Teacher honored | Library seeks donations for seed-lending program

The Tuscarawas County Public Library System's seed-lending library has been a popular stop for avid and novice gardeners in Tuscarawas County.

"Seed sharing has been around for centuries," said Robyn Guedel, adult and teen services manager. "A seed-lending library is where gardeners can check out seeds from the library's collection, grow them, save the seeds and return seeds from the propagated plants to the library.'

The seed library was started in partnership with local master gardener Judy Clegg, who had read about

seed libraries and contacted the library's director to see if the county's library would consider adding this service.

Open-pollinated and heirloom seeds are in labeled packets that detail if the seeds are annual/

perennial: sun/shade/partial; height, color and planting instructions; and if they are easy, advanced or difficult to grow.

'Customers are able to check out three seed packets at a time," Guedel said. "The limit is subject to change as the seed library expands."

According to Guedel, the seed library is looking empty this growing season. Those interested in donating seeds to the library can pick up envelopes for seeds at the drive-up window or in the lobby of the Main Library.

The seed library, housed in a vintage card catalog, is currently located in the lobby at the Main Library. Along with the seed library is information, instructions and educational information on gardening.

The Tuscarawas County Public Library hopes to encourage the tradition of seed sharing, nurture local plant varieties and foster a community of sharing.





CLAY creations

Work continues on site of new home for Clay Museum

The updates continue at the future home of the Clay Capital Heritage Museum at a two-story building on the corner of East Third Street and North Main Street in Uhrichsville.

"We are currently working on phase four at the museum," said Wendy Zucal, director of the Dennison Railroad Depot Museum, which manages the Clay Museum. "It is a \$450,000 budget, of which \$300,000 is state capital budget dollars, and we are required to match \$150,000."

New glass windows, mullions and doors were recently installed by Miceli Glass, as was some new outdoor lighting by Wood Electric. An upcoming project is first-floor restrooms. Other projects already completed include a new roof, downspout repairs, brick repairs, awning repairs, demolition and a new HVAC system.

There is no set date for the new museum space to open as all the work is being done in phases depending on the funding they receive.

"The first floor is our primary goal. There will be a coffee shop and museum gift shop in the front of the building, and there will be a smaller theater inside a kiln," Zucal said.

Once the first-floor improvements are complete, second-floor renovations will begin.

"Eventually, we will have a large community space upstairs for museum programs and community use," Zucal said.

The entire project is expected to cost \$2 million, and supporters have raised more than \$1 million.

The name of the museum has been changed to the Clay Capital Heritage Museum, and a new logo was designed to better represent the purpose of the museum to remember the clay industry for its contributions and to honor those who worked in the clay plants.

Some of the new exhibits planned for the new site will be a history of clay and brick-making plants in the past and what is happening in the industry today. Another will highlight how the history of the clay industry ties into railroading and will tie exhibits to the Dennison Depot. The exhibits will focus on the clay workers, how the industry impacted the community and sewer pipe folk art.

Plans also include an expanded gift shop and a coffee shop. The Clay Capital Heritage Museum is currently open during the summer months and for tours. Guests have visited from all around Ohio and out of state.

Clay has been used since ancient times. Because of the rich clay deposits in the area, the clay industry grew from the 1800s to early 1900s. During that time there were 32 clay plants in Tuscarawas County, most of which were in the Uhrichsville area.

The industry has left its mark on the area with the long-running Clay Week Festival, which was last held in 1999, and the Miss Clayland Pageant. Miss Clayland began in 1950 and has had at least six Miss Ohio winners and one Miss America.

Clay Capital Heritage Museum site manager Becky Clough, whose grandfather worked at one of the clay plants, is excited for the future of the museum and the extra space it will allow them.

"We're going to have more room to be able to put out more artifacts because we have a lot to show," Clough said. "So that's going to be a blessing."

They'll also have more room to set up activities for children including clay days where children can come in and carve designs into their own block of clay. They also have a scavenger hunt to keep kids engaged.

"They have to look for different artifacts throughout the museum. It makes them aware of a lot of history that they would never really look for. But because of that scavenger hunt, it makes them check things out," Clough said.

Clough recently showed some of the more interesting pieces in the museum including some miniature clay pipe samples to make it easy for salesmen to show products to clients

The folk art is among the most admired pieces at the museum including a grave marker made from a clay pipe and glazed. Many of these creative pieces also can be seen at the Union Cemetery in Uhrichsville.

"People don't realize just how interesting it is to come in and check out some of this history," Clough said.

The Clay Capital Heritage Museum is holding a reverse raffle fundraiser on March 18, and proceeds will benefit the new museum site.

Tickets are available at the Dennison Depot and cost \$20. The grand prize is \$1,000, plus other cash prizes as the raffle is broadcast live on Facebook at 10 a.m. Call the Dennison Depot Railroad Museum at 740-922-6776 or contact any museum representative.

The raffle is sponsored by Superior Clay Corporation.



Learning the lessons of the past is important

I recently read a news report and saw a quote I thought said all you needed to know about a recent situation that has been weighing on my mind and probably yours.

"The Russian invasion of Ukraine marks a turning point. It threatens our entire post-war order," German Chancellor Olaf Scholz said in a statement.

He meant post-World War II order, of course, and it's good to know this time so many nations are taking the invasion seriously and doing what they can to help.

Because history is important and a way for us to learn from our mistakes, let's do a quick review of a few things that led up to WWII and see why we can't turn our backs.

Adolf Hitler became chancellor of Germany in 1933 and declared himself "the supreme leader." A little red flag there, but nobody was paying attention. Then Hitler sneakily began stockpiling weapons, which he wasn't supposed to be doing. He was obsessed with the idea that the "pure" German race was superior, and they needed more land to expand.

Also in 1933 in Germany on March 22, the first official concentration camp opened at Dachau. April 1 saw a boycott of Jewish shops and businesses. On April 7 a law was passed barring Jewish people from holding civil service, university and state positions. On May 10 there were public burnings of books written by Jews, political dissidents and others not approved by the state. This was just the start.

It's important to learn more about all the atrocities that took place against the Jewish people, and many good resources are available. But fast forward to 1938: Hitler sends troops to occupy Austria and the following year takes over Czechoslovakia.

Guess what? No one was paying attention yet. Other nations were too preoccupied with their own issues, and Hitler's aggressions went unchecked.

They finally started getting a little nervous when Hitler and Soviet leader Joseph Stalin signed the German-Soviet Nonaggression Pact on Aug. 23, 1939, which ultimately meant when Hitler decided to invade Poland, the Soviets would not fight against them and even would help them take over the country.

On Sept. 1, 1939, Hitler invaded Poland from the west. Hitler's plan of world domination finally was recognized, and Great Britain and France declared war on Germany. Unfortunately for Poland, Soviet troops attacked from the east on Sept. 17, and the country fell quickly.

On April 9, 1940, Germany invaded Norway and occupied Denmark.

On May 10, 1940, German forces swept through Belgium and the Netherlands.

On June 14, 1940, German forces entered Paris, and France was divided.

From September 1940 through May 1941, German forc-

es bombed Britain extensivelv.

Condensed version: On Sept. 17, 1940, the evil leaders from Italy and Japan joined Germany in the Tripartite Pact, which intended to deter the United States from entering the war. Though the United States had been helping Britain and France obtain weapons, the U.S. didn't join the war until Dec. 7, 1941, when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor.

Interestingly, I once worked with a woman who was married right before Dec. 7, 1941, and when she and her husband heard about the attack at Pearl Harbor, they drove to Washington, D.C. on their honeymoon to hear President Franklin D. Roosevelt declare war. They were some real history buffs.

The war did not end until Sept. 2, 1945. Worldwide, it killed an estimated 85 million people — 15 million in battle, 25 million in battle wounded and 45 million civilian deaths. Some estimates put the toll even higher.

But amid the ongoing war in Ukraine that has me shutting down at odd times to pray for a country and people I never thought about before, I have to wonder if technology is going to play a role in uniting the world in peace.

Advancements have us learning of events happening around the world in minutes.

We can hear from ordinary

people who are fleeing Ukraine or fighting in Ukraine, see the disturbing text messages sent by a Russian soldier to his mother, and see Russian people protesting the war in the streets, which a few years ago would have been unheard of. Even now, we suspect they are risking their lives to do so.

Another positive result of technology is the internet has connected us all to the point we realize how much we all have in

ge Ukraine lee, see the live, what our heritage is or our religion. I suspect and hope this commonality will eventually unite us all in peace.

Pray for an end to war and a huge thank you to those in the military who have served and those who continue to serve and stand ready to protect us.



COVID-19 virus can increase the risk of shingles

Dear Savvy Senior,

How effective is the shingles vaccine and what is the CDC recommendation for getting it? My older brother and sister, both in their 50s, got COVID a few months back, followed by shingles. Do you know if there is a connection between these viruses and would the shingles vaccine have protected them?

Scared of Shingles Dear Scared,

Great question. Many



healthcare professionals across the country have been urging their older patients to get the shingles vaccine in addition to the COVID-19 vaccinations during the pandemic because getting COVID-19 can increase your chances of developing shingles. And the more severe case of COVID you get, the greater your risk for shingles.

The reason for this is because when you contract COVID-19, your immune system becomes compromised fighting off the virus, which gives shingles — a virus that already exists in your body if you've had chickenpox — a chance to reactivate.

Here's what you should

know about shingles, the shingles vaccine and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendations.

What are shingles?

Shingles, also known as herpes zoster, is a burning, blistering skin rash that affects around 1 million Americans each year. The same virus that causes chickenpox causes shingles. What happens is the chickenpox virus that most people get as kids never leaves the body.

It hides in the nerve cells near the spinal cord and, for some people, emerges later in the form of shingles.

In the U.S., about one out of every three people will develop shingles during their lifetime. While anyone who's had chickenpox can get shingles, it most commonly occurs in people over age 50, along with people who have weakened immune systems. But you can't catch shingles from someone else.

Early signs of the disease include pain, itching or tingling before a blistering rash appears several days later, and it can last up to four weeks. The rash typically occurs on one side of the body, often as a band of blisters that extends from the middle of your back around to the breastbone. It also can appear above an eye or on the side of the face or neck.

In addition to the rash, about 20-25% of those who get shingles go on to develop severe nerve pain — postherpetic neuralgia — that can last for months or even years. And in rare cases shingles can cause strokes, encephalitis, spinalcord damage and vision loss.

Shingles vaccine

The vaccine for shingles called Shingrix (see www.Shingrix.com) provides much better protection than the old shingles vaccine, Zostavax.

Manufactured by Glaxo-

SmithKline, Shingrix is 97% effective in preventing shingles in people 50-69 years old and 91% effective in those 70 and older.

Shingrix also does a terrific job of preventing nerve pain that continues after a shingles rash has cleared — about 90% effective.

Because of this protection, the CDC recommends everyone age 50 and older receive the Shingrix vaccine, which is given in two doses, separated by two to six months.

Even if you've already had shingles, you still need these vaccinations because reoccurring cases are possible. The CDC also recommends anyone previously vaccinated with Zostavax be revaccinated with Shingrix.

You also should know Shingrix can cause some adverse side effects for some people including muscle pain, fatigue, headache, fever and upset stomach.

Shingrix, which averages around \$205 for both doses, is covered by most private health insurance plans including Medicare Part D prescription drug plans, but there may be a cost to you depending on your plan. Contact your insurer to find out.
