcoming changes, you can make changes to your coverage during fall open enrollment, which runs from Oct. 15 to Dec. 7.

Here are three types of changes to look for:

Costs

If you have a Medicare Advantage plan, find out what you can expect to pay for services in 2023. Costs such as deductibles and copayments can change each year. For example, your plan may not have had a deductible in 2022. but it could have one in 2023. A deductible is the amount of money you owe out of pocket before your plan begins to cover your care. Another example is your plan may increase the copayments you owe for visits to your primary care provider or specialists.

Coverage

If you have an Advantage plan with prescription drug coverage, check to see if your doctors, hospitals, and other healthcare providers and pharmacies will still be in network for 2023. You have the lowest out-of-pocket costs if you go to providers and pharmacies that are in your plan's network. If you see an out-of-network provider, your plan may not cover any of the cost of your care, leaving you to pay the cost out of pocket. You also should contact your providers directly to confirm they still will

accept your plan in the coming year.

Drugs

If you have prescription drug coverage, look through the plan's formulary, which is the list of drugs the plan covers. Formulary changes can happen from year to year, so make sure the medications you're taking will be covered next year and they're not moved to a higher tier, which will affect your copay. If you see any changes that will increase your costs, you may want to select a different drug plan that covers all of your medications. If the formulary is incomplete or you do not see your drugs on the list, contact the plan directly to learn more.

If you have not received an ANOC by the end of September, you should contact your Medicare Advantage plan or Part D plan to request it. This notice can be very helpful in determining whether you should make any changes to your coverage during the fall open enrollment. Reading your ANOC also can prevent any surprises about your coverage in the new year.

Shopping, comparing and enrolling in a new Medicare Advantage or Part D plan during the open-enrollment period can easily be done online at Medicare's Plan Finder Tool at www.Medicare. gov/find-a-plan.

Or if you don't have a computer or internet access, you can call Medicare at 800-633-4227, and they can help you out over the phone. Your State Health Însurance Assistance Program, which provides free Medicare counseling, also is a great resource to help you make any changes. To find a local SHIP counselor, visit www.ShipHelp. org or call 877-839-2675.
