

# **Organist to perform concert**

American organist Joshua Brodbeck will perform at the Coshocton Presbyterian Church on Sunday, May 1 at 3 p.m. The public is welcome to attend this free event, which will be held in conjunction with the Pomerene Center for the Arts' annual Dogwood Festival.

Brodbeck has delighted concert-goers with his talent and with his audiencefriendly programs," said Alice Hoover, organist at the Coshocton Presbyterian Church. "His program entitled 'Buxtehude, Bach, Bish, and Brodbeck' will be one of classical music and hymn arrangements. We are excited to welcome this young artist."

Gillian Weir of the United Kingdom. He has won first prize in many competitions.


In addition to several concerts in the United States, Brodbeck has performed for tours in Germany, Switzerland and the Czech Republic.

Currently, Brodbeck is the minister of music and artist-in-residence at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Columbus, overseeing the entire music program and concert series. He also is the artistic director for the Delaware Community Chorus and director of worship for the Southern Ohio Synod of the **Evangelical Lutheran Church** in America.

At the May 1 concert, Brodbeck will play the Engle organ, a tracker-action organ built by the Taylor and Boody Company. The organ was a gift to the church from Joe R. Engle and was dedicated May 20, 1979. This historic organ is similar to instruments J.S. Bach would have played.

The Coshocton Presbyterian Church is located at 142 N. Fourth St. in Coshocton, across from the court square. The parking lot and the building are wheelchair accessible.

# Marking History

Schoenbrunn celebrates 250th anniversary of its founding

free two-day event will cel-A ebrate the 250th anniversary of the founding of Historic Schoenbrunn Village near New Philadelphia.

Tuesday, May 3 marks the exact date Moravian missionary Rev. David Zeisberger, other Moravian missionaries and Christian Delaware families arrived at the site in 1772. Zeisberger had been invited to establish a mission at the invitation of the Delaware leader Netawatawees.

The first event on May 3 will feature a number of representatives of the groups that have been involved at Schoenbrunn from the very beginning — the Delaware Tribe and the Moravian Church.

Wendy Zucal, director of the Dennison Depot Railroad Museum, which operates the village for the Ohio History Connection, feels it's important to mark this occasion.

"It's also an opportunity to bring people together — the Ohio History Connection, our Delaware partners and our Moravian partners — for the betterment of the village," Zucal said

The event is the first time a field guide, "Understanding Schoenbrunn Village: Field Guide to the Moravian Delaware Village of Welhik Thuppeck," will be available for purchase at the gift shop. Welhik Thuppeck is what the Delaware called the village and the name Zeisberger used in his diaries.

Seth Angel, a volunteer at the village for 10 years, originally wrote the new field guide so Schoenbrunn volunteers had a better grasp on the history and to let them know about some of the people who may have been overlooked.

"Each of the individuals that to donate to the project. lived in the village had a story. Unfortunately, a lot of those stories have been lost to time, but the ones that we still know and still remember through the diaries, we need to tell so they aren't forgotten," Angel said.

In addition to the history, the center portion of the book is a walking tour around the village, stopping at each of the reconstructed homes, and it also has a section to talk about God's acre, the village's cemetery. A time line of the Moravian missions ends with Goshen, which was founded in 1798 and was Zeisberger's last mission.

Angel of New Philadelphia will portray the town crier at the event.

"I'm looking forward to just the opportunity to meet with some of the folks that are coming in, both the Delaware contingent coming in and people coming from Bethlehem, Pennsylvania," Angel said. "I'm also looking forward to talking about

Another project to look for will be a map inside the museum that is going to be representative of the Ohio Country between 1760 and

"That's going to show distances of how long it took to get somewhere," Laurence said. "It's going to be interesting. It's a small map, but it's good for the kids. It took two weeks to go from Schoenbrunn to Fort Pitt or to Detroit.'

The 250th anniversary will be celebrated year round with a speaker series from May 2022 to May 2023 in conjunction with Kent State Tuscarawas and the Moravian churches. There also will be commemorative items for sale in the gift shop including original artwork from local artists.

On Aug. 14 the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District will partner with Schoenbrunn to sponsor a Paddle into the Past event

Life in the village revolved around a system known as choirs.

"In the choir system, the village was divided by age, gender and marital status. And those choirs or groups attended church worship, had fellowship time and studied, worked and so forth together in those choirs. And that was kind of the overarching structure of the village," Angel said. "That's something that's kind of hard to understand today, but I'm hoping the book will help visitors and staff understand how the village operated at that time."

Longtime volunteer George Laurence of New Philadelphia headed up a project to build a ghost cabin that will be part of the village for the first time during the 250th event. Made of a metal framework, the structure gives shape to the next cabin rebuilding project village officials would like to undertake. Visitors will be able to use their phones Bank, and WTUZ.

# Help for kids who stutter as close as your library

Stuttering: For Kids By Kids," a DVD in English

Many children who stutand Spanish starring kids ter have never met others who stutter, is available who struggle with the same at most public libraries or disability. In this DVD from



the Stuttering Foundation, they meet kids who recount how they handled challenges such as teasing, speaking out in class and teaching others about stuttering.

Swish, an animated basketball character designed by students at Purdue University, narrates the DVD. The children, who range in age from first-graders to high school students, offer differing views of stuttering.

For example, Matthew, age 10, said, "It's no big deal," but Kate, age 9, worries about talking, what is going to happen next and whether or not she'll stutter.

Arianne, age 14, said, The hardest part about stuttering is to get through it and to stay in there when you're stuck.'

Umang, age 12, said, "Sometimes it gets kind of annoying when you want to say something and you can't. I also get worried what other people might think if I do stutter and wonder if I'll be able to get out of my

blocks and things."

"All those interested in helping kids learn more about stuttering will want to see this tape," speech-language pathologist Bill Murphy of Purdue University said. "The children featured are a perfect example of how to openly and honestly handle stuttering."





# Cinco de Mayo a bigger deal in the U.S. than Mexico

Mexico gets quite a bum rap here in the states. The country has been invaded by numerous old-world powers and by the U.S., trampled and cut down to size so frequently they become an easy target for fatuous politicians with no more knowledge of Mexico or Mexicans than a snake has hips.

Cinco de Mayo, literally Fifth of May, is next week, and many of us will make some kind of tequilasoaked jab at joining in the celebration.

The holiday, which is a bigger deal in the U.S. than in Mexico proper, marks a victory in turning the forces of Napoleon III out of the country in 1862. Mexicans suspended debt payments to other nations in 1861, and French, Spanish and English troops marched right in to try and slap some coin out of them.

The English and Spanish soon left as it wasn't worth the trouble. The French stayed on, hoping to weaken American influence south of the border and turn Mexico into a monarchy led by the Austro-Hungarian empire.

The French took a beating at the battle of Puebla,

and Cinco de Mayo celebrates that victory, even though the French kept on fighting for a few more years before taking their cigarettes and heading back to Paris.

Because of the large Mexican population there from the earliest days. California was the starting point for Unites States celebrations of the day, and the rest of the country got on board after Franklin Roosevelt's Good Neighbor Policy opened the way for better relations with nations in the Caribbean.

The usual celebratory dish for Cinco de Mayo in Mexico is a poblano pepper in mole sauce, a rich, dark brown sauce with an ingredient list as long as a Pontiac, with Mexican chocolate playing a central flavor role.

Mole is something I've never tackled outside of buying it in a jar and thinning it a bit, but it is most surely delicious with just

Not counting fast food, I can think of at least six Mexican restaurants off the top of my head, which we are fortunate to find in our backyard, plus a great many pop-ups and food trucks. That makes us extremely lucky as the LatinX community has matured enough to stabilize and begin sharing more of their culture and cuisine.

As I would bet you had misconceptions about the origins of the day, Cinco de Mayo in the United States has become more of a generalized celebration of Mexican culture. Los Angeles, Chicago and Houston make a really big deal of it, closing streets and throwing a big party, more so than in Tijuana.

Cinco de Mayo has been a federally recognized holiday in America since 2005, but it is not an official holiday in Mexico. We celebrate pretty heavily in the U.S., consuming 81 million pounds of avocados and more tequila than any other nation on earth that day. That's a lot of guacamole and margaritas.

Everyone has their favorite recipe for guacaabout anything you might mole, and this is the one

I've worked on and fussed with over the years. It probably has more ingredients than a purist would like, but I like my guac a little chunky and with a little added color.

In taking the pit out of the avocado, turn it upside down and push from the back after halving it. Sticking a big knife into the pit sends a lot of people to the ER every year. The injury even has a name, "avocado hand."

### **GUACAMOLE**

2 Hass avocados, pitted, peeled and cut into small

1 clove garlic, crushed 2 teaspoons red onion, finely diced

1 or 2 Serrano chilies, seeded and finely diced (or to taste)

2 tablespoons Roma tomato, finely diced

Cilantro leaves, chopped, to taste 2 or more tablespoons fresh

lime juice Small pinch of cumin powder

l teaspoon kosher salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl and

In 2020 OMEGA received a CARES Act Supplemental Planning Grant for COVID-19 Economic Recovery from the U.S. Economic Development Administration. 

"They also show what it will take to fix the problem and proofficials to identify priority areas for broadband expansion. The study estimates it will cost \$743 million to install fiber to the home in the region with \$558 million in grant funding needed. Tom Reid, president of Reid Consulting Group, said this is about what it would cost to build just 50 miles of highway.

Educational travel, which combines travel with indepth learning opportunities, has become a very popular way of travel among retirees. Here are a few good places to turn to find these types of trips in the U.S. and abroad.

### **Tour organizations**

One of the best places to start is with Road Scholar at www.RoadScholar.org, which invented the idea of educational travel for older adults in the mid-1970s. The Boston-based organization offers 5,500 learning adventures in all 50 states and 150 countries.

You can search for learning adventures by location, interest, activity level and price. Road Scholar also offers Choose Your Pace senior travel tours that allow participants to adjust their level of challenge on

a daily basis. And for skipgen vacations, they offer tours designed specifically for grandparents traveling with their grandkids.

Another excellent option is Smithsonian Journeys at www.SmithsonianJourneys. org, a nonprofit travel group affiliated with the Smithsonian Museum. They lead 350 educational trips a year on every continent that are led by experts from a variety of fields — academia, the diplomatic corps, scientists and curators, among others

If you're seeking more adventure, you may want to consider ElderTreks at www.ElderTreks.com, which offers over 50 travelers small-group adventures by both land and sea in more than 100 countries. Their trips center on adventure, culture and nature, letting you get up close and personal with the locals.

### **Academic travel**

Another good source for

educational trips is colleges and universities. Some of my favorites include Cornell University's Adult University at SCE.Cornell. edu/travel, which offers a half-dozen educational trips and courses in the U.S. and abroad, each lasting a few days to a week or more. And Stanford Travel/Study at Alumni.Stanford.edu offers educational travel journeys to more than 80 countries each year.

Most college/university trips are led by faculty who share their expertise, along with regional experts and local guides, and you don't need to be an alumnus to participate.

Also check out the Traveling Professor at www. TravelingProfessor.com, a small-group touring company led by Steve Solosky, formerly a professor at the State University of New York. They offer a dozen or so tours abroad each year and take between eight and 16 people.

### **Cruising options**

If you enjoy cruising, consider Grand Circle Travel at www.GCT.com, which offers educational travel aboard small ships, and

Naturalist Journeys at www. Naturalist Journeys.com, which specializes in nature and birding tours.

And it has themed cruises — Lewis and Clark, Mark Twain, Civil War and more — for people with specific historical, literary or other interests.

And Viking River Cruises at www. VikingRiver-Cruises.com is geared to older travelers and focuses on European art, history and culture. Each cruise makes one to two port stops a day as the ship winds its way up or down Europe's most famous rivers like the Rhine, Seine, Danube and Douro. A free sight-seeing tour is included at all stops, and special-interest excursions are available for additional fees. Viking offers tours in the United States too.
