BCC to host adult education open house

Buckeye Career Center will host an adult education open house on Tuesday, March 14 for prospective adult students. The event, which will highlight full-time and part-time adult education programs, will run from 4:30-6:30 p.m. in the cafeteria at Buckeye Career Center.

The open house is open to soon-to-be high school graduates, adults interested in earning a GED or high school diploma, adults wanting to start a new career, or even adults hoping to learn additional skills or earn industry credentials.

Instructors of the nine full-time programs will be there to discuss their programs with attendees. Admissions representatives also will be available to talk about the application process and review financial

aid options with potential students.

Frank Polen, adult education director, encourages anyone who is considering BCC to learn more about the offerings.

"Everywhere you look, employers are advertising for skilled labor. Each of our full-time programs lead to career skills and industry credentials," Polen said. "There are numerous ways to help fund your education at BCC including grants and scholarships, making for an affordable and viable postsecondary option. By attending this event, you will be able to gain valuable information to impact your future."

The full-time programs that will be promoted include cosmetology, dental assisting, HVAC-R, heavy equipment/CDL A

operator, Law Enforcement Training Academy, medical assisting, medical office and billing specialist, utility lineworker, and welding technology. These programs will run late August

through mid-May 2024. All are completed during that nine-month period, with the exception of cosmetology, which is a two-year program.

Representatives also will

be available to speak about BCC's part-time/career-enhancement programs, apprenticeships, the adult diploma program and specialized training offerings to earn industry-recognized credentials. Some of these programs include machining, maintenance mechanic, forklift operator, healthcare, EMT/fire, CPR/first aid and more.

‘A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to a Murder’

It's good food, a parade of celebrities and a mystery killer as the Newcomerstown Historical Society offers up "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to a Murder" March 31 and April 1. Doors open at 5 p.m.

The original production was written by Chris Hart and Ray Booth and features a cast of well-known characters, even if the show allows plenty of wiggle room for a few incongruities. "There's Phyllis Diller, yes?" said Hart, who directs and appears in the show. "But there's also Taylor Swift, so there you are."

Hart said the cast, seasoned members of the Old Main Street Players, is easy to direct. "Such a wonderful and talented group of people. They really don't need much direction. It's a lot of improvisation, so you never know what to

expect."

Dinner with the show includes chicken and rice, green beans, noodles, coleslaw, and a roll and dessert. Tickets are \$30 with tables for six or seven people available.

Hart said the show centers around the late comedienne Joan Rivers. "You come and see the Joan Rivers talk show. A bunch of celebrities show up, and she doesn't like them and they don't like her, so she gets to work cutting them down to size. Everyone who appears on her show must bring a gift, so people bring candy, flowers, yada yada."

After Rivers is finished having her comedic way with her guests, Hart appears as Lt. Columbo, which causes Rivers to claim illness and leave. Soon after, she's found murdered.

"Oh no, she's dead," Hart said. "At that point

it's everyone in the room is a suspect and we will be interviewing you all. But let's eat first."

In other words the meal will be served during a break in the action. The cast mingles with the audience, asking questions until a vote is taken to see who can successfully guess the identity of the murderer.

Hart said he and Booth had produced several such shows and wondered if they might write one themselves. They began by writ-

ing something in collaboration with the Newcomerstown Historical Society for Christmas this year.

"We took it to the museum, and they said they'd love to have something around April Fools Day. 'Could we write something that quickly?' we wondered. Well, yes we could, and we did," Hart said. "There's plenty of comedy and unexpected fun."

The cast of nine portrays

celebrities from The Dude from "The Big Lebowski," played by David Boyer, to Susie Hart as Vanna White and Vane Scott as Ed McMahon.

Other cast members include Mackenzie Carr as Taylor Swift, Laura Brown as Phyllis Diller, Dave Boyer as Grandpa Jones, Michael Wise as Lenny Lugnuts and Christy Penland as Joan Rivers.

In addition to his turn as

McMahon, Scott is entertainment director for the museum and has worked with Hart many times before. "We have a core of people who are great at entertaining an audience," Scott said. "There's a lot of improv, and they're all very good at that."

The group has offered up many shows in the past including a full-scale replication of the "Hee Haw" show. "We like to do a lot of entertaining for the community," Scott said. "People enjoy and appreciate it, and we have a lot of fun."

Skating Away

New Dennison project
a win for the community

Adding a wintertime attraction and giving children something to do outside will be a positive for downtown Dennison, according to Mayor Greg DiDonato, who wants to use an ice-skating rink to attract more people to the village and help local businesses.

The skating rink will be added at Heritage Park between the gazebo and the commemorative wall. The rink will be available for use from mid-November through February.

Any warm weather will not be a problem. The synthetic material used for the ice rink will provide a solid surface, no matter the temperature. Smaller pieces will be locked together to form a 48-by-64-foot area for skaters.

The rink will include an existing shed on the gazebo property that will be used to house skates available for rent, and there will

be an area for skate changing and seating. The village will work with The Cambridge Ice Rink LLC on the rink project.

The city will purchase the rink with donations they are receiving for the project. Although an agreement is yet to be finalized, it is planned that Cambridge Ice Rink will be responsible for setup at the beginning of the season, managing the rink during the season with local employees and disassembling the rink at the end of the season. The rink will be stored in Dennison during the warmer months.

Three poles will be added to the east side of the project so decorative string lighting can zig-zag over the rink, connecting to the four existing poles. DiDonato would like to see the lights left up year round.

DiDonato said he is excited the stone gravel that covers the area will be converted to a large concrete pad to make a sturdy base for

the project in the winter and other activities in the summer.

“There’ll be no more gravel where those benches are. So from now on when we have weddings and the festival, all those benches and tables will be sitting on cement,” DiDonato said. “The other nice thing is if we have a function now, we have the parking lot that’s sitting across from the depot, and we have this. If you want to do a small version craft fair or art show, you don’t have to put it in the street. You’re going to have two areas to put it in.”

The history walkway that is currently in the center of the gazebo seating area will be moved to a new area across from the First National Bank of Dennison, where Dennison’s “LoveTusc” sculpture also will be placed.

Those using the rink will be required to sign a waiver, which will be kept on file. The use of waivers at the Cambridge rink has shown 15% of patrons who visit their rink are from Tuscarawas County.

Prices for using the rink will be \$8 with skate rental available for \$2. DiDonato said they will look at some ideas like passes or discount nights to be able to offer some savings.

As part of the rink package, the village will receive 140 pairs of skates to rent, and for smaller children they will have a total of 10 dolphin and penguin skate aids to use for balance. A commercial skate sharpener is included in the total rink cost too.

As of now plans are to open the rink on Thursday and Friday from 5-9 p.m. and noon to 9 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. The rink would be available to rent for private parties on Monday through Wednesday.

Care of the rink must be done

daily with the synthetic material being brushed and oiled. Skates must be sharp to keep the material, which lasts about seven to 10 years, in good condition.

The total estimated cost of the skating rink is \$127,969.48. DiDonato is appreciative of the support the project has received so far from the community.

Stocker’s Concrete has offered to provide the cement work for 50% off, providing a significant savings, and the village received a \$30,000 donation from the Reeves Foundation.

The village is currently raising money through the sales of five-year advertising sponsorships, which are available at three levels. A gold sponsorship at \$5,000 includes a 3-by-6-foot banner with

a logo and information to be displayed at the rink, business name, announcement hourly during business hours, and a free three-hour private company skate party on a weekday. A silver sponsorship for \$2,500 includes a 3-by-3-foot banner, business announcement once per evening and a free two-hour private company skate party on a weekday. The bronze sponsorship for \$1,250 includes half of a 3-by-3-foot banner and business name announcement once an evening during business hours.

To order a sponsorship, call 740-922-4072 ext. 4, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

“We’re trying to approach businesses and say, ‘Would you be willing to basically buy your advertising and prepay for five years?’” DiDonato said. “We’re trying to see if we have a group of people who would be willing to pay it forward. We would like to see if we could pay this off by year’s end, and we’re over halfway with those sponsorships.”

Sponsors for the project so far include the Dennison Depot Railroad Museum, First National Bank of Dennison, Dennison Eagles, Uhrichsville Moose and the R.K. Lindsey Funeral Home.

Not only will residents have use of the facility, but also it will bring in visitors who will eat, shop and maybe even stay overnight at the Dennison Depot’s recently launched Rail Car Bed and Breakfast.

“The more people you bring into your town, the more it helps your community. We get something for the kids, we get a clean, safe event for families, it’s a great location, it’s healthy, and at the same time, it helps the business district,” DiDonato said. “It’s a win-win.”

Conservation District's tips for maintaining a strong pond

Anytime is a good time to get out and inspect your pond, especially if you are noticing lower water levels. Hopefully, with this mild winter, it has not kept you cooped up and you've been able to monitor your pond regularly.

We have had a rather dry winter as well, and maybe that is the cause for lower water levels in your pond. Don't fret. The spring showers should be right around the corner. But with some



rain recently, springs are recharging and may have begun refilling your pond already. Keeping your pond dam well maintained and in good condition allows for easier inspection and maintenance.

Here are some tips for maintaining a good, strong

pond:

—Always establish, control and maintain proper grass vegetation on and around your pond dam. If bare spots appear from any erosion, reseed them immediately.

—Keep the primary spillway clear of debris to eliminate it from clogging and causing overtopping to your pond.

—Keep the emergency spillway grass covered at all times and check it after significant rain events when it

is used. Mow it at least three times per year to discourage woody species.

—Ensure concrete is sound, not scaling or deteriorating and make sure it is not scoured.

—Inspect the drop structures, emergency spillways, embankments and berms. Replace deteriorating boards, channels, pipes, trash racks and any other components.

—Check for holes in the dam fill from animals such as groundhogs, musk-

rats and even beaver. These holes can greatly reduce the strength of the dam and cause the pond to leak. Muskrats and groundhogs can create tunnels for long distances, creating an easy path for the water to seep through, further saturating the pond dam fill material.

—Do not allow any woody vegetation to become established on the dam as the roots can channel throughout it and create seepage and leaks.

—Look for excessive

settlement and seepage, especially on the downstream toe of the dam, and any evidence of piping around any outlet pipes. This is a quick way for pond failure to happen.

It is very important to always inspect and properly maintain everything on your pond. Remember to always consider there can be a threat to downstream neighbors and land.

Claymont high school students learn about investing

Claymont's career-tech business program has a new educational tool that helps students invest in the stock market. Last year the district purchased a stock ticker from Rise Display in Las Vegas, and it has been a big hit among students and staff.

The ticker provides

students with up-to-date quotes and information on stocks, cryptocurrency and foreign exchange rates, as well as national news headlines.

Investing in the stock market is part of the curriculum for business foundations, which is one of three classes currently offered in

the CTE business program at Claymont. Other courses students can take include marketing, where students advertise and run a school store, and entrepreneurship, where students learn the skills needed to run their own businesses.

Next year, with the help of a bank loan and the Junior Achievement program, students will start and operate a small business during school hours and compete with other business programs around the state.

According to Andrew Zimmerman, the school's business teacher, "Students

utilize the stock ticker with an online simulator, thus allowing them to invest \$100,000 of play money while they are still in the learning phase."

Zimmerman has seen a significant amount of interest in learning about the stock market over the past five years, and he sees it as a great opportunity to get kids thinking about their financial futures.

"Even though I grew up knowing generally what stocks were, I didn't really start educating myself and taking risks until I was in my 30s. These kids should get quite a head start by the

time they graduate," Zimmerman said.

The ticker was purchased using career-tech funds from the state.

The business program is

one of four career-tech programs offered at Claymont High School, along with agriculture, information technology and manufacturing operations.

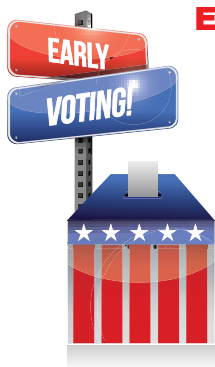

Home energy assistance is available for residents

The Ohio Department of Development and HARCATUS Tri-County Community Action Organization Inc. will help income-eligible Ohioans stay warm during the cold winter months.

The Home Energy Assistance Winter Crisis Program provides eligible Ohioans assistance paying a utility or bulk fuel bill or assistance paying for heating system repairs. The program will end March 30.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment with HARCATUS. Appointments can be scheduled by calling 855-806-9650.

The following documents are needed to complete the appointment:

—Copies of their most recent energy bills.

—A list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30 days or 12 months for each member.

—Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.

—Proof of disability if applicable.

“We want to remind households that if they have started an application and not completed it, HARCATUS must finish the process quickly. Please get us the necessary documents. Also, more than likely, temperatures will probably turn colder at least one more time this winter. Reach out to your local HARCATUS office now to begin the process before the March 30 deadline,” said JoEllen Sanders, community services program director at HARCATUS.

Eligible households can receive up to \$175 if they are a client of a regulated utility or \$750 if they are a client of unregulated utilities such as electric cooperatives and municipal utilities.

The assistance is applied

to their utility bill and/or applied to heating system repair costs. Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines to qualify for assistance. An appointment no-show may result in utilities being shut off.

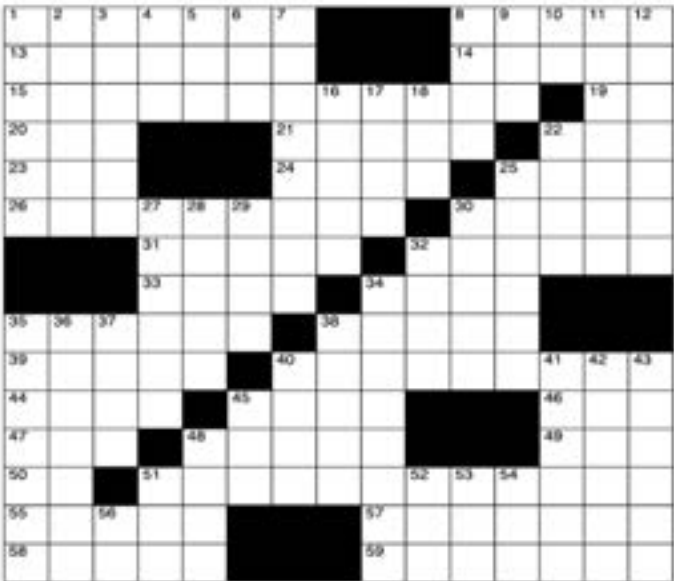

Tax advocates warn of fraud and missed benefits

Tax time can be rife with emotion as filers anticipate a refund or worry they may owe. But what filers may not consider is tax season is an opportune time for fraudsters to take advantage of unsuspecting victims.

Dana Goldstein, attorney with Community Legal Aid's Low-Income Taxpayer Clinic, stressed filers are responsible for the information listed on their returns. False or inaccurate information can lead to problems with the IRS and state and local tax departments.

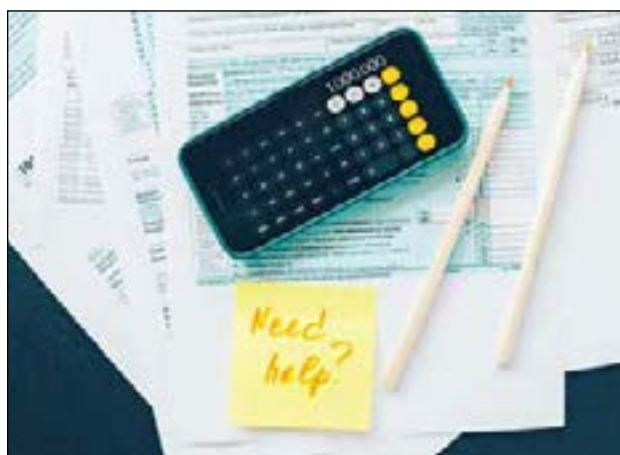
Goldstein urged filers to have returns completed by someone who is both competent and trustworthy, citing particular concern for immigrant and refugee filers with limited English proficiency.

The nonprofit firm has seen firsthand the harm done when tax preparation becomes a vehicle for fraud. Scammers, who often hold a position of trusted authority within the immigrant

community, may fabricate income, create false households or wrongfully claim children on a return and then collect the fraudulent refunds for themselves.

"Language barriers, cultural expectations and trust issues can drive immigrants to rely on preparers who speak their native language or have a known connection with their community," Goldstein said, adding it also puts them at greater risk of fraud.

A fraudulent return not only gets the taxpayer in trouble with the IRS, but also can threaten efforts to obtain citizenship. Widespread fraud concerns prompted Legal Aid to create a partner tool kit that includes fraud-warning flyers in multiple languages including Swahili, Ukrainian and Spanish. The tool kit has been shared with partner organizations throughout its eight-county service area in efforts to protect the immigrant community.

Warning signs of a fraudulent preparer might include offering to prepare a return for free, promising a refund within 48 hours, promising a refund without reviewing documents and a preparer who does not list their name or provide an Electronic Filing Identification Number on the return.

In addition to fraud

concerns, advocates worry some caregivers may miss out on credits, particularly the 2021 Expanded Child Tax Credit. This tax credit provided up to \$3,600 per qualifying child, and for the first and only time, households did not need earned income to receive the benefit.

An online portal was

provided so qualifying parents or caregivers could claim the credit if they otherwise were not required to file taxes. That portal was shut down in 2022, leading some to believe it was too late to claim the credit. However, that is not the case.

Qualifying caregivers such as grandparents or kinship care providers who had minor children in their household in 2021 can still claim the credit by filing a 2021 tax return.

"The Expanded Child Tax Credit was a game-changer when it came to lifting children out of poverty," Goldstein said. "We want parents and caregivers to have every opportunity to claim any funds they are yet entitled to receive."

Goldstein recommended using an IRS certified tax preparer to ensure an accurate return and avoid fraud. Free tax preparation is available through the Volunteer Income Tax Assis-

tance program for income-eligible individuals. VITA services can be found by calling 800-906-9877 or visiting irs.treasury.gov/freetaxprep.

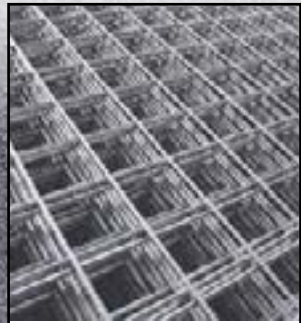

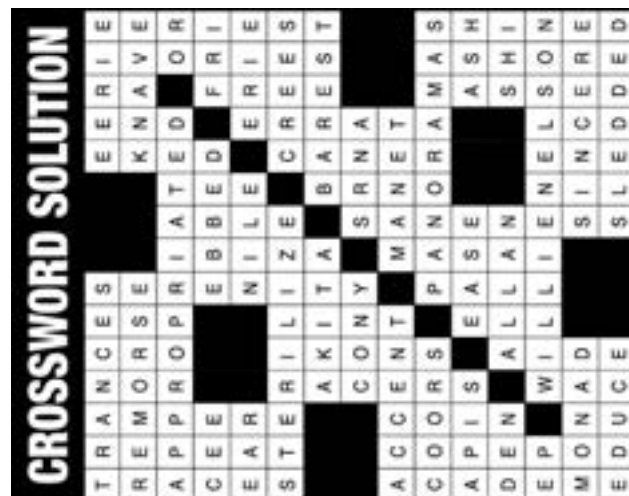
