On Wednesday, Jan. 4, Friends of the Homeless held a public meeting at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church Parish Hall. Approximately 60 people attended the meeting including area residents, several members of city council and two county commissioners.

The purpose of the meeting was to present the case for building a new homeless shelter, to be named the House of Hope, and to answer questions from residents who live near the proposed site at 327 Beaver Ave. NE in New Philadelphia.

Friends of the Homeless has asked city council to rezone the property, but the problem seems to be the shelter does not qualify under any of the city's current zoning. Cheryl Ramos, city councilwoman and chair of the zoning and annexation committee, said a meeting will be scheduled to consider the matter, with the date and time posted on the city website at www.newphilaoh.com.

The current shelter at 211 E. High Ave. in New Philadelphia is housed in a 90-year-old structure. Connie Clark, a volunteer and fundraiser for the organization, described widespread deterioration in the building.

The proposed new facility will include 20 rooms for men, 20 for women and six family units, along with a dining hall and community rooms.

Rev. Joe Svancara, board president for Friends of the Homeless, said the current building cannot be renovated properly to solve the problems that currently exist. He said the structure is not ADA-compliant and is not

built to any modern specifications.

The panel of board members and volunteers from Friends of the Homeless also fielded questions from the audience, many of which were acknowledged as legitimate concerns. Other concerns appeared to be due to a lack of understanding of how the shelter works.

Concerns stated by residents were as follows:

Fear that a shelter will attract drug addicts to the area

Calvin White, executive director of the current Friends of the Homeless shelter, said while some who come to the shelter for help are addicted, they are not criminals. It was stated the shelter provides drug and alcohol counseling and mental health services through the Wellmore Centre in New Philadelphia.

Worries about increased traffic

Panelists said traffic will be routed

to an unused back road and should not cause a problem, as the current facility does not attract much vehicle traffic.

Part of the land is in a floodplain

Jeff Mathias, a local realtor who is helping find a new location for the shelter, said the shelter would be built on 2 acres that are not in the floodplain. However, at least one resident said he has pictures of the road the organization plans to use, and it floods often. Clark said she would be interested in seeing the photos.

Concerns the facility will be near **East Elementary School**

Mathias said New Philadelphia Superintendent Amy Wentworth sent a letter in support of the shelter being built on Beaver Avenue.

In a copy of the letter obtained by The Bargain Hunter, Wentworth offered support for the shelter as long as background checks are performed and no one is admitted who has a crim-

inal background or record of being convicted or having pleaded guilty to any sex offense involving children.

A hand-out from the Friends of the Homeless said, "Background checks are performed on all potential guests. Sex offenders and those convicted of arson or violent crimes are not admitted. Guest belongings are inspected. Guests observe a 10 p.m. curfew.'

Lisa Meese, pastor at Preach the Word Ministries, was troubled no one had informed her about the plan to build the House of Hope right beside her church.

"We're all for this homeless shelter," she said. "I have an obligation and a responsibility for those people that go to this church. We have many children that attend here. I'm also worried because there's also people wondering if their cars are going to get broken into."

Why Beaver Avenue?

"We've gone to seven locations, and we've been shot down in seven locations," Mathias said.

Amanda Fontana, a volunteer and board member, cited the need for shelter residents to have access to social and health services within walking distance as a reason to build within New Philadelphia.

In the end, while one resident who lives near the Beaver Avenue location said she would support the shelter if it were built there, another resident seemed to sum up the feelings of most of the area residents attending.

'There's no question it's needed. but not on Beaver Avenue."



Ohioans are urged to get booster

Ohio Department of Health Director Bruce Vanderhoff and Ohio Department of Aging Director Ursel J. McElroy are urging Ohioans to give themselves maximum protection from the COVID-19 virus by staying up to date with vaccinations including the updated booster.

Vanderhoff said although case counts, hospitalizations and deaths from COVID have not reached levels seen over the past two winters, about 2,500 Americans and 90 Ohioans are dying each week. Also, much of the nation is now seeing a rise in a new, highly contagious variant known as XBB.1.5.

He said those age 65 and older and those who are immunocompromised or have certain chronic conditions are at greater risk for serious illness or death if they have not received the updated booster, which targets the more recent Omicron subvariants.

Data shows 79% percent of Ohioans who have died of COVID have been age 65 and older. While 86.9% of that population is fully vaccinated, only 38% have an updated booster.

That means more than 1.2 million older Ohioans are unvaccinated or not up to date with the booster that was made available in September.

could," Vanderhoff said. "Many of these deaths are preventable."

ODH recently debuted a public-service announcement aimed at promoting boosters. The ad is appearing on television, radio, social media and billboards. It can be viewed on the department's YouTube channel.

Vanderhoff said while the vaccines deliver strong cellular immunity cru-

cial to fighting off COVID-19, even that immunity can wane over time, especially as people age. The updated COVID-19 vaccine can provide a boost to that immunity.

"At the start of each new year, many of us resolve to take steps to improve our health, so I hope that more Ohioans will consider getting vaccinated or boosted," Vanderhoff said. "That clearly is the safest, most reliable way you can reduce your risk of serious illness, hospitalization or even death as a result of the COVID-19 virus."

Library to host BBBS Sisters program

In order to mark National Mentoring Month, the Dover Library will host a program titled Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio FAQ.

Beverly Pearch, president and CEO of BBBSECO, and Dan Warther, owner of Warther Woodworking and a Big Brother, will be at the library on Wednesday, Jan. 25 at 6:30 p.m. to share information regarding the programs that are provided to youth in Tuscarawas and Carroll counties, like school and community-based mentoring, camp opportunities, individual assistance, and resource connection. They will present volunteer opportunities and ways to assist the agency.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Ohio has been active since 1973. The organization currently serves children in Tuscarawas and Carroll counties and has active school programs in eight different districts across the counties.



Area high school students meet with their Little at their school to do activities such as reading, board games, sports, computer games, homework help or a simple conversation.

BBBSECO also has a community-based mentoring program. Littles in need of a mentor are matched with a volunteer Big who develops and maintains a relationship, serving as a positive role model and source of reliable support.

Matches are based on common interests, backgrounds and aspirations. Bigs and Littles explore the local community and share activities they both enjoy for at least four hours a month. Some Bigs meet their Littles on the weekends while others meet in the evenings. Each that works for them.

"If you are a person who wants to make a difference in the life of a young person, you should come to this program," said Sherrel Rieger, program specialist at the Dover Library. "You don't have to be an expert. You just have to be sincere. BBBS will change your life."

Pearch, a 2009 Kent State University graduate, is currently serving as president and CEO of BBBSECO. She has been with the agency since 2009. She has been a Big Sister in the school-based program since 2015.

Build Up Dennison project will have a snowball effect

A \$1.3 million project at Dennison will give the downtown a facelift and help welcome more visitors and businesses to the village.

Mayor Greg DiDonato is not the only one excited about the project. Many businesses and individuals in the village have already donated to parts of the project including new lighting, benches and decorative areas along the sidewalks. The village also is working with Superior Clay to design new planters for downtown.

The last major update to the village was done in the 1960s.

The village received grants for the Build Up Dennison project including \$441,000 from the State of Ohio for storm drain replacement, \$230,000 from the American Rescue Fund and \$171,000 from the Governor's

Office for Appalachia. The village also secured funding that, along with a loan to the village and village funds, will provide a total of \$351,000 for paving in the downtown area. A grant from the Rosenberry Foundation also provided \$35,000.

DiDonato still has a sign in the mayor's office that reads "Dennison Thanks You" from the original Dennison Depot Railroad Museum project in 1984. Now those is the community are stepping up again. Even with the grant funding, the village still needed to raise \$211,000. It was a goal that was met in just four months.

"We're excited because the truth is we've already raised the money we need to meet our obligations to all the funding. Now what we're raising will allow us to do some extra fluff projects," DiDonato said.

He'd like to see two different

kiosks added to highlight not only important spots in Dennison, but also other attractions in Tuscarawas County.

"We're talking about a partnership with Tuscarawas County. One side would be all the highlights about what's in Tuscarawas County, and then our side would show like the Town Hall, the depot or historical buildings," DiDonato said as he pointed out other registered landmarks in Dennison like the Lanning House, The Railway Chapel and the old Dennison High School.

To raise money, the village sold sponsorships for the decorative light poles, benches and 42 decorative brick areas for the sidewalks. Only a few light poles and decorative brick areas are still waiting for sponsors, and the items will feature the names of the donors.

"This has been a vision," DiDonato said.

Donations are still being accepted and will go toward extras like directional arrow signs pointing the way to attractions.

The new decorative light pole project is planned to begin this summer. All the electrical to the poles will go underground, making the streets more attractive. They will be strategically placed.

"What I'm being told by our computer experts is that we should have no dark spaces. Everything should be visible," DiDonato said. "This is for safety and walkability."

Currently, there are 18 commercial-grade benches planned to be placed around the city. The metal benches will have a cutout on the back that spells Dennison. New vinyl welcome signs have been ordered to place throughout the village in two different designs. Both feature a different view of the Dennison Depot Railroad Museum in blue or tan, the village of Dennison logo and a Welcome or Welcome Historic.

Bidding for the project, except for the lighting, which is an AEP project, will take place in the fall with projects beginning early in 2024.

The storm sewer project will be completed first with existing catch basins on Grant Street to be removed and replaced from the creek to the gazebo area on North Fourth Street. Existing storm lines in that same area also will be removed and replaced.

Existing stop signs in the downtown area will be removed and replaced with stop signs lined in black with black posts and decorative street signs on top. The benches and new light posts also are black. Paving will be done along Grant Street from the creek to North Sixth Street, Hanna Street, and sections of School Lane and Depot Lane. DiDonato hopes workers find the original bricks under a part of the Depot Alley in good shape. He would like to see them left to enhance the atmosphere of the gazebo/depot area.

The Build Up Downtown Dennison project will create a snowball effect. DiDonato has already heard from one business that plans to do a facelift on its building to make it more attractive.





SWCD annual tree sale underway now

By Randy Clum "Blessed are those who plant trees under whose shade they will never sit." -Rabindranath Tagore, Indian poet

The Tuscarawas County Soil and Water District is offering trees for sale. The district has selected two evergreens (conifers) -Norway spruce and white pine — and four deciduous trees — red oak, scarlet oak,



white oak and sugar maple. These six species grow well in our soil types and are fairly free of disease and insects. When considering a planting location for your new seedling, do

your due diligence. Even oaks take two years for the though these are small seedlings, plan for their mature size in your landscape — 6 feet, 12 inches. Check for underground and overhead utilities, as well as sight clearance along roadways.

The evergreens, as the name suggests, retain their most recent growth of needles year round.

We have selected Norway spruce due to its lessor susceptibility to the fungus that are affecting the blue spruce. White pine is a fastgrowing evergreen with lacy needles and is well-suited to this area. The Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District planted this pine around its flood-control lakes in the 1930s.

The oak species all bear an annual crop of acorns. White oak likes a wide variety of growing sites, and its acorns are a favorite for a variety of wildlife species. White oak has the longest life span of all of the trees offered for sale, over 400 years. Red and scarlet

acorns to mature and are more consistent producers of acorns than the white oak. The red oak has the largest acorns of the three oaks. Scarlet oak has the smallest acorns of the three oaks, will grow on dry sites and will have the most brilliant fall color.

So why plant a tree? In an urban setting, they act as air-conditioners and filters of the atmosphere. The trees will remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and provide oxygen during photosynthesis. Trees will sequester carbon in their cell walls as long as they are not decaying. This holds true for any wood product.

Trees will slow down rain drops and help the water infiltrate into the ground, lessening the strain on our storm sewers. Trees help with species diversity and enhance wildlife habitat. And finally, trees will add value to your property value.




