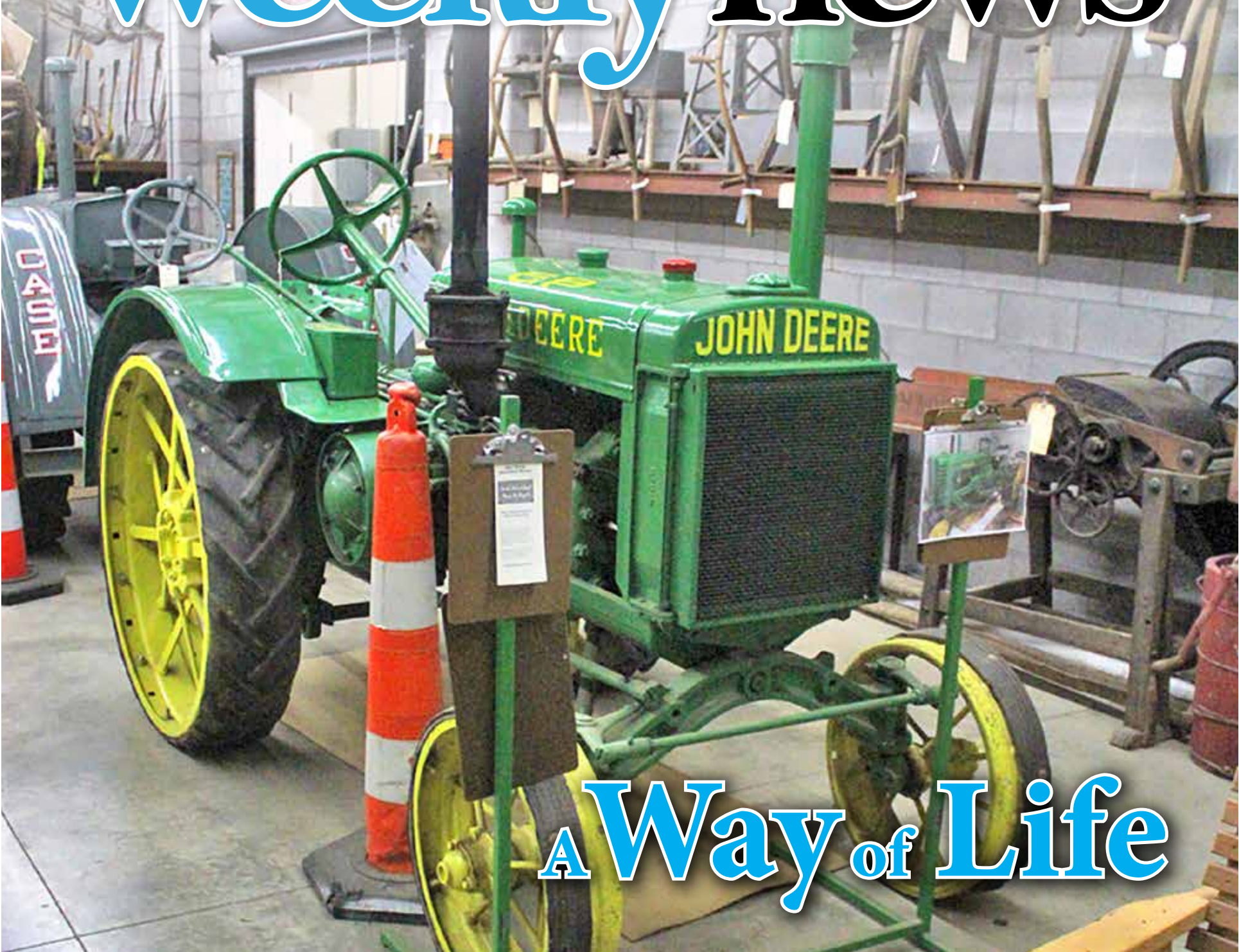

McLarnan still on the trail to helping others

Gambier's Doug McLarnan, a member of Sub-Alpine hikers club, set out on May 14 at noon for a 140-mile walk around Knox County.

He set out on this walk to raise awareness of the destruction in Ukraine where his god daughter is currently helping people, but that quickly changed when he heard about what retired Gen. Mark C. Arnold was doing. Gen. Arnold, who owns a farm on Rutledge Road in Knox County, is on the front lines making sure training and supplies are being provided to front-line medics. He is raising money for the Frontline Medical Ukraine Fund at the Columbus foundation. This Columbus foundation fund provides advanced trauma training to Ukrainian Army medics, which will save many lives and help reduce casualty rates in their fight against Russia. Having served as a firefighter and EMT for more than 25 years, McLarnan felt this was a great cause and that he wanted to help.

McLarnan also set out on this hike at the age of 74 to honor two fellow hikers who died this past year.

Jim Buchwald and Bob Herald hiked the hills and valleys of Knox County well past their 90th birthdays, showing their love for nature and the great outdoors.

This is McLarnan's second trip around Knox County.

His first walk was back in 1995 when he walked to raise awareness for mentoring the youth. He says the hardest part of it all is getting started

and putting the first foot in front of the other. McLarnan has noticed after all these years this walk is harder on him due to his age, but he wasn't going to let that stop him. When it's hot out, he isn't able to walk as far, only averaging about six miles a day instead of the usual eight to 12.

"Everybody thinks walking is hard. It's not hard. Hard is getting started, the determination to get it done. But, I'm pretty sick of it right now," McLarnan said as he neared the end of his journey.

He has met a lot of interesting people on his walks, including a Mennonite family whose son had just gotten back from taking supplies over to Ukraine with his church and had been making arrangements to go back to bring more. He had met an Amish family who said they don't see many 'English' in this area. He has had people offer him food and water while out hiking which he turns down since he brings his own with him.

"I met a couple people who were associated with Ukraine," McLarnan said. "One was a milk truck driver up in the far northern part of Knox County. We were walking along and

he came by us twice, a big tanker truck and just smoked us to death with his dust. The third time he came upon us, I was with my friend, he stopped and we gave him our pamphlet and he said 'Svoboda,' which is freedom in Ukrainian."

Friends and family have been the most helpful to him while during this hike they have been getting him to and from where he needs to go on certain days. Carrie Harbor has also been a lot of help to him as she had designed a little booklet for him to hand out while on his walks of what he was doing it for and how to help donate to the cause. 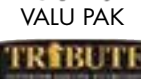

New camp suffers major setback

Camp because I said I would is more than just a retreat in the country. It's part of a much bigger movement with the goal of teaching people to make promises and take action to improve their lives.

The nonprofit because I said I would was created after founder Alex Sheen delivered the eulogy at this father's funeral in 2012.

"My dad was a man of his word," Sheen said.

He spoke about how his dad treated his promises and how too often people think they can get to something later. Sheen then handed out promise cards and encouraged people to keep their commitments. After that, he started doing motivational speaking and developing programming for those who are incarcerated and for grieving families. His aim is to help others develop their character and work on being honest with themselves and accountable.

Now he's added Camp because I said I would into the mix. Unfortunately, an early morning fire at the camp on June 4 set back their plans for the facility located at 3483 McCament Road in Walhonding, just across the Coshocton County line.

"Geographically, this was the perfect spot for us," Sheen said. "We are midway to Pittsburgh, Columbus and Cleveland. This allowed us to be in a place to help a lot of people."

Space was available to rent for retreats and weddings. Grieving families can stay for free in the cabins. The cabins were untouched by the June 4 fire, but the main event center and program headquarters is a total loss.

"The most important loss isn't the square footage but the lost contents," Sheen said. "Our laundry was there with all our sheets and blankets for the cabins, our computers, the satellite internet, T-shirts, wristbands, and camp recreational items."

The main building held a wide selection of board games, DVDs and other outdoor games for families

staying at camp to borrow.

"The cause of the fire is still being investigated, but from what I understand, there was no criminal intent suspected," Sheen said. "No one was hurt, but everything in the building was lost. Nothing survived. The

five resort cabins are still OK, though, and we can still have families in bereavement meet here."

While they have insurance, fundraising campaigns have been started to help the organization continue to offer programs during this

difficult time.

"Our main focus in fundraising is to continue to support our current programs to the best of our ability and not necessarily to help with the building costs themselves," said Lexie Brinker, fundraising and development coordinator. "I say this because we are not sure what insurance is going to cover just yet, so we don't want to give any potential donors the wrong inclination of what their money would be going toward."

"We know what it's like to build something from nothing, but this time we don't have nothing. We have everyone that we've built relationships with," Sheen said.

A Way of Life

Agricultural museum
harkens back to days long ago

A small group of dedicated volunteers give of their time to make sure that an entire way of life is not forgotten. The staff of the Knox County Agricultural Museum tell stories of hard working, extended families, and close-knit, loving communities. The museum, open at their location on the Knox County Fairgrounds since 1985, is filled with sights and stories.

"I grew up between Danville and Millwood," museum volunteer Art Mizer said. "We had a little farm out there. It was only 40 acres, but we planted corn and we had wheat and hay. We also had four or five cows. We had some hogs. With 40 acres, you could make a bit of money from that, back then. Not like today."

Mizer, who was born in 1941, is old enough to recollect a time before Knox County's rolling, hilly landscape was strewn with strip malls, cell phone towers and subdivisions of rubber-stamped houses. Mizer went to Howard High School, graduating in 1959, before Howard High merged into East Knox High School. That year saw the largest graduating class in Howard's history – 31 students.

Surrounded by the many displays in the Knox County Agri-

cultural Museum, Mizer recalls his responsibilities growing up on a farm.

"We didn't have too many chores before school," Mizer said. "Dad took care of that. My granddad had a farm, about two miles from us, toward Danville. He had 80 acres, and we would go up there to help him to make hay."

As Mizer grew older, his responsibilities grew.

"We would go out and help people bale hay," Mizer said. "We would work for 75 cents an hour. It was a hard job, but you got a meal out of it, as well. I have no idea, what they would charge today, but I don't think anyone could afford it. I remember, one day, down at the neighbor's place, we bailed over a thousand bales of hay and that was a long day. It was a lot of work. It was a nice, dry day and we started before lunch, and

we kept going until that evening. When you're young, you don't think about that."

Amongst the displays on agricultural museum's 18,000 square feet of floor space, a 19th Century threshing machine, like one produced by Mount Vernon's C.&G. Cooper, sits quietly in one corner. The threshing machine extracts the seeds of grain from the stalks and husks, beating the plant to make the seeds fall out. Threshing machines as big as the one on display took a community to run them. Even Mizer, who grew up in post-World War II America, was able to experience this life as it still existed in rural Knox County, when family members brought their threshing machine into Danville to help his grandfather with the harvest.

"They would bring it from Tiverton," Mizer said. "That was a slow process, then. It might have been pulled by a tractor of some kind, but I cannot verify that. I just remember, when they did that, it was a big deal. The farmers from around would come and help. Then, they would move the machine to their place. Everybody helped each other at that time."

It wasn't just the men. The farm women, using wood or gas stoves, like some on display in the museum, fed the men, who worked to keep the thresher going.

"You wouldn't believe the things they cooked up," Mizer said. "Great food. Grandma would set the table and we'd have a feast. Then, when they went someplace else, the women would get together at the other farmer's houses and help there, too."

Cutting up corn to fill the silo became another community project.

"They would bring the (silage cutter) to the farm," Mizer said. "Same deal on that. Everyone would help. Also, we made hay."

Like many other farm families, the Mizers had a few milk cows. The old milk cans, on display in the museum, are a familiar sight to Mizer.

"We sold milk at that time, when I was growing up," Mizer said. "I don't recall who bought the milk. They just came by, in a truck, and picked up the cans of milk. Where they took it, I don't know."

The agricultural museum will be open every day during the upcoming Knox County Fair, which runs July 22-29. There are about 4,000 items on display. The sights range from vehicles and machinery to early hand tools and household appliances. There is the "Loom Room," with looms of all

sizes, where rugs are still made the old-fashioned way. Once per week, a group of volunteers weave rugs like they were made in the 19th century.

There's only one thing missing at the museum.

"Young blood," Mizer said. "We need young volunteers. I would say that our average age

is 70 and above. As we get older, who's going to do this?"

NOSL finals to be at MVNU

The Northern Ohio Soccer League has announced that the 2023 NOSL Finals will be hosted at Mount Vernon Nazarene University's CH4 Stadium on Saturday, July 22. The first-ever women's final will kick off at 4:30 p.m. while the men's final has a 7:30 p.m. start time.

CH4 Stadium opened in 2022 with a seating capacity of 500, a press box, patio seating, restrooms and concessions after brand new turf and lights were installed in 2019. Additional features include a walkout tunnel and covered dugout benches to shield teams from the sun or weather. A fully-furnished press box and camera deck will allow both games to be live streamed by WMFD in Mansfield.

Admission is free for both games and gates will open for fans at 3:30 p.m. with official league programs being available for the first 100 fans in attendance at both games. Food will be on site for both games and other activities such as giveaways and contests will take place throughout the evening. The MVP awards ceremony for both the men's and women's leagues will be handed out in between games.

Riverside to get splash pad

A new recreation and learning area will soon be coming to the west end of Mount Vernon.

City Council heard Information at its meeting Monday on a splash pad and library pavilion to be built at Riverside Park.

"The splash pad was the No. 1 item that was requested when we did the parks' master planning roughly two years ago," said Council member Amber Keener. "We had a lot of feedback from the community. So, we have been very fortunate in having local organizations that were interested in partnering in these two projects."

The projects will be adjacent to and complement Rotary Club playground at the southern end of Riverside Park. They will replace the "volcano fountain," which has been inoperable for some time.

The splash pad will be funded by Ariel Corp. and

will feature a pirate theme. It will be ADA compliant and named in honor of the late Hunter Wright. The Public Library of Mount Vernon and Knox County will donate funds for the library pavilion, which is expected to house book talks, the youth summer reading program, author talks and even some exercise classes.

"We're really excited. We're looking to have an expanded space for more family friendly library activities," said Jamie Lynn Smith Fletcher, development director at the library. "This will allow us to expand our footprint in Riverside Park."

Keener said there will be more meetings to finalize the plans and costs around the end of the month and they hope to break ground by this fall.

Council also had a spirited discussion about overgrown grass around retention ponds on the north end of the city. The ground used to be mowed by the city or a

company contracted by the city, but has not been mowed since 2022. The ponds serve the residents of Compass Pointe, which includes Latitude and Longitude drives.

Questions arose about why the area was no longer mowed, as well as who would have to pay to have it mowed.

Three options were discussed: Residents organizing themselves and paying for the mowing; residents setting up a private stormwater management facility and charging the residents a fee to pay for the mowing; or the city could mow and issue fines to the residents.

A one-time contract was suggested, where the city would mow the ponds this time and then residents would be responsible for maintenance.

The meeting also was a first for John Ruckman, who filled the 2nd Ward council seat that was open after the resignation of John Francis.

Gambier approves finances

Financial matters were at the forefront when the Gambier Village Council met Monday.

The village will reimburse Kenyon College for application fees paid for a project that would have turned the tennis courts into a parking lot off of East Woodside Drive. The village charges a \$4 fee for every \$1,000 a project would cost for consideration of a conditional use application. Kenyon decided not to go through with the \$800,000 project and council approved refunding the fee (\$3,200) minus a \$75 charge for the conditional use permit.

Village Administrator R.C. Wise noted the Ohio Emergency Management Association will reimburse the village for extraordinary expenses incurred during a power outage from June 13-16, 2022. The village had incurred expenses of more than \$18,000 during the outage, and OEMA will reimburse them for 75 percent of their costs.

Wise also noted in his report that the price of salt will be going up this winter. Cargill will supply the village with salt for the 2023-24 winter at a price of \$59.27 per ton, up from \$56.21 per ton last winter.

During the meeting, council also approved its budget for the 2024 fiscal year.

The village is expecting to receive \$1,705,815.15 in revenue for the year. Add in a carryover balance of \$832,716.47 and that will be give Gambier \$2,538,531.62 in available funds.

Estimated expenses will be \$4,144,227.66, leaving the village with an estimated shortfall of \$1,605,696.04.

Village Administrator R.C. Wise said that's because there are projects that may or may not be done during the fiscal year or the village is looking at getting grants to fund the projects. One such project is work on Duff Street, which the village will apply for a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission in November. There's also a street light expenditure that may or may not be needed, as well as possible underestimation of municipal income tax to be collected.

"It's a common strategy. It gives you flexibility," Wise said. "Like last year, we ordered a new truck in May, but it didn't arrive until this March so we had it listed on the budget in both years."

Council passed a resolution designating Park National Bank, Peoples Bank of Gambier, Cambridge Investment and STAR Ohio as depositories for active, interim or inactive funds for a five-year period. Council also approved putting

\$200,000 from inactive funds into STAR Ohio, which is expected to get a 5 percent rate.

Members also had a first reading on an ordinance setting salaries for the mayor and council members. They plan to have the salaries set before the election of a mayor and two council seats.

Council also agreed to allow the Knox County Board of Elections to use the Community Center gymnasium as a polling place for Gambier and College Township for the special election in August, the general election in November and the presidential primary in March 2024.

The community center will also continue to be used by Head Start this school year after the organization asked to retain the usage of one classroom.

Wise also reported that Duff Street will be temporarily closed on Aug. 5 for Pelotonia, and that COVID-19 sampling will continue at the wastewater treatment plant after the Ohio Department of Health informed the village it will continue to receive federal funding through 2025. Wise said they are looking to add Influenza A and B, as well as RSV to the tests in September.

The next council meeting will be Monday, Aug. 7, at 7 p.m.

when one of her children had veered into the danger zone. “Do you understand?”

All I knew is I was sick and tired of being made fun of for the way I looked, like the time I was taking a walk with my sister after supper at our aunt’s house and the way verbal taunts flew my way.

“Hey, scarecrow!” I heard coming from a gang of older guys gathered on a front porch. “Better be careful ... strong wind’s gonna come and blow you into the next county, you skinny punk.”

I remember being very self-conscious about my gaunt physique whenever I went to a public swimming area, be it a pool or a lake or a river or an ocean, and the way I’d grab my shoulders with the opposing hands, crossing myself in a protective “X” formation.

Gym class was bad too, what with those humiliating

showers afterward, the ones that offered no place to hide a skeletal appearance from prying eyes and stinging barbs that hit home.

But there came a turning point involving, of all things, ping pong.

It was the summer of Bobby Kennedy getting gunned down and the demonstrations in Chicago, a time when the center could not hold, and against that crazy backdrop, my family took a vacation.

It was to a rather bucolic — if passed-its-prime — place called Indian Lake, and we stayed at a once-plush lodging known as Beatley’s, which had been a favored destination for Mom’s family when she was growing up. I liked it immediately, if only for the game room that had several pinball machines and a jukebox, one that had “MacArthur Park” and “Classical Gas” among its many singles.

It also had a table-tennis setup, and I remember sitting there in the screened-

in portion of the resort, watching people play a game with which I was unfamiliar. There was one guy who was thinner than me, and he always beat the living crap out of anyone who challenged him, not in a mean way, just proving he was better.

During a lull in the action, I approached him, wanting to find out how he did what he did the way he did it. He said only two words.

“Trust yourself.”

In the years that followed, Dad would construct a ping pong table for us, and we would play a lot, especially during the summer months, when the patio would be the site of tournaments around Memorial Day, the Fourth of July and Labor Day, and I won tons.

I never did gain much weight, even after those festive hamburger and hot dog cookouts, but I learned to trust myself — to often like myself — even when I got called names like “stick” and “slats.”

Wishing now I’d played ping pong against that college girlfriend.
