

Council asks mayor to resign or retire

Council took care of city business first, and then near the end of the Dover City Council meeting on Aug. 2. Mayor Richard Homrighausen was again asked to resign or retire, this time with one council member proposing council take action if the mayor does not.

Near the end of the meeting, Council President Shane Gunnoe asked if there was any unfinished business.

Yes, Mr. President. I have a question for the mayor," Ward III Rep. Sandy Moss said. "At the last council meeting, (the mayor) made a statement to the media that he is at the office on a regular basis. I would like to know what his definition of a regular basis is. Is it 40 hours, 30 hours, 10 hours?

"10 hours," Homrighau-

Moss continued with a report of the mayor's actual

the past two weeks.

The week of July 19, 20, 21 and 22, Monday through Thursday, you were in the office 15 minutes each day. That comes up to an hour," Moss said. "Last week, July 26 and 27, you were in the office for a halfhour, the 29th 15 minutes and Friday the 30th a half

work time at the office for hour. It doesn't come close to 10 hours.'

> The mayor looked at a sheet of paper as he responded.


> 'I answered your questions during the last council meeting, and I will not do so again tonight," Homrighausen said. "Your decision to continue discussing or attempting to discuss this topic only distracts from legitimate city business, which our residents deserve.'

> Ward IV councilman Bob Mueller took issue with this statement.

> 'Mr. Mayor this is pertinent to the city of Dover when you're not in the office what most people would consider a reasonable length of time," Mueller said. "We do understand you're not well. We do understand, and we had hoped that you would consider resigning, retiring, whatever you want to call it. This is the business of the council when the mayor becomes impaired to the point where others are doing his job, and that is what is happening.'

> Council-at-large member Don Maurer asked Homrighausen about questions council members had submitted in writing to him in the past.

> "I was just curious if given the time and circumstances if he had gone over those questions and then did he prepare to answer some of them in front of council," Maurer said. "I echo what Bob (Mueller) said,

the concern there is for the condition of the mayor and the condition of council and the condition of the city so we can move forward. Did you look at them?"

"Yes," Homrighausen

Council-at-large member John Correll then asked the mayor if he had any comment he wanted to make on the questions.

"Not at this time," Homrighausen said.

Shane Gunnoe said he had several questions council members had asked him to relay that were part of the resolution 3-21. The questions included have you ever delegated or allowed family members to requisition city property or access locked facilities and have you ever allowed a noncity employee to answer email on your behalf, among many other questions.

"Shane, I will not answer your questions," Homrighausen said.

'That's OK. I'm putting them on record," Gunnoe

Maurer was frustrated that at the last meeting all council got from the mayor in response to their questions was yes or no answers. "All we wanted to have is a conversation and a few explanations. Obviously, we're not getting that."

Moss took her comments a step further.

"I would just like to sug-

gest to council members we have gone this far. I suggest we do not wait on the state's decision and we proceed forward with our plans. And yes, it's going to cost more money, but I'd rather pay that extra money than pay someone \$98,000 a year that can only be in the office for an hour a week or an hour and 45 minutes," Moss said.

Moss consulted with law director Douglas O'Meara before declining to provide more information about the plans when questioned after the meeting.

At the meeting Homrighausen reported the GE building is set to be demolished this month, and he congratulated the city's Olympic medal winner.

"I can't begin to tell you how proud I am, along with the rest of the city of Dover, of Hunter Armstrong's performance in the 2020 year Olympics, and he is receiving a gold medal in the 4-by-100-meter relay,' Homrighausen said.

Nicole Stoldt, auditor, reported the city is in the process of organizing a recognition ceremony for Armstrong in conjunction with the end of summer celebration. More information will be announced soon.

Dave Douglas reported the city's paving program is going well, and they anticipate having extra money to add streets that weren't on

Greg Bair reported donations were received from the Vietnam veterans group of \$500 and \$100 from a private citizen for the proposed memorial in downtown Dover for veterans.

In other action council voted to suspend the rules and then passed emergency ordinance No. 29-21 authorizing the Dover Police Department and the City of Dover to dispose of certain property at public auction or sale. The property would have a limited or probable value below \$1,000.

Council also suspended the rules and voted to autho-

Tucked Away Arena to host first rodeo

ith the perfect name for its location off a country road, the newly opened Tucked Away Arena will host its first-ever rodeo on Saturday, Aug. 21 at 7 p.m. and is IPRA and APRA sanctioned.

The events at the rodeo will be bull riding, saddle brone, bareback brone, team roping, steer wrestling, tie-down roping, barrel racing and breakaway roping. Mutton busting may be added. Follow the arena's Facebook page, Tucked Away Arena, for the latest information.

The Diamond J Ranch & Rodeo Company of Oak Hill, Ohio will provide the stock, announcement and staff for the event.

For rodeo organizers Jeanine and Mike Smitley of Uhrichsville, it was something they have been considering for a long time but are now making a reality. COVID-19 spurred them into action.

"Last year with everything, a lot of the contractors were having a really hard time staying afloat, Jeanine Smitley said.

Rodeo participants were hurt too as many rodeos were canceled. Mike Smitley and his son, Cooper, learned this firsthand when Cooper competed in the National High School Rodeo finals last year in Oklahoma

The only places most rodeos could be held were private facilities, so the Smitleys decided to build an arena on their farm.

We wanted to try to give back. haul the materials to Ohio. We had planned on trying to do it earlier than what we have, but with everything it's a lot," Jeanine Smitley said. "People don't realize how much it takes to put it all together."

This is actually a full rodeo, and it will have all of the events,' Jeanine Smitley said.

The arena is centered at the bottom of a wide hill, so spectators are encouraged to bring lawn chairs and blankets to get comfortable while watching the event. There will be a number of food options available including Kelly's Lemonade, a barbecue food truck, and hamburgers and hot dogs. The Rush Township Volunteer Fire Department will serve chicken dinners as a fundraiser for the department.

Cooper Smitley, who is taking high school courses online so he can compete in rodeos, competed again this year at the National High School Rodeo finals in Nebraska in tie-down roping, steer wrestling and team roping.

Cooper Smitley's been busy with rodeos this year.

'When he gets back, he is actually going to be going on the road to compete in some IPRA rodeos with another fellow that we know," Jeanine Smitley said.

Of course, Cooper Smitley will be right at home, literally, as he competes at the Tucked Away Arena rodeo. Jeanine Smitley plans to compete too in barrel racing.

Book store expanding and moving to new location

Books-N-Things, in downtown New Philadelphia for more than 15 years and in Zoar for many years beyond that, is moving once again. This time the move presents challenges and opportunities for owner David Croto and his family, who are all involved in the upcoming move.

"We started looking around for a place to move and considered several locations in and out of Tuscarawas County that might work," Croto said. "On balance, we've been doing business here in Tuscarawas County for a long time and felt a responsibility to stay here where we have had so many customers for so long."

Books-N-Things will move just a block away to the corner of Fair Avenue and East High, below the home of Craft Bistro and Lounge. The space, as Croto points out with no trace of worry, is much smaller than the current bookstore.

"We will have the chance to maybe change things up a little bit," he said. "We won't be able to have all of our inventory out all the time, so we will have to specialize a little bit in what we offer and bring some new levels of organization to what we're doing."

Croto has secured storage space nearby for inventory not currently on shelves in the new store, and he plans to increase his online reach by spending more time personally attending to the organization and marketing of books online. "It's something that requires a lot of time and attention, and we should be in a better place to do that now," he said.

The move itself will take herculean effort, as anyone who has visited the store will appreciate. To put things into perspective, the 75,000-80,000 titles that

must be moved either to the new store space or into storage likely weigh somewhere around 15-16 tons.

"We're going to need a lot of boxes," Croto said, "and I've ordered more dollies. In addition to the books you see, the basement is full of books not yet out on shelves."

The target opening date

is Sept. 1 with the new name, Bookman's Cafe.

Inventory will continue to be some of the most varied of any book shop in the country. "There's something for everybody, literally," Croto said.

The store has always carried rare collector copies that will never be read, along with reading copies in every segment imaginable. Art, literature, religion, cookbooks, classics, travel, history, fiction, biography and how-to are a small fraction of the kinds of books to be found at Books-N-Things. The store carries newly published works, comics and illustrated novels, and a large selection of new and old children's books among those 16 tons of hard and soft cover volumes.

Croto's wife, Shelly, and daughters, Shelby and Courtney, are all continuing to play a role in the store. Shelby Croto is constructing an arch at one of the two entrances to the new store. Protected from weather, the arch will be filled with books, leaving no doubt as to what kind of business can be found inside.

The new store will offer seating and coffee with home-baked treats available, made by Shelby Croto, who also is a pastry chef.

"We will have to be more selective in what is out on the shelves," Croto said, "and we may be a little bit more of a specialty bookstore, but we will still be able to track down just about any title you may be looking for. It will still be a great hometown bookstore, and our customers will recognize us right away. We're trying new things and have a lot of ideas for the new space."

The store is closed for the month of August to make the move. Croto said donations of time and boxes are welcome. See further information at the store's Facebook page.

Master class boosts your recycling know-how

The Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Recycling District wants to help people become a master recycler. The course offers recycling enthusiasts an in-depth study of recycling practices and how to put them to use in their own communities.

The \$40 course combines speakers, field trips and other activities. Master recyclers exit the course with enhanced knowledge, sharpened skills and a passion to share their experience with others in their communities.

The course runs for eightconsecutive Thursdays from 5:30-8:30 p.m., beginning Sept. 2. Wendy Bollock, outreach coordinator, said people shouldn't let the length of the course dissuade

"It's not seven weeks of listening to me blab," she said. "It's super fun. I keep people entertained and busy. Plus, I feed them a light dinner when they arrive."

Now in its third year, the Master Recycler Program is sched-

uled to include a field trip to Blue Rock Station, Ohio's first Earthship, nestled on 40 acres near household and waste. Philo, Ohio.

"It's a completely sustainable way of life," Bullock said of the 2,200-square-foot home made of tires, cans, bottles, mud and other recycled materials. "We also will visit landfills and local facilities to learn from experts in the industry.'

Some of the topics covered by the course include the following:

—Reuse of local resources.

- Food waste and composting.
- —Alternatives to hazardous
 - -Reducing electronic waste.
 - —Thoughtful consumption.
 - —House plants and air quality.
 - —Water quality.
 - —Litter prevention.
- -Landfill and recycling center operations.





New Philadelphia VFW helps Uhrichsville veteran

By Teri Stein

A Uhrichsville veteran, Gary Snyder, would have built if not for the generosity of the Carl C. Stoller Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1445 in New Philadelphia and its supporters.

Snyder served a combined total of one year, seven months and 17 days in Vietnam during two tours with the United States Army during the time he was enlisted from 1967-68.

"I worked on big trucks. I went out with a wrecker and picked up the ones that got blown up," Snyder said.

Snyder enlisted when he was 18 and just out of high school. He is from the New Philadelphia area and has lived in the Uhrichsville area for the past 21 years.

The shared experiences are what keeps veterans close, and Snyder easily recalled his time in Viet-

"I did a lot of growing up there," Snyder said. "You really can't tell people how it was over there. You had to just experience it yourself. You're at 18, 19 or 20 years old. We had to grow up fast."

'When I first got home, to move from the home he I don't know what I was dreaming about. I just grabbed the backboard of my bed, snapped it off and threw it right through the wall," Snyder said. "It scared the heck out of my parents, but I was dreaming about something over there, and that happened that quick. I had to watch myself after that."

In civilian life Snyder worked as a welder and started his own welding business. Then he developed heart issues and COPD, which impacted his ability to care for his

A leak in his washing machine caused an area of the floor and the joists in his home to rot, something Snyder didn't notice until it was too late.

Members of VFW Post 1445 came to the rescue, proving veterans have a bond that can't be broken.

'Because of his health issues and with a limited income, he couldn't keep up with it, and it just kind of snowballed," said Steve Chenevey, post commander It's an experience that and a Vietnam War veteran

It wasn't the first time the VFW post had helped Snyder. About two years ago, they helped provide a mobile scooter and fuel for heating his home.

"I had heard of (the VFW post) doing things for people, but it brought tears to my eyes when (Chenevey) told me what the post was going to try and do. It's just unheard of in my point of view, and I've got the upmost respect for the club," Snyder said.

Snyder prefers living on his own and felt he had nowhere to turn for help prior to the VFW stepping

"The whole idea is so he can stay in his home," Chenevey said. "He doesn't want to go to a nursing home or assisted living. He wants to be out on his land, and that's what we're going to do."

Better View Renovation LLC, owned by Dustin Correll, is completing the work.

They are working with us with getting him back in his home, and they're being very fair," Chenevey said.

"They are a great bunch of guys too," Snyder said.

Chenevey estimated the cost of helping Snyder will be about \$25,000.

Besides fixing the house, we want him to try to get back on a little more solid ground," Chenevey said.

The post plans on helping Snyder with heating costs, a water filtration system, air-conditioning and purchasing a lift chair. They also are going to help with food over the winter by providing products from the newly opened veterans food pantry at the New Philadelphia post. The AmVets Post 1338 in New Philadelphia also is contributing.

The VFW is not equipped to take care of someone for years.

"Our job is to get him stabilized a little bit and back on his feet. We're also working with other organizations so we can hopefully get that accomplished," Chenevey said. "We want him to get a restart. He can build up a little savings, and then he'll be able to do what he needs himself, which is what he wants to do.'

The post ensured Snyder connected with the VA to determine assistance through that organization. A home health nurse has

already checked on Snyder and will assist with other needs Snyder may have, like grab bars in the home.

The VFW post is happy to help. Until Snyder developed health issues, he had always been selfsufficient and didn't want to ask for assistance. Then problems with his health and home spiraled out of his control.

"That is typical of a lot of veterans," Chenevey said. "They will not ask for help unless things get to a point like this.'

Snyder's cousin, Steve Stropky of Columbia, has helped him over the years and contacted the VFW. Stropky also is an Army veteran of the Vietnam War.

Snyder is pleased with the help from the post including a stay at an area hotel to keep him out of the dusty environment until work is completed.

"I appreciate everything the VFW is doing for me, Snyder said.

portation between cities. The first trolley cars of the Tuscarawas Traction Company ran between Canal Dover and New Philadelphia in 1889. The line was later extended to Uhrichsville. In 1906 the local trolley company merged with the Northern Ohio Traction and Light Company, based in Akron. By 1929 the trolley service became unnecessary because families were able to afford automobiles.



Ribbon cutting planned for Bolivar trail connection

It has been a long time in the making, but a new quarter-mile stretch of the Towpath Trail is complete, connecting the McDonnell Trailhead at the border of Stark and Tuscarawas counties to the rest of the trail in Bolivar.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony will take place Monday, Aug. 16 at 4:30 p.m. to officially open the new section, which features a 100yard boardwalk over the Tuscarawas River, through the original canal prism and under a railroad bridge, along with an overhead canopy to protect trail users from any debris falling from the railroad.

The latest addition means 90 miles of the Towpath Trail can be followed continuously from Cleveland to Zoarville.

The approximately \$507,500 section also means trail users no longer have to navigate a tricky section of state Route 212, a hazard the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition began working to eliminate about four years ago.

"This is a key connection," said Dan Rice, executive director of the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition. "It not only completes 90 miles of the trail, but it all links all four counties, making it a vital connection for hikers, bicyclists and other a parks coordinator," he said. trail enthusiasts.

Tuscarawas County commissioner Kerry Metzger agreed with the importance of the connection and lik-

ened putting together the Towpath Trail to a giant connect-the-dots puzzle.

"The concept when we first started the trail project was like connect-the-dots," Metzger said. "But first you have to create the dots. wherever they may be."

Metzger said the original goal for completion was 2020, but funding opportunities and working out easement agreements with property owners influenced the time line.

Metzger has worked closely with Rice on the project since 2005, as have other county commissioners and the parks department. "We didn't even have a parks department then, just Jane Clay running things as

terms as a U.S. representative for Ohio's 16th Congressional District.

Metzger said this section is the one he told Rice he really hoped to see completed when he left his position as county commissioner in 2018. "I had hoped to have it finished before I retired the first time. But now I'm back as a commissioner, and it is finished. I'm proud and I'm glad," he said.

Rice said there are still about 11 miles of trail to complete to connect Zoarville to New Philadelphia, and plans are in development.







He's married to a model

In my last column, I wrote about the benefits of volunteering — despite that spider that was running around inside my clothing for an hour at one event. But volunteering has now allowed me to cross another item off the old bucket list — modeling.

I answered the call for modeling for promotional photos that were being taken at one of the places where I volunteer. I was happy to have the opportunity. I never thought I'd get to be a model, but here I am. Even better, my husband, Joe, can now say he is married to a model.

I was totally cut out for this modeling assignment because it was a fullcoverage modeling job. I was ready for my shot in 1700s period colonial clothing — a long dress, apron, long-sleeved shirt, white work cap and, of course, the essential scarf that goes over your shoulders and pins in the front to make sure no skin is showing beneath the neck. It was sure to be my best photo ever.

We models, there were five of us, had to arrive early to get the best light at 7:45 a.m. But how long could this take?

around until our photographer and the PR person in charge of the shoot figured out where the best place to take the photos would be. It really didn't take that long until we were called out to the garden area.

Then I found out what professional models have been saying for years is actually true: Modeling is hard work.

I was trying to be in character of how I thought a colonial person would look while gardening. I thought they would look pretty serious. After all, gardening in colonial times was serious one bad crop and you don't have anything to eat. You would starve with no grocery or dollar stores or colonial-style fast food restaurants nearby.

But I was wrong again. The photographer wanted me to smile like I was having the time of my life reaching for that green bean tendril I was pretending to wrap around a pole.

Soon there was anoth-First, we had to wait er problem with my shot.

My glasses have lenses that darken in the sunlight, and they were starting to turn gray. Sure, I'd look like a really cool colonial lady in sunglasses, but it was not period correct. These lenses were not something that was available in colonial times. The glasses had to go.

I slipped them into the pocket of my skirt. I was still good for taking directions just as long as the photographer told us exactly what he wanted us to do. Otherwise, he was a fuzzy blob. A time or two, I had to ask the other models what direction he was pointing for us to move.

We picked up our props to pose for photos in the garden, and then we kept switching places until everyone had used every tool and been in every position in the garden.

For the next shot, we were standing together behind the garden, holding our tools, chatting and smiling. This was pretty easy as I didn't know my co-models well, so we had a lot to talk about.

Then there were a couple more locations we took shots at, and what I had envisioned as being only about 20 min-

If I had a nickel for every time the rice pot boiled over

Japanese chef Masaharu Morimoto is probably the greatest chef in the world. pulling off feats in his dishes that seem impossible while making everything look effortless. Morimoto can literally do anything and everything in the kitchen and cook at the highest levels in just about every cuisine in the world. His advice to cooks at home?

"Get a rice cooker."

Cooking a perfect batch of plain white rice presents a challenge to many cooks, especially for those of us who grew up on Minute Rice. There are a lot of video tutorials out there, with no shortage of advice on getting it right.

I always saw having a machine designated to cooking just one thing to be a waste of money, and many rice cookers are about the size of a basketball, taking up a lot of precious counter or stashing space. I've learned to make a pretty decent batch of plain rice, but it's a side dish you have to be careful about and give rice is finished, it switches

your attention.

If I had a nickel for every time the stupid rice pot has boiled over, spreading sticky, hot starch water all over the stovetop, I'd be a fairly wealthy guy. No matter how low I set the burner, it cooks over. So we make a lot of Ouinoa instead of rice because it is better behaved. I intensely dislike scraping smelly, burned starch off the stove.

Over the weekend we spotted a small rice cooker/ steamer at the clearance price of \$12. At that tiny investment, I was willing to surrender my principles, and we bought it. We tried it out on Sunday.

Morimoto is right. Get a rice cooker.

All you have to do is add water and rice, close the lid. and hit the button. When the

to keeping the food warm until you're ready, so no more swearing at a boiledover mess. Set it up and come back with a fork when you're ready to eat. I am sold.

There are still a few things you must do to get perfect results, and the most important step in making white rice is to rinse it well before cooking. Measure your uncooked rice into a bowl and cover it with cold water. Swish the rice around in the water with your fingers until the starch from the rice clouds the water and drain it in a mesh strainer. Return the rice to the bowl, add water again and repeat the process for at least three, better four times, until you have clear water. This prevents the rice from becoming too sticky and clumpy, offering a fluffy finished product.

Once the rice is cooked. it's ready to eat as is or to become fried rice or a cilantro and lime version. With the cooker we bought, you

also can use an included basket to steam vegetables at the same time.

You're not limited to ordinary long-grained white rice and can produce buckets of short-grained sushi rice, brown rice or any type of rice you like. With this gadget I may be persuaded to splurge for the supposedly outstanding but pricey Carolina Gold Rice.

Our cooker is a brand called Aroma and normally costs about \$38 at retail. You can find many brands with varying features in stores and online with a little research.

I don't have an air fryer, a toaster oven or a slow cooker because I've never found justification for any of them. Now I have to transfer rice cookers out of their category and into the "must have" group.

Get one. You'll thank me, and you'll be very happy to not have to scrape burned starch from your

stove top. If you have one a rice cooker right away. of the awful glass-surface stoves, as I do, you should away at your cooktop with a stop reading this and go buy razor blade again.






