Artifacts found near Zoar Levee identified

In an online meeting on Sept. 2, Nathan White of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers spoke about artifacts recently unearthed during preconstruction work on the Zoar Levee.

White also provided those in attendance with a written management summary of the items and where they were found.

According to the report, a total of 124 historic artifacts were recovered. Among them were shards of coarse earthenware likely to have been made in Zoar, fragments of window glass likely manufactured around 1845, numerous nails, fragments of metal and ceramic, along with other items.

The artifacts have been sent to a lab for further identification, dating and context. While the items may have some significance historically, they may not be “museum-worthy,” according to a comment made by

Al Tonetti of the Ohio State Historic Preservation Office.

A stone-lined privy or well also was detected, along with what appears to be a pit yielding fragments of broken bone near the site of the cow barn.

According to the report, two of the sites examined contain archaeological features and associated historic artifact deposits that may be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. However, White said rather than dig up the areas, they will avoid and protect it for future exploration by another party.

“As much as I would like to see archaeological excavations in certain areas, I can’t do it without a good reason for doing so,” White said, referring to the scope of the Army Corps’ job of repairing the levee.

White said in all areas an archaeologist who meets the standards set by the U.S. Secretary of the Interior will

monitor any earth-moving activities in case anything is uncovered. However, any discoveries in the areas cleared for construction are unlikely to yield further artifacts, according to previous testing at the sites.

“We have a good idea of what we’re dealing with as far as historical properties and how we can eliminate any impact.”

Trench demo scheduled for this month

White said a demo of the Internal Erosion Interception Trench will take place in September at the foot of the levee behind the First Street parking lot. The

purpose of the demo is to measure the actual vibrations generated by the work and to test the soil content to see if it can be used to determine whether it can be used in the concrete fill mix for the IEIT.

According to White, testing in this area has shown it is statistically unlikely any cultural resources exist. “But again, we will have backhoe monitors onsite just to be sure,” White said.

Construction on the levee is scheduled to begin once the Army Corps approves the results of the demo test.

White said the preconstruction vibrations survey of homes and buildings in

proximity of the IEIT demo area is complete, and the survey of all other properties is nearing completion.

The purpose of the survey is to establish a baseline ground vibration assessment that can be compared to any vibrations caused by construction activity.

In an October 2020 meeting, Mike Nield of the Army Corps said construction of the IEIT will generate even lower levels of vibration than those experienced during relief well installation, which had taken place in the summer.

Prior to this, White also had assured residents in the January 2020 meeting that four seismographs would be located throughout the village to measure vibration levels.

White also reviewed levee repair work conducted in 2008-09 in response to seepage under the levee following area flooding in 2005 and 2008. He said the village can expect the type of work in the current project to be similar.

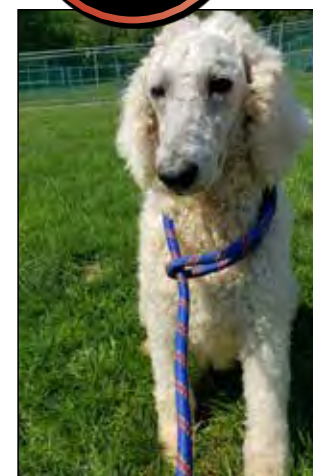

Dover area family to host benefit car show Sept. 18

A private automobile collection will be on display to the public for a small donation on Sept. 18 from noon to 4:30 p.m. as part of the Timken Family Cancer Center Car Show, to be held at the home of Jon and Bonnie Mason, who live outside of Dover.

The Masons are hosting the benefit to provide funds and raise awareness for the Timken Family Cancer Center, which will be part of Aultman Hospital in Canton. The new center is on schedule to open in 2022 and hopes to fill a vital need in the community.

Aultman's cancer services will be relocated to one building that was designed with patients' needs in mind. According to an Aultman Foundation web page, the new cancer center will feature one centralized entrance and patient drop-off, support services to streamline patient access, a modern design that enhances collaboration between healthcare team members, infusion areas that expand patient privacy and improve treatment, and family respite areas and gardens to promote wellness and comfort.

For the Masons, helping others who have cancer is their main concern.

"It's not easy for people to go where they need to go for treatment. Instead of going to Columbus or Cleveland to get their cancer treatments, it's right there in Canton," Jon Mason said. He and his wife, Bonnie, hope the new center will be more convenient for area cancer patients.

Bonnie Mason previously worked as an emergency room nurse, and that is what attracted

them to the idea of having a benefit for the cancer center.

"Cancer is not easy; it is a terrible disease," Jon Mason said.

In the past the couple has held benefits to donate to the Cancer Society and help fund a heart health organization.

Many donations from supporters to the car show have already been received. There is a \$10 entry fee to enter a car in the show, which will be judged by professionals. Awards include best interior, best paint, best chrome wheels, best GM, best Ford, best Mopar, best truck, best bike, best street rod, best original antique, best rat rod, best wheels, cleanest and best of show.

Food trucks will be available, and DJ Spikeman will play music. No alcohol will be permitted.

Visitors to the show are welcome and may tour the Masons' three carriage houses full of about 80 vehicles for a \$5 donation to the new cancer treatment center. Many of the cars are from the 1920s, 1930s and 1940s.

The location of the car show is 4744 Mt. Pleasant Road NW in Dover. Signs will be posted.

The Masons have been a couple since the seventh grade, and both graduated from Dover High School before going to college. Jon Mason attended Kent State University for a degree in engineering, and Bonnie went to the Idabelle Firestone School of Nursing in Akron.

Jon Mason worked for about 10 years as an engineer before he made what proved to be a good move. He had always wanted to own his own business like his father had, and he purchased a staffing business that became Mancan. It was a rough start, but before long the business became successful. Now they own multiple offices in multiple states and employ about 6,000 staff.

"We've been very, very lucky," Jon Mason said. "How did it happen? I don't know. I swear God sits on my shoulders and takes care of me."

After their children, Jeff, Deborah and Ryan, were raised, Jon began to add cars to his collection.

"I've been thinking of cars ever since I was a little boy and drove little metal cars around in the dirt," Mason said.

One of the first vehicles Mason purchased was a truck once owned by the late Ralph Simmers, a house mover who lived on the south side of New Philadelphia.

Getting to a collection of 80 cars was a very slow process, but during that time, Mason said he never lost sight of the fact he just loved old cars, so much so that once he buys one, he usually keeps it. He's sold very few cars from his collection.

Finding new cars is easy.

"People call him," Bonnie Mason said. "Everybody knows he's a car man, and Jon talks to at least one person every week about a car."

They've also driven two cars they purchased in California — a 1950 Buick and a 1949 Mercury — home on Route 66.

But does Jon Mason have any favorite vehicles? "They are all favorites. I just like cars. If it's got a motor and four wheels, I like it," he said.

All the cars in the collection have been fully restored, and Jon Mason employs two people to do the work. They are currently working on an old Mustang and an old 1940 Chevy truck. Though Jon Mason enjoys working on the cars, he said, "I don't crawl around on the floor very good."

Some of the cars in his collection include a 2018 Rolls-Royce, a 2016 Aston Martin, a 1936 Maharaja Duesenberg,

a 1967 Chevy Super Sport, a 1953 Studebaker Avanti, a 1939 Lincoln Zephyr and the Mason. The company that manufactured the vehicle was later sold to the Maytag Company, which is no longer in the automobile business.

The Masons hope to open the collection to the public as a museum in a year or two, but until then this may be the only opportunity to see this car collection.

The CHARGE of remembrance

Zoar to hold Civil War Re-enactment
Sept. 18-19

One may wonder why a village founded by religious pacifists would hold 10 re-enactments of Civil War battles. One of the Society of Separatists of Zoar's founding principles said they could not participate in war.

At the same time, the Zoar settlers could not condone the practice of slavery, and 14 members of the Zoar population enlisted with the Union Army in 1862.

The event will commemorate the 160th anniversary of Maj. Gen. Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson's Shenandoah Valley Campaign. Jackson's campaign is famous, among other reasons, for the fact that he marched 17,000 men 646 miles in 48 days.

This year's re-enactment will take place Sept. 18 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sept. 19 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The event will commemorate the 160th anniversary of Maj. Gen. Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson's Shenandoah Valley Campaign. Jackson's campaign is famous, among other reasons, for the fact that he marched 17,000 men 646 miles in 48 days.

Specific battles to be re-enacted are the first Battle of Kernstown, in which Jackson was defeated, and the Battle of Cross Keyes, in which

he and his troops were victorious.

Darrell Markijohn, chairperson for the event, has been re-enacting Civil War battles since 1993. He rose through the ranks to, at one time, become commander of the entire Union Army across all the states.

Markijohn said the Kernstown and Cross Keyes battles were chosen because a number of Ohio regiments fought in them. "This also gives each side a chance to 'win' a battle," Markijohn said.

Plenty of "civilian" activities

This year marks the return of the popular Anvil Tavern, a 19th-century period tavern featuring two special Union and Confederate brews developed by Lockport Brewery.

Food will be provided by the Zoar United Church of Christ, Holy Trinity Church and local restaurants. In addition, there will be ice cream and kettle corn trucks.

Speakers include Civil War expert, author and publisher of B-List History, David Dixon, comparing the American Revolutionary War and the Civil War.

A first-person presentation of the life of Henry "Box" Brown will convey how Brown had himself shipped out of slavery to Philadelphia and eventually made his way to Boston, where he helped fellow escapees on the Underground Railroad.

Civil War songstress Diane Virostko will perform songs from the Civil War, Dave Lewis will present a history of quilting and Eric Sterner will present "Anatomy of a Massacre," recounting the massacre at Gnadenhutten.

Visitors also can take in a Civil War history display at the Bimeler Museum. "This exciting exhibit is a collaboration of a number of regional museums and historical societies coming together to showcase the impact the Civil War had on the home front in this area," said

Tammi Shrum, site director for Historic Zoar Village.

The exhibit includes a one-of-a-kind American flag made in Zoar during the Civil War featuring hand-painted stars. Also on display is a memorabilia pyramid made of souvenirs a veteran of Antietam collected after returning to the battlefield for that express purpose. It features Minié balls, artillery shots, spurs, belt buckles and a cannon ball on top.

On display for the re-enactment weekend only will be artifacts belonging to 91-year-old Don Myers' grandfather, who served in the Civil War.

Remembering the first re-enactment

Markijohn reflected on Zoar's first Civil War re-enactment in September 2001.

"It was right after 9-11," Markijohn said. "We weren't even sure if we should hold the event."

With 1,000 re-enactors coming in from eight states, the biggest problem, Markijohn said, is they just didn't know how to contact all those people in time to cancel. "We figured if we canceled it, people would still show up."

Markijohn said, in the end, because everything else was canceled, people came. "We ended up holding a really nice memorial, and it was the right thing to do."

MCC sends supplies to help Haiti in recovery

Boxes of canned meat and relief kits from Mennonite Central Committee brought joy and relief to recipients who are struggling to recover from the Aug. 14 earthquake that devastated the southern peninsula of Haiti.

The supplies were the first of any to reach Saint-Jean-de-Sud, a southwestern municipality made up of several towns, on Aug. 31, more than two weeks after the 7.2 magnitude earthquake occurred. Two thousand people died. It destroyed homes and buildings, leaving 650,000 people in need of emergency-management assistance.

Relief organizations including MCC struggled to get supplies to people because the main road to the south was unsafe. Gang activity, robbery of supply trucks and tropical storm Grace, which came three days after the earthquake, kept trucks grounded.

Gradually, police have been able to establish more security on the road, so two members of MCC's assessment team drove to Saint-Jean-de-Sud on Aug. 29 to help set up for the distribution.

And two days later, MCC sent its first shipment and two more assessment team members by a Mission Aviation Fellowship airplane. MAF provided its services free of charge.

The distribution unfolded smoothly because MCC's partner AVOREDES was organized and prepared. Fifty families received a relief kit and 12 cans of meat, which represents the maximum the aircraft could hold.

AVOREDES chose the recipients whose homes were damaged or destroyed and were especially vulnerable in other ways. They included pregnant women, people with disabilities and families headed by elderly persons or single women. About half were members of Mennonite churches in the area.

"All of them that we talked to mentioned, you know, a neighbor who they knew was facing hard times — family member, cousin, someone who they knew needed help, who they would be sharing some of their cans with," Paul Shetler Fast said. "We weren't telling them to do that. We weren't encouraging them to do that. But they said, 'You know, when God gives you a gift, then you give gifts to others.'"

Their generosity and compassion also sustained them before help arrived.

"Everywhere you look, people are doing what they can to rebuild, patching houses that can be patched," Shetler Fast said. "Neighbors have been letting neighbors stay in their house, especially when it rains." Otherwise, those without safe housing sleep outside.

About half of the vulnerable recipients were members of Mennonite churches in the area, which are part of Assemblée de la Grâce, a member of Mennonite World Conference. AVOREDES, the Creole acronym for Association for the Reform and Development of Saint-Jean-de-Sud, is associated with Assemblée de la Grâce.

MCC intends to send two more shipments to this area in the next couple of weeks with MAF. The assessment

team will evaluate longer term needs this week. The results will inform MCC's long-term response.

This same area is still recovering from Hurricane Matthew, which caused a lot of devastation in 2016. People remember how MCC helped them rebuild their livelihoods then and are asking for similar assistance this time.

The earthquake caused market women to lose their goods that were stored at market and in their homes. This year's crops, which would be used to pay school fees, are gone. Farmland is destroyed, and churches, houses, roadways, bridges and schools are damaged.

"And so people are looking ahead, not just to the need for the next plate of food, but beyond that," Shetler Fast said. "How do they rebuild? How do they send their kids to school this fall? How do they rebuild a livelihood that's sustainable?"

MCC anticipates its long-term response is likely to include trauma healing and long-term livelihood recovery, said Raquel Conde Guevara, interim MCC representative in Haiti from Oakville, Ontario. The work may be carried out in cooperation with other nongovernmental organizations.

Conde Guevara said MCC also will work with another southern MCC partner, SOFA, the Creole acronym for Solidarity of Haitian Women. Its work is focused on preventing gender-based violence. In the midst of a disaster, women are more vulnerable to abuse, said Conde Guevara. She expects MCC’s support of SOFA’s abuse prevention and psychological and social support to increase as part of the earthquake response.

SOFA staff in the town of Beaumont reported more than 300 houses were damaged and destroyed in addition to livelihoods, gardens and livestock. MCC is sending meat and relief kits there too. Nature Fest returns to The Wilderness Center

The Wilderness Center has a long history of supporting and promoting local artists, craftspeople and photographers. 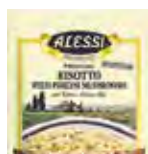

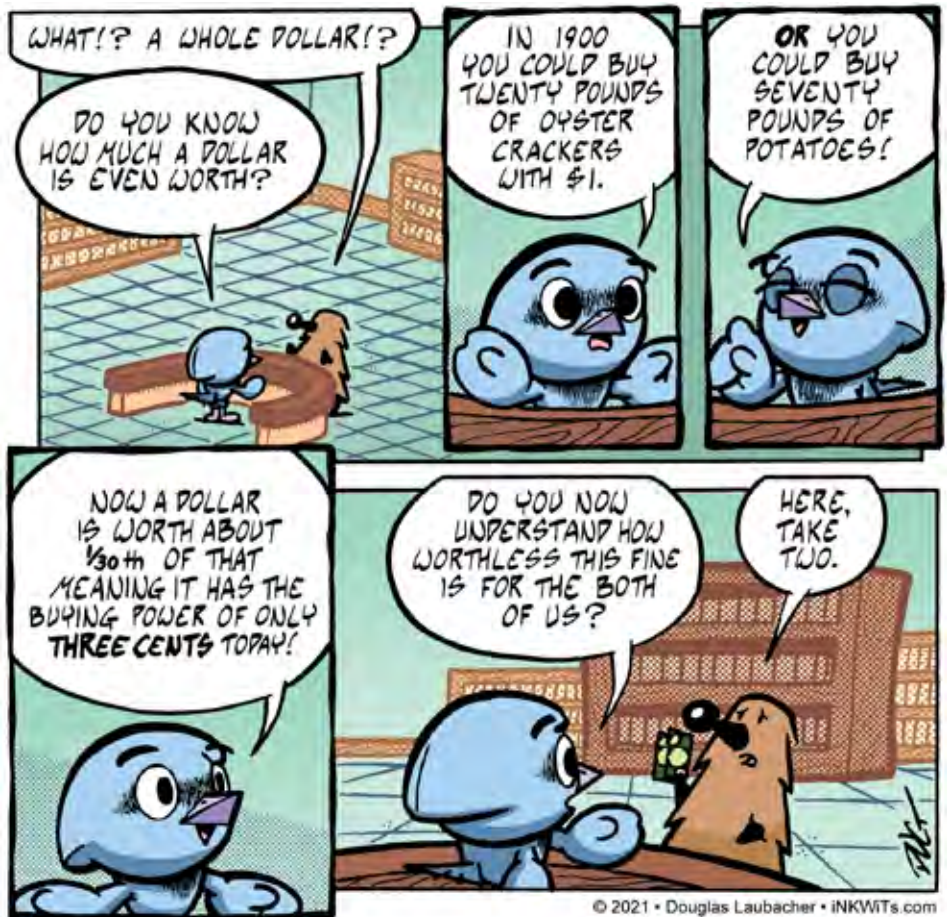

Program helps seniors manage their benefits

Dear Savvy Senior,
Does Social Security offer any special help to beneficiaries who struggle managing their benefits? My aunt, who has no children, has dementia and struggles keeping up with her bills and other financial duties.

Inquiring Niece

Dear Inquiring,

Yes, Social Security actually has a little-known program known as the Representative Payee Program, which helps beneficiaries who need help managing their Social Security benefit payments. Here's what you should know.

Authorized by Congress back in 1939, the Social Security Representative Payee Program provides money-management help to beneficiaries who are incapable of managing their Social Security income. Beneficiaries in need of this help are often seniors suffering from dementia or minor children who are collecting Social Security survivors' benefits.

Currently, more than 5 million Social Security beneficiaries have representative payees.

Representative payees also handle benefits for nearly 3 million recipients of Supplemental Security Income, a Social Security administered benefit program for low-income people who are over 65, blind or disabled.

Who are payees?

A representative payee is typically a relative or close friend of the beneficiary needing assistance, but Social Security also can name an organization or institution for the role, like a nursing home or social-service agency.

Some of the duties of a representative payee include:

- Using the beneficiary's Social Security or SSI payments to meet their essential needs such as food, shelter, household bills and medical care, as well as personal needs like clothing and recreation.

- Keeping any remaining money from benefit payments in an interest-bearing

bank account or savings bonds for the beneficiary's future needs.

- Keeping records of benefit payments received and how the money was spent or saved.

- Reporting to Social Security any changes or events that could affect the beneficiary's payments (for example, a move, marriage, divorce or death).

- Reporting any circumstances that affect the payee's ability to serve in the role.

As a representative payee, you cannot combine the beneficiary's Social Security payments with your own money or use them for your own needs. The bank account into which benefits are deposited should be fully owned by the beneficiary, with the payee listed as financial agent.

Some payees, generally those who do not live with the beneficiary, are required to submit annual reports to Social Security accounting for how benefits are used. For more information on the responsibilities and restrictions that come with the role, see the Social Security

publication, "A Guide for Representative Payees," at www.SSA.gov/pubs/EN-05-10076.pdf.

How to get help

If you believe your aunt may need a representative payee, call Social Security at 800-772-1213 and make an appointment to discuss the matter at her local office. Applying to serve as a payee usually requires a face-to-face interview.

Social Security may consider other evidence in deciding if a beneficiary needs a payee and selecting the person to fill the role, including doctor assessments and statements from relatives, friends and others in a position to give an informed opinion about the beneficiary's situation.

You also should know that if you become your aunt's representative payee, you cannot collect a fee for doing it. However, some organizations that serve in the role do receive fees, paid out of the beneficiary's Social Security or SSI payments.

Tag teaming it on the mowing after a lot of rain

I'm not happy the remains of Hurricane Fred recently went through our area and caused the grass to jump up a few inches overnight. After two weeks of enjoying a late summer dry period where we didn't have to mow, the grass was now looking worse than it did in the spring. Joe and I were tag teaming it on the mowing. Hurricane season is not looking good for people who mow their own grass. A second huge storm system has already dumped more inches of rain in our area. When will it end?

It felt like someone had stuck a hot poker into my right ankle. I hobbled in pain.

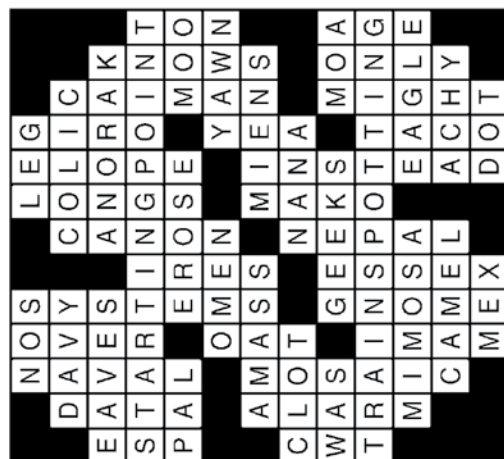
Joe was immediately super concerned and full of empathy.

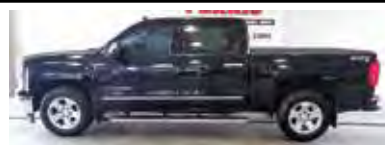
