Philharmonic will bid farewell to Benjamin

On Saturday, June 4, Eric Benjamin will conduct his final concert with the Tuscarawas Philharmonic at the Performing Arts Center at Kent State University at Tuscarawas. It has been, according to Benjamin, a 25-year love affair since he first became the musical director and conductor of the philharmonic.

The final concert of the season, "A Tuneful Goodbye — with Friends," will bring together classical music with the music of some of Benjamin's friends and will include an appearance by Dr. Jongho Kim, who will take over as the philharmonic's next musical director.

"Eric has created a unique place in the history of the Tuscarawas Philharmonic and in this community," said Carey Gardner, vice president of the philharmonic board of directors.

Along with some celebrated symphonic pieces by Hindemith and Barber, the concert will feature compositions by Benjamin and his friends: Alex Bevan of Cleveland, Willie Nelson, John Williams, jazz musicians Richie Travers and Jackie Warren, and Dover

native Elizabeth Langford Estes.

Combining musical genres has been one of Benjamin's fortes as musical director, whose approach and willingness to interact with audiences made him a beloved maestro to the orchestra and concert-goers.

"Eric has a great relationship with the orchestra members," philharmonic concertmaster Mary Bontrager said. "He has always been easy to work with. I will have many memories of making great music together."

From his early days conducting the orchestra in the Dover High School audi-

torium to his tenure at the PAC, Benjamin said he has tried to take some of the pretentiousness out of classical music concerts, talking casually to audiences about the various pieces of music being performed.

"I've always enjoyed the interaction between Eric, the orchestra members and those of us sitting in the auditorium," Gardner said. "Eric's self-deprecating humor and animated style on the podium engaged, amused and educated the audience in a style all his own."

One of Benjamin's concerts brought local country musicians to the stage and finished with Beethoven's "Pastoral Symphony," which is about living in the country.

"You just have to use a little imagination and give yourself the opportunity to try something a little outside of the envelope," Benjamin said. "I've been able to do that here."

The conductor who almost wasn't

A native of St. Albans, Vermont, Benjamin started out as a rock and roller, playing in several bands as a seventh-grader. "But then I heard 'In the Hall of the Mountain King' from the Peer Gynt Suite by Edvard Grieg, and I was really taken with it," he said. "So I gave up my rock and roll career — the money, the women, the whole thing. I even gave my rock albums to the local public library. Classical music was a way for me, in adolescence, to identify myself. I wasn't an athlete, I wasn't the best student in class and I wasn't a chick magnet."

After completing his master's degree in orchestral conducting at the New England Conservatory of Music, Benjamin described the day he sent in his application for the assistant conductor position with the Akron Symphony Orchestra, which he landed.

"I distinctly remember standing in line at the post office," he said. "It was five o'clock, and I was having to express mail the application, and that was money that I couldn't really afford to spend. So I actually stepped out of line and walked toward the door but was struck with the thought, 'You can't win if you don't play.' So I got back in line, paid my money and sent it out."

A wonderful, growing experience

That's how Benjamin sums up his quarter-century with the philharmonic. "They always gave me room for expansion in terms of programming and the technical capacity of the orchestra, so we all grew together for 25 years," he said.

"When I first dreamed about being a conductor, I wanted to be part of a team of people who would present classical music in a wide variety of genres, and that's what I found here. I'm just the guy who waves the stick."

Benjamin plans to spend more time on creative writing projects, particularly for educational purposes. "I've got sketches for pieces that are older than my children, and my oldest is 32. So it's time for me to get going on those if they're ever gonna see the light of day," he said.

As Benjamin concludes his time in Tuscarawas County, Gardner had this to say: "Thank you for 25 years of musical memories and learning experiences. Thank you for taking the philharmonic to new heights artistically and leaving the organization with a wealth of public support and appreciation for the value of the orchestra to the Tuscarawas Valley."

New Philadelphia mayor says home rule is at risk

At the May 23 meeting of New Philadelphia City Council, Mayor Joel Day recognized three general service department employees for going beyond the call of duty. On April 12 Triston Hunter, Mike Brinkley and Donny Pettitt were driving a city vehicle on Park Avenue Northwest when they saw an elderly woman fall down the steps outside of her home. The three called 911 and stayed with her until paramedics arrived.

"Had they not responded so quickly, it's uncertain just how long the woman would have gone without help," Day said.

Day also said in his report to council that the Oĥio Municipal League has advised local elected officials and citizens of continuing efforts by the Ohio legislature to erode the power of cities to enact local self-governing laws and regulations, otherwise known as home rule. According to Day, OML cites a lack of participation by local citizens and elected officials for giving special interest groups and lobbyists more say in writing legislation.

Day urged citizens to get involved by learning more about the bills being considered by the Ohio legislature by visiting www.legislature. ohio.gov and contacting State Rep. Brett Hillyer and Ohio Sen. Jay Hottinger.

Service Director Ron McAbier said the Kent State Connector Trail planned by the city will be completely funded by grants totaling more than \$2 million. He also said work on runway lighting at Harry Clever Field will begin the week of May 30, and the Dominion gas line project has been rescheduled to begin in September, at the earliest.

Jim Seldenright, chair of the airport commission, asked for and received a vote approving two new members to the commission to fulfill unexpired

Mitch Pace reported for the parks commission that construction will begin on pickleball courts at Tuscora Park on Aug. 1. Pace also said the city parks department is looking for summer

Dean Holland reported for the health board, saying the city health department will be receiving state funds totaling \$22,755 as reimbursement for expenses incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Along those same lines, Holland said COVID-19 cases are on the rise again in both the city and Tuscarawas County. Vaccines and home test kits are still available at the city health department.

Holland reminded the public that FEMA is offering funeral assistance for deaths caused by the COVID-19 virus. Those needing assistance should apply at www.fema.gov.

In other health matters, Holland said 20 overdose deaths were reported in the of April, with 12 of those occurring in New Philadel-

Approved legislation

Council voted to do the following:

-Increase sanitation fees by 50 cents per month beginning in June. Councilwoman Cheryl Ramos said she felt the measure was a "happy compromise" from the originally proposed \$1.25 per month increase.

—Approve the mayor's appointment of Nicole Bache, director of nursing at the city's health department, to represent region 11 on the OneOhio Recovery Foundation board in charge of dispersing settlement proceeds from opioid legislation.

-Adopt an agreement between the city and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees Local 1958 and Ohio Council 8 regarding city employee contracts from Jan. 1, 2022, through Dec. 31, 2024.

Tuscarawas Valley Farmers Market to open June 1

he 14th season of the Tuscarawas Valley Farmers Market will open Wednesday, June 1 and be held every Wednesday from 3-7 p.m. through Oct. 12 at the Tuscarawas County Fairgrounds in Dover. The only week they do not set up is fair week, so there will be no market on Wednesday, Sept. 21.

The market is held rain or shine and moves under the grandstands at the fairgrounds when inclement weather is expected.

"The most frequent comment we hear is how friendly our market is, from the vendors to the volunteers and everyone in between,' said Hannah Hartman, a volunteer with the Tuscarawas Valley Farmers Market. "It really has become a place for social interaction as much as a grocery stop. We also hear a lot of comments about how fantastic the fresh produce tastes, which comes as no surprise to us because much of the produce you'll find at our market was picked either that morning or perhaps the day before.

'When you compare the taste of a fresh-picked fruit or vegetable to one that has traveled hundreds or even thousands of miles and been in transport and sitting on a shelf for several days, there is no comparison. We often challenge shoppers to taste the difference because it is very noticeable."

Old is new again at the market

Other than new vendors, the only new things are really just the return of some old things," Hartman said. "We're excited to bring back cooking demos on a monthly basis. They were previously held every week."

Cooking demos are scheduled for mostly the first Friday of each month at 5 p.m. inside the Clover Café and will feature Mary Marshall on June 8, July 6 and Sept. 7 and Sherry Schie on Aug. 3 and Oct. 5.

"Both live music and the food trucks have always been well received by market-goers, and we know our patrons really missed the music when it was put on hold due to COVID restrictions," Hartman

The market will have live music each Wednesday from 5-7 p.m. A variety of food trucks will be available on a rotating scheduling.

The Tuscarawas Valley Farmers Market participates in several programs that assist qualifying individuals with the cost of purchasing fresh produce at the market including SNAP/Ohio Direction Card. P-EBT (school lunch card), Produce Perks, the Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program and WIC.

A guide to the programs also is posted on the homepage of the market's website at www.tvffm. org. They also accept their own form of currency — carrot cash.

In addition to opening day, the volunteers will hold Tuscarawas County Farm Bureau Barbecue Demonstration and Stock Up for Independence Day on June 29. Kids Day is planned for July 20, and Customer Appreciation Day will be Aug. 10 during National Farmers Market Week.

The volunteers also are working to connect with local artists with Hispanic roots to develop a new event that coincides with National Hispanic Heritage Month, which runs from Sept. 15 through Oct. 15.

The market group already has plans to hold another Thanksgiving market indoors at New Towne Mall as they did last year.

"The Holiday Market was a great success, especially considering it was in a new location. People turned out, and our vendors

The sixth annual Holiday Market will be held the Tuesday before Thanksgiving on Nov. 22 from 3-7 p.m. at the mall.

The volunteers with the farmers market feel it's important to shop

"When you shop at the TVFM, you are directly supporting our local food economy and the farmers who work tirelessly to provide high-quality, nutrient-dense produce to our community," Hartman said. "A common theme you'll find when trying to consume a healthier diet is that foods with no preservatives are always the best choice, and such foods are the norm at a farmers market."

The opportunity to speak directly with the farmers who grow the food is important.

"If you have any questions about their growing practices, whether they use any sort of sprays or anything about their processes, you can get your answers on the spot. This is especially helpful if you are someone with dietary restrictions or allergies and need to know specific information about what is in the foods you consume." Hartman said. "Additionally, many businesses like to use the term local to describe their product offerings, but they often do not define what that means.

"For the TVFM, local means the products come from within a 50-mile radius of the Dover/New Philadelphia area, and all of the vendors at the TVFM meet that requirement. It doesn't get much more local than that.'

The TVFM also operates the Tuscarawas Valley Food Hub Initiative, which is a program developed to connect local institutions like restaurants and healthcare facilities with fresh, local produce.

"One of the goals of the TVFM is to strengthen our local food economy by encouraging a partnership between buyers and growers of local farm products that benefits consumers and producers, and the Food Hub does just that," Hartman said. "The restaurants and others who participate call the farmers directly to place their weekly order. Then the farmers bring the orders to the market on Wednesday, and participants pick them up with assistance from market volunteers."

The current Food Hub participants include Cleveland Clinic Union Hospital, Community Hospice, Fresh the Market, Hennis Care Centre of Bolivar, Missions Café and Park Street Pizza. Visit www.tvffm.org/food-hub for more information including prices.

Eight new vendors will join the market this year including the following:

3Peas Market Garden, a full-time vendor: Products include lettuce, baby greens, radish, peas, carrots, Swiss chard, kale, squash, beets, beans, onions, cucumbers, tomatoes and peppers.

Bake N Spoon, a part-time vendor the first and third weeks of the month: Products include fruit pies, cream pies, cakes, cupcakes, cookies, candy, breads, soups, jams and other seasonal items.

Eagleton Farms & Gardens, a seasonal vendor in July: Products include blueberries, raspberries of several varieties, sunflowers, daisies, jams, syrup, zucchinis and cucumbers.

Edelweiss Ridge Farm, a part-time vendor the first and third weeks of the month: Products include free-range duck, chicken and bantam chicken eggs; blown and cleaned eggs for decorating; unusual and eccentric produce; and herbs and flowers.

Ellington Farms, a parttime vendor the second and fourth weeks of the month: Products include beef snack sticks, steaks, ground beef, roasts, pork roasts, chops, sausage in many forms, chicken breasts, thighs, drumsticks, chicken sausage, eggs, spices, farm hats and goat soap.

Magnolia Spring Farm, a part-time vendor the third week of the month: Products include fresh flower bouquets including peonies, ranunculus, sweet peas, sunflowers, dahlias and more; dried flowers; handmade floral soaps; wreaths; flower and veggie starts and plugs; heirloom pumpkins; and heirloom veggies.

Modern Remedies, a fulltime vendor: Products include CBD honey, full-spectrum CBD oil in vanilla/caramel and peppermint, and CBD body butter.

Rae's Custom-Made Chipotle Seasoning, a full-time vendor: Products include three blends of dry seasonings.

Tuscazoar, Rural Action join forces for cleanup

Officials at Camp Tuscazoar and Rural Action volunteers joined forces to clean up the riverbank at the camp for the first time. The group removed 960 pounds of trash including a bowling ball, two basketballs, tires and plastic bottles, the most found item.

The event was held as part of the Ohio River Sweep, which is an annual volunteer cleanup that extends the entire length of the Ohio River and many of its tributaries. Scouts also had the opportunity to earn a Soil and Conservation Merit Badge.

Marissa Lautzenheiser of Rural Action had scouted the area the day before and divided it up into four sections for the more than 50 volunteers to clean.

Lautzenheiser has participated in cleanups at other locations before that found unusual items, so she didn't want to predict ahead of time what the group might find.

"My favorite thing we found is a canoe that had a big hole in it. It became an office canoe after we tried to check the registration, but there wasn't one. We found a cell phone that we were able to charge,

tives that the volunteers could help with, we narrowed in on two activities. One was a river pickup because of their location behind the Dover dam. They end up with a lot of litter that was not generated at the camp but simply floated downstream.'

When Dover Dam is closed during springtime floods, it can be detrimental to the camp.

"Everything from south of Akron stops right here," Lautzenheiser said.

Once the water level drops behind the dam, that can leave a lot of trash. "We decided that a river sweep would be a great way to get everyone involved and to really talk about what an impact the river has on the camp," Lautzenheiser said.

Another initiative the camp decided to pursue this year was sustainability with their fundraising events.



involved with Rural Action.
"I knew that we needed

"I knew that we needed to move towards more active conservation projects that involve larger groups of people. So I cast that vision out to the board of directors, that we come up with ways of cleaning the water that passes through our land or passes by our land. And how can we be just better stewards of our land?" Harris said. "We do that through large projects with the ODNR when we do former mine reclamation projects. And then we also do that through planting trees, and we looked at how much waste we produce at events.'

The camp plans to have more events with Rural Action.

"I'm not sure where this will take us, but we're going to keep going down that path, doing our part for the river," Harris said.

Lautzenheiser and Harris also led a safety talk before the cleanup. Included was

information on keeping hydrated, identifying poison ivy and other hazards like ticks, and taking care when picking up items to use gloves and litter pickers.

Safety was the top priority. For this sweep volunteers worked on cleaning the banks of the river only, and no one got into the water.

Lautzenheiser thought the litter pickup also was an educational one.

'We found an amazing amount of Styrofoam. And I think that really opened the kids' eyes to the things that are disposable that you buy, like at the gas station on your way to a day at the beach or the day at the river," Lautzenheiser said. "It doesn't actually get disposed of unless you put it away. I think that it was good for them to see that Styrofoam was in tiny little pieces as small as a thumbnail, all the way up to full coolers. I think it's good for everyone to be reminded that the things that we purchase never really go away. They just go somewhere else."

The organizations would like to have another litter pickup in the fall if there is a need. Lautzenheiser thanked all the volunteers.


"We couldn't have done it without the volunteers," she said.

It's something you can do to participate in something larger than yourself. It's all about gathering people to explore the

After the Biggest Hike, the trails are open for exploration the rest of the summer. "The trails are pretty much never closed." Roberts said. "Each section is around 50-60 miles long. 

Buying local is more popular than ever, and the Erb family of Sugar Valley Meats in Sugarcreek has been supplying meats to local customers since 1990.

"People are trying not to rely so much on large retail stores," Mike Erb said. "We offer furnished beef and hog in whole, half and quarter sizes. We want customers to know this is an option for them as opposed to buying small amounts or bulk meat at a grocery store. We can save you money and offer less common cuts of meat."

Erb explained that when you purchase a whole, half or quarter size beef or hog, you are paying a flat rate for the meat. Every cut of beef included will essentially be the same cost compared to the grocery store, where you pay according to the cut of meat.

"Steaks are the same price as hamburger," Erb said. "You pay by the pound, and it all balances out in the end. Just keep the meat in your freezer, and depending on the size you buy, you'll have meal options for several months to a year.'

In the meat case at the grocery store, you're limited to what is available that day. Erb said



purchasing a furnished whole beef or hog offers options in terms of cuts of meat. The experts at Sugar Valley Meats will help you with that, too.

"We want to be a resource to our customers on what cuts come from a whole or half purchase, how these can be prepared and open their eyes to a whole new world of what is available to them," Erb said. Then there are the food bloggers

In sharing with a group of cookbook junkies online, I noted my wife is a chef and I am a food columnist. Both of those should be a little glamorous, certainly more so than in reality, but there were comments from people who thought we have the perfect jobs.

They're right, of course, at least in my case. And then others wanted to know



how they also could get into the world of writing about foodie things. I had no wisdom to share. How did I get started? "They asked me to" was the best I could come up with. It made me think again about the alluring trap of putting together a cookbook. Writing is a compulsion for me, something I've always found I have to do in one way or another, whether anyone is paying attention or not.

I was entering writing contests in grade school and dabbling in uncredited advertising copy as a teen. It seems logical after writing hundreds of columns that a cookbook might be a next step.

Aside from knocking the idea of a collaboration around with friend and fellow compulsive writer Jerry Marlowe, it's a pit I don't plan to fall into. Jerry has great ideas for such a book while I surely do not.

In the United States alone, about 3,000 new cookbooks are published every year, with records being set in the pandemic years since 2020 when so many began baking at home.

That's an awful lot of voices to try and shout over for attention. I can't imagine more than a handful ever recoup enough money to reach anything like a minim wage equivalent.

Of course, Ina Garten deservedly socks away a giant sack of cash every time she jots a paragraph on a dinner napkin, but for the rest of us on the fringe of cookery, not so much.

I don't write expecting to get rich because that's a fool's errand, but It's nice to feel your work is getting in front of at least enough eyeballs to fill out a lunch party.

Then there are the food bloggers, God bless their little hearts. My goodness, what a crowded segment that is. There must be a thousand bloggers for every paper cookbook published. I'm not swimming in that pool, either. I want to write about food, not my yellow childhood bicycle for 17 paragraphs.

The trick, as has been wisely pointed out to me as something I sometimes lack, is a degree of self-awareness and the ability to spot your own limitations.

I think recipes shared in a cookbook should be tested and retested under numerous circumstances until they are ironclad and foolproof. I don't want to spend a month making Alfredo every day.

And what possible recipe could I share? Not many of the things I make are total originals, and I'm just enough of an old aunt Maude that I'm not sharing those secrets with anyone. My aunt Katherine's secrets for making her candy pie went with her to her grave, and I intend to do the same with my amazing marinara.

Cookbooks also are not the cheapest of things to produce. I like a cookbook with lots of pictures, and I'm hyper critical of those pictures. A food photographer would have to be engaged — and a book designer and cover artist.

You'd have to procure sensibly ironic dishes for plating your creations attractively, fancy French glassware and some nifty one-of-a-kind cutlery. It is an enormous undertaking.

I do know my limitations, and I am old enough to know how to rein in my demanding background ego. Aside from the fun collaboration I mentioned, I'm going to shy away from such an alluring mistress. After all, I have a couple of fat novels to finish.

How to start a walking program and stick with it

Dear Savvy Senior,

My doctor recently suggested I start a walking program to help get my weight and blood pressure under control, but I've never exercised much and am 66. Can you recommend some tips?

Hate to Exercise Dear Hate,

You should follow your doctor's orders. Years of research have shown walking may be the single best exercise you can do to improve your health as you age. It burns calories, which will help you lose weight, builds endurance, enhances muscle tone and doesn't pound your joints.

It also helps improve or prevent many age-related health problems including high blood pressure, diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, osteoporosis, dementia and even depression.

But walking is not only good for what ails you. It's also one of the easiest and most convenient exercises you can do and is completely free. All you need is a good pair of walking shoes that fit well and a little desire. Here are some things you should know to help get you started and stay motivated.

Getting started

Start out slow if you need to. For many people this means head out the door, walk for 10 minutes and walk back. Do it every day for a week. If that seems easy, add five minutes to your walks the next week and keep adding five minutes until you are walking as long as you desire. It's also a smart idea to start and



finish your walk with a few simple warm-up and cooldown stretches. Stretching will make you feel better and help prevent injury.

Most fitness professionals recommend walking about 30 minutes, five or more days a week. Or for optimal health benefits, aim for 10,000 steps per day, which is the equivalent of about 5 miles.

Your walking pace also is important. While strolling around the park or neighborhood at an easy pace is good for you, a brisker pace that has you breathing heavily but still able to carry on a conversation provides better health, fitness and weight-loss benefits.

Staying motivated

While starting a walking program takes initiative, sticking with it takes commitment. Here are some tips to help you stay motivated:

— Find a walking buddy: Having a friend to walk with can provide motivation and support along with companionship.

—Wear a fitness tracker or pedometer: These devices measure how far you've walked in steps and miles, providing motivation by spurring you to meet a particular goal and showing you if you've met it. Or if you use a smartphone, there are free pedometer apps you can download like www.

MyPacer.com, www. Google.com/fit or www. Accupedo.com.

—Join a walking club: To find one in your community, call your nearby medical center, mall, health club, senior center, running shoe stores or Area Agency on Aging to see if they sponsor or know of any clubs or groups. Or try www.MeetUp.com or the American Volkssport Association at www. AVA.org to search for noncompetitive walking clubs in your area or start

—Keep a journal: Use it to keep track of your walking minutes, steps or mileage and total it up at the end of each week to see how you're progressing. There also are free apps like www.Map-MyWalk.com and www. Walkmeter.com that use GPS to map your walk and measure your distance and time, which is fun and motivating.

—Have a backup plan: If bad weather, allergies or other factors limit your outdoor walking, have a backup plan like walking at your local mall, buying a home treadmill or joining a health club


