SEI artists collaborate on a new mural

A new collaboration between artist Jon Stucky and Starlight Enterprises Inc. will feature three paintings done by Starlight artists in the design of a new mural in downtown New Philadelphia.

A grant from the Ohio Arts Council is funding the project, which includes the opportunity for the individual paintings to travel to different locations around the county. The grant was written by local artist Jon Stucky and Jeannine Kennedy, director of the Tuscarawas County Center for the Arts.

Stucky has collaborated on other projects with the Starlight artists, starting with one on Ashwood Lane in New Philadelphia. In the past the Starlight artists have helped by contributing pattern work to the design.

"This time I met with them in January, and we talked about it, and we came up with a tropical theme. So I had them all draw out tropical flowers. We're actually using the drawings they've done. We've blown the drawings up bigger and incorporated them into the paintings on canvas," Stucky said. "And then (the painting designs) will also

be on the walls. It's a much larger scale work because normally they come in after there's a big section of color and they put in smaller stuff. I wanted to make their work more prominent."

The painting designs are flowers, which the SEI artists have painted in some of the murals with the signature angel figures Stucky enjoys painting.

"We've dropped the flowers with the angel figures that we did on the very first mural. It's like a true collaboration between everything we've done since the beginning of that very first one," Stucky said.

The new mural will be on the south side of the building that houses Mustard's @ The Wine Rack and the Mini-Shop Drive-Thru. The businesses are owned by Tony and Rachel Montero.

"They have just offered the wall. This is not an advertisement for their business. This is just a piece of art," Stucky said.

The Monteros also provided a wall along the alley last year for a starburst mural Stucky and Starlight completed.

Stucky enjoys collaborating with Starlight and is impressed with the art pro-

gram Starlight has developed for individuals with developmental disabilities.

"I love what they do. They inspire me. I love that they have that facility in this county. I'm always trying to help promote and raise money to keep that accessible to that part of our community," Stucky said. "It's very rare, especially with a community our size, that we have that kind of program available. But I think it's really important. It's something you find in much bigger cities but rarely in a small community like ours."

The Starlight artists not only consider Stucky a mentor, but also a friend. Artist Rodney Fuller said he enjoys working with Stucky, and their friendship has helped him learn. Fuller has learned new techniques from Stucky that he applies to his own projects.

Art life coach Carrie Herbert said since the collaborations with Stucky, Fuller has been inspired by the opportunity to work on larger pieces like the ones they are working on now for the new mural. Fuller's paintings now have distinctive style.

Fuller expresses himself through art.

"I can look at pieces and say that's Rodney's piece because I know how he paints," Herbert said.

Herbert and art life coach Kelly McMillen operate the art studio at New Towne Mall.

"With Rodney, what is really cool is that he looks at something and puts his own interpretation on it," said Tracy Aubihl, community connections manager for Starlight. "He really has raw talent — a raw, innate talent that he has as an artistic person that he is able to create and see a vision that you and I and other people might not be able to see."

One can see the influence of Stucky in some of the paintings Fuller creates.

"We can't say enough about Jon. It's opened up their creativity beyond what they see. They can interpret things, and there's a whole world out there that they didn't realize," Aubihl said.

Reviewers for the State DODD stopped by the New Towne Mall studio recently, and they were impressed with the way the Starlight program has used art to allow their individuals to contribute to their community including the murals around New Philadelphia and at the Tuscarawas County Fairgrounds, their shop at Alley Cats, and selling paintings at the county office building and Cleveland Clinic Union Hospital in addition to their studio.

"(The reviewer) took pictures of everything and the street art," Aubihl said. "(The Starlight artists) are leaving a permanent mark in the community with the street art and creativity wise. That was just amazing to them. That's a huge breakthrough."

The reviewers said in an exit interview that art is one of the things the Starlight program is a leader in.

Aubihl said the reviewers purchased some art before they left.

"They didn't buy it because it was made by artists with disabilities. They bought it because this

was great art,” Aubihl said. “That says a lot upon itself. They weren’t just making a donation; they were saying I like this art.”

The Starlight art program has been active for the last two decades with different artistic opportunities.

“However, in the most recent years, we have evolved more as a community partner. We have always partnered with the Tuscarawas County Center for the Arts with Jeannine Kennedy, and that has been a wonderful opportunity for us to showcase art,” said Cassie Elvin, CEO at SEI. “And now community partners such as Jon Stucky have absolutely evolved our art program to be a substantial community partner in the arts.”

The program focuses on individuals’ own strengths.

“We don’t want to focus on disabilities. We’re focusing on the talents and the abilities,” Elvin said.

Elvin is pleased with the opportunities the New Towne Mall studio affords them.

“It’s been a very positive thing for us. It’s not sheltered as part of the community. It’s in the community, and they’re also getting to express their talents and aspirations,” Elvin said.

In addition to art, the studio and store provide the artists an opportunity to

provide customer service, helping customers with their selections and making transactions using a Square account.

All the artists enjoy the benefits of working at the mall. It offers an opportunity to meet people, get lunch and even do some shopping.

In addition to paintings, the art studio offers a variety of gifts including soaps and decorative wooden items. The studio is located opposite of the mall’s food court. Hours at the Starlight Art Studio in New Towne Mall are Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Salute TO SCHOLARS

Indian Valley Foundation presents scholarships

It was an evening of remembrance and inspiration when donors and members of the Indian Valley Foundation presented scholarship awards to 28 students at Indian Valley High School in Gnadenhutten.

Guest speaker Jeff Rankin of Cincinnati, a 1972 graduate of Indian Valley High School, spoke at the event about his career and the value of reputation. He credits always trying to do the right thing as part of the success he's had. Rankin started out at Proctor and Gamble and moved on to other companies, working his way up to president in one company.

"What's the definition of reputation? It's two things: your actions and what other people say about you. That's your reputation. You can control your actions. You cannot control what other people say about you," Rankin said. "Your reputation precedes you wherever you go. You can't shake it. It's going stay with you. It's the most powerful leverage you can have in your life and in your business in the future."

Rankin reminded students that through their actions they have been working on their personal reputations throughout high school.

"Why you are here tonight is because of what other people are saying about you," Rankin said. "(The IVF has) seen your actions and is going to acknowledge you as having a great reputation by awarding some people scholarships. Continue to build on your reputation, wherever you're going next and in your personal life and professional life."

Rankin congratulated the students and thanked them for being the future.

Dave McPeek, president of the IVF, noted the impact of attending Indian Valley Schools.

"One thing about attending a

small school like Indian Valley North and South was back in the day we did forge great relationships with our classmates. And one thing that's never changed around Indian Valley is the quality of education," McPeek said. "I look back at our class. We have doctors and lawyers, counselors, nurses, engineers, and it was a pretty highly successful class. As I look back on that, I see in reading your scholarship applications that that trend continues to this day."

Many heartfelt memories were shared during the presentation of the awards.

Amy Wentworth, superintendent of New Philadelphia Schools, presented a scholarship in memory of her father, a longtime Indian Valley teacher.

"Henry 'Hank' Allgyer was unashamed in his love for all things Indian Valley. He energetically and enthusiastically supported this district in words and in deeds. He was a bus driver, a teacher, but most importantly he was a lifelong learner. And he would be absolutely thrilled to know that even today he's able to impact students in their learning," Wentworth said.

Scholarship presenter Blair Hillyer took time to speak about the person behind The Leslie S. Harrold Charitable Endowment Fund, which donated some of the award money. At the time of her passing, Dr. Harrold was the medical director for Community Hospice.

"She lived in Massillon, and if you would have seen her around, you probably would have never known she was a doctor. But she was on call 24/7 for every dying patient in hospice. And her charge — zero — never collected a paycheck," Hillyer said. "She was so happy with Tuscarawas County she left a lot of money for scholarships. She also left a ton of money to Community Hospice to help folks who are in their last days. I said when she passed away, we lost the best volunteer we ever had."

Former educators Kandi Wilson and Jayne Huebner presented a scholarship in memory of their late colleague, Debbie Gilmore.

"As you know, the Indian Valley community lost a beloved teacher, colleague and friend with the passing of Debbie Gilmore earlier this year. Her loss was felt by many, and she is greatly missed," Wilson said.

Founding IVF member Minnie Garabrandt was pleased the group was able to distribute scholarships to all 28 students who applied this year.

"I have to tell you that my heart is full and overflowing. I trust that each one of you will remember the wonderful remarks that have been made tonight and especially the graduating seniors going on into college," Garabrandt said. "But don't forget about us when you get out into the working world. Remember the Indian Valley Foundation is going to need younger

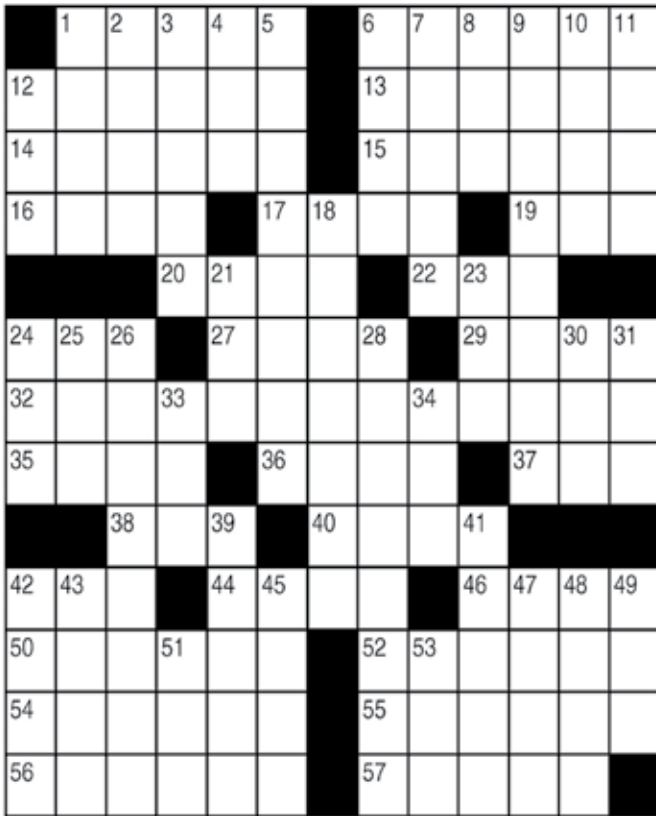

SWCD mission says it all

“Providing assistance for the wise use of our natural resources for present and future generations.”

This Tuscarawas County Soil and Water Conservation District mission statement says it all, and your local SWCD will most likely be able to help you in your mission, whatever your soil and water mission may be.

Whether you are rural or urban, I suspect the “wise use of our natural resources for present and future generations” is at the top of your list, be it consciously or subconsciously.

We live in an area with great diversity involving our natural resources, and your local SWCD office personnel can help you with whatever your potential need may be involving the natural resources you may have under your care.

Preserving soil and helping to keep water clean are obviously a couple of the main goals of the Soil and Water Conservation District. There has been a wealth of science-based knowledge gained and passed down over the past eight decades the SWCD organization has been in existence.

Some of the more rewarding soil and water preserving achievements I have witnessed over the last several decades is a result of the mass adoption of no-till



and reduced tillage practices and the reduction of nutrients applied where soil levels are not actually the limiting factor.

The use of cover crops wherever possible has recently gained great popularity and has helped to keep soil covered, which obviously reduces erosion, nutrient loss and aids in water conservation.

These extremely beneficial practices are a result of the hard work and research conducted by OSU Extension and implementation assistance by SWCD personnel and land managing implementors. I implore you to try something new on your little section of the earth that will positively impact our soil and water.

Urban projects could be composting and reduced nutrient use on lawns. Rural projects could be reducing tillage and/or somehow reducing trips across a field in cropping situations. Hay and pasture projects could involve more efficient fertilizer usage through more appropriate distribution, timing and soil testing.

Yes, soil test, soil test,

soil test all fields including row crop fields and the sometimes overlooked hay and pasture fields. I have observed testing of hay and pasture fields is not done at the frequency and intensity it should be. There is much production being missed out on in hay and pasture fields as a result of poor nutrient management. “Don’t guess, soil test.”

Conservation practices in your wood lots should not be overlooked either as trees and forested areas are a very large proportion of our land mass.

As this column brings thoughts to your mind, write them down, then contact your local SWCD office with your ideas. There is a good chance they can offer you guidance along with resources and references that can help you figure out the best implementation plan and assist you in putting your plans in to action.

Your local SWCD office may not do it all, but it seems they can somehow make it all happen with the years of knowledge and expertise that has been grown through the years.

The mission is “Providing assistance for the wise use of our natural resources for present and future generations” after all.

The process of downsizing and moving to a new home is a big job for anyone, but it can be especially overwhelming for seniors who are moving from a longtime residence filled with decade's worth of stuff and a lifetime of memories. Fortunately, there's a specialized service available today that can help

make your mom's move a lot easier for her and for you.

Senior move managers

To help your mom get packed up and moved into her new home, you should consider hiring a senior move manager. These are trained organizers — they are not moving companies — who assist older people with the challenges of relocating and can minimize the stress of this major transition by doing most of the work for you.

A senior move manager can help your mom pare down her belongings, decide what to take and what to dispose of, recommend charities for donations, and help sell her unwanted items. They can even create a customized floor plan of her new home so your mom can visualize where her belongings will fit.

Senior move managers also can get estimates from moving companies, oversee the movers, arrange the move date, supervise the packing and unpacking, help set up her new home, and have the house cleaned and just about anything you need related to her move.

If you want to do some of the work yourself, you can

pick and choose only the services you want. For example, you may only want a move manager's help with downsizing and selling excess furniture and unwanted belongings but plan on doing the actual packing and moving yourself.

The cost of working with a senior move manager will vary depending on where you live, the services you want and size of the move, but you can expect to pay somewhere between \$60 and \$125 per hour or more, not including the cost of movers.

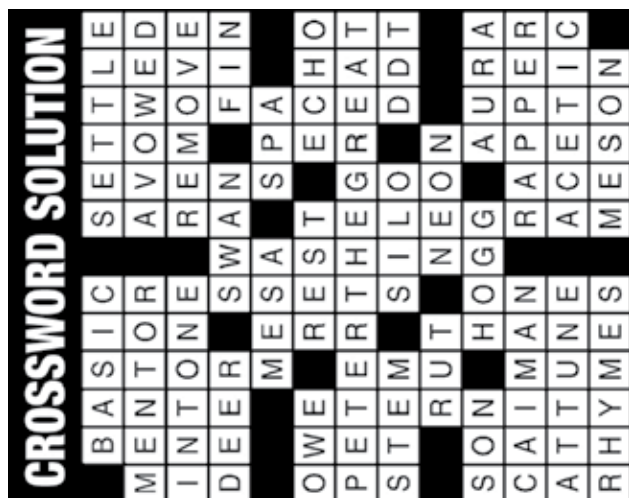
