# Starkey retiring after 28 years leading WCCVB

After nearly three decades of service to the community, the executive director of the Wayne County Convention & Visitors Bureau is headed off into the sunset for retirement.

Martha "Marty" Starkey has spent the past 28 years of her life helping visitors make the most of their trips to Wayne County. But even before taking her position with WCCVB, she worked for more than a decade in the travel industry, with this area being all she has ever professionally known. Now she said it is time to spend her life with the people she loves most, doing what she enjoys best.

"I have been in the tourism industry 40 years that seems like a long time," Starkey said. "My husband is retiring at the end of July, so I didn't want to wait too long. The grandkids are always on my mind. They are only little once, and it is so much fun watching them grow up."

While her retirement won't be effective until later this year, Starkey has a few more months to finish up any projects and also reflect on all of the

accomplishments she has space has increased, which made happen throughout her tenure in Wayne Countv tourism.

"Wayne County has definitely expanded its tourism product in the last 28 years," Starkey said. "We probably have about three times the hotel rooms we did when I came here in 1994. Also, the meeting allows us to bring in more groups and events.

"It takes the entire community to make tourism a success. Getting the people here is just the first step. They need to feel welcome, have a great time and feel like their visit was worth the investment they made."

been accomplished in the area of Wayne County travel and tourism during the past 30 years, Starkey said there is still so much she'd like to see happen here and hopes some of her ideas she didn't quite get to will be made possible in the near future.

"I have always said we are water deprived in Wayne County, meaning we don't have a huge lake or winding rivers," she said. "I would love to see Shreve Lake expanded into a tourist destination, maybe a few of those tree-house accommodations, that type of thing. I have always wanted to see a multiday event that we would become known for, like Circleville, known for its Pumpkin Show. It has been in existence since 1903 and attracts 300,000 people every year. Pretty impressive for a town of 13,000."

And while she already believes Wayne County does a good job at ensuring each and every visitor enjoys their stay while in the area, she would like to see everyone have a wonderful experience when they spend their leisure time here.

"This is up to every one

# The YOU?

Career center's adult education programs offer new job paths

ooking for a new career path, a refresher or just some knowledge in an area of interest? The Wayne County Schools Career Center probably has something for you.

The career center has released its 2022-23 adult education course catalog, which is loaded with possibilities for career-minded individuals.

Programs available include law enforcement, office technology, medical (dental assisting, practical nursing and more), trade and industry, cosmetology, computer classes, general interest

courses (photography, retirement planning, et cetera) and more.

As with any year, the catalog has some changes from 2022 in terms of what is still available and some new offerings.

"It's pretty much the same amount of change that we would typically have," said Sandy Elliott, the center's career technical supervisor. "It's dictated by interest. It's dictated by industry demand, what industries have a need for, and it's also dictated by the instructor — if we have the instructor for that typical trade or activity."

As with all things in the academic world, the career center's offerings have been affected by COVID-19 and the constantly shifting unemployment rates that have followed.

"I'm sure that has an impact on things," Elliott said of the pandemic. "The really big impact is that unemployment rate. In Wayne County it's pretty low. Everyone who wants to be employed is employed. Our focus then adjusts, and we do more customized training and specific training for business and industry."

The catalog is highlighted by the center's Aspire program of free academic classes. Those include applied academics, customer service representative and medical math.

The administrative office professionals program is just one of the many offered by Wayne County Schools Career Center in adult education.

The center also offers a free adult diploma program and courses for those 20 and older living in Ohio without a high school diploma or GED. Among those programs are administrative office professional, accounting clerk, human resources clerk, nurse aid, fast track welding and more.

"Aspire is a state-funded program for people to improve their academic skills," Elliott said.
"There's a real push to improve their technical skills."

New courses this year include IT fundamentals, Microsoft specialist and certified manufacturing associate, along with a customer service specialist course that has become a top draw.

'IT fundamentals is a new launch for us," Elliott said. "I don't have a gauge of how popular that will be.'

Customer service specialist has been popular this summer.

Aspire students can earn their high school diplomas, if needed, while earning their credentials in customer service.

Among things available for prospective students are one-onone student advising, financial aid, job-placement services, externships and professional development. Day and evening classes are held in Smithville, Wooster, Orrville and Millersburg. Courses also are available virtually and via distance education.

Registration for fall courses is available. Elliott said interested students can sign up pretty close to the last minute as long as they have what they need before registering.

"There are some acceptance requirements," she said. "In some programs, one is to take an assessment to make sure they're ready to move into the program. If they don't meet the acceptance scores, we send them back through Aspire, where it's free, and have them brush up on the skills, and then they take the test.

"Another requirement is letting us know how you're going to pay. All are financial-aid eligible. There are Pell Grants and others available. We were just awarded a short-term grant from the Ohio Department of Higher Education and are VA approved.'

While the pandemic did cause the need for a shift to remote learning, now there are only limited online and distance opportunities. Elliott said the best way to learn, and the one students prefer, is hands-on and in person.

Still, the pandemic showed things can be shifted to a hybrid or remote model if needed.

of that through our creditor to be a hybrid model. We can Zoom students into class now.'

On July 13 from 4-6 p.m., the center will hold an open house for adult education and a Wayne County graduation celebration for most current information.

Attendees can have some complimentary ice cream while visiting labs and other facilities.

'It's an opportunity to educate the community about what we have to offer," Elliott said. "We have 27 high school technical programs, nine specifically geared to adults for people looking for a new career."

The catalog is published once a year in the spring to inform the public of the center's fulltime, part-time and general interest courses offered for adults at WCSCC.

# **Funding for Shreve Lake** rehab now in state budget

A problem that started repairs needed. in 2014 is getting attention after state representatives passed a capital budget recently that includes \$5.5 million to restore Shreve Lake.

State Rep. Scott Wiggam (R-Wayne County) voted for the improvements that will make Wayne County's only public fishing lake fishable once again.

"Shreve Lake was a big reason why I voted for the capital budget," Wiggam said. "This project has been passed over for some years, but it is now getting the attention it needs to bring this lake back to its natural beauty and will provide recreational opportunities for the people of Wayne County.'

In September 2014, the overflow pipe that runs under the dam was failing, causing sinkholes to form in the earthen dam. The 58-acre lake's water level was lowered for safety concerns.

Now the work will begin with the release of \$900.000 from the Ohio Controlling Board to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to contract with a company to provide engineering services for the eventual work to come

As part of the design process, the contracted engineers will have to perform site investigations to determine the extent of

# Juneteenth explained

# Holiday commemorates emancipation of enslaved Black Americans

Juneteenth was recognized as a federal holiday on June 17, 2021. Even though it is in its infancy on paper, Juneteenth is considered the longest-running African American holiday in history.

The National Museum of African American History and Culture said Juneteenth marks a significant date in American history. June 19, 1865 marks the day the Union Army arrived in Galveston, Texas under Gen. Gordon Granger and announced to the locals that all enslaved African Americans were free.

While the Emancipation Proclamation went into effect on Jan. 1, 1863, and the Civil War ended in April 1865, it took time before the end of slavery was actually enforced in resistant states like Texas.

Reactions to freedom ranged from utter joy to pure shock. Some former slaves awaited job offers from plantation owners, but others sought new lives elsewhere, primarily in the Northern United States. Settling in new areas brought challenges, but individuals rose to those challenges.

The first of what would become an annual Jubilee Day celebration took place in Texas in the year following

Granger's arrival. Through the years the day took on the name Juneteenth, a shortening of June 19, and featured celebrations with prayer services, barbecues, music and other social activities.

Texas was the first state to make Juneteenth an official holiday, with others following suit in subsequent years. It wasn't until June 2021 that Congress passed a resolution establishing the celebration of Juneteenth as a national holiday. It was signed into law on June 17, 2021, two days before the

first official federal commemoration.

Juneteenth remains a celebration of not only freedom, but also family and the joy surrounding release from oppression. According to www.Juneteenth.com, special foods and beverages are served for Juneteenth celebrations, particularly those not available or consumed on a daily basis and many that are red in color. Celebrants recall their heritage and culture while looking ahead to future opportunities.





actual Beatle.

At this point it seems pretty darn superfluous to "review" a concert put on by someone who has toured the world over and, according to quora.com, has performed live over 2,500 times. That is roughly seven years straight of concerts.

What I will say is after the show opener, McCartney delicately balanced some Beatles favorites ("Blackbird"/"Ob-La-Di, Ob-La-Da") with songs from his expansive solo career ("Maybe I'm Amazed"/"Band on the Run") over the three-plus hours of stage time. I have been to quite a few concerts in my lifetime, but I do not think anything will ever cap-

ture the pure theatricality of McCartney performing "Live And Let Die." I could not help but think I was witnessing a song being performed, interwoven with the lighting, video projections and pyrotechnics, with absolute and perfect bril-

But the strength of the show, the experience, came by way of McCartney's storytelling throughout the evening. There were not many of the 36 songs played that he did not give context to or allow the visuals surrounding him to help tell a song's story.

A particularly poignant moment came when his guitar technician brought a ukulele on stage and Paul told the story of George Harrison gifting him this particular ukulele and the two of them sitting around playing Harrison's "Something" together. As McCartney played it live, still images of the two of them graced the pictured backdrop, most of which involved laughter shared between the two

band mates.

But of the many highlights (too many to mention in this column), the most powerful of show moments came when McCartney and John Lennon were reunited.

The first of his encores was "I've Got a Feeling," the first three-fourths of which is all sung by Paul. Toward the song's end, footage of John singing his part, taken from the Rooftop Concert in Peter Jackson's "Get Back," appeared on the three video backdrops. There was John, donning the famous fur coat, strumming away on his guitar while singing, "Everybody had a hard year .. everybody had a good time," enveloping Paul as he turned to look at this lost former band mate.

It was an unexpectedly emotional moment, as one could not help but think of what the world was robbed of on Dec. 8, 1980. I felt it was too inappropriate to ask, but based on the tears streaming down June's face, I would guess she was

thinking the same thing. It is the rare viewing moment that feels both colossal and intimate at the same time.

So with my wife and teenage son to my left, 70-year-old sisters to my right, all watching an 80-year-old work musical magic on stage, I celebrated turning 50.

And because of McCartney's innate ability to make you feel like you are best friends, I took his closing number to heart; more guidance than lyric for anyone willing to listen, regardless of age: "And in the end / The love you take / Is equal to the love you make."

# Only way to sum up spring season is 'best ever'

Those three words pretty much sum up the incredible spring sports season turned in by Wayne County high school teams and athletes.

Winning state championships, as most area sports fans probably already know, were Triway softball, Norwayne boys track and Waynedale baseball teams.

Winning individual championships at the state track and field meet were the Bobcats' Dillon Morlock (shot put) and Colby Morlock (discus).

It's worth pointing out collectively just how special and rare these feats were.

There are only four divisions in softball and baseball, so that means 25% of the titles came back to little ol' Wayne County.

Only one other Wayne County school had ever even won a state title in softball: Dalton back to back from 2006-07.

Same thing for baseball, with only Northwestern ever hoisting a state title banner, and those were earned way back in 1966 and 1959.

This area may be looked at as a farm land, blip on the map by many people, but local athletes let the state know it's pretty special here.

#### **Diamond stars**

The Triway softball team won the first state championship in program history and just the second in school history. The magnificent bowling team brought home the gold this winter.

Top-ranked Triway defeated second-ranked Jonathan Alder 2-1 in the Div. II final at Firestone Stadium in Akron on June 4. The Titans finished the season 30-2.

Having returned everyone from its 2021 state runner-up team, Triway was the clear favorite to take the title.

Wavnedale was a surprise Div. III state baseball champ after its walk-off, 2-1 win over Milan Edi-



son at Canal Park in Akron on June 12. Connor Gatti drove in Josiah Raber with a two-out line-drive single to right-center.

The Bears upset Liberty Union and MLB prospect Adam Miller 5-4 in the state semis.

The Golden Bears had graduated one of the best players in program history, Jaden Varner, after being knocked out in the district tournament in 2021.

This year's Waynedale team started out just 1-4, but never lost again. The Bears rattled off 26 straight wins to earn legendary status and finish 27-4.

Being able to be on both state championship teams this year is something that's honestly hard to wrap my head around, but at the same time, it's an amazing thing and definitely an experience to always remember," Yoder said. "Both of these teams have made a huge impact in my life."

A number of people have praised Yoder for being on both teams or asked her, "How's it feel to win two in one year?"







A three-sport star, Raber said leaving his high school career celebrating a state title on the final day was worth all of the time, energy and effort he and his teammates poured into honing their skills.



# When it came to card games, Father did know best

Bridge originated early in the 16th century, which means that by the time I became aware of it, I was 450 years late to the party.

That didn't prevent me from asking Dad if he'd teach me to play.

But I'm getting ahead of myself.

Let's start at the begin-

My parents didn't do a lot



they did frequently involved Bridge. My earliest recollections have little or nothing to do with the game itself, its rules or its nomenclature.

Instead, I remember the of socializing, but what little preparations my parents

made when it was their turn to host to the Bridge Club. They laid in all manner of snacks and libations, Mom whipping up what we kids came to call "Dorothy Dip" as my father set up the bar and crushed the ice.

There was a sense of anticipatory expectancy in air, a feeling that superseded visits by relatives or sleepovers with our friends. My parents bustled about for hours before

the arrival of the first guests, dusting and cleaning, arranging magazines just so, turning the seldom-used living room into something out of "House Beautiful."

They were of the belief that children were best seen and never heard, so after perfunctory greetings, we retreated downstairs to watch TV or, more often, upstairs to our bedrooms, out of sight.

But that didn't mean we

were unaware of the sensory overload — the scent of perfume and after-shave, the aroma of pipe tobacco, the convivial chatter, the sound of ice clinking in cocktail glasses.

Sometimes, I'd head down to the kitchen for a bottle of Choc-Ola, and I'd hear words like "dummy" and "no trump" and "rubber" and "overtrick" and "singleton," marveling at their secret argot.

In the years to come, after playing simple childhood card games like War and Go Fish, I became exposed to Hearts, Spades, Poker and 500 Rummy, all of which afforded chances not only to win a bit of cash money, but also opportunities to hang out with my friends.

There also was something called Boo Ray, which was so popular among the guys who worked at the parks and rec department that I had no choice but to learn the rules. Sadly, the passage of time has eroded any specific memory of how to play, but the years will never erase the spirit of camaraderie the game engendered

That was summer 1975, an expanse of days and nights that saw me engaged in my first serious girlfriend experience and also included the first and only time I'd ever see the Rolling Stones live.

It was the summer of 39 as well, as in the number of consecutive shifts the boss would growl at the outset of the afternoon session, "Dewey, grab a push mower." Thirty-nine straight times it happened, a record I'm pretty sure still stands back home.

I didn't mind, though. I'd be dropped off, just after our lunch-break Boo Ray game, and work through the hottest hours of the day, just me, a lawn mower, a can of gasoline and the sweet promise of seeing my girlfriend later that evening. Ah, those dreams of youth.

A few years after that, following college, I fell in with another crowd of fellow employees, this time at my hometown newspaper, and was introduced to a game called Euchre. It was predicated on a sort of sixth-sense relationship with your partner. one that — when operating at full power — enabled serious runs of very good luck.

As you might imagine, though, accusations of "table talk," a rather polite term for pernicious cheating, were more than a common occurrence, which simply added to the allure of the game itself.

My relationship with Euchre lasted for more than a decade, and it cemented in my mind the importance of a good partner. There was something quite thrilling about ordering him up — that is, making trump before he had a chance to declare his best suit — and using that ESP to take all five tricks, earning two points in the process.

I knew from my childhood that, maybe more than anything else, Bridge was built on a similar foundation, one that required a reliable symbiosis between partners, so I thought I was ready to learn the game. I was, after all, in my early 40s, no longer a child.

So I called my father.

"Hey, Dad," I said. "I have a question, well, a request, for

"What's that?" he said. What do you need?"


"Would you be willing to teach me how to play Bridge?" I asked.

"No," was all he said and promptly hung up.

Before you jump to any rash conclusions as we approach Father's Day, let me stress he was a remarkable man, a soldier and a scholar, a thinker and a tinker, a craftsman and a caregiver. But he'd known me from games around the kitchen table, everything from Jeopardy to Trivial Pursuit, Tripoley to art quizzes, so he was familiar with what might be called my rather mercurial temper.

In his mind he probably pictured a fit of my pique poleaxing an otherwise civilized gathering of unsuspecting guests, creating chaos where before had been a genteel game of bids and points.

So I never learned to play Bridge, and even though I suspect I'd have been pretty good at it, it's probably for the best I didn't.






