Each year the Claymont FFA reporter, secretary and treasurer complete their assigned considered for their State books and record keeping to submit for grading. They may receive either a silver, bronze or gold rating. This year all three officers earned a gold rating.


To earn the State FFA Degree, students must first earn the Greenhand and Chapter Degrees. They must be at least a junior in high school and meet minimum requirements such as community service hours, other involvement in activities and investing or earning a certain amount of money within their SAE. Students must fill out an application to be FFA Degree.

The Claymont High School agriculture program currently has 60 students. The program offers a variety of classes including agriculture, food and natural resources; animal and plant science; animal anatomy and physiology; and food science. become the first in Tuscarawas County to receive the Teen Mental Health First Aid Certification.

Ice cream party celebrates Blue Ribbon Award

Though Port Washington Elementary was recognized in September and November 2022 as a Blue Ribbon School by the United States Department of Education, the Indian Valley Foundation has carried the celebration through to almost the end of the school year by hosting an ice cream party for the students on May 15.

The school, which serves nearly 400 students from kindergarten through fifth grade, won in the category of Exemplary High Performing Schools.

This proved to be a problem for the Indian Valley Foundation, which usually recognizes awardwinning people from the district during its annual gala in April.

"One of the recipients of our awards that we give each year was Port Washington Elementary for the Blue Ribbon Award, which is a national award for schools, and it involves the whole school. We couldn't figure out what to do for them because usually it's one person and we give them one gift," said Pat Kohl, a member of

the IVF. "We finally decided that we could do an ice cream day for the kids."

The event took the foundation a half-hour to serve each student an ice cream cup with sprinkles. They

received their treat while sitting on the grassy lawn of the school.

The IVF has grown over the years and does many things to help

the teachers and students in the district. It also gives scholarships, classroom grants and building grants. It gives new teachers \$50 to help set up their room, and new support staff are included.

"At first we had to pinch pennies," Kohl said. "But now we've grown and can do more."

It was the State of Ohio that got the ball rolling. It first notified the school to nominate them for the award. Port Washington Elementary accepted and went through the application process. Its application filled out 20 pages.

"That's quite an application process," Principal Troy Page said. "We had a committee of teachers who volunteered their time. We all wrote our Port Washington application and submitted it. It was mostly just narratives that you had to write up and describe."

The application included information on eligibility certification, demographic data, school overview, curriculum and instruction, school climate and culture, and strategy for academic success.

In November 2022 an award ceremony for all the national recipients was held.

"Indian Valley School District was kind enough to send the team of staff members from Port Washington that worked on the application to Washington, D.C.," Page said. "Three of our team members were able to attend the actual award ceremony, which was myself, Mrs. Patty Couts, who is one of our teachers, and Dr. Ira Wentworth, our superintendent. It was quite an honor."

Other individuals from the

volunteer committee also attended and participated in presentations on varying topics on how to make schools better during the two-day trip.

Port Washington Elementary School was only one of 13 schools in Ohio to receive the award last year. Schools can receive the award as often as every five years. Port Washington previously won the award in 2003. At the ceremony in Washington, D.C., the school was recognized as a two-time award winner.

The school also received a plaque and a flag to display.

People working together are the reason for Port Washington Elementary winning the award.

"It all goes back to our students, our staff and our families," Page said. "They're the ones that truly put in all the work on a daily basis, and it's just nice to be recognized for doing what they do. That's what makes our school special."

Parts of the school overview section tell the reasons for the school's success:

"Community members, parents, visitors and students who enter this exceptional building often tell staff that the school emits a feeling of family. Indeed,

this is our secret ingredient. That's something extraordinary — so vital to the students and staff who thrive here," the overview reads. "Our teachers, cooks and custodians become their matriarchs. When students struggle, they are supported by our intervention specialists, Title I staff, speech pathologist, educational aides and community volunteers.

These members fill the role of grandparents, spoiling the boys and girls by working with them in small groups, rewarding them at each small success, and treating any disabilities with unconditional love. All students can learn and are supported wherever they are on their academic journey. We work toward a common goal: our district mission of 'working together to personalize a rigorous standards-based learning experience.' Each morning as announcements conclude, these words resonate from our classrooms: 'Say it loud and say it proud: P-O-R-T Positive Outgoing Respectful Team."

Find your own private fishing hole

According to the Outdoor Foundation, 86% of adults who enjoy fishing learned to fish when they were children. Larissa Smith is one of those adults who learned as a kid.

"I used to fish with my dad at a friend's pond, and I have very fond memories of that," she said.

Smith and business partner Roger Hollis started FishMySpot hoping to keep the sport of fishing alive in an era when children tend to hole up indoors with video games instead of being outdoors with family. As a mother of three, Smith said she knows all too well how daunting it can be to plan a fishing trip with kids.

"It can be overwhelming figuring out where to go, packing up the car, driving a long way and fighting crowds at public lakes, Smith said. "It's a lot of variables, and we help take those variables out."

Hollis agreed. "We recognize that there are public places for people to go fishing, and that's fine. We're certainly not opposed to doing that. But they can be overcrowded and overfished."

FishMySpot is a website that allows people to locate a fishing pond or lake they find appealing and reserve it for an exclusive fishing experience. "It gives families a place where it feels more comfortable to teach kids how to fish," Smith said.

How it works

Visitors to www.Fish-MySpot.com can book a private fishing experience at private ponds and lakes throughout Ohio. Pond owners have agreed to open up their fishing holes for families and fishing parties at fees that are reasonable.

"Our ponds still have nice-size fish, and some said. "Others have small-

Visitors to www.Fish-MySpot.com can search for ponds based on criteria such as price range, user ratings and types of fish desired. Prices range from \$35-\$400 or more. Some owners allow you to keep the fish you catch while others ask you to catch and release. Details of each location are spelled out on the website.

"If you want to go fishing at Lake Erie, it's a long drive, and it's expensive," Hollis said. "This gives people a great place to spend some quality time at a very low price."

Some locations offer just fishing while others offer extras such as camping and the use of canoes, picnic tables and grills. Fish range from crappie and catfish to largemouth bass, sunfish, bluegill and walleye.

A work in progress

Smith said she hopes to grow FishMySpot to include private access to locations across the country.

"When we took the company to market in 2020, we had only 12 ponds listed," she said. "Now we have more than 25 in Ohio, and we just added one in West Virginia."


Smith said there are additional locations not listed on the website that can be privately booked as well.

Smith invited pond owners to check out the website and learn how they can earn a little extra income by listing their locations.

"On our website pond owners can sign up to see how much they can possibly make," she said. "If it's appealing enough, they can list their spot."

Smith said pond owners keep 70% of the fee they determine while 30% goes to FishMySpot. "That helps cover our expenses like marketing. We also cover all of our pond owners under a \$1 million liability insurance policy."

Eric Gagne, a relief pitch-


er with the L.A. Dodgers when he won the Cy Young Award in 2003, will be honored at the luncheon and serve as parade marshal.
